Sunday, Jan. 4 Fair and not very cold. Fine day. Went up on mountain with Bill Young to show him where to chop.

Monday, Jan. 5 Butiful day fair and warm. V & I went to Belfast this afternoon 1-8-5.

Tuesday, Jan. 6 Warm overcast. Went up chopping this afternoon. Came home and drew out a ax. Bill and Orris Young started chopping cord wood for me today.

Wednesday, Jan. 7 Overcast, snowing tonight & colder. Went and spread what plaster we had on our new cloth press.

Saturday, Jan. 10 Fair fine day. Went on mt chopping this afternoon. Jenness Keller hauled my lumber home from mill 1275 fit. Paid him \$7.80. 7103 M.

Sunday, Jan. 11 Clear and cold as the devil. Stacked my lumber and piled it pretty today.

Monday, Jan. 12 Fair and a good day. Went up and cut some oven wood tonight have been painting doll faces.

Tuesday, Jan. 13 Snow this morning. Turned to rain fair and colder tonight. We V & I went over to "Warren" tonight to a pre birthday party tonight.

Wednesday, Jan. 14 Fair clear as a bell & cold as the devil. V's 40th birthday. I gave her a \$5 gold pieces in a little velvet lined box. Guss & Alta each a record for her machine. Mrs Warren a butifull bath towel.

Thursday, Jan. 15 Fairly good weather. Mrs W & G & Alta came over spent the evening. We danced by music from Vesta's new "Cheney"

Friday, Jan. 16 Snow most all afternoon. James Dean & Lawry Rankin started hauling ice for us. Snowing tonight.

Saturday, Jan. 17 Fair fine day. Fred Frohock James Dean & Larry Rankin hawling ice for me today. Cold as the devil. We all went to the dance. Small crowd. Went in Snowmobile today.

Sunday, Jan. 18 Clear & cold. Fred Frohock has been hawling ice for us today. He finished the 20 ton we put up. Jenness Keller hawling saw dust. Paid Frohock hawling \$12.

Monday, Jan. 19 Fair and bitter cold. 32 below zero this morning some places in Maine it went down to 60 below.

Tuesday, Jan. 20 Overcast and cold. Snowing hard tonight. Frank Cooper called in to see how the Snowmobile was working.

Wednesday, Jan. 21 Fair and cold. Went in the Snowmobile. Did not get in until 3 o'clock, about 20 inches snow fell.

Thursday, Jan. 22 Fair and warmer. Made better time with the Snowmobile today got back at 1-30. We have lived here 13 years today.

Friday, Jan. 23 Fair, blowing great guns. Roads are drifted full. 10° or more below zero all day did not cover all my route.

Saturday, Jan. 24 Fair but bitter cold. Did not cover all my route. Roads still unbroken. Total eclips of the sun this morning at 9-15. Wonderfull sight.

Sunday, Jan. 25 Fair and fine. Took the Snowmobile and my mail and went out thru Searsmont & Belmont. Married Mildred Lermond & Allen Morton.

Monday, Jan. 26 Warm and snowing part of day. Thick fog tonight. Took horse out and drove up as far as Geo Collemer's. Leon Burton's horse got away from him & was drown in the Knights Pond.

Tuesday, Jan. 27 Not so cold and snow most all day. Blowing great guns tonight. V. took a [?] today. Put her feet in hot mustard water?

Wednesday, Jan. 28 Fair and cold. 24° below in Searsmont. Roads drifted full but light snow, covered it all O.K.



Friday, Feb. 6 Fair and warm butifull day. We went over to Warren's tonight to wait for the world's ending?

Saturday, Feb. 7 Another fine warm day. Dandy traveling. We went to the dance tonight, big crowd.

Wednesday, Feb. 11 Overcast fog and rain hard. Roads awfull slumpy. Frank Cooper and a Snowmobile, with sliding transmission, was waiting for me in Searsmont today.

Thursday, Feb. 12 Rain hard all day. Got stuck once and had to shovel for an hour to get thro up by the Town House. See a flock of 9 robins today.

Friday, Feb. 13 Another butifull warm Spring like day. Frank Cooper was in E. Searsmt with a Snowmobile Sliding Transmission for much this morning.

Saturday, Feb. 14 Fair and warm fine day. Big Free dance at Community Hall given by the V.I.S. and a fine time 55 couples.

Sunday, Feb. 15 Warm and raining tonight hard. Carried Vesta over to see her mother this afternoon. XXIII ROBINS THIS SPRING

Monday, Feb. 16 Softer mushy weather. Warm just like the last of March. Guss helped me shift my Snowmobile over from runners to wheels. Died Elnor Heal Cummings age 88 yrs.

Monday, Feb. 23 Warm and rain all day. Just like April weather. Alta Warren went to the Island to see Vera?

Tuesday, Feb. 24 Fair and very warm. Just like spring. Guss & I went up to Northport to see about gravel.

Wednesday, Feb. 25 Another warm springlike day. The wood sawyers came this afternoon, but broke their engine before they got startid on my wood.

Thursday, Feb. 26 Overcast part of day. Snowing a little and raining more tonight. Had my fire wood. Elma [??] & Marion Drinkwater.

Friday, Feb. 27 Fair and cold, blowing great guns. Wind west.

Saturday, Feb. 28 Fair nice warm day. Went to Camden got load of grain at the Union. Vesta not feeling well so we did not go to the dance.

Wednesday, Mar. 11 Warm and a soft drizzley rain falling all day. Roads very muddy but went in car just the same.

Thursday, Mar. 12 Fair and warm fine spring like day. Did some work in the black shop. Made a pair of side irons to hold up mud gards on Tractor.

Friday, Mar. 13 Another fine warm day. Worked in blacksmith shop build the iron work for a sign board like this [*drawing of ironwork*].

Saturday, Mar. 14 Fair and warm. Vesta came out and helped pile up fire wood while I split. Vesta commenced to build her new blue dress.

Sunday, Mar. 15 Got up this morning and the ground was white. Snowed about 6 inches. Shifted wheels onto my Snowmobile this afternoon.

Monday, Mar. 16 Fair and fine froze hard last night about a foot of snow back in Belmont. Went in Snowmobile.

Tuesday, Mar. 17 Rain this afternoon. Jess Keller tryed to get my wood from the Mt, but couldn't. I went to Camden this afternoon got grain. Alta Warren went to Rockland to be fitted with storm windows.

Wednesday, Mar. 25 Fair fine day. Broke one of the drive belts on my Snowmobile. Guss buried the Big Truck in front of his house. Drop all under the mud.


Sunday, Mar. 29 Still overcast and rainy. Did not get up until afterwards this morning. Mendid chains for Guss this afternoon.

Saturday, Apr. 11 Another fine day. Roads are about all settled only very rough. Colin Coombs went away today after a two month vacation. We went to the dance tonight. Dead time no pip.

Sunday, Apr. 12 Fair and cold. Strong east wind. We took a little ride up to the Bullock place and measured the frontage. 33 ft from the ctr of road.

Monday, Apr. 13 Fair and cold as the dickens but the traveling good. Guss took up the first load of lumber to the Side of the road house.

Tuesday, Apr. 14 Overcast and very cold & raw. Harry & Ethel Frohock up and spent the evening. After they went we went over to "Warrens". Guss birthday. 41 yrs young. Ice cream and cake.

Wednesday, Apr. 15 Rain hard all day. Roads pretty sloppy but got around in good time.

Thursday, Apr. 16 Clear and cold as the devil. Did some work about the place afternoon. Carried Gram McKinney to Camden. We went after Alice, but boat 5 hours late out of Boston.

Friday, Apr. 17 Overcast and cold. Went out to Virgil Halls and had new transmission lineing put in car. XXVIII

Thursday, Apr. 23 Butifull warm spring day. Went trout fishing. No luck only 3 fish.



Monday, May 11 Rain all day and a good part of last night. Washed & whitened our dining room ceiling today. Paid A.G. Collemer [??] in full for hay \$26.

Tuesday, May 12 Fair fine day. Worked up by the Road house this afternoon had Elna Collemer to help.

Wednesday, May 13 Fair and warm. Worked until 7 o'clock on the Road house. It is growing slowly.

Thursday, May 14 Overcast and warm. Built an ice box this afternoon, or rather got one all most built.

Friday, May 15 Fair and warm. Worked up on the Road house until 8 o'clock tonight. Elma Collemer worked today for us.

Saturday, May 16 Rain hard last night. Partly overcast and showers today. We went up to our farm and planked the spring over.

Sunday, May 17 Overcast and showers. We went up to the Road house then took a long walk up the Arthur road. Fine wilderness trail.

Monday, May 18 Fair and very cold. Went up and worked on our house this afternoon.

Tuesday, May 19 Fair but rather raw & cold. Went up to the way side this afternoon. Frank Bullock is painting the house.

Tuesday, May 26 Very good but it is just awfully cold.

Wednesday, May 27 Cold and overcast. Worked up at the Shack until quite late.


Thursday, May 28 Still a bum bit of weather. Worked up to Shack this evening. We went to Rockland this afternoon bought goods.

Tuesday, Jun. 2 Overcast and cold. Went up to the Shack sold Hot Dogs and ice cream tonight.

Wednesday, Jun. 3 Hot and muggy. We, Vesta & I went to Belfast this afternoon. Stopped at the way side and [unfinished entry]

Thursday, Jun. 4 Fair and very hot. The first one of the season. Built an ice box today. Sold \$9.72 tonight.

Friday, Jun. 5 Very hot, a regular blisterer. Worked on our ice box all afternoon. Guss will carry it up in the morning.

Saturday, Jun. 6 Very warm, and a terrific thunder storm tonight. Opened the Shack for business this evening.

Sunday, Jun. 7 Overcast & cold this forenoon. Fair this afternoon. Did a fairly good business allmost \$30. In the week since the Shack opened, have sold \$100.49. Not bad?

Monday, Jun. 8 Raw cold overcast with heavy thunder storms. Not much traid and very little traffic.

Tuesday, Jun. 9 Nasty cold raw foggy weather. Trade light and house cold.

Wednesday, Jun. 10 Still fog cold & overcast. Did but little business up at the "Shack".

Thursday, Jun. 11 Fair fine clear cool day. Business about the same. Jenness Keller & wife up to see us tonight. Sold out flock of hen's for \$50.

Friday, Jun. 12 Another butifull clear & cool day.

Saturday, Jun. 13 Butifull day fair and warm. Carried Alta up to the Shack this morning. Vesta took a half day off.

Sunday, Jun. 14 Fair fine day. We all did a making [?] business today. Sold out everything in the eating home \$27.54

Monday, Jun. 15 Overcast cold as the dickens. We had a very small traid today between 5 & 6 dollars.

Tuesday, Jun. 16 Another bum old day and not much doing. State [??] Gang now tarring the road.





1926 Very cold overcast. Snowing tonight regular blizzard setting in.

1927 Snow hard last night & today. Helliday ~~Don Peck~~ Don Peck house \$500. Hung for sale. Went to Belford get a pair when house from Coopers for 200.

Tuesday, Dec. 1 Bitter cold this day and overcast. Went up and cut fire wood this afternoon.

Wednesday, Dec. 2 Overcast and raining tonight much warmer. Look like a big storm coming.

Thursday, Dec. 3 Rain all day and still it rain tonight. Some storm we are having for sure.

Friday, Dec. 4 Rain all day with never a let up. Still raining tonight with no sign of a let up.

Saturday, Dec. 5 Another rainy day. It has stormed steadily for 48 hours. Roads awfully muddy. Vesta gave the "Warrens" a butter "Pinkey" [?]

Sunday, Dec. 6 Awfull rain storm still this makes the fourth day of stiddy rain.

Monday, Dec. 7 Fair and very warm. Amborn & Pitcher went with horses. I went with my car. Roads very bad mud.

Tuesday, Dec. 8 Warm and muddy. Got back fairly decent time and went to Belfast this afternoon.

Wednesday, Dec. 9 Clear and colder. Snow squall this morning. Roads awfull rough. Two fires in Camden today.

Thursday, Dec. 10 Fair fine day not so very cold but roads very rough. Sent generator to Waldoboro Garage to have repaired.

Friday, Dec. 11 Overcast and warm. Put the four tires on my Snowmobile this afternoon.

Saturday, Dec. 12 Overcast and warmer looks like rain and it is raining tonight.

Sunday, Dec. 13 Fair fine day but pretty blamed cold. Guss came over and helped me put the belts on my Snowmobile.

Monday, Dec. 14 Fair cold with a strong west wind. C.V. very cold tonight had a fire in our sitting room stove.

Tuesday, Dec. 15 Clear & cold, and awfull rough traveling. Went to the farm this afternoon and cut fire wood. Got a good big pile of it cut and piled now 2 or 3 cords.

Wednesday, Dec. 16 Fair & warm. Butifull day. Went to Belfast got my shoe rubbers. Alta went to Camden. Got medicine from Dr Hart for Mrs. Mc.

Thursday, Dec. 17 Fair and mild fine day. Hell a popping now every day. Mrs McKinney's mind is surely left her it's just like a sive [sieve].

Friday, Dec. 18 Butifull fall like day. Mrs. Mc. a awfull day just about killing V.

Saturday, Dec. 19 Another butifull day, not very cold fine day. Mrs. Mc. is in awfull shape and growing worse all the time.

Sunday, Dec. 20 Fair fine mild day. Roy Oxton & Amos Pitcher hawling my fire wood from the Old Hart place. Mrs. Mc so bad today I could not go cutting oven wood. Paid him \$8.00

Monday, Dec. 21 Overcast cold. Spitting snow. Very heavy mail today. Was late in getting back to the office.

Tuesday, Dec. 22 Overcast and cold. Busted a new shoe on car today had to buy a new one.

Wednesday, Dec. 23 Overcast and snow squalls. Heavy Christmas mail, the heaviest this year have ever handled.

Thursday, Dec. 24 Fair fine day. Went to Belfast this afternoon. Did some shopping. Guss went with me. Tonight with the "Warrens" help gave Vesta a miniature Christmas Tree.

Friday, Dec. 25 Christmas. Fair fine day. Vesta gave me a fine new blue macanaw coat made by "Brewster". I gave her a new shopping bag. Pair of walnut candle sticks & money.

Saturday, Dec. 26 Clear and bitter cold tonight. Guss & I went to Belfast this afternoon. Dr Hart came again tonight.

Sunday, Dec. 27 Clear and very cold. I have a damnable rotten cold. Do feel like hell today.

Monday, Dec. 28 Bitter cold, but I went to Belfast this afternoon. Got the papers to have Vesta appointed guardian of her mother but Mrs Mc will not live long.

Tuesday, Dec. 29 Bitter cold but have managed to keep busy. Went to Belfast. Guss & Alta went with me to buy things for Vesta.

Wednesday, Dec. 30 Clear and cold. Mrs. McKinney died this morning at 7-30. Trozier [?] the undertakers from Camden made all arrangements. Died Vesta's Mother, Josie Ellen age 72 yrs.

Thursday, Dec. 31 Fair and cold. Went out to Ctr got new bushings in car. Put our ice up today. Got in of Will Munroe, Fred Frohock hauled it with his truck. 144 cakes. Will Young helped stow.
