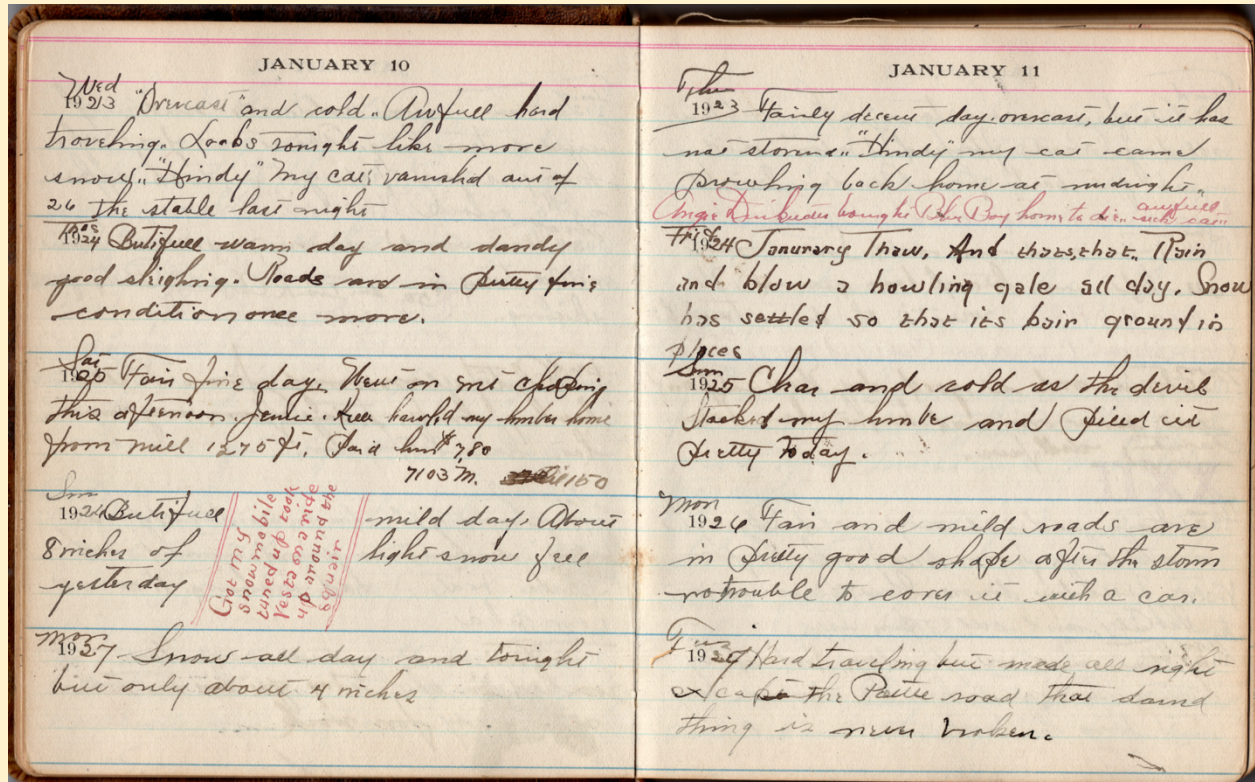


RALPH RICHARDS - 1924

Wednesday, Jan. 2 Butifull day fair clear and cold. 6° below zero this morning. A cloudless day, meaning a storm tomorrow. Herb Thomas bought a new 4 tube Radio set.

Thursday, Jan. 3 Snow this morning turn to rain & rained all day. Colder tonight.

Friday, Jan. 4 Fair and growing cold. Roads are in fair shape froze hard.

Saturday, Jan. 5 Cold and overcast, looks like another storm coming.

Sunday, Jan. 6 Cold. Flying snow and a curse of a mean old day. Just stoked the stove all day.

Monday, Jan. 7 Another cold day. Hard traveling roads drifted some. Had to go thro the field in one place.

Tuesday, Jan. 8 Fair, very cold this morning. Traveling a little better. Amborn called as witness on the Geo French auto accident. Leroy Rankin hauled me load of hay 1880 lbs \$14.10 Paid

Wednesday, Jan. 9 Fair and warm, very warm. Snow melted today. Pretty good sleighing. (\$50 due Frank Cooper Paid Dec. 28)

Thursday, Jan. 10 Butifull warm day and dandy good sleighing. Roads are in pretty fine condition once more.

Friday, Jan. 11 January Thaw. And that's that. Rain and blow a howling gale all day. Snow has settled so that its bair ground in places.

Saturday, Jan. 12 Fair and not cold. Snow most all left us. Lots of bair ground. We went to the dance tonight. \$150 Due H.A. Dean. "Oscar Johnson" came up from Clark Island. Went to the dance with us.

Sunday, Jan. 13 Fair and warm, very mild. Sharpened the shoes and shod a horse today. "Johnson" left for Clark Island after dinner.

Monday, Jan. 14 Warm. Snow all day, a soft damp snow. V's birthday 39. Gave her a Rinstone Barrett for her hair. Guss & Alta came in with a heap of cake & candy.

Tuesday, Jan. 15 Butifull day clear and cold. Down to zero this morning. "Johnson" got fired at Clark Island. Came up stopped at Guss tonight. They were all over spent the evening.

Wednesday, Jan. 16 Overcast cold this morning but raining hard tonight. Regular flood. "Johnson" the [??] stranger. Went this morning to Bangor? 19 days of sleighing.

Thursday, Jan. 17 Butifull day. Fair and warm. All the snow gone and the grass on the lawns is bright green. Went in wagon today.

Friday, Jan. 18 Fair and colder. Went in my car. Only got out of the road twice. We gave a Corned Beef & Cabbage party tonight. Guss & Alta took supper with us.

Saturday, Jan. 19 Raw cold & overcast. Went in car today. We took supper with the Warren's and all went to the dance together.

Sunday, Jan. 20 Rain hard last night. Overcast and warm today. Just like spring. We kept open house again today. Had eleven callers.

Monday, Jan. 21 Bitter cold. The coldest day yet. Blowing a gale N.W. Every indication of a howling snow storm. Went in car again today.

Tuesday, Jan. 22 Clear & bitter cold. 20° below zero this morning. Roads bair ground & nickle plate of ice. Overcast tonight, looks like snow. Went in car today. 4th trip.

Wednesday, Jan. 23 Fair and mild, fine day and nice traveling. Went in car. Masonic installation at The Trap tonight. We were invited but did not go??

Thursday, Jan. 24 Fair fine day. Not cold. Worked all the afternoon repairing a rear mud gard on "Henry"

Friday, Jan. 25 Snow and then snow harder. Tis a regular old switcher. Went in sleigh. This makes the 20 day of sleighing.

Saturday, Jan. 26 Clear and cold. Roads were only partly broken. Very crusty. Hard traveling. We went to the dance tonight. Way below zero. Couldn't keep warm.

Sunday, Jan. 27 Awful cold day 20° below this morning, and it's been 8° below all day. But I still got 14 eggs, cold as it is. Sun set in the "Notch" tonight.

Monday, Jan. 28 Clear and bitter cold. 28° below this morning in E. Searsmont and a bitter night tonight.

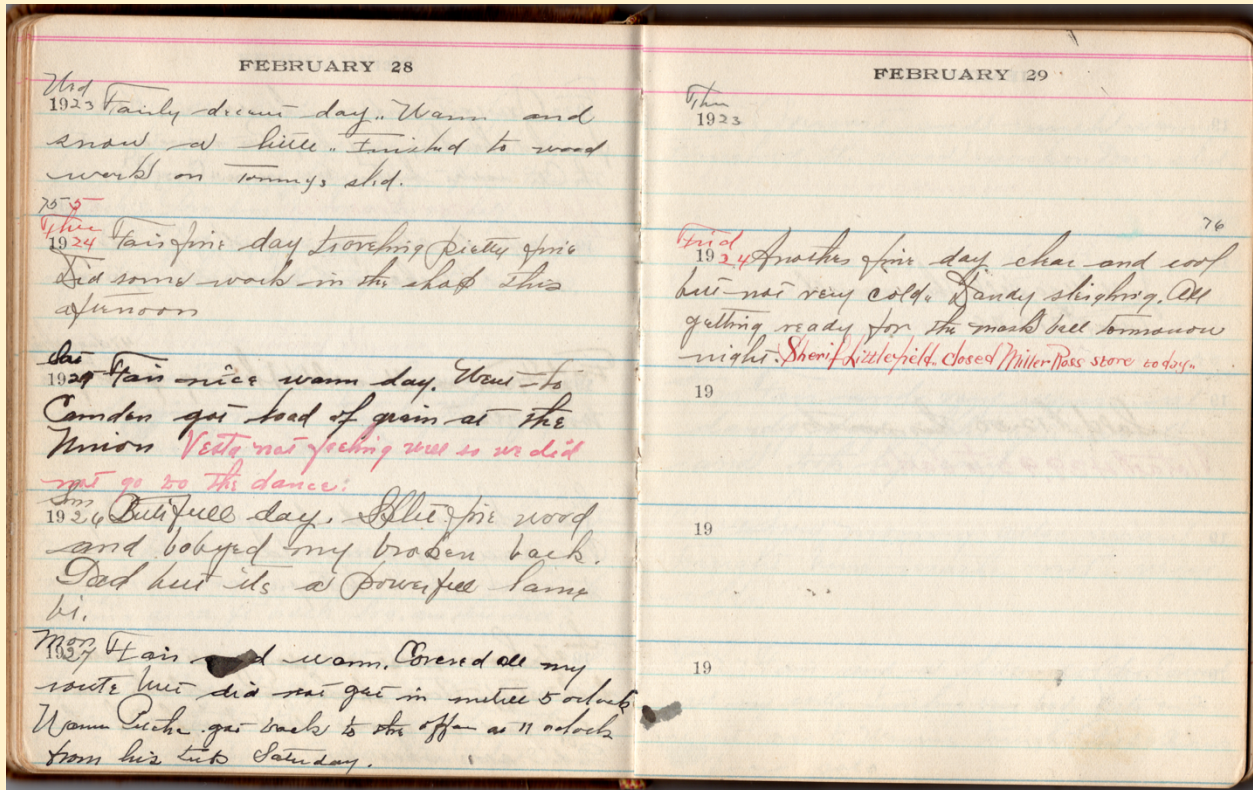
Tuesday, Jan. 29 Fair and much warmer. It's a butifull day 40° above zero. "Davis" Elizabeth and the baby called this afternoon. Died Clarence Collemer, age 17 yrs.

Friday, Feb. 1 Fair fine day. Roads are in pretty nice condition. Mostly bair ground. Clarence Collemer buried today. Poor lad only 17. Drove car on route today.

Saturday, Feb. 2 Fine day, partly cloudy, mild. Sun shone part of day. Pretty fine wheeling. Went in car again today.

Sunday, Feb. 3 Colder and partly overcast. Did some work in the blackship shop. John Willett came up for a little while today. Died Ex President Woodrow Wilson???

Monday, Feb. 4 Fair fine day. Dandy traveling and tis fine weather we have had. Went in my car again today.

Tuesday, Feb. 5 Dull gray overcast day. Roads in fine condition. Oscar Johnson came down from Bangor. Stopped for dinner? Went in car today.

Wednesday, Feb. 6 Cold and stormy. Snow that was all most rain froze as it fell all day. Went in sleigh.

Thursday, Feb. 7 Snow squalls overcast & cold. Traveling not bad. Car's running all time on the main road Belfast to Camden. Lawry Rankin hawled me load hay 2480 - \$18.80 Paid

Friday, Feb. 8 Squally some snow fell last night about a half inch. Will Young & Aubry Clark went out to the camp at Andrews Pond fox hunting. Fred Frohock brought me load grain from "Stovers", Camden \$20.05

Saturday, Feb. 9 Fair clear & cold but dandy good sleighing. We got 26 eggs today from our hens. 29 days sleighing

Sunday, Feb. 10 Butifull morning mild and fair. We took our car and drove down to Clark Island. Bought Guss & Alta back with us. Roy Young we took down. Snowing tonight.

Monday, Feb. 11 Snow squalls and cold today. Roads are drifting first time this winter. Guss & Alta in tonight.

Tuesday, Feb. 12 Fair and cold as the devil. Fine sleighing. Got 22 eggs today. Born to Mr & Mrs Merrill Brown another son.

Wednesday, Feb. 13 Fairly good day, overcast and blamed cold this morning. Clear tonight.

Thursday, Feb. 14 Another fine day. Dandy good sleighing. \$75 due S.I. Co Camden. Alta over tonight. She & Vesta making paper caps for the supper tomorrow night.

Friday, Feb. 15 Fair clear & cold. All the roads are fine. As smooth & Hard as glass. Only about 6 inches snow on the ground.

Saturday, Feb. 16 Fair fine day but cold as the dickens. Wind blowing a gale. Vesta gave her Big Night Cap Social. It was a howling success. Cleared \$11.64

Sunday, Feb. 17 Still fair and still cold. But looks like a snow storm coming. Lets hope it won't come. Died Geo W. Lermond Sr. age 81 yrs

Monday, Feb. 18 Fair and cold. And elegant sleighing. Some different from last winter. "I'll say it is" Geo Mahoney back from California. Visiting at Emery French. 38 days sleighing.

Tuesday, Feb. 19 Another fine day. Clear & cold but just wonderful winter weather. Smoking a ham for Guss Warren.

Wednesday, Feb. 20 Snow. Regular blizzard. Worst storm of the winter. Sold \$7.40 [??] to date. Dr. Hart came and carried Elsie Collemer to the Hospital in Rockland. 40 days of sleighing to date. We have sold to date \$308.40

Thursday, Feb. 21 Snow all day and ye gods what traveling. About three in snow fell and blowed into drifts. The froze with a curse. Covered my route. Warren did not get to Hope. Center stage did not go.

Friday, Feb. 22 Clear and cold. Don't have to drive. Cold as the devil. Just kept the fries [?] on the bring [?] side all day.

Saturday, Feb. 23 Fair fine day, but cold as the dickens. Big dance at the hall tonight but only a few there.

Sunday, Feb. 24 Another cold day. Some warmer this afternoon. Did some work in the shop fixing our to be radio? Died in Lewiston Hiram Heal age 97 yrs 9 months

Monday, Feb. 25 Fair fine day. Traveling some better. Carried Vesta to Lill Woosters this afternoon. Born to Elsie & Aubry Collemer in the Knox Hospital a daughter.

Tuesday, Feb. 26 Butifull day fair and warm. And pretty good sleighing. Sold 10 doz eggs to Roy \$3.60. Married Doris Heal & Percival Sawyer.

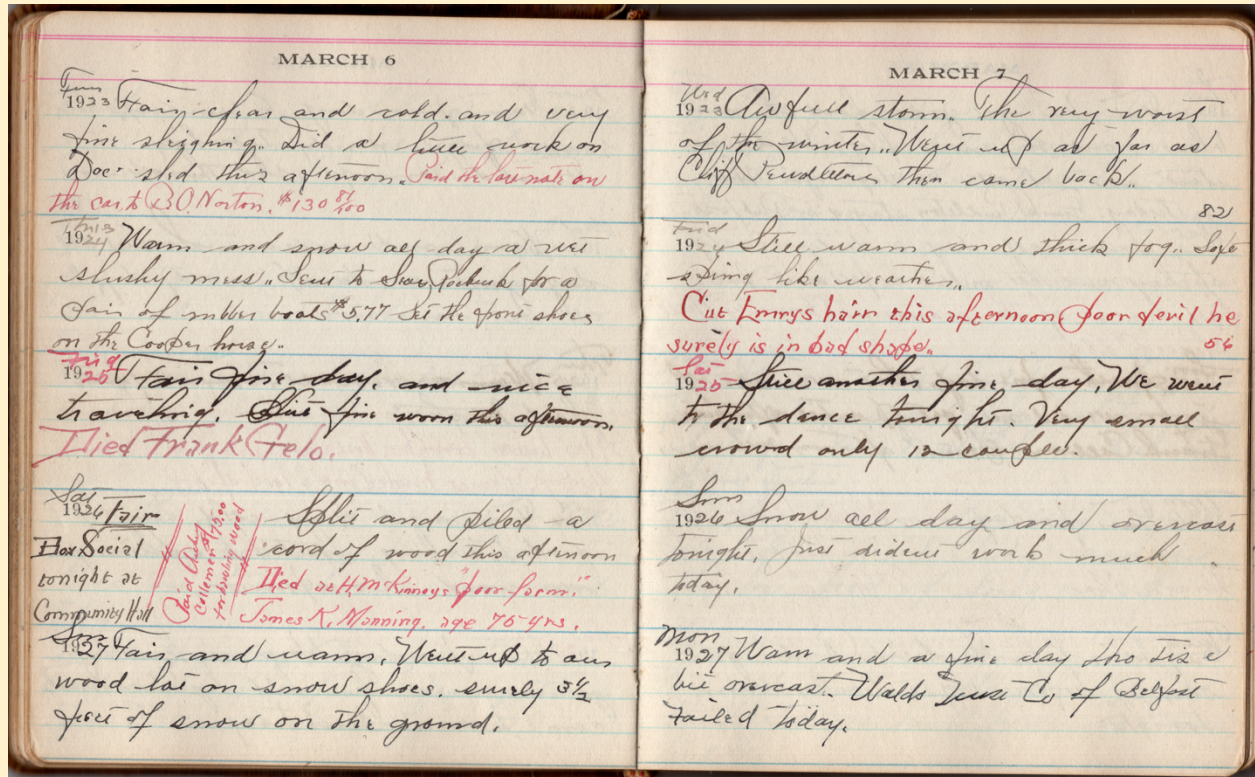
Wednesday, Feb. 27 And still fair and fine. Did some blacksmith work this afternoon. 47 days sleighing

Thursday, Feb. 28 Fair fine day traveling pretty fine. Did some work in the shop this afternoon.

Friday, Feb. 29 Another fine day. Clear and cool but not very cold. Dandy sleighing. All getting ready for the mask ball tomorrow night. Sheriff Littlefield closed Miller Ross store today.

Saturday, Mar. 1 Fair fine day. Big Mask Ball tonight at Community Hall about 20 couples masked. Had a whale of a time. I went dressed as a woman nobody knew me. Alta, dressed as Martha Washington.

Sunday, Mar. 2 Slightly overcast, not very cold. Feel rather poor. Johnson chopping wood, came up this afternoon. Dr Hart of Camden lanced an abces on Emery French leg today. 51 days sleighing

Monday, Mar. 3 Another fine day. Dandy good sleighing. The horse I got from Cooper dead lame in both fore feet.

Tuesday, Mar. 4 Fair fine warm day. Nice sleighing just a few spots of ground bair on the roads. Warm tonight.

Wednesday, Mar. 5 Warm and overcast. Snow all day, just a damp nasty drizzle almost rain.

Thursday, Mar. 6 Warm and snow all day a wet slushy mess. Sent to Sears Roebuck for a pair of rubber boots \$5.77. Set the front shoes on the Cooper horse.

Friday, Mar. 7 Awfull storm. The very worst of the winter. Went up as far as Cliff Pendletons then came back.

Saturday, Mar. 8 Snow all day a dirty nasty stickey mess that meltid as fast as it fell. Last dance of the season at Community Hall cleared \$8.80

Sunday, Mar. 9 Butifull bright mild day. Just like spring. Repaired a sleigh runner.

Monday, Mar. 10 Fair fine day. Horizon Star repsents "Geo Nichols" his star has set. Town Meeting Eugley 1st Bert Collemer 2nd LS Russ 3rd. Horace Miller Tresurer LC Rankin Clerk Fred Hardy Tax Collector. 59 days of sleighing.

Tuesday, Mar. 11 Raw & cold. Guess a storm comeing for sure this time. Died at the Ctr Mrs Adelbert Drake.

Wednesday, Mar. 12 One hell of a day. Snow squalls, and blowing a liveing gale, just howling. Wind easterly. Some wind. Got up to the "Lermond Place" Trees across the road could not get thro had to come back. 61 days of sleighing.

Thursday, Mar. 13 Blowing a gale. Roads are blocked got out to Searsmont. The Crie Road full of snow and no track, had to come back thro the Ctr.

Friday, Mar. 14 Fair fine day quite a big wind all day. Covered all my route but it only half a road at best. Six mastid schooner of Portland the "Wyoming" lost with all hands on Nantucket Sholes.

Saturday, Mar. 15 Fair fine clear cold afternoon, but this morning ye gods didnt it snow, twas a howling northeaster. Gus & Alta came over tonight and we jazed untill midnight. Some dance?

Sunday, Mar. 16 Cloudy and rather cold. Blowing to beat 3 of a kind. Guss came and got thear Phonograph. Died Geo Bullock age 73 yrs.

Monday, Mar. 17 Fair and blowing a gale of wind. Guss Warren went to Camden got me a load grain. Road out to Searsmont blocked. Lawry Rankin hawled me a load of hay.

Tuesday, Mar. 18 Fair and strong wind howling. Roads drifted pretty bad. Lawry Rankin hawled another load of hay 2480 lbs in all \$18.52 67 days sleighing

Wednesday, Mar. 19 Fair and some warmer the snow settled quite a bit today. Drove the black Cooper horse. Dead lame.

Thursday, Mar. 20 Raw cold overcast. Warm up this afternoon. Snow went today. Ordered a new car of Frank Cooper for delivery May 15 \$433.

Friday, Mar. 21 Very warm and very slushy. Durned hard traveling. Startid in to take my old car apart this afternoon.

Saturday, Mar. 22 Fair and warm fine day. Lots of bair ground. Went clambing tonight got some big ones. Guss & Alta came over tonight and we danced untill midnight.

Sunday, Mar. 23 Another fine warm day. Got up at 5 oclock this morning, went clambing got a pail full large clams. 72 days sleighing

Monday, Mar. 24 Fair and warm. Snow about all gorn. See a flock of robins this morning. Went in wagon first trip.

Tuesday, Mar. 25 Another fine warm day. Pretty muddy. Drove the black Cooper horse very lame.

Wednesday, Mar. 26 Still fair nice weather. Roads are getting pretty sloppy in places.

Thursday, Mar. 27 Another fair day but awfully cold. Jennice Kellers birthday 31 yrs old. Burned Clarence Woodburys Buildings only \$1,100 insurance.

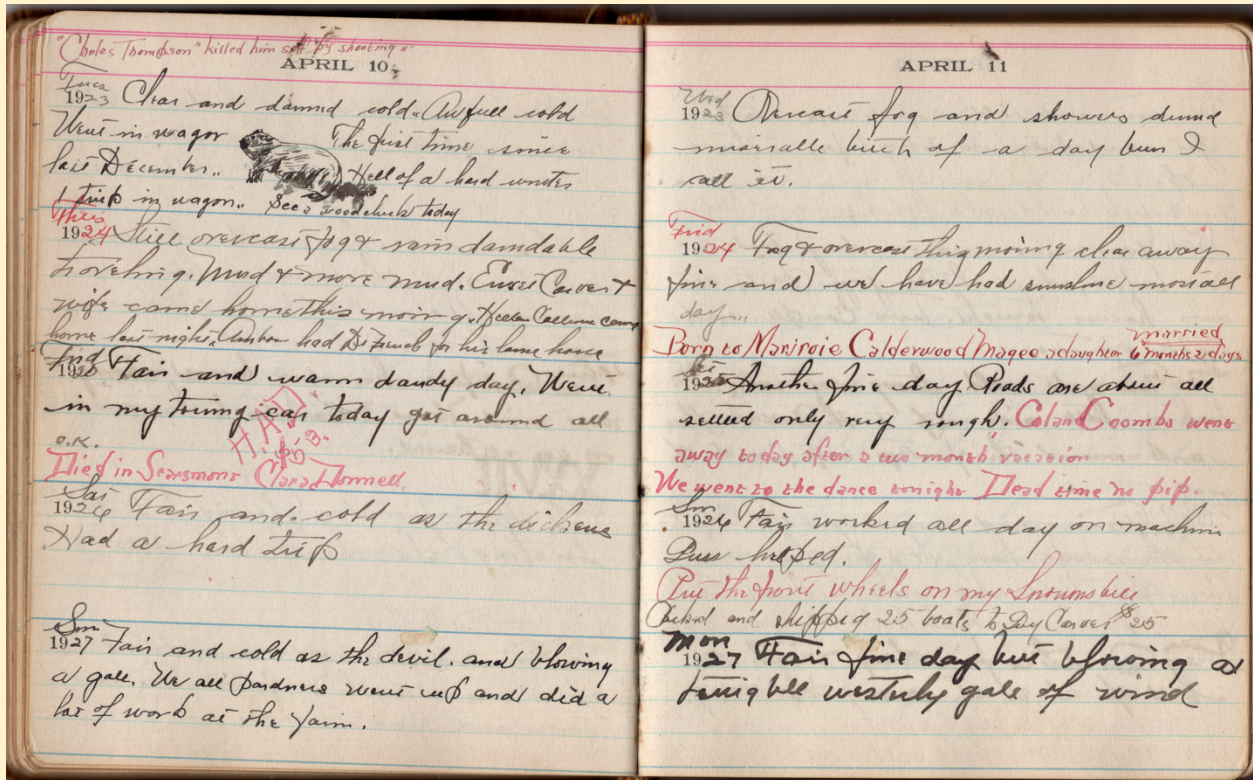
Friday, Mar. 28 Fair but not very warm. Traveling not so bad. Lots of ice and snow in the roads yet.

Sunday, Mar. 30 Overcast showers & snow squalls today. Did a little work in the shop, but to blamed nasty to stay out of doors.

Monday, Mar. 31 Fair and warmer. Frost comeing out quite a few places and mud quite deep. Married Geo Staples & Florence Flagg?

Tuesday, Apr. 1 Fair, very cold last night. See a big flock of Black Birds this morning. The first this spring. Drove that old clipped runaway out to Searsmont got a little small mair.

Wednesday, Apr. 2 Snow hard all last night & today. Alta over makeing a new coat for Vesta. Dandy. 73 days sleighing

Thursday, Apr. 3 Overcast, cold. Went in a sleigh again but the snow went like smoke this afternoon. See a blue bird today. 74 days of sleighing.

Friday, Apr. 4 Fair and warm, overcast. Tonight looks like rain. Went in wagon today. See a red wing black bird today.

Saturday, Apr. 5 Fair and warm. Frost comeing out in many places. Hard traveling. Borrowed some records from Clifton Dickey & we had another little 2 couple dance Guss & Alta.

Sunday, Apr. 6 Overcast and cold. Very cold raw east wind. Worked on car took pistons out & put in new rings. Died in Camden Lovica Young 79 yrs.

Monday, Apr. 7 Rain hard all day and blowing a gale. Roads breaking up. Guss & Alta in tonight & we jazzed for a while. Amborns Cooper horse awfull lame.

Tuesday, Apr. 8 Rain most all day terriable traveling frost comeing out all over the route. Nell Morse sent out a S.O.S. today for cut the [stanells?] and droped two cattle into the barn celler, one dead, choked to death. Died Mrs. Rose Pillsbury.

Wednesday, Apr. 9 Overcast, showers, damd bum weather and the cussedest kind of traveling. Alta went to Camden to take cair of her brother Foster. Sick with Pheunomia.

Thursday, Apr. 10 Still overcast fog & rain damdable traveling. Mud & more mud. Ernest Carver & wife came home this morning. Helen Collemer came home last night. Amborn had Dr French for his lame horse.

Friday, Apr. 11 Fog & overcast this morning clear away fine and we have had sunshine most all day. Born to Marjorie Calderwood Magee a daughter. Married 6 months 2 days.

Saturday, Apr. 12 Fair nice warm day. Roads are very bad. Had a little jazz party at our house tonight. Two couple and supper afterward.

Sunday, Apr. 13 Pretty day. Put new oversize rings in the pistons of Henry. Got them all in. Set 3 Hen's tonight.

Monday, Apr. 14 Fair and cold. Strong west wind. Hard traveling. Drove the Little Cooper mair and she was one damd tired horse tonight? So was I. Born to Mr & Mrs Arnie Knight a son.

Tuesday, Apr. 15 Fair and still very cold. Only 18 above zero this morning. Tonight Harry Frohock, Shirley Young & Alta Warren in rehursing the Easter offering.

Wednesday, Apr. 16 Fair, clear and cold. Ground froze as hard as flint this morning.

Thursday, Apr. 17 Fair and quite warm. Nice day drying mud up a very little. Worked on car all afternoon. Ice went out of the Andrews Pond.

Friday, Apr. 18 Butifull morning, cloudy and cold tonight. Roads are drying up a little, but still very bad. Took banking boards from house this afternoon. Ice went out of the LI'seller Pond.

Saturday, Apr. 19 Rain hard all last night and it snowed hard all day today. About 4 inches fell, hellish traveling.

Sunday, Apr. 20 Fair fine day. Went to church this afternoon. Easter Concert. Quite a crowd at the service. Guss the French fisherman got a seal in his nets this morning.

Monday, Apr. 21 Fair fine day. Got back quite early and put in the afternoon assembling "Henry Ford". Got it running like a Waterbury watch.

Tuesday, Apr. 22 Rain hard all day. Awfull storm, very cold. Drove a horse out to Searsmont for "Amborn" and swaped for another skate.

Wednesday, Apr. 23 Still rain very cold, a miserable bitch of a day. Got good and wet.

Thursday, Apr. 24 A miserable bitch of a day rain and snow mixed in with sleet bum weather.

Friday, Apr. 25 Overcast, shower & hale, bum weather. Mud drying up some worked on car this afternoon.

Saturday, Apr. 26 Fair and some warmer. Dance at the Big Hall tonight. Big crowd, but a bum time.

Sunday, Apr. 27 Fair butifull spring like day. Pitt came over from Portland today. He & Louie up spent the evening.

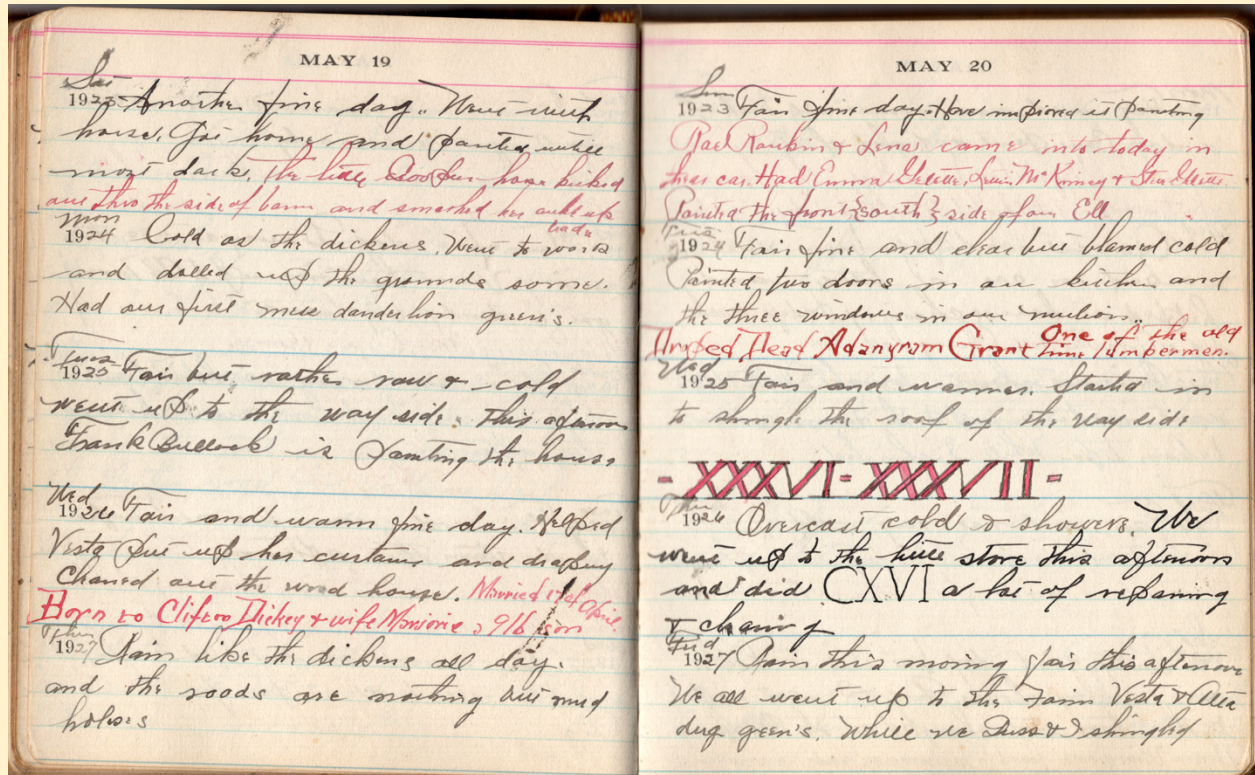

Monday, May 5 Fair nice day but feels like late fall. Got a headach and feel like a stewed prune. Went in car today second time this spring. Got 21 chick from 3 hen's.

Tuesday, May 6 Fair and cold. Went in car again today. Did go fishing took Roy Hurd and we fished the Geo Heal mill stream only two trout.

Wednesday, May 7 Butifull spring day, fair and warm. Finished washing our kitchen celen. Vesta finished papering one of the chamber rooms.

Thursday, May 8 Fairly decent kind of a day but still very cold. Did some work on car. \$50 due Sarah F. Knight. Paid May 8/24. Set 4 hen's tonight.

Friday, May 9 Still its cold and commencing to rain this noon. Storming tonight.

Saturday, May 10 Overcast fog and rain. We went to the dance tonight at Community Hall. Supposed to be a poverty ball. More silk, than rag's present. Big crowd.

Sunday, May 11 Overcast cold. Got up at 3 oclock this morning took Bill Young and we went trout fishing up to Cobb town. Stream very high.

Monday, May 12 Cold rain and gennaly miserable. Stormed all day. Amborn made his first trip in a car.

Tuesday, May 13 Rain all day, cleared tonight. Roads very slippery. Put new bushings into car this afternoon.

Wednesday, May 14 Fair pretty nice day. Did some work on car. Tonight we took Guss & Alta out to Mystic Grange Belmont to the dance. Rain hard comeing home Fun time.

Thursday, May 15 Thick fog & raining this morning. Clear away afternoon fine tonight. Put a front spring into car. Bustid one last night. Married last night Pitt Keller & Dasey Roberts?

Friday, May 16 Cleared away at last. Did some work cleaning up our yard. And putting it in dress condition.

Saturday, May 17 Another fine day. We went to the dance at Community Hall tonight. Last dance given by the Village Imp Society.

Sunday, May 18 Fair fine day. Got away at 3-30 this morning. Went trouting up to Cobb Town got 6 dandy big trout. Died in Somerville Mrs Eugene Thomas.

Monday, May 19 Cold as the dickens. Went to work and dolled up the grounds some. Had our first mess danderlion green's.

Tuesday, May 20 Fair fine and clear but blamed cold. Painted two doors in our kitchen and the three windows in our mullion. Dropped dead Adanyram Grant one of the old time lumbermen.

Wednesday, May 21 Overcast and fog, bum weather. Worked on car a little and helped at house cleaning. Ladys wash day at Community Hall. Cleaning hall.

Thursday, May 22 Fair fine day. Painted some in our kitchen.

Friday, May 23 Fair fine day. More paint on the kitchen finish. Vesta & Alta down at Community Hall this afternoon dusting.

Saturday, May 24 Overcast and cold as the devil. Spring dance at the Hall tonight. 100 couples V & I went rotten time

Sunday, May 25 Rain hard most all day. Slept & smoked the day away. Guss & Alta in tonight.

Monday, May 26 Fair pretty good day. Painted all afternoon. Sam & Edith Perry came today. Scott Knight smote Miller Ross right lusterly upon the eye & nose breaking & blackened same.

Tuesday, May 27 Fair fine day. Roy Oxton plowed our garden for us this forenoon. Finished painting our kitchen.

Wednesday, May 28 Rain hard as the dickens most all day so could not do much out door work.

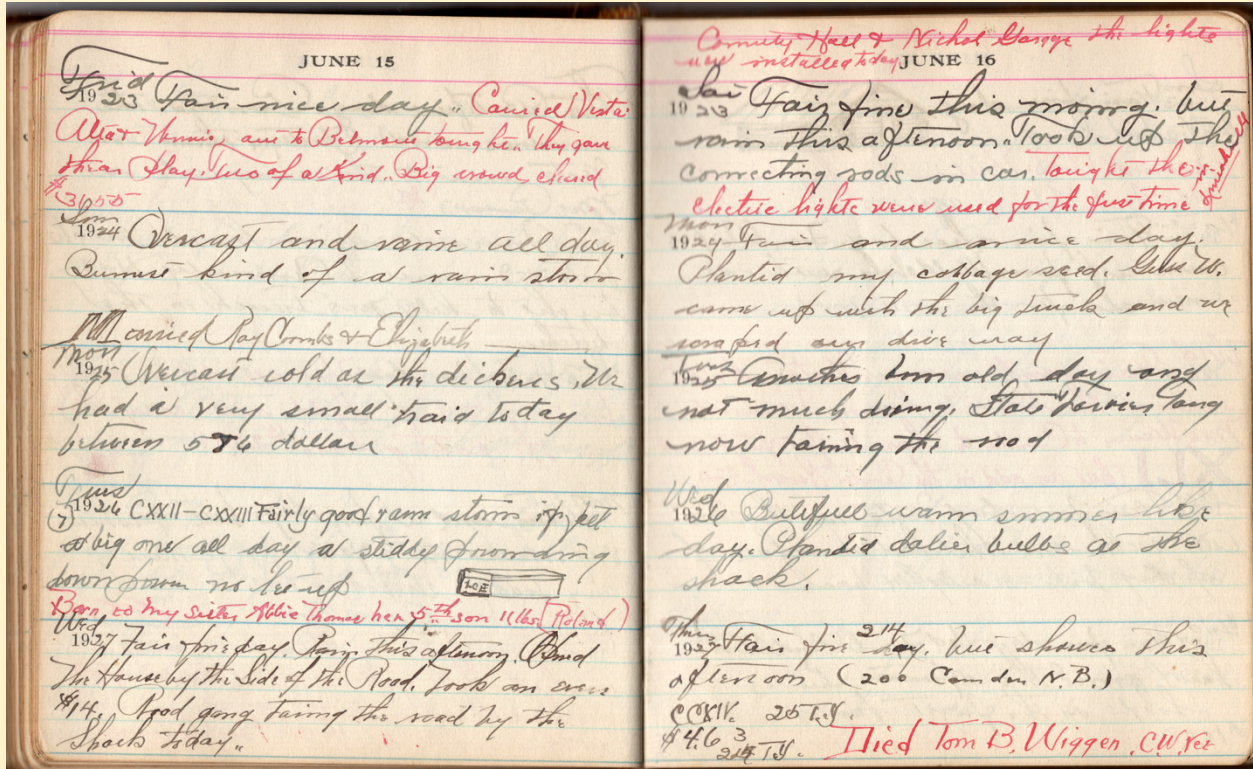
Thursday, May 29 Rain some more. Did not get to the dance in Belmont after all our planting.

Friday, May 30 Fair & cold. Got up at 12-45 this morning. Amborn & I took our "Cooper" horses back to Searsmont. See a big raccoon comeing back. We took Guss & Alta up to Ft [???] to see Frank Brown spent the day on his barge.

Saturday, May 31 Still blowing a westerly gale. And I have one rotten cold. Head feels like a water bucket & twice as large.

Sunday, Jun. 1 Fair and still blowing. Frank Brown came back from Bangor to attend the dance last night??? Born to Mattie & Ernest Heal a daughter.

Monday, Jun. 2 Another fine day. But feel like a pickled prune, got a rotten cold. Some better I hope.

Tuesday, Jun. 3 Fair and warm. Still have my cold with interest. My nose feels & looks like a seed cucumber! Burned Lee Goss farm buildings & 4 horses 3 cows, hens & hogs.

Wednesday, Jun. 4 Fair and warm. Have felt punk all day. Durn a cold anyway. Went to Marriners Hall to dance last night to Guss & Alta.

Thursday, Jun. 5 Fair fine warm day. Roy Oxton came and harrowed furrowed & put the dressing on our garden.

Friday, Jun. 6 Hot as the hinges of hell and then some.

Saturday, Jun. 7 Fair fine day. Broke another front spring in car. That makes two in a month. President Coolidge vetoed the salary increase today for postal employees. Ant that hell?

Sunday, Jun. 8 Butifull day. Put a new front spring into Henry Ford. V & I took a little ride of twenty miles this afternoon. The "Bushes" came this morning.

Monday, Jun. 9 And still butifull weather. Put the finish coat of Kinze on our dining room floor this afternoon.

Tuesday, Jun. 10 Fair fine clear day. Plantid potatoes and small garden [??] this afternoon. Born to Alice & Don Patten a son, 6 in six years.

Wednesday, Jun. 11 Butifull day. Did some mowing & choring up about the buildings. Washed the car. Four girls came down on the boat to go back with Dr. Bush, returned to Worcester.

Wednesday, Dec. 3 Fair and some warmer. Went in the Skooter today got along O.K. Frank Collemer came down tonight brought his radio it came in fine. Went to Camden.

Thursday, Dec. 4 Fair and cold. Went in the Hell wagon today got back to the office at 12-20. Guss came over & we put up the frame of the ice house.

Friday, Dec. 5 Fair and warmer. Went in the hell skooter today and made good time.

Saturday, Dec. 6 Overcast and warm. Went in the Snowmobile. Ran out of gas & had to walk from Slab City to Geo Collemer & send a S.O.S. to Roy Hurd.

Sunday, Dec. 7 Overcast fog & a few showers. Guss & I went out to Russ Carvers to get a horse but did not like it.

Monday, Dec. 8 Warm and rain like the dickens. Worked this afternoon around the place fixing every tight & dry.

Tuesday, Dec. 9 Fair and warmer. Split oven wood this afternoon and wheeled it in tonight.

Wednesday, Dec. 10 Fair fine day. Too blamed good roads very muddy and it cussid traveling.

Thursday, Dec. 11 Fair and rather cold. Did some work on the ice house and split fire wood.

Friday, Dec. 12 Cold as the dickens. Snowing tonight. Went to Belfast this afternoon did our Christmas shopping.

Saturday, Dec. 13 Warmer rain most all day. We went to the dance tonight Vesta & Alta served. Very small crowd, but they made \$8.89. I had requested letters.

Sunday, Dec. 14 Fair and rather cold with a strong west wind. Guss came over and we worked on the ice house. Got it mostly finished.

Monday, Dec. 15 Bitter cold and ye God but the roads are awfull to ride on. They are cut up so rough.

Tuesday, Dec. 16 Overcast. Cold as the devil. Look & feels like snow. Have been putting out oven wood in. Mrs McKinney went back to Mrs Perrys.

Wednesday, Dec. 17 Rain and froze as it fell this forenoon. Stoped storm afternoon but still overcast. Today I delivered pks of insured & reg mail.

Thursday, Dec. 18 Raw cold and overcast all day. Guss & Jen Keller hawled saw dust to fill the bottom of the new ice house.

Friday, Dec. 19 Cold and raw, bum kind of a day. Had a very heavy mail today. Married Merret Carver and Gladys Brown.

Saturday, Dec. 20 Fair but growing cold fast, tonight its very cold. We went to the dance at the Hall quite a few people there cleared about \$9.

Sunday, Dec. 21 An awfull day. So cold that water will freeze at any time & in any place in our kitchen. 12° below zero with a howling westerly gale.

Monday, Dec. 22 Cold as the devil. Only 8° above zero all day. Had a very heavy mail. Vesta & I went to Belfast this afternoon. Delivered 23 insurid pks today.

Tuesday, Dec. 23 Fairly good day, still rather cold. Heavy Christmas mail. \$7.54 cancerlation. Worked down at the offace tonight and had insured packages to deliver tomorrow.

Wednesday, Dec. 24 Rain, then snow, then rain again but partly clear and warm tonight. V & I went to the Christmas tree party at the school house.

Thursday, Dec. 25 "Christmas" Did not have to drive. Vesta gave me a butifull Signet Ring, Box cigars and a fine Brier Pipe. I gave her a White and Amber Toilet Set, Perfume, and a Cheney Phonograph.

Friday, Dec. 26 Another partly stormy day some rain, and clear weather tonight. Last of the Christmas mail. Vesta sick feeling powerfull bad.

Saturday, Dec. 27 Fair and warm fine day. Did not go to the dance tonight. V sick and feeling rotten.

Sunday, Dec. 28 Clear and cold as the devil. Bitter cold this morning way below zero.

Monday, Dec. 29 Fair and warmer but still cold as the Dickens. The traveling is very good. Roads nickle plate with ice.

Tuesday, Dec. 30 Butifull day fair and warm. Guss Warren went up and helped cut timber on the mountain lot today.

Wednesday, Dec. 31 Fair and colder. Went on the mountain chopping this afternoon. Went to the dance tonight Community Hall. Danced this year out and the new one in. Good By 1924 You are finished.
