Dear Dr. Hinton:

In reply to the request in your letter of April 11, 1933, I submit the following report covering the adult admissions to Iola Sanatorium during the past ten years. It does not seem feasible to extend this study any further into the past years. Our report follows:


1550 men were admitted to Iola Sanatorium in the past ten years. 105 or 6.2% of these men had positive Wassermanns. Nine were nontuberculous, and of the 96 who had tuberculosis 32 were single, 37 married, 13 separated, 11 widowed, and 3 divorced.

1202 women were admitted in the past ten years. 51 or 4% had positive Wassermanns. Two were nontuberculous. Of the 49 who had tuberculosis 10 were single, 23 married, 9 separated, 4 widowed, and 3 divorced.

The combined percentage of positive Wassermanns in the tuberculous group is 5.2.

During this same period we admitted 2655 white and 97 colored adults, percentage colored 3.5.
