A man in a bowler hat, long coat, trousers, vest, stands in front of the side door in front of his carriage, drawn by two horses. A woman stands in the front door wearing a long dress and hat. Two children are on the front porch; one wears a sailor hat, two-piece dress and black stockings and the smaller one is wearing a white bonnet and a long dress. Another woman with a plumed hat and high collared two-piece dress stands before them.

Description: This is a colored postcard of the Vermont House at the Shelburne Museum. Asa R. Slocumb built the Vermont House in the 1790s shortly after moving to Shelburne, Vermont. His descendents continued to live there until 1929 when they abandoned the house. The museum acquired the house in 1950. A facade made with stone from a Shelburne Falls gristmill was put over the deteriorated walls. This stone house is furnished as the home of a retired sea captain and features American Queen Anne and Chippendale pieces. A gravel path is pictured in the foreground of the image. Flowers are standing in front of the stone home. A wooden fence runs parallel to the gravel road. A brick chimney sits on top of the stone building. Men and women are walking toward the entryway of the stone building. Leafy deciduous trees dot the landscape pictured.
