From Carriages to Jet Planes

- 1673 Louis Joliet and Father Jacques Marquette come through Chicago Portage
1770 Jean Pointe de Sable built a home and fur trading station on north shore of Chicago River near site of Tribune Tower.
1778 George Rogers Clark won Upper Mississippi Valley from British.
1803 Fort Dearborn was built.
1812 Massacre of settlers fleeing from Fort Dearborn.
1800 Illinois-Indiana Territory
1809 Illinois Territory Separate
1818 Illinois became 21st State. 1825 Erie Canal opened.
1830 Town site of Chicago laid out. Lots were sold to finance a canal.
1833 Chicago incorporated as a town with 550 inhabitants. Father St.Cyr.
1795 By Treaty of Greenville, Ky. the Indians ceded 6 square miles at the mouth of the Chicago River. / 1816 Treaty of St.Louis land ceded 20 mile corridor.
1836 Gradually the Indians were pushed out of the area - Black Hawk Wars - by 1836 all Indians were west of the Mississippi.
1836 Work was begun on the proposed Illinois-Michigan Canal.
1837 Chicago was granted a City Charter. Population 4000.
1847 IBVM Sisters landed in Toronto, Ont.
1848 Canal was finished. A highway for industry and commerce, in Northern Ill.

1848-1856 Construction of railroads in Illinois was very rapid. Caused a revolution in agriculture.
1850 Population of Chicago was 30,000.

1860 Population of Chicago was 110,000.

1861-1865 Civil War/Chicago Boom followed. Cattle Market. City of Wood.
1871 Chicago Fire. *Famous architects come to Chicago.*
1880 IBVM came to Joliet.
1892 IBVM came to Englewood in Chicago - (Barnum Grove in Town of Lake)
1893 Columbian Exposition in Jackson Park, Chicago
1896 IBVM came to Sault Ste.Marie, Michigan. Loretto Convent Englewood built. Silent movies in New York.
1895 Marconi invented radio.

1905 IBVM came to Woodlawn.
1909 IBVM came to St.Bride
1914 World War I
1916 Model T Ford sold for \$400.
1918 IBVM left Joliet.
1925-1950 Golden Age of Radio 1924 IBVM came to St.Cyril's.
1926 International Eucharistic Congress in Chicago.
1927 Loretto High School built in Englewood. Branch Novitiate on Harvard Ave.
1929 Beginning of Economic Depression. New school wing at Woodlawn and Sault.
1930 IBVM came to St.Adrian's.
1933 Century of Progress Talking pictures. 1941 U.S. entered W.W.II
1949 IBVM moves Westward. Growth of TV in the 1950's/
1960 Space Age
Transistors
Solar Energy
War: Korea, Vietnam, Civil Rights
Vatican II
1968 Civilian clothes in IBVM
