This same spirit is evident in our Federation and all of us are deeply grateful for these priceless gifts of love and loyalty from each of you.

Sister Callista McGuire is our last surviving member from Joliet and Sister Florence Maloney the only living member who once taught in Joliet.

The Joliet Alumnae group has not had any "new blood" since 1918, vet those "girls" who remain are very active members of Loretto Federation.

Our Englewood and Woodlawn Alumnae groups have had no new members for many years but we are certain that the Loretto spirit will endure in spite of that.
