Series 1: Pedigree or Ancestral Charts

- 1.1 Listing of Births and deaths beginning with Ebenezer Barstow (1756-1834) Earliest records range from 1756 through 1885, single page.
- 1.2 Listing of First Cousins, Barstow and Nash, photocopy of handwritten data, "as of 1932".
- 1.3 Pedigree Chart, Barstow, Heman (1790-1868) , son of Ebenezer Barstow (1756-1834) including siblings and children.
- 1.4 Copy of handwritten list: "From family Bible of John L. Barstow copied by C.L. Barstow Dec 1942 before presenting this bible to Theodore Barstow
- 1.5 Document showing Fred B. Nash, children of M.A. Nash, and children. This photocopy was found in the Barstow family folder and kept with it.
- 1.6 Handwritten Pedigree chart starting with Barstow, John who came to New England in 1635. 9 pages, 6 of which are pedigree chart.

- 2.3 "Another entry in Dad's Book, "Barstow family record of births at Shelburne". Starts with Heman Barstow b. 1790, The records were found in Scott's Bible, Vol 1, fly leaf, Heman Barstow. Another reference cited "The National Encyclopedia of American Biography" Vol VIII, p. 328 about John Lester (Barstow?)
- 2.4 Notes about Ebenezer Barstow (1756-1834), Heman Barstow (1790-), listing service information, residence and children. Page 199-200, handwritten 2 pages.
