James H. Young's wife died tonight

Wednesday, January 13

Put New Axe handle in my axe

Fixed feeding trough for hens and some new nests

Twenty days to date of sexual fasting and it were better forever, than to be so coldly repulsed, even when the <u>doubtful pleasure</u> is seldom sought. If one must needs practice "Onanism" constantly in such intercourse

Perhaps it were better to abstain altogether

Reading The Pathway of Life by Talmage

Slept but little thinking over the miserable life which I have been led since my marriage. Henpecked <u>started</u>, found fault with for what I've done and what I've not done, my wishes set at naught, my own relatives and old friends estranged my every act and motive criticised till I no longer feel free in what should be my own home. No love or smiles or kisses or affection

no compulsion to sleep with me, nor need she treat me like a dog unworthy of kindness or respect, and as to any demonstration of wifely tenderness or loving sweetness, I had long since ceased to expect it having waited eight years of married life in a vain expectation of any such weakness

But let it pass, possibly the time may come when she may realize how intensely selfish, and cold and repellant her conduct has been and how slowly but surely it has frozen the ardent affection which I felt for her.
