Wrote Testimony for them on the mock trial. A stormy time with Olive before their arrival, because I went to meet her night before, after Singing School. Accused me of thinking that Mill's would come home with her. Told her it looked as if she had taken it upon herself to defend Mill's character even if she had to quarrel with every one else, her husband included. And I had warned her for own good not to be intimate or friendly to such an extent as to cause any comment or scandal. If she could not take such advice as it was meant it was high time for me to interfere and stop this going out so much nights alone and remaining till 11 O'Clock.
