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Constitution

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Constitution.

Article 1. Name.

This organization shall be called the Loretto Alumnae of St. Bernard's, Chicago, Ill.

Article 2. — Object.

The object of this association shall be (a) to maintain and perpetuate the memories and friendships of school-girl days at St. Bernard's; (b) to promote and to strengthen the ties that bind them to their Alma Mater; (c) to promote the interests of St. Bernard's School; and (d) by mutual encouragement and by lives of true Christian womanhood to honor their holy Patroness, Our Lady of Good Counsel.

Article 3. Officers.

Section 1. The officers shall be a President, Vice-President, Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary and Treasurer, whose duties shall be such as usually pertain to such offices. Elections shall be by ballot, ~~selected~~ members to constitute a quorum.

Constitution — Continued

Section 2.

In the absence of the President — his duties shall be performed by the Vice-President.

Section 3. The term of office shall be one year.

Section 4.

All business transactions and important proceedings of the Association shall be subject to the approval of the Superior of Loreto's Convent, St. Bernard, Chicago, and the Principal of St. Bernard's High School.

Article 4. — Membership.

Section 1. None but Graduates from St. Bernard's High School shall be eligible for membership.

Section 2. — Eligible Candidates shall be admitted to Membership, at the Annual Meeting, on signing the Constitution and paying the fee.

Section 3. — The fee from each Member shall be One dollar payable on or before the ^{date of the} Annual Meeting.

Constitution - Continued.Article 5- Meetings.

Section 1. There shall be three regular meetings held in the year, viz. in October, February and June. The last of these shall be the Annual Meeting of the Alumnae, at which the enrollment of new members shall take place, and which shall be held within three days after the Commencement Exercises at St. Bernard's.

Section 2. — Special Meetings shall be called by the President or application of four members. All members to be specially notified of the proposed meeting.

Section 3 — All meetings shall be conducted according to the rules of Parliamentary usage, as laid down in "Robert's Rules of Order."

Article 6. Amendments.

The Constitution may be amended at any regular business Meeting of the Alumnae, by a two-thirds vote of the members present, provided a written notice of the intended change has been given at least two weeks previous.
