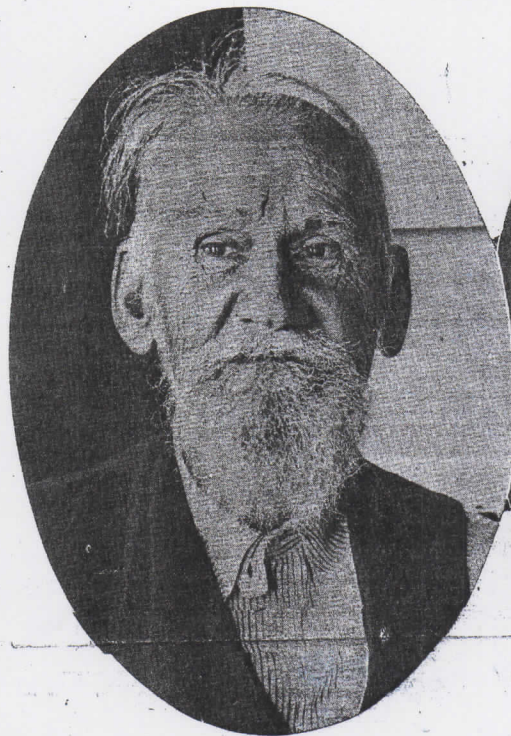


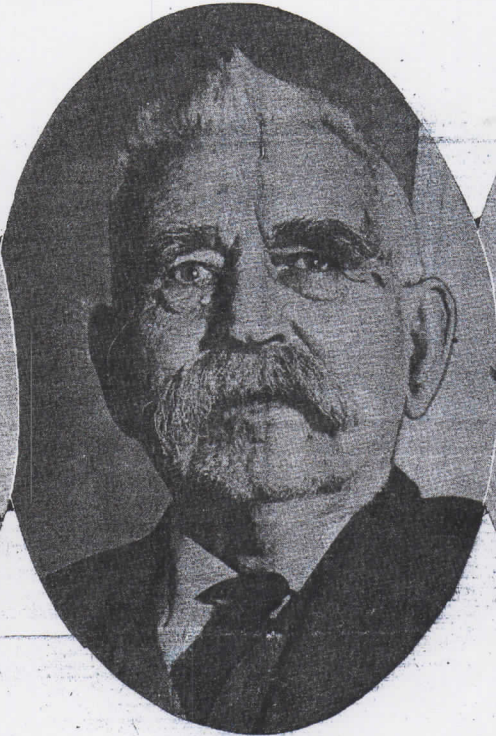

LONGEVITY IS JUST A HABIT WITH HILLER "BOYS"

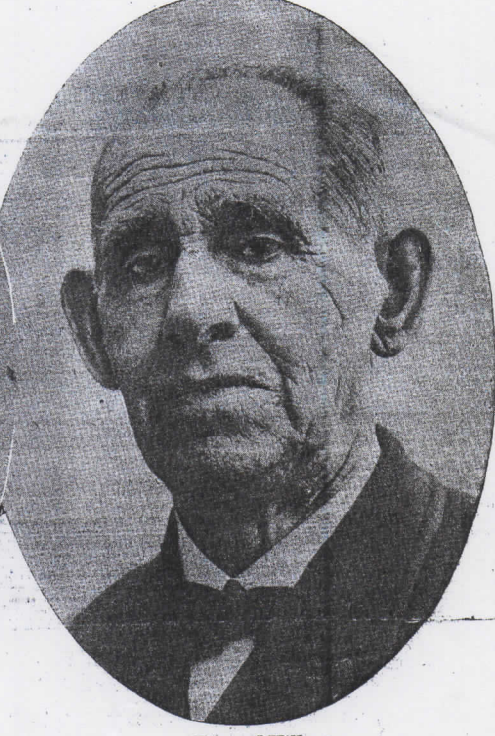
Three Brothers Reach Shady Side of 80 Without Feeling That an Octogenarian Is Necessarily Ancient—Matthew Totes Cane as Trophy Awarded to Oldest Man in Mattapoisett—Lilburne and Edward Are Lively

Longevity is a confirmed habit with the native residents of Mattapoisett. They collect years in that little seaside town as connoisseurs of antiques pick up their treasures. For example, take the three Hiller brothers, whose combined collection totals 253 years.

Matthew Hiller, late master of his vessel on the sea, holds the town record. On March 9 his collection reached the sum of 86. Consequently, he possesses the cane given long ago as the trophy of the oldest man in town.

Only in point of years on earth is Matthew the oldest man in town. Actually he's among the most youthful.

Brother Attains 84

Matthew Hiller's brother Edward, who lives in the old family homestead on Pine Island Corner, was 84 yesterday. Their young brother, Lilburne, developer of Crescent Beach, was 82 last April 23. A sister, Mrs. Thomas Evans, died a few years ago at the age of 81.

Taken as much for granted as the hills, themselves in the little town of their birth, the three have histories as varied and full of interest as their years are many. Hardships have not been few, rough knocks have been plentiful, but there's little now in the appearance of any of the three to indicate aught but peaceful, comfortable lives.

Maybe it's their Friends faith. Perhaps it's wholesome living and honest labor. Something has kept them young, eager, full of cheer. After a chat with them one comes away thinking of old Ben Ezra's plea:

"Grow old along with me,
The best is yet to be,
The last of life for which the first was made."

Three Born in Farmhouse

All three were born in a large square farmhouse built by Seth Hiller, their father, when he was twenty. The location was then in the old Town of Rochester. Mat-

thew was born in 1840, a decade or more before Mattapoisett became a separate town, and the old home thenceforth was not in Rochester but in Mattapoisett.

Captain Matthew Hiller lives on Cannon street in the heart of the village. A large man, bushy-browed, slightly stooped by weight of years, he looks 20 years younger than the records say.

Few wrinkles are in his strong face, and his iron-gray hair and mustache still are heavy. There's little of quaver in his voice, but his hearing is not as good as once it was. Rheumatism and the lingering effects of mishaps on the sea have stiffened his home a bit and lessened his activity, but he's still a familiar figure daily on Mattapoisett streets as he goes to store and post office.

Followed the Sea

"I followed the sea," says Matthew Hiller, as he takes the ever-present pipe from his mouth. "When I was 15, I shipped from Mattapoisett on the bark Willis under Captain King. I made two voyages on the Willis, then shipped on my third trip from here on the Samuel Themas."

None of the three brothers served in the Civil War, but to Matthew came a taste of it in 1862 when the Altamaha, of which he was captain, was captured by the Alabama. "The Altamaha went out from Marion. It was the fifth vessel to be taken and sunk by the Alabama," Captain Hiller says. After being kept in irons for two days and nights, he and his crew were landed on the Western islands.

Shortly afterward, Matthew went into the merchant service. "I had to learn seamanship all over again, almost," he says, "for the steam vessels in the merchant service were quite different from my sailing ship."

Goes Into Oil Fields

Until 1889 Mr. Hiller remained in the merchant marine, operating between New

York and Boston, with the exception of seven years spent in the oil fields of Clarion and McKean Counties, Pennsylvania. For 14 years he was Superintendent of Piers in New York.

Captain Hiller was born March 9, 1840. Just 19 years later, March 9, 1859, he married Miss Beuretta W. Hammond, Marion. She died in Bradford, Pa., Oct. 1880. Jan. 17, 1889, he married Mary I. Rockefeller in New Bedford; who today is his helpmeet and constant companion.

They argue over dates and names a little, in a friendly, husband and wife sort of way, he and his second bride of 37 years ago. There's love light in the eyes of each speaking of the other, and at atmosphere of understanding in their attitudes that

only years of journeying the way together can bring.

The Captain gave a glimpse of his still vigorous spirit, when he offered to climb in his automobile and guide the way to the home of brother Lilburne and the old homestead of Oliver Wendell Holmes. One thought of a line from one of that poet's verses, "Old Time is a liar, we're 20 tonight."

Five children, Lydia, William, Emerson, Charles and Ira, were born to Matthew by his first wife. Four, George, David, Matthew, Jr., and Jennie resulted from the second union. None of them is at home now.

Down in the old homestead, all alone save for daily morning visits of a nurse,

lives the next brother, Edward Burroughs Hiller. His solitude has also recently been broken by the arrival of his son Joseph and the latter's family from Lansdowne, Pa., to spend the Summer in Mattapoisett.

Edward's Memory Good

Teacher, carpenter, operator in the oil fields, and farmer, Edward's 84 years have been lived to the full. And scarcely a detail of the experiences of those years but still is vivid in his memory. Dates, names and places are ever ready to his tongue. The other brothers acknowledge the superiority of Edward's memory over theirs, and he himself declares modestly, "I think I've retained my faculties pretty well."

Mr. Hiller is an ardent worker in the Society of Friends. When interviewed the other day, he had just returned from a week at the annual meeting of the New England Society of Friends at Wynthrop Center, Me. He made the trip with his son in the latter's machine.

"I lived here at home until I was 27," Mr. Hiller said. "Then mother went to live with brother Lilburne, and I decided to try my luck in the West. I took my mason's trowel and carpenter tools and started West."

Came Back to Pennsylvania

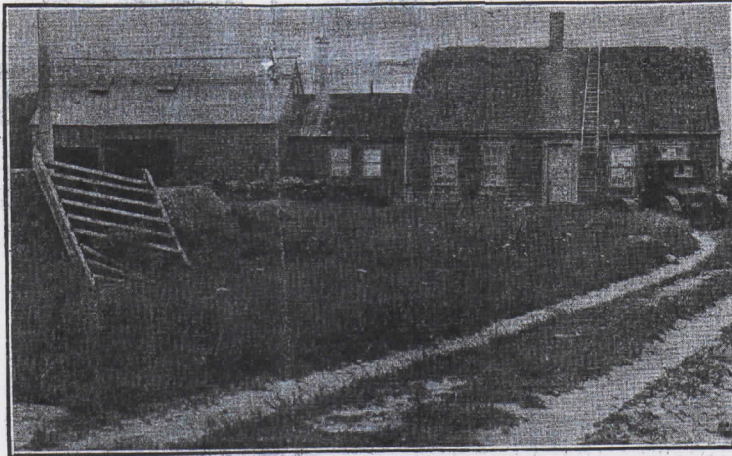
Fellow travelers on the train told numerous stories of building depression in the Middle West, so in Chicago, Mr. Hiller says, he bought a ticket back to a town in Northwestern Pennsylvania. Here he found the town full of workmen and empty of work.

"I asked a man there if he could direct me to a Yankee boarding house. He said there was one run by a York Yankee. So I went there and got a room. There were a lot of men there all out of work and back on their board bills. I told the landlady to expect me for meals at working man's hours, and then I went looking for a job."

"Once, I remember, after I'd canvassed the town pretty well, I came across a man working on a barn. I asked him if he wanted any help. He said no, he had plenty of time and couldn't afford to hire. Anyhow, I stayed and helped him three days just for sociability, though I didn't get a cent for it."

"Where's Hiller?" "Oh, he's working at so and so." The others couldn't understand how I got so much work. "One thinks they might have understood if they'd taken cognizance of the set of his jaw and the firm lines of his mouth."

Mr. Hiller gradually began to get building contracts, and during the three years of his stay in that Pennsylvania section built a number of houses. At 30, he came

Declares Frankly She Does Not Expect to Revolutionize Human Nature---Will Endeavor to Put City Half Way Between Open and Wide Open

As I have already said, Mrs. Landes is allied closely with academic life. Her husband is headmaster of the Washington School in the Washington State University. It is pertinent to add that he is a good deal of a man on his own account, and that the considerable period conducted the affairs of the university as its interim President. 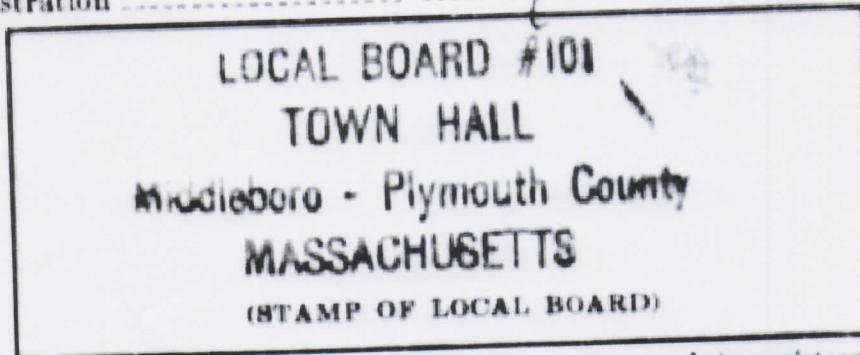
