Simon Huntington, born august 7, 1583, was probably married once before his marriage with Margaret Barrett on May 11, 1623. She was born September 29, 1595, daughter of Christopher and Elizabeth (Clark) Barrett. Christopher Barrett was Mayor of Norwich England in 1634 and 1648. He died in August 1649. Simon Huntington died of small pox on the ship before reaching America.

The church records of Roxbury, Mass. contain the earliest record of the Huntington name in New england. It is in the hand writing of Rev. John Elliot, the pastor of that ancient church. It is a "record of such as adjoined themselves unto the fellowship of this a "record of Christ of Roxborough, as also of such children as was born church of Christ of Roxborough, as also of such children as was born unto them under the holy covenant of this church, who are most propunto them under the church." This is the record of Margaret Huntington.

MARGARET HUNTINGTON, WIDOW, CAME IN 1633. HER HUSBAND DIED BY
THE WAY OF THE SMALL POX. SHE BROUGHT ____ CHILDREN WITH HER.

This is practically all that is certainly known of the progenitor of the Huntington Family in America. The rest is tradition, inference and conjecture.

Margaret Huntington, the widow, married Thomas Stoughton in 1635 or 1636, and moved with him to Windsor, Conn. He was prominent in the early history of that settlement, and died there March 25, 1661.

William Huntington, with respect to the parentage of William the evidence is meager. However the letter of Peter Barrett to Christopher Huntington, dated April 20, 1650, is of some importance. This letter was published in the "Genealogical Memoir of the Huntington Family" of 1853. In it the writer, a brother of Margaret (Parrett) (Huntington) Stoughton, directs the division of the sum of about 140 between her children, Christopher, Simon, Thomas, Ann, and the investment of the thomas' share untill he should "come capable"

to employ it." William is utterly ignored, which plainly suggest that he was not nearly related in blood to the Barretts. Wiliam might well have been a son of Simon by a first wife, who died before his marriage to Margaret Barrett.

If at the time of the immigration, he was aboy from ten to eighteen years of age, he would naturally come with the rest of the family. But before long his rising feeling of independence might impel him to strike out for himself. So, apparently, he did not go to Connecticut with Pargaret and the rest of the children, but is found in Salisbury, Pass. as early as 1640.

His descendents have been here to for classed as descendents of Simon although we may greatly doubt if Margret Barrett was their ancestress.

At a general meeting of the freemen of Salisbury, on the 26th of the 10th month in 1642, it was ordered that thirty families should remove to the the west side of the Powow River, the dividing line between Salisbury and Amesbury. Williams was probable one of the families who then crossed the river and became one of the pioneers in the new settlement of Amesbury, then called "Salisbury New Towne". He, however, retained possesion of his share in the old Salisbury, as he was recorded as "townesman and commoner" there on the third of twelfth month, 1650. He also paid the tax for the support of the Rev. Wm. Worcester, who was pastor over the first church in Salisbury down to his death in 1662.

William married Joanna Bayley, a daughter of John Bayley. Tradition makes William a religious man, and that he was a man of enterprise, and of a thoroughly english spirit is evidenced by his occupancy of the exposed outpost of the English settlements of that day-opposition to French encroachments being the mainspring to the settlement of that frontier town. The residence of Wm. Huntington in 1685-6 is given in the "Hoyt Family" as next to Thomas Hoyt. This was in Pleasant Valley on the banks of the Merrimac, where the river is a half mile wide and altoger a beutifull place.

The following minutes were copied from the Salisbury New Towne records and help to indicate the character and position of William Huntington.

1653-4 1st month. One acre and ninety two rods, his share of

the beach common. Being one of the sixty two persons of the division of the meadow toward the Merrimac river, and the great creek toward Merrimacs river's mouth and the barberry meadow, he drew lot No. 55

1654.1st month. He enrolled as one of the present inhabitents and commoners of the New Towne.

1658, October 29. He is recorded as drawing land by lot, and he was one of thirteen to whose children 500 acres was given. His son John is mentioned as the child to inherit his share.

1660, 10th month. "a towns shiep is grantied to Willi Howntinton for his son".

1661, he was one of twenty five to whom lots were laid out at the Lions Mouth.

1662, April 1. He drew 120 acres of land: and March 1662-3 thirty acres "west of pond near childrens land".

New Towne, 11th month 18th day 1663. He drew lots between Hamptonshire and Powow river" and in 1667 12th month 18th day he drew lots in four places.

In 1664 Wm. Huntington bought of John Hoyt, sen., a lot of land adjoining his own on the Merrimac River.

William died about the year 1689.

Christopher Huntington, born July 25, 1624. He probably accompannied his mother to Wirdsor Conn., where he must have spent his youth. He here married, October 7, 1652, Ruth, daughter of Wm. Rocycuth. The prominent and highly respected member of the community. Well "a prominent and highly respected member of the community". He removed, probably, in the spring of 1654, to Saybrook, as the birth of one child appeared in 1653 on the Windsor records and the death of another in May 1654 on those in Saybrook. Here he remained until the spring of 1660, when with the company of the Saybrook colony who

had organized themselves into a church under the care of Rev. James Fithch. He removed to the valley of the Yantic, and with his brother Simon, aided in laying the foundations of the new town of Norwich. He had now reached the prime of his manhood; and proved himself one of the most efficient and usefull of the hardy pioneers. His name occurs often in the early records of this enterprising town and always in honorable relations. His house lot was one of the prominent localities of the settlement. In 1668 the general court granted him 100 acres of land not more than twenty acres of it to be meadows. In 1678 appointed town clerk. In 1685 his name occurs as one of the committee to make provision for maintaining the reverend minister.

His death had occured in 1691 as appears from the probate of his will. No stone marks the resting place of this pioneer of the Norwich settlement. He sleeps, doubtless, not far from the banks of the pleasent Yantic, in the meadow where rest, unmarked, the mortal remains of so many of the pioneers of the early settlement of Norwich.

Christopher Huntington, born in Norwich November 1, 1660, being "the first born of males in the town". Born, thus, during the first year of the history of the native town, and destined to grow up in its infancy and spend his manly vigor and mature age in its forming period, he was also designed and used by Providence, as a prominant contributor to the prosperity of its most vital secular interest, and a marked pillar of support to those of religion. His character, molded, mainly by the best of all influences, those of a quiet home, in which every day piety hallows everyday toil, and over which a sense of duty rules as the deepest incentive to its labor and pastime alike, unfolded early with every element of consistency and strength. In a period of exposure and calling often for extreme adventure, he became resolute and fearless. In an age devoted to the revival of a simple and primitive piety, he became a humble and inflexible Christian: and with the best and amplest means at his disposal, trained himself to the most intelligent and effective discharge of every duty, either to God or the world.

He married for his first wife, May 26,1681, Sarah, born January 1663, daughter of Deacon Thomas Adgate, by his second wife Mrs. Wary Bushnell widow of Richard Bushnell of Saybrook. She was the mother of his first eight children, and died in Norwich Febuary 1705-6 aged 42. He married for his second wife, in October 1706 Mrs. Judith (st evens) Brewster, widow of Johnathan Brewster, a great grand son of the venerable Elder Brewster, the spiritual guide and teacher of the Mayflower pilgrims. She became the mother of four children.

In 1684 the town grant him a parcel of land on a small plain near the mouth of Crane brook.

In each of the years 1691, 1705,1709 he is on record as the first townsman. He succeeded Richard Bushnell, as town clerk, which office he transmitted in due time to his son Isaac.

In 1695 or 96 he was appointed deacon and in this office served with marked ability to the close of his life. He appears to be a

practical surveyor: and his decision on a dispute regarding land titles ,was in those early days an end of all strife. He was, accordingly on the commision with his uncle Simon to redeed the lands whose tittles were in dispute.

He had become an extensive land holder, as the early records abundantly show. IN 1705 July 21 he and his brother Thomas deed to John Elderkin "all that our one hundred acres of upland and meadows, which we hold in partnership, as it was given to us by our honored father, Christopher Huntington, as by his last will and testement". Connecticut colonial records show that Christopher was deputy to the general court, May and August 1710 and that he was appointed Justice of the Peace, in May 1714 and October 1715.

He died in norwich, April 24,1735 and his remains were interred, as his headstone shows, on the brow of the hill in the southeast corner of the uptown burying lot in Norwich.

Ruth (Huntington) Wheelock, born in Norwich, November 28, 1682; where she married January, 1707-8 Ralph Wheelock, of Winham Conn. a son of Capt. Eleazer Wheelock, of Mendon, Mass. who was born in 1683

She deserves a special notice in this memoir, both for her own great personal worth, and for the excellence and eminence of her descendents. Every tradition respecting her makes her a woman of unusual intelligence and of rare piety. Her home, the main theater of her

life, was blessed equally by her timely instructions, her holy example and the administration of a gentel yet firm discipline. She died in Windam September 1, 1725. Her husband married for his second wife Mercy Standish by whom he had one child Mary, born November 28, 1728 Ralph Wheelock, the husband of Ruth, was chosen deacon of

Windham Church in 1729. He died in Windham, October 15, 1748.

Thither he repaired and here he had the satisfaction of laying the foundations of what has become Dartmouth College, of which he became the first president. He married for his first wife, Mrs. Sarah Maltby a daughter of Rev. John Davenport, of Stamford Conn. and for his second wife, Miss. Mary Brismade, of Milford, Conn. . Ruth, a daughter of his first wife, was the wife of Rev. Dr. Wm. Patten of Hartford Conn. and mother of Rev. DR. Wm. Patten. She was a woman of marked accomplishments. Another daughter, Mary, married Proffesor Woodward of Dartmouth College; Abigail married proffesor Ripley of the same college. John graduated in the first class of Dartmouth, in 1771 and succeeded his father in the presidency of the college, which office he filled for nearly fouty years. His only daughter became the wife of the Rev. DR. Allen of North Hampton and president of Bowdoin College. Two of Eleazers sons, Col. Eleazer and James also graduated from Dartmouth College.

Thomas Huntington, born October 28, 1757. He married for his first wife October 14, 1779, Nabby, daughter of Ebenezer and Sarah (Clark) Backus, and for his second wife Abiah Griswold. He enlisted in the Continental Army in the Revolution on "Nov. 30 or December 1 1775 for the term of thirteen months in the company commanded by Col. Johnathan Brewster and was attached to the regiment commanded by Col. Jedidiah Huntington then at Roximy near Boston. In april following went to New York and remained there til the American Army retreated. His regiment went too and in October following marched into New Jersey and from there to Crown Point in the state of New York and was discharge at the last mentioned place in the month of January 1777 having served the full term of his enlistment and was honorable discharged".

He lived in Middletown, Vermont from 1796-1820 and was the Justice

of the Peace for Rutland County. He was a Deacon of the Baptist Church in Middletown. At one point he owned and operated a clothing mill in this town. His millitary records and pension record has him listed as a stone mason.

He removed to Dresden, New York in about 1821. On October 28, 1822, he and his sons Erastus and Noel bought a parcel of land for \$515 from Margaret Easton. This parcel of land contained 100 acres of lot #52 of Williams Big Patent on Dresden Hill. Thirty acres of this land is now owned by Westil Huntington(1.2.4.2.1.5.4.2.1.5.2.). The First Baptist Church of Dresden was organized in his home in 1823 and he was the first Deacon of the Church. In 1840 he was the only living pensioner in the town. He died June 28, 1842. His wife Abiah Huntington died December 11, 1842. They are buried on Dresden Hill but no stone marks their grave.

Andrew J. Huntington, born October 25, 1868, he married October 28, 1891 , Allie A. Mclean. They lived in Fair Haven Vt.

Daniel Folsom Huntington, born March 29, 1825. He married July 25, 1846, Clarissa daughter of Isaac and Hannah Hurlburt. She was born June 1, 1823. Her brothers, Reuben and James Hurlburt built the two keystone bridges in Dresden, one in Pike Brook and the other in Clemons. These bridges are made of loose laid stone. The stones were laid over a framework of green saplings. When the stones were all laid, Reuben whould then ask for volunteers to go under the bridge and with an axe cut away the sapling framework, since there were no volunteers he did the task himself. When the framework was cut away the stones would settle and said to have sounded like a loud roar of thunder. these are called keystone bridges because there is one stone that if removed the bridge would collapse. They got \$25 dollars for each bridge and this was divided between five people. The bridge in Clemons was built around 1861 and used as a road until 1928. Both of these bridges still stand today.

Daniel and Clarissa lived on a 133 acre farm on Dresden Hill latter owned by their daughter Mary Ann and Scott Duell. He died July 16, 1878. She died April 5, 1910. They are both buried on Dresden Hill.
