


RALPH RICHARDS - 1923



Monday, Jan. 1 Good morning. Wish you all a very Happy New Year. Fine warm day with a powerfull heavy rain storm. Built a couple of sleds for the "Kid's".

Tuesday, Jan. 2 Fair and rotten traveling. About half my route bare ground. Took the shoes off the Cooper horse and sharpened them tonight by lantern light. We see a honest to goodness robin today.

Wednesday, Jan. 3 Overcast and colder and very rotten traveling. Did not get back from my trip until dark.

Thursday, Jan. 4 Snow and blow an awfull storm only covered part of my route. Got back at dark. "Vesta's" Blue boy (cat) went away today.

Friday, Jan. 5 Fair and not cold, just pleasant winter weather. Roads are partly broken but managed to get thro and covered all the route.

Saturday, Jan. 6 Overcast and very cold. We went to the dance at Community Hall tonight, nice little time.

Sunday, Jan. 7 Fair and bitter cold. P.O.M. Wellman Esq. called up on us today. I put a shoe on my sleigh. Killed in a drunken brawl at Camden John D. Knowlton age 45 yrs.

Monday, Jan. 8 Snow hard all day and still comeing down thick tonight. To late, and to blamed tired to do any work. Georgie Wiley devorced from Natt Wiley. See Jan 12

Tuesday, Jan. 9 Fair and cold. 216 miles of cussid traveling. About a foot of heavy snow fell. Got into the offace at 5 o'clock. Died Geo Brown.

Wednesday, Jan. 10 Overcast and cold. Awfull hard traveling. Looks tonight like more snow. "Hindy" my cat vanished out of the stable last night

Thursday, Jan. 11 Fairly decent day. Overcast, but it has not stormed. "Hindy" my cat came prowling back home at midnight. Angie Drinkwater brought Blue Boy home to die. Awfull sick cat.

Friday, Jan. 12 Awfull snow storm. Snow & blow all day. Roads blocked "Barton" did not get back from Camden tonight. Married Georgie Furgison & a Sly Bird Robert Berry.

Saturday, Jan. 13 Awfull snow storm one of the worst in year's and terriable cold. Down around zero all day. Did not make my whole route.

Sunday, Jan. 14 Fair & warmer. Put in the day digging our self out of the snow drifts. Every thing buried out of sight.

Monday, Jan. 15 Snow all day snowing tonight. Got out to Albert Marriners [?] roads blocked, awfull traveling fed my horse and got back to offace at 5-30 in a blinding snow storm. 31 day's

Tuesday, Jan. 16 Overcast snow part of the day. Went up to the Miller distric got [??] of about all my mail.

Wednesday, Jan. 17 Fair pretty fine day but cussid traveling covered all my route. Went to the hall to a rehursal tonight.

Thursday, Jan. 18 Snow all day. Very cold this morning 12° below zero and the traveling dont improve much.

Friday, Jan. 19 Fair clear cool day and dumd bad traveling. Vesta is takeing part tonight in a dress rehursal for thear play.

Saturday, Jan. 20 Snow & rain most all day but a little better traveling. Winnie Young, Frank Collemer, Harry Frohock Alter [Alta] Warren and "Vesta" gave her farce play "Two of a Kind" tonight.

Sunday, Jan. 21 Warmer. Rain all day. Did not get up untill afterwards. Then shoding sleighs. Droped dead Joe Wiley age 68 yrs.

Monday, Jan. 22 Warm, snowing a soft, damp, melty, wet snow. Roads are terriable a horse buried all out of sight in the drifts.

Tuesday, Jan. 23 A little colder, roads froze a bit, but damd hard traveling. Butifull clear cloudless day storm comeing sure.

Wednesday, Jan. 24 Snow all day. Very cold last night 14° below this morning. Little better traveling. Raining & snowing hard tonight.

Thursday, Jan. 25 Snow and blow all day & tonight regular blizzard. Helluva storm.

Friday, Jan. 26 Fair and cold. Another damd storm sleighted for tomorrow. Damd hard traveling. Lawry Rankin hawled us 2140 lbs hay today

Saturday, Jan. 27 Fair and very cold. Dumed cold tonight. We went to the dance at C Hall. Did not get to bed untill 2 oclock this morning.

Sunday, Jan. 28 Fair and continued cold. Slept for half a day tho Pitt came up and finished it.

Monday, Jan. 29 Fair and cold. My patrons in the "Pottle" neighborhood, decided to open the road, so I got thro that way today.

Tuesday, Jan. 30 Fair and bitter cold. Regular howling moist gail blowing. Little better traveling.

Wednesday, Jan. 31 Fair and warmer. The first real good day we have had this month. Cuss roads drifted badly.

1926	Fair and cold. Broke roads with my snowshoes over part of my route.	1926	Fair and warmer. Sleighed over wood road and did work on snowshoes. An old acquaintance of Pitts called today Eddie McElroy.
1927	¹⁹²⁶ CXCV. SNOW This morning warm and so ge. Chaud greway and the sun shone out of the day. Guess gone to See Pitt GNT to visit Frank Brown.	1927	¹⁹²⁶ CXCVI. OVERCAST from this afternoon and tonight. We went over to Warren this evening. Visited our old W. C. W. Club where we had our Christmas luncheon. Stockings & Nightdress.

Thursday, Feb. 1 Butifull day, like spring this morning and pretty fair traveling. Did some work about the buildings & hen house. Married Stanley Gray & Mabel Roberts a widow woman with 7 children.

Friday, Feb. 2 Another butifull day. Not very cold and a cloudless sky. Pitt missed us both last night & tonight.

Saturday, Feb. 3 Snow all day, a heavy damp snow. Colder tonight. We went to the hop at Community Hall. Nice time. Good big crowd. Died in Northport Geo Herrick.

Sunday, Feb. 4 Cold and cloudy bum bitch of a day. Am feeling pooched after the spree last night. Helluva time. Took my snowshoes and went up on the mountain to see our new wood lot.

Monday, Feb. 5 Fair and cold. Darned cold just about froze today. Pitt came up and took supper with us. \$75 Due Sarah Knight {Paid Jan 31}

Tuesday, Feb. 6 Fair and very cold. Pretty good sleighing. Pitt came up and took supper we played checkers untill twelve oclock tonight.

Wednesday, Feb. 7 Clear and cold. Darned cold too. Bay froze over a right smart distance this morning. Died Uncle James Tracy age 86 yr's.

Thursday, Feb. 8 Cold and cloudy. Warmer tonight. Pitt came up and we spent the evening playing checkers. Paid Security Trust Co \$78 on my \$225 note. Died Mrs Riley Mathews (Caddie)

Friday, Feb. 9 Overcast and warmer. Strong west wind. "Hindy" our kitten is commencing to be sick.

Saturday, Feb. 10 Snow most all day and cold. Roads are in fine shape now, good sleighing. About 4 feet of snow on the ground in the woods. Some winter?

Sunday, Feb. 11 Overcast with snow squalls. Bum day. Vesta & I went to Mrs Mathews funeral this afternoon. The Rev H.J. Holt of Camden officiated. Born to Mrs & Mr W.J. Munroe a son 8 lbs.

Monday, Feb. 12 Fair and cold. Dandy good sleighing. Did some nessary repairs on our hen house this afternoon. Born to Mrs & Mr Merril Brown a son.

Tuesday, Feb. 13 Snowing hard this morning and its snowed all day, and snowing hard tonight.

Wednesday, Feb. 14 Snow hard all day, and still snowing tonight. About a foot of new snow this time. \$125 Due Security Trust Co. Died infant son of Merrill & Louise Brown.

Thursday, Feb. 15 Howling gale. All roads blocked. Went on snow shoes out as far as "Carvers". Came back home over the mountain.

Friday, Feb. 16 Bitter cold day. Covered all my route. Had my horse down twice all buried up in the snow. "Pendleton" did not start for Belfast at all & Barton only got a mile towards Camden.

Saturday, Feb. 17 Fair and cold 18° below zero this morning. Bay remained frozen all day. No open water in sight tonight.

Sunday, Feb. 18 Still very cold clear bright day. Split fire wood and have been very busy burning it all day.

Monday, Feb. 19 Fair and cold. Traveling very hard. Part of my road still unbroken. Hell. Big fire in Belfast tonight, burned the "Colonial Theatre" "Greens" 5 & 10¢ store Mitchell & Trussells and others.

Tuesday, Feb. 20 Fair with slowly riseing temperature overcast and warmer tonight. Vesta down to Winnie Young to a rehursal.

Wednesday, Feb. 21 Fair fine cold day. Reserve [?] cutter smashed her way up the bay today. From 7 to 15 inches of ice.

Thursday, Feb. 22 Fair clear & cold. Today the Chew & Jaw society met with Vesta. Some holiday "Ill tell the world I had"

Friday, Feb. 23 Fair fine day clear & cool and very nice sleighing. Vesta has gone down to Winnies tonight to another damd rehursal.

Saturday, Feb. 24 Fair today. Cold overcast and snow tonight. Vesta gave another of her little "amusements". As old Clamb Johnson used to say. Cleared a little over \$15.

Sunday, Feb. 25 Fair, slightly overcast and warmer. Havent felt much like work today after last nights jamboree.

Monday, Feb. 26 Overcast and warmer. Snowing this afternoon and tonight. The "Kobs" have been hawling my hay today from Harry Frohock's. Gave him \$18 for a ton & a half.

Tuesday, Feb. 27 Overcast and much warmer. "Kobs" finished hawling my hay. Pitt went out to the Ctr rabbit hunting. They are now Gray??? Died in Rockport Bertha Gray.

Wednesday, Feb. 28 Fairly decent day. Warm and snow a little. Finished to wood work on Tommy's sled.

Worked in blacksmith shop this afternoon.</p> <p>Thurs 1926 Cold raw overcast. But I managed to split 3 cords of wood this afternoon. 185. B.O. note</p> <p>Fri 1927 Overcast and rain. Heavy thunder showers this afternoon. Roads awful muddy and the frost all coming out of the ground. See 2 Chubmunk today.</p>	<p>1923 Rain hard most all day, but the traveling was at three hours. Froze some last night.</p> <p>See 5 robins today. V.R. 94 m</p> <p>1924 Fair and some warmer the snow settled quite a bit today. Drove the black Coopers horse. Food same.</p> <p>Sat 1925 Rainy, but traveling. Frank Col. See came today and I traded cere with him.</p> <p>Fri 1926 Fair and a dandy day. Split and piled wood all afternoon.</p> <p>Sat 1927 Fair and warm. Also soft mud big. Very hard traveling C.C.VIII. Made and early return. got back soon. Ralph Brown came tonight to the Warrens 100.</p>

Thursday, Mar. 1 Overcast and much warmer. Finished the wood work on Dee's sled. \$127 Due the bank on B.O. Norton note.

Friday, Mar. 2 Warmer and overcast. Snow a little warm tonight. Eclips of the moon see it in fine shape tonight.

Saturday, Mar. 3 Fair and warm. Roads are pretty fine now. Got a hell of a bad cold in my head. We went to the dance tonight.

Sunday, Mar. 4 Warm overcast. Soft damp snow and some rain falling tonight. Louie & Pitt came up this afternoon.

Monday, Mar. 5 Fair fine day. Came off cold and froze. Dandy traveling. Finished Mannys [?] sled this afternoon.

Tuesday, Mar. 6 Fair clear and cold and very fine sleighing. Did a little work on Dee's sled this afternoon. Paid the last note on the car to B.O. Norton \$130 81/100.

Wednesday, Mar. 7 Awfull storm. The very worst of the winter. Went up as far as Cliff Pendletons then came back.

Thursday, Mar. 8 Fair, but ye gods how the wind blows, and the snow fly's. We did not start out at all. No stage got thro yesterday. Frank Pendleton stayed in Belfast.

Friday, Mar. 9 Clear & cold. Got out into E. Searsmtont "End of road" So had to come back to Lincolnville Ctr. and over to Fathers place that way.

Saturday, Mar. 10 Snow hard, regular blizzard. Got out into E Searsmtont. But had to come back, roads unbroken.

Sunday, Mar. 11 Fair, and not so cold. Worked like hell all day getting wood in and doing chores. Died Georgie Woodbridge age 56 yrs. Died Eleanor B Moody age 83 yrs.

Monday, Mar. 12 Snow all day. Town meeting. "Eugley" 1st, Nichols 2nd Russ 3rd selectmen. Fred Hardy collector. Horace Miller treasurer. Went out thro Belmont took dinner at Lige Morse. Then came back.

Tuesday, Mar. 13 Thick fog, warm. Commence snowing this afternoon. Snowing hard tonight. Pitt came up and spent the evening.

Wednesday, Mar. 14 Fair and colder and terriable traveling roads are surely snow bound [?] more than 4 ft in the wood and ten foot drifts in the road's. Married Barbara Heal & William Caine.

Thursday, Mar. 15 Butifull day, cloudless not a cloud in sight all day. It will storm inside of 24 hours. I bet. Cussid hard traveling.

Friday, Mar. 16 Snow this morning turn to rain awfull storm. Only got out as far as Orris Young's. First rain storm since New Year day.

Saturday, Mar. 17 Fair fine day but ye god's such traveling. Roads all but inpassible. Horse slump all out of sight. Pitt Keller operatid on at "Siblys Hospital" Rockland yesterday for nose trouble.

Sunday, Mar. 18 Another fine warm day. And I have been at work like a black bitch all day. Snow nearly went some. That's good. Died Georgie Woodbridge. "Died Annie Phil Mahoney"

Monday, Mar. 19 Rain hard most all day but the traveling was a little better. Froze some last night. See 5 robins today.

Tuesday, Mar. 20 Fair and bitter cold. Down to zero this morning. Pretty good sleighing but awfull rough.

Wednesday, Mar. 21 Fair and warmer. Got quite slumpy this afternoon. My Mothers birthday 72 years old today.

Thursday, Mar. 22 Fair and warmer. Thick fog tonight. Traveling pretty good today. Been pruning apple trees this afternoon. Paid Sarah Knight \$10.40

Friday, Mar. 23 Fair and very warm. Snow went like the dickens today. Roads are awfull slumpy. See 24 wild gees

Saturday, Mar. 24 Overcast and warm snow all the forenoon. We went to the dance tonight, big crowd. Cleared \$7.50 See a blue bird.

Sunday, Mar. 25 "Bob Hardy" hawled me a half cord fitted wood. Fair fine day. Took my snowshoes & went up on the "Gushee" lot. 3 ft of snow any place in the woods. Built a couple of horses for my work shop.

Monday, Mar. 26 Fair fine day, clear & cold. Covered all my route. Have been at work in shop this afternoon.

Tuesday, Mar. 27 Cold, overcast, very raw cold wind. Got a hell of a cold. Feel like a stewed prune.

Wednesday, Mar. 28 Overcast, and awfull cold. Tonight snowing & blowing a howling northeast snow storm.


RALPH RICHARDS - 1923

Thursday, Mar. 29 Bitter cold 20° below zero this morning. Went out to the barn, our cow had a new baby. Went 27 days over her time. This is the calf Ant it pretty.

Friday, Mar. 30 Snow last night, overcast today. Warmer tonight looks like rain. About broke my fool neck today. Sleigh body tipped up with me in it.

Saturday, Mar. 31 Born to Mr & Mrs Clayton Parker a son. Fair and bitter cold. North west gale blowing. Went clamming tonight & got a pail full of fine big fellow's. Married Vivian Manning & Percy Richards.

Sunday, Apr. 1 Born to Lena & Asbry Wade a son. Fair and cold as the devil. We had a little "Screech Owl" come to visit us stayed all the afternoon on our roolway door.

Monday, Apr. 2 Overcast and warmer and a pretty big amount of snow on the ground. Strong southerly gail blowing.

Tuesday, Apr. 3 Overcast and warmer. Roads got a little bit slumpy before I got back. "Vesta" is at a director's meeting C.H. Corp. Guss & Alta Warren came home from Belfast.

Wednesday, Apr. 4 Fair and very warm. The snow has melted fast today. Roads very slumpy. See 3 flocks blackbirds. Died Phoebe [Phebe] Heal age 90 yrs.

Thursday, Apr. 5 Fog and rain miserable bitch of a day. The schooner Charles & Willie of Rockland sailed today. She has been frozen in here all winter.

Friday, Apr. 6 Overcast. Rain hard last night. Clear and cool tonight. See 3 black duck out at Slab City today.

Saturday, Apr. 7 Fair and warm. Roads getting bair but awfull deep drifts that are slumpy. We went to the dance tonight. Good big crowd.

Sunday, Apr. 8 Overcast. Rain hard this afternoon. Have been trying to clean up our yard but it's a helluva job.

Monday, Apr. 9 Fair and cold as the devil today. Roads are pretty bair. Walked about 17 miles. 115 Days of sleighing. Frank Dickey's wife Georgie was carried to the Hospital Belfast.

Tuesday, Apr. 10 "Charles Thompson" killed him self by shooting. Clear and damned cold. Awfull cold. Went in wagon. The first time since last December. Hell of a hard winter 1 trip in wagon. See a woodchuck today

Wednesday, Apr. 11 Overcast fog and showers dumbed miserable bitch of a day bum I call it.

Thursday, Apr. 12 Fair and cold. Awfull cold weather got around pretty well today before it thawed up. Fred Frohock hawled me a load of grain from Camden.

Friday, Apr. 13 Fair and bitter cold. Frost comeing out some, but still miles of road covered with ice and snow. The road up by "Pottles" still blocked with snow & impassable.

Saturday, Apr. 14 Fair and cold as the devil. Roads froze very hard last night. We went to the dance tonight. A very large crowd. Nice time.

Sunday, Apr. 15 Born to Russel Carver & wife Jennie a daughter. Overcast and very cold. Looks like more snow comeing. Cow sick. Get a veterinary from Belfast one "Flagg" by name. Called it acute indigestion "Hell"

Monday, Apr. 16 About 4 inches new snow on the ground this morning. "Pitcher" went in a sleigh. Fred Frohock hawled me a load of fire wood. Half cord. Georgie Dickey operatid on W.C. Hospital Belfast.

Tuesday, Apr. 17 Fair and warmer. Damnable hard traveling. Went up by "Pottles" today, they just got the road shoveled thro. First time in six weeks.

Wednesday, Apr. 18 Overcast and colder than hell. Roads very muddy. Snowed a few times today a little fluffy.

Thursday, Apr. 19 Clear and cool, butifull day. Mud drying up a little but lots of snow ice in the roads. Our cow not so well "going to die?". Another hundred dollars gorn to hell. My luck?

Friday, Apr. 20 Fair clear day. Cow worse going on a long journey soon. Called French the vetanary from Rockland. Hell. \$6.

Saturday, Apr. 21 Fair and very warm, allso very muddy. Hardest traveling we have had yet. Got a hell of a cold. Feel like a pickle.

Sunday, Apr. 22 Warm overcast & shower's. Have a helluva cold. Geo Rube Mathews tried to rape little 5 year old Lavon Frohock today. The damd beast ought to be cut. Then lynched.

Monday, Apr. 23 Overcast raw & cold. Got a hell of a bad cold feel nine tenth pooched. Sheriff Littlefield came down from Belfast and took Geo Mathews to jail. For trying to rape the little Frohock girl.

Tuesday, Apr. 24 Snow and rain all day terriable storm. Am all in tonight. Pitt came up tonight. He goes to Portland tomorrow for the season.

Wednesday, Apr. 25 Clear away cold. Strong west wind. Mud drying up some. Ice went out of the Andrew, Tilden & Levenseller Ponds.

Thursday, Apr. 26 Fair fine day. Mud drying up very fast. Have been building a hen yard this afternoon.

Friday, Apr. 27 Fair fine day. Roads drying out fast. Have been working on our lawn this afternoon.


Saturday, Apr. 28 Overcast and then rain tonight it has just poured in torrents. V's got a helluva cold. So have I.

Monday, Apr. 30 Overcast this morning. Rained powerfull hard. Cleared away fair fine this afternoon and tonight. Set out 8 Gravenstein apple trees. Set 4 hen's, 2 on Barred Rocks 2 on RI Reds.

Tuesday, May 1 Rain and fog part of the day. Some bad mud places. And some cussid wash outs.

Wednesday, May 2 Another pooty good day. Did some work on our lawn, got the last cedar stump out.

Thursday, May 3 Fair fine cool day. Did a little grafting. Frank Cooper called tonight to look at the horses. "Found" the body of Dave Brown chief game warden of Maine. At Big Bog Dame near Canada boundary Disappered the 14 of last November

Friday, May 4 Fair tonight. Rain like hell this forenoon. Have been working on our lawn untill after dark tonight.

Saturday, May 5 Fair fine day. Roads are damd rough, and some muddy. Went to the dance tonight. Pretty good time.

Sunday, May 6 Fair fine day. After I got up took my little hoe and put in the day working on my lawn. Died Leather Ann Crooker age 66 yrs.

Monday, May 7 Fair fine day. Have worked on "Henry Ford" about all the afternoon trying to get it in condition to run.

Tuesday, May 8 Fair fine day. Went in my car first trip this year. Roads dry enough but awfull rough. \$82 Due City Nat Bank on the B.O. Norton note. Paid May 8-1923

Wednesday, May 9 Fair nice day drove a horse got hell shook out of my hide yesterday

Thursday, May 10 Another nice day. Went with a horse. Did some work on lawn. Feel about pooched.

Friday, May 11 Clear and cold. Went in car today. This afternoon went trout fishing got 7. First time this year

Saturday, May 12 Rain overcast, miserable weather went in car. Vesta gave her Farce Comidy Two of a Kind at Community Hall to a large audiens tonight.

Sunday, May 13 Fair and colder. Did some work on our front lawn and tried to get a little rest, after last night dissipation. Born to Alice & Don Patten a 10 lb son Alice is 20 & has 5 kid's

Monday, May 14 Fair fine day. Went in car. Set out 3 Elm & a rock mapel tree this afternoon. Died in Cranston RI Capt Rosco Pendleton age 78 yrs

Tuesday, May 15 Raw cold & overcast bum weather. V & I dug our first mess danderlion green's. Mother went on tonight's boat to Boston gorn to viset Will & fambly.

Wednesday, May 16 Born to Eddie Prince and wife a little princess "Rose". Overcast and fog. Showers tonight. Shod the little horse this afternoon. A crew of men arrived today to start cutting the wood on the French Mt.

Thursday, May 17 Fog this morning clear away warm. Went out to Belmont trout fishing this afternoon. Only got one trout. Stream full of Alewives.

Friday, May 18 Fair and warm. Went in car and got back early. Commenced to paint our house this afternoon.

Saturday, May 19 Another fine day. Went with horse. Got home and painted until most dark. The little Cooper horse kicked out thro the side of the barn and smashed her ankle up bad.

Sunday, May 20 Fair fine day. Have improved it painting. Rae Rankin & Lena came into today in thear car. Had Emma Gelette, Lettie McKinney & Steve Gelette. Painted the front {south} side of our Ell.

Wed October 31-1923 When we got above the stream Katahdin at Rockwood we found a party of hunters bring down one of thear company shot last Saturday thro the right lung and right wrist. Bullet entered his back close up under the sholder blade and came out thro his chest on right side passing thro his right wrist. He was mistaken for a deer by his Father in law. Poor devil not much chance for him. Died at Portland Hospital November 14-1924

Sunday, Nov. 4 Butifull warm summer like day. Vesta & I went up to our wood lot on the mountain this afternoon.

Monday, Nov. 5 Fair butifull day. We took Alta to Belfast with us this afternoon. Harold Dean & Frank Dickey went to New York City to work in a hash house?

Saturday, Nov. 10 Fair clear & cold. Guss Kobs with his crew of Bohunks sawed a little more of our fire wood. Have been splitting and wheeling it under cover.

Sunday, Nov. 11 Fair fine day. Have split wood, wheeled wood, and piled wood up in our wood house all day. Married Verna Mahoney & Hugh Pendleton.

Monday, Nov. 12 Another nice warm day. The Kobs finished sawing our wood. Set a few traps this afternoon. Burned The Marchell Cilley buildings.

Tuesday, Nov. 13 Slightly overcast warm. Put a new end into our barn this afternoon. New timber and new boards. Married Dana Fletcher & Elizabeth Timberlake.

Wednesday, Nov. 14 Fair and colder. Put part of a side into our barn this afternoon.

Thursday, Nov. 15 Warm & cloudy. Shingled on barn and split wood untill 8 oclock tonight.

Friday, Nov. 16 Warm & overcast. Shingled untill dark, then split fire wood. Guss Warren carried the state truck back today. Went to Camden got V's mother. She is at Mrs Perrys again at \$7 per.

Saturday, Nov. 24 Rain most all day and raining tonight. Roads very muddy. Went to the dance tonight, cleared a little over \$12.

Sunday, Nov. 25 Raw cold fog & shower's. Surely tis bum weather.

Monday, Nov. 26 Fair nice warm day. Went to Belfast this afternoon trying to borrow some coin of the [??]. Born to Stanly Hills & wife a daughter.

Tuesday, Nov. 27 Fair fine day, warm. Paul (M Cooper) Abbies 16 month old baby boy awfully burned with hot fat. Horace Miller carried Abbie & the baby to hospital Belfast.

Wednesday, Nov. 28 A pretty fine day. Roads are very muddy. Shingled on our barn this afternoon. Married Walter Frohock & Laura Leadbetter? Married Arline Morse and Clyde Marriner.

Friday, Dec. 14 Fair and colder. Bitter cold tonight every thing freezing up tight. Went to rehursal at the Hall tonight.

Saturday, Dec. 15 Fair very cold this morning. Roads damdable rough. The Willett boys & some of shear men came to the dance tonight from Clarks Island. Oscar Johnson stoped with us. 4 eggs. Paid tax \$52.86 Ant that hell? Born to Callie Lermond Morse a daughter. Married June 12-1923 6 months and 3 days. Such is the inderscretans of youth.

Sunday, Dec. 16 Cold but not to bad, overcast. Snowing tonight. We carried "Johnson" to Camden. Took Guss & Alta with us.

Wednesday, Dec. 26 Fair and mild. Roads are all thawed up again heavy traveling and a big lot of mail

Thursday, Dec. 27 Fair and colder. And ye gods but its awfull rough. Went to Belfast this afternoon.

Sunday, Dec. 30 Fair clear & cold. About a foot of snow on the ground. Roads are drifted quite badly.

Monday, Dec. 31 Overcast early. Snow most all day a fine dry storm and very cold. Drove the Cooper horse. He is soft but a good little roader. Sold \$5.20 milk in December.
