### NINETEENTH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR

#### NEW MUSIC DIRECTOR

We are pleased to welcome our new Cathedral Music Director, Richard Proulx, nationally known composer, conductor and organist.

A product of the unique musical traditions in the Archdiocese of St. Paul, Mr. Proulx was educated in parochial schools of that city and later attended both MacPhail College and the University of Minnesota. Further studies took him to the Columbus Boychoir School at Princeton, St. John's Abbey at Collegeville and the Royal School of Church Music at Croydon, England. Roger Wagner and Robert Shaw are among his teachers.

In St. Paul, Richard Proulx's choir of men and boys gained a national reputation through its many recordings, telecasts, and appearances with the Minnesota Orchestra and the Minnesota Opera.

Moving to the Pacific Northwest in 1968, he served as Music Director at St. Thomas Episcopal Church in Seattle where he directed four choirs, a chamber orchestra, established a tradition of liturgical handbell-ringing based on medieval practice and initiated a concert series featuring Northwest artists in performances of major works with orchestra.

He was appointed to both the Music Commission of the Archdiocese of Seattle and the Standing Commission of Church Music of the Episcopal Church. He was one of the editors of "Worship II," and has contributed to many other new hymnals. He has edited an extensive series of authentic renaissance and baroque motets in practical performing editions, designed for small choirs.

Richard Proulx has published over 200 compositions. His one-act chancel opera, "The Pilgrim," was commissioned for the 1978 National Convention of the American Guild of Organists and has enjoyed recent publication at Notre Dame University, Richmond, Seattle, and Denver. He has also written documentary film scores and television commercials. Workshop, recital and broadcast activities have taken him to most parts of this country and Canada and he has made two European tours.

Mr. Proulx plans a Cathedral music program of broadened scope with increased parish and community participation. In addition to the Men and Boys' Choir and the Cathedral Handbell Ringers, two new school groups will be formed: a Chamber Choir of 12 professional singers (mixed voices) and a Parish Mixed Chorus, open by audition to volunteer singers, drawing upon the considerable talent in the parish and its immediate community.

Details of the program will be announced in coming issues of THE CHURCHES.

Meanwhile, we warmly welcome Richard Proulx to our Cathedral parish family.
