We have used these substances in the preparation of antigen for our technique and have found one antigen quite superior to any hich /e have propered from dried beef heart. We are going to compound and standardize cardiclipin antigen for use in our test; and this antigen, as I understand it, will be distributed by the Venereal Disease Research Laboratory without charge to those laboratories which with to perform our tests with cardiclipin antigen in parallel with the mass testing of routine specimens.
