EAT, DRINK, AND LIVE FOREVER!

Whenever we sat down at the kitchen or dining room table for a family meal, the primary principle used to be “*Eat what you get!*” We never dared question mother’s menus. If we could not always eat what we liked, we soon learned to like what we ate—or go hungry.

GOOD FOOD AND GOOD HEALTH

But somewhere along the line we began to realize that this old saying was being turned around. Now we are being told, “*Get what you eat!*” For example, we get fat if we eat too much, we get heart trouble and cancer, we get other illnesses and ailments if we eat the wrong foods. We have become very conscious of just how much the food we eat contributes to our health.

IN THE DAYS BEFORE DIETS

Jesus and his disciples lived in the days before calorie-counting became popular. They did not know about fats and fibers, cholesterol and calcium. They were not tempted to put on a miner’s hard hat (with the light on the front) and use a pickax as they ate their way through their daily minimum requirements of iron, magnesium, zinc, and copper (see side panel of any breakfast food box).

“GET WHAT YOU EAT!”

But for all this absence of nutritional information, Jesus still believed in the principle “Get what you eat!” So when he celebrated the Last Supper with his disciples, he told his table guests exactly what they were getting (gospel: Mark 14:12-16, 22-26).

In the bread they ate they were getting his body: “Take this,” he said, “this is my body.” In the wine they drank they were getting his blood: “This is my blood, the blood of the covenant”

WE GET ETERNAL LIFE

As we continue to get the body and the blood of Jesus, we also get everything else that he is willing and able to give us. Jesus puts it this way: “All who eat my flesh and drink my blood will live in me and I in them” (John 6:57—communion antiphon).

How privileged, how blessed we are to be able to eat and drink at the Lord’s table of eternal life!
