Gentlemen - enclosed is a sample of blood from a white male, Age 42 yrs. who was found to have latent in 1951 while hospitalized for gastro-intestinal complaints and nervousness. He was treated at that time with 4 million units of penicillin.

In 1953-1954, he was hospitalized at the Vet. Hospital where his blood and spinal fluid were negative.

During the past 2 months, each of these samples of his blood have been reported as doubtful.

Would you be good enough to run the gamut of tests on this blood, namely quantitative determination Hunter, Kahn, Wasserman, VDRL and (overbears)

Kolmer on this sample.

During his hospital stay
in 1953-1954, he suffered
with peripheral neuritis.

Ulnar, bilateral, which
has improved. No cause for
the neuritis was found.
