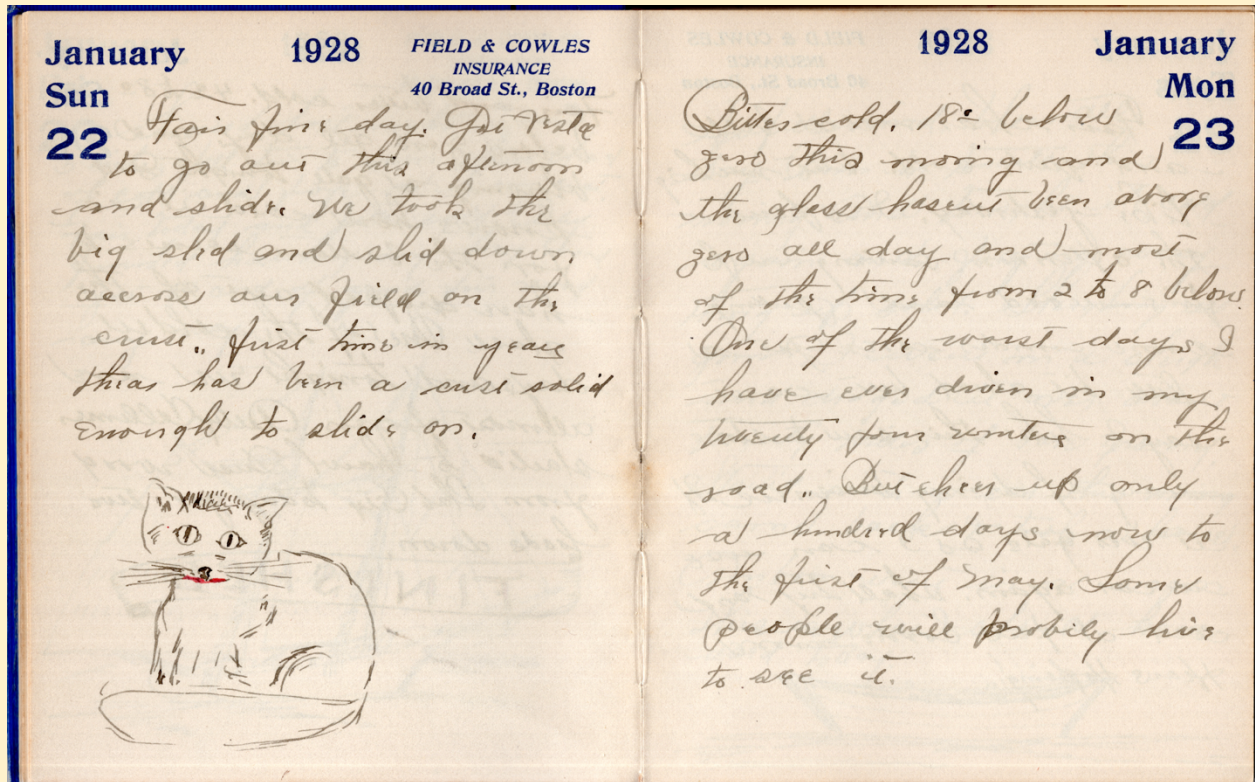


RALPH RICHARDS - 1928



Sunday, Jan. 1 This is the New Year. Hellow, Prime looking little fellow. Fair and very warm, just like a summer day. Let us hope it will keep up the rest of the year. One of my horses got to kicking last night and smashid the end of the stabel out. Some kicking.

Monday, Jan. 2 Clear and cold. Dont have to drive mail today so startid the New Year by going up to our wood lot on the mountain and cut fire wood all day. Have two good load cut and piled mostly oak and mapel.

Tuesday, Jan. 3 Another clear cold day 3 below zero this morning. Took my ax and hoofed it up the mountain cut another six feet of fire wood. Harold McKinney hawled a load of hay for me this afternoon and tonight Aubry Collemer hawled me another. Much hay now.

Wednesday, Jan. 4 Fair clear & cold. More fire wood fell to my trusty ax this afternoon got three cord cut and piled now and its surely great wood. Oak Beech Birch and mapel, that's been growing fifty years or more.

Thursday, Jan. 5 Still fair clear and cold. Put in a busy afternoon on the mountain cut a cord and piled it up in less than three hours. Getting some dandy wood oak, beech, birch and maple.

Friday, Jan. 6 Fair and warmer. Went up chopping this afternoon. Harry Frohock came and sawed what wood we had at the house. About a cord I split and put it into our wood house tonight after supper. Hired Guss Warren to help Harry

Saturday, Jan. 7 Warm, just like a spring day. Took the car and Vesta & I with Guss & Alta went up to the Farm. Cleaned out the ice house and then we all went to burning brush and did a whale of a good [twitch] at it.

Sunday, Jan. 8 Butifull day. Vesta feeling not very well so we took a short ride to Camden and up to the Farm. This afternoon the weather was so perfect we went up the [Delby] Road for a little walk and tonight went over to "Warrens" and spent the evening. Found dead in his home alone this morning Fred Moody.

Monday, Jan. 9 Warm and light rain all day. Thick fog tonight. Frost comeing out of the ground and the roads are getting muddy. Have felt like a stewed clam this afternoon and blocked out an ax handel. Had a fire in my forge repaired a set of ice tongs, sharpened a ice chisel and drew out an ax.

Tuesday, Jan. 10 Fair and warm. Some of the time boiling hot. Had all kinds of trouble with my car. Punctured shoe, and a spark plug to clean. Went up to the Farm this afternoon and cut bushes. Guss was chopping thear all day. Dr Hart opened Emery Frenchs foot on top. They are afraid they will have to take the foot off.

Wednesday, Jan. 11 Warm and rain. Colder tonight and clear. Carryed Guss & Alta up to the Farm this morning. Guss to chop, friend wife to burn brush. Vesta & I went up and got them after we had our dinner. Did some work in the shop this afternoon. Made a bush hook. Know what that is? It looks like this. Virgel Hall put a new set of spark plugs into my car this morning.

Thursday, Jan. 12 Fair and warm finest kind of weather the sky looks and the air feels just like April. (Wish it was) Carried Guss & Alta up to the farm this morning and after dinner Vesta & I went up. The females of the firm burned bush while the male portion cut it. Also a little fire wood. I carried up the bush hook I made and it works O.K. Bert Knight went to Bangor today and got his wife Bessie from the insane hospital. Clifton Fletcher carried him

Friday, Jan. 13 Fair and warm. Had to stop at the Center this morning and have Virgel Hall put a new set of spark plugs in my car. This afternoon I went to Camden, got some repair parts for my car and a couple of hundred pounds of blacksmith coal. Tonight warm and overcast. Roads today muddy as the very dickens.

Saturday, Jan. 14 Fair fine day. Vestas birthday and she had Guss & Alta over to supper. Mrs Warren gave Vesta a sofa pillow. Also a box of handkerchiefs, Guss a slab of bacon done up in a dozen or more boxes and wrapping, and Alice Dickey sent her a very pretty set of holders and a case to put them in. After supper Alta & I did the dishes and we all went to Belfast to the pictures. Snowing hard when we came home.

Sunday, Jan. 15 Fair and cold as the dickens. Put brake rods on my Ford this afternoon and doubled the cross chains on the skid chains. So blamed cold we could not go up to the farm and cut bush or any thing else. Guess a spell of good weather is over, but we should be thankful for what we have had. I am.

Monday, Jan. 16 Very cold. 20° below zero in E Searsmont this morning. 4° below here. Went in my car. No trouble altho there is 4 or 5 inches of snow that fell Sat night. It helped smooth out the rough spots on the road. Thick & overcast tonight. Looks & feels as tho we would have a regular blizzard before tomorrow night. Snowing 10 P.M.

Tuesday, Jan. 17 Clear as a bell and cold as the arctic this morning. About 6 inches snow fell last night. And ye Gods how it blows. Startid with a car but after covering a couple of miles gave it up came back and took a horse and sleigh. Awfull hard traveling part bare ground. Got back to the office at 2 oclock.

Wednesday, Jan. 18 Fair and not very cold. Drove the goat mair today and got back before one o'clock. Aubry Collemer started to haul my fire wood from off the mountain. Got down one very small load in 4 hours. Guss went up to the Farm chopping today. I took the car and went after him tonight. Aubry got another load of wood down tonight after dark some of the long wood I cut this winter.

Thursday, Jan. 19 Cold as the dickens and bum sleighing. I towed my wagon down from Father this afternoon. If it don't snow will have to go in it tomorrow, but tonight it looks like a regular blizzard. Went up after Guss this afternoon in my car. Aubry still carting wood for me from the mountain. Will finish the five cord I cut tomorrow, and then to try and get the 10 cord of dry down. Helluva job? Freddy Hall and Christine Marriner were married today. I think she is almost 13 years old and he is about 33.

Friday, Jan. 20 Snowed last night about 5 inches fell then to rain then cleared off cold and froze a heavy crust. Fair today and bitter cold. Aubry finished hauling my long wood got 5 cord of good fire wood any way.

Saturday, Jan. 21 Fair and bitter cold. 4° to 8° below zero all day and blowing a gale tonight. God knows how cold it is for the bottom seems to have dropped out of the glass. One of the coldest days and tonight we are almost frozen. Aubry Collemer started to haul Guss wood from Slab City today got two loads down.

Sunday, Jan. 22 Fair fine day. Got Vesta to go out this afternoon and slide. We took the big sled and slid down across our field on the crust. First time in years there has been a crust solid enough to slide on.

Monday, Jan. 23 Bitter cold. 18° below zero this morning and the glass hasn't been above zero all day and most of the time from 2 to 8 below. One of the worst days I have ever driven in my twenty four winters on the road. But cheer up only a hundred days now to the first of May. Some people will probably live to see it.

Tuesday, Jan. 24 Fair clear as a bell and quite cold. But nothing like yesterday. I spent the afternoon sawing up fire wood and putting same under cover. Got a little bit ahead but can't say I like this saw to store way of doing

buisness. If it ever gets so I can use a car again shall try and cut a few cords more. Hears Hopeing!

Wednesday, Jan. 25 Awfull wind. Blow all day. Rain in torents this morning. And tonight its cold again and freezing every thing up solid. Sleighing all gorn. I went in a sleigh and draged it over about twenty miles of bare ground. Startid with a car this morning came back & took a horse. Amborn went in a wagon. This is what I should have used today [*sketch of a boat*].

Thursday, Jan. 26 Fair and cold as the devil. Went in my car today and had no trouble. Most all the ground is bare. Aubry still at work on my fire wood and perhaps if the winter is long enough he will get it all down. Riley Mathews the last civel war vetran in town had a bad fainting spell today. Yesterdays gale did lots of damage blowing hen houses over doors of the building breaking down trees and chimney off from houses.

Friday, Jan. 27 Butifull day fair and cool. Aubry still hawling wood. Guss went up to the Farm again today and I went up and got him this afternoon. And tonight we had a caller in the shape of Percy Wellman and when I got back Alta & Guss helped entertain him. Vesta gave him his supper and then he left for a six mile walk.

Saturday, Jan. 28 Fair and cold. Went up to the Farm and got Guss on the way home borrowed Frank Collemers saw rig and we towed it home with my Ford. Allso borrowed a bag Crack Corn. Rigid up the dinged thing and sawed a little wood to last over Sunday. Aubry did not hawl wood today. Died Emery French age 66 years 9 months.

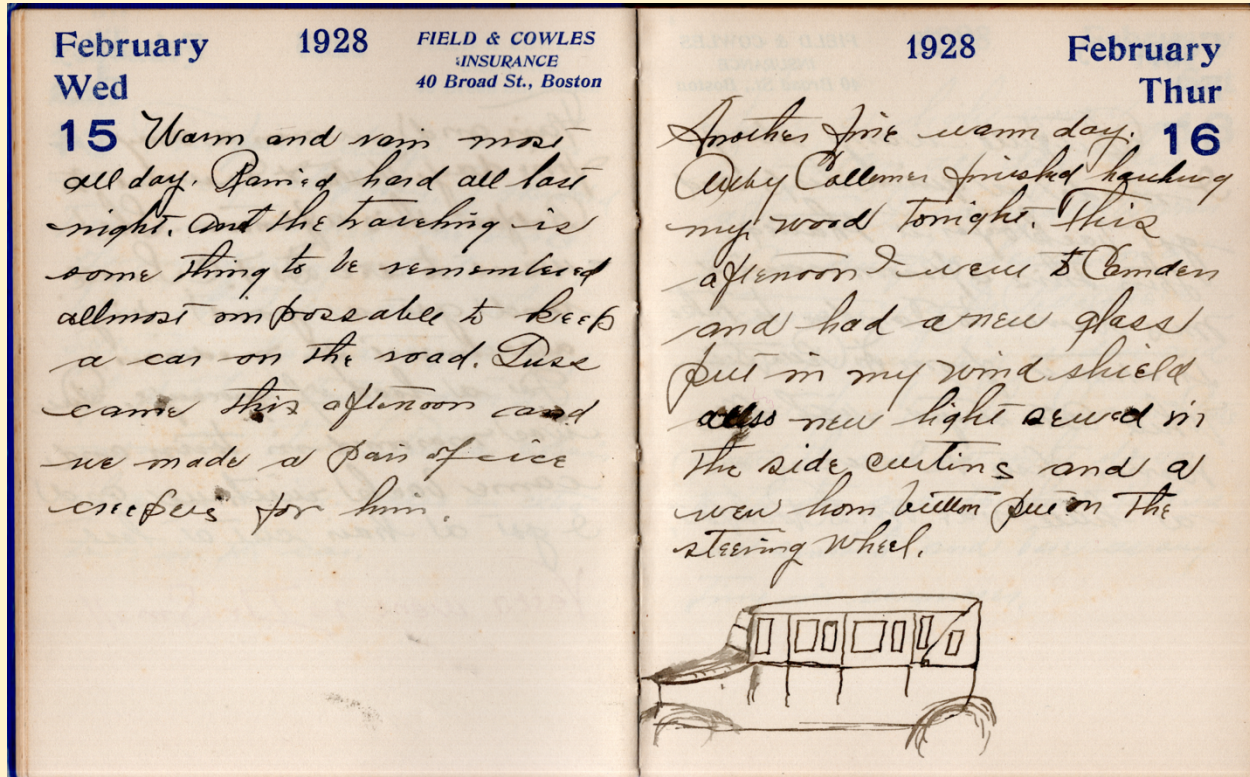
Sunday, Jan. 29 Snow and blow a hell of a blizzard only thing good about it not much snow fell. But its been so cold today we could hardly keep warm with two stoves going wide open. Went over to Warrens tonight

Monday, Jan. 30 Fair and cold. Just a little snow flurry last night. This afternoon Guss and I rigid up the [*Fliver*] with the sawing rig and sawed a couple cord of dry fire wood. I dont think much of the outfit but its way a head of pushing a buck saw. Married Clarence Drinkwater and Lydia Herrick.

Tuesday, Jan. 31 Butifull mild day. Went to Emery French funeral this afternoon. Rev Homan of Camden preached, and the Mason allso held a short service. Guss let the black horse [*Margoin*] to the stabel door Amos Pitcher then led her up to the burying place and Roy Hurd met them and startid her on her long sleep with a 30-30 bullet. So mate it be. Died George Coombs.

Wednesday, Feb. 1 Warmer, with a soft snow fall part of the day. Guss & I sawed wood with my car this afternoon. Have all the dry wood cut for the stove now, all that Aubry has hauled from the mountain about 6 cord. Alta & Hazel in this afternoon to see Vesta. She Hazel takeing orders for dress goods.

Thursday, Feb. 2 Clear as a bell and cold as ----. Blowing a gale of wind. We put up our ice, it is slippery and nice Thank God its finished again. We bought it of W.J. [Muse] and had it delivered today. 112 cakes of ice each weighing 400 lbs. Guss & I packed and stowed it. Ralph Brown pet sow had a litter of 6 pigs last night 3 of them froze to death.

Friday, Feb. 3 Overcast and warmer. Had a broken front spring hanger when I got in to the offace so went to Camden and had some repair work done on car. Comeing home, "Bang" and I had a burned out bearing, had to go back to Camden left my car at Garage

Saturday, Feb. 4 Overcast and rain. Went to Camden this afternoon and went to the pictures while having my car repaired. Burned out a conecting

rod bearing and so that cost me \$10 buck to have it repaired. Had valves ground & carbor take out.

Sunday, Feb. 5 Fair and cold. This morning we all the company went up to the Farm. Guss & I covered the ice with sawdust & Vesta & Alta cut & burned brush. We had dinner at the store and did a fine bit it landscape gardening. See two real red breasted Robbins this morning in our field and the black bird that has winter hear was with them.

Monday, Feb. 6 Fair and awfull cold this morning 10° below zero and a cold that just filled the house. Worked like the dickens putting fire wood under cover all this afternoon, have enough now to last untill May I think. Our chimney got afire this morning and I put ten lbs of salt, pound of soda and 2 boxes soot remover into it.

Tuesday, Feb. 7 Butifull day. Mild and warm and dandy traveling. Practically all bare ground and the ruts and holes filled and frozen with Ice. Vesta has an awfull bad cold and soar throte so bad that she has a big pork rine around it tonight. Guss & Alta in tonight and Guss is pooched with a lame side & sholder.

Wednesday, Feb. 8 Rain and sleet all day. Warm but ye Gods isant it icy. Had to get out of car a dozen times or more and melt the ice from my wind shield. It stormed so I could not work on our fire wood so put in a buisy afternoon in the blacksmith shop sharpening and tempering tools. Died Edger Pottle age 82 yrs.

Thursday, Feb. 9 Overcast and colder. And tonight it is snowing hard. Carried Guss to Camden this afternoon to see doctor Green and he found he has a nice case of shingles, whatever that is. Guss Mathews wife Gladys called on Vesta this afternoon. I bought Vesta a pair of bedroom slippers in Camden allso a pair silk stocking to go with them.

Friday, Feb. 10 Overcast with a soft downy snow all day. Not more than an inch fell and just like frost. Dandy traveling, roads are better now than any time last summer. We see a bunch of robbins this morning in our orchard.

Saturday, Feb. 11 Fair and colder. Still butifull winter weather. Did some more blacksmith work this afternoon. Made a very long and very thin steak knife and put a buck horn handel on it. Some knife.

Sunday, Feb. 12 Another butifull day. Did not take a ride, too cold for the misses. Got the big car all tuned up with the chanes on and then decided it was more sensible to sit by the fire and continue to grow old in comfort.

Monday, Feb. 13 Fair fine day, warm and very slippery. I skidded twice and rolled the tires of my driving wheels and blew the tubes, and this afternoon had a regular [??] of patching tubes and mounting tires. Put a spair shoe on carrier, allso an extra tube in the car.

Tuesday, Feb. 14 Fair and warm a very fine day. Vesta & I went to Belfast this afternoon. She went to see Dr. F.C Small and got a good big assortment of medican. Got a load of groceries. Guss was marooned in town and came back with us, and I got a hair cut at last. Vesta went to Dr Small.

Wednesday, Feb. 15 Warm and rain most all day. Rained hard all last night. And the traveling is some thing to be remembered allmost impossible to keep a car on the road. Guss came this afternoon and we made a pair of ice creepers for him.

Thursday, Feb. 16 Another fine warm day. Aubry Collemer finished hawling my wood tonight. This afternoon I went to Camden and had a new glass put in my wind shield allso new light sewed in the side curtains and a new horn button put on the steering wheel.

Friday, Feb. 17 Butifull warm day. I made a quick trip and got back before it thawed then this afternoon carried Mrs Warren to Camden to take treatment from Dr Pettapiece. While Alta stayed with Mrs Warren Vesta & I went on a little ride over to Rockport.

Saturday, Feb. 18 Snow a light snow has fallen all day. This afternoon I carried Mrs Warren to Camden for her second treatment by Dr Pettapiece. Went in our big sedan and went fine. Tonight Creamer & Betts plowed the road out right down to the tar and the State Road is as smooth and bare as any time in summer.

Sunday, Feb. 19 Fair and colder. Blowing and the air full of flying snow. A few car's out today bucking the snow drifts but not many.

Monday, Feb. 20 Fair and warm fine day. Vesta & I went to Belfast this afternoon. She went to see Dr Small, and surely he is helping her, I can see she is better in only a weeks time since she went to him. Drove a horse over the route today.

Tuesday, Feb. 21 Fair and bitter cold blowing a gale. Drove my Ford on my route today. Got stuck a couple of times, but every thing all right after that. Carried Mrs Warren to Camden this afternoon to see the doctor. She is in bad shape.

Wednesday, Feb. 22 Fair and not very cold didnt have to drive today. Went to Camden this afternoon, got a new spair rim for my car. Raining hard tonight. After I got back shifted and mendid a pair of tires on the Ford.

Thursday, Feb. 23 Fair and warm just like spring the snow went today like smoke and the traveling is fine no snow to bother on the whole route.

Friday, Feb. 24 Fair and very mild all day untill about 3 oclock then it turned cold and its bitter tonight. We had Manly Turner for dinner again today, and a person that will eat no flesh fish or fowl its rather hard to find any thing he can eat. Sister Abbie gave birth to her seventh child and sixth boy today. Carried Mrs Warren to Camden to the Doctors this afternoon.

Saturday, Feb. 25 Fair and colder, made my trip in record time today. And this afternoon Guss & Amos Pitcher helped saw fire wood and gee ant I lame tonight my old soupe bones surely ach. We got all the dry cord wood cut and have the long green wood to do tomorrow between 5 and 6 cord of that. Awfull cold. Tonight and blowing a gale.

Sunday, Feb. 26 Clear and bitter cold 18° below zero this morning. Had a duce of a time to start my car this morning. Guss & I got it startid and went up to the Farm. Got a gallon of oil, then we rigned up the sawing outfit and sawed all day. Finished my fire wood about 15 cord. Amos Pitcher helped again today. Paid him \$4.00. Carried the saw rig home to Frank Collemers tonight.

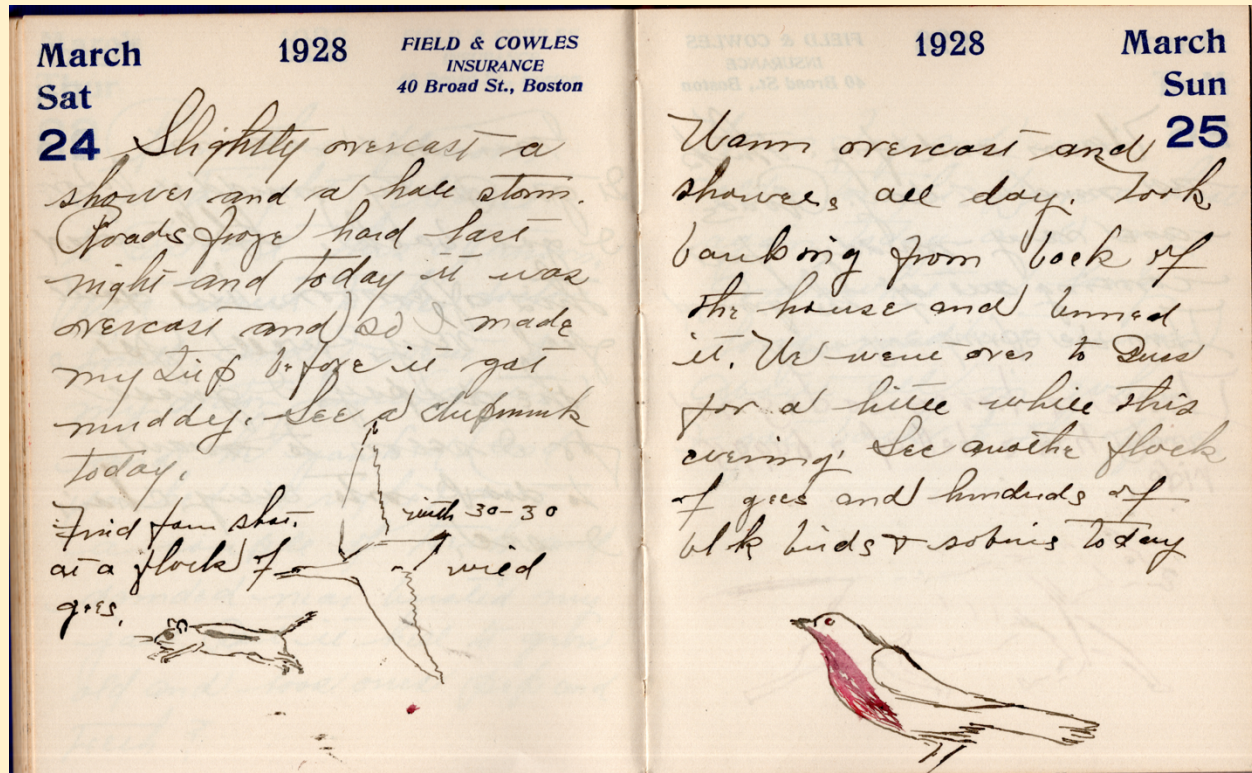

Monday, Feb. 27 Fair and warmer. We Vesta and I went to Belfast this afternoon. She went to see doctor Small, and I did a little shopping bought a new felt hat light gray in color with a \$4./98 price.

Tuesday, Feb. 28 Another fine day. Went to Camden with Mrs Warren this afternoon and while she was receiving treatment, Vesta and I went on a ride down to Thomaston. Dandy traveling no snow and the roads dry.

Wednesday, Feb. 29 Warmer slightly overcast. Split and piled fire wood this afternoon and kept at it untill 9 oclock tonight

Thursday, Mar. 1 This is a fine day warm and spring like went up to the Farm this afternoon. Then went to Belfast. Put my checks in the bank and did a little shopping. Albert Dean finished sawing Guss fire wood. Sent a telegram to S.W.P. asking him for a sworn statement for Salon Bartlett concerning the McKinney property.

Friday, Mar. 2 Fair fine day. Went to Camden this afternoon. This evening we all had a caller. Percy O.M. Wellman came took supper and spent the evening. I split and piled fire wood untill after 9 oclock tonight.

Saturday, Mar. 3 Fair and colder. Nice traveling. I covered my route yesterday & today without chains on the car. Split and piled wood all afternoon. Albert Dean and Guss finished sawing Chas French's wood and mooved the machine down to Eunice French.

Sunday, Mar. 4 Fair and not very cold but a strong S.W. wind blowing a gale tonight. Split and piled fire wood about all day. Made a freezer of [fruit] ice cream and we carried some over to Mrs Warren and fambly tonight.

Monday, Mar. 5 Fair and cold as the dickens. Split fire wood this afternoon and this evening. Finished splitting my green wood. Now have about eight cord of dry mountain wood to split and put under cover.

Tuesday, Mar. 6 Fair and cold, nice day. Split and piled wood this afternoon. Carried Mrs Warren to Camden her eight trip to the doctors. Vesta did a wash this forenoon so did not feel like makeing the trip to Camden.

Wednesday, Mar. 7 Overcast. Snow this afternoon and tonight. I went to Camden for Herb Thomas with 85 lbs dressed chickens. He hauled me a load of hay.

Thursday, Mar. 8 Fair but cold as the devil. Went to Belfast this afternoon. Put some money in the bank and got some medican for Vesta from Dr Small. Borrowed \$25.00 from Hollis Dean for a week and a day.

Friday, Mar. 9 Overcast and cold a raw east wind and it cuts to the boan. This afternoon carried Mrs Warren to Camden to the doctors this makes the ninth trip she has taken. Harry Frohock cut his foot badly. Had to have 3 stitches taken in it.

Saturday, Mar. 10 Fair fine day. Split fire wood all this afternoon and have a goodly bit piled against the wood house all ready to put under cover.

Sunday, Mar. 11 Fair butifull warm spring day. Put a lot if wood in the house. [Orresa] Youngs house got afire but we put it out without much damage.

Monday, Mar. 12 Fair fine day. Split fire wood and put a lot into the wood house. Town meeting day. J.S. Mullin 1st Lawrence Rankin 2nd Geo Nichols 3rd. Horace Miller Town Clerk & Tresurer. Town raised \$14,350

Tuesday, Mar. 13 Fair and very warm. Roads are muddy as the devil and the frost is comeing out. Carried Mrs Warren to Camden this afternoon, the tar road is breaking up.

Wednesday, Mar. 14 Fair and warm the roads froze a little last night, so I got around in my car before they thawed up very much. Pooched one of my

new tires this morning. Drove a sharp stone thro it. Died at the Center Old Charles Drinkwaters wife "Cancer".

Thursday, Mar. 15 Fair and colder and ye gods isant the roads rough. Well a plowed field is smooth beside them. Guss has a job of cutting & burning brush for Geo Allen up on Crehore [*Patent*].

Friday, Mar. 16 Fair and warm, nice day. Went to Camden this afternoon carried Mrs Warren to the doctor this made her 11th trip and I be darned if I think she is as well an she was a month ago. Picked a nale up and had to go to Jamesons Garage and have tire changed.

Saturday, Mar. 17 Snow squalls but a rather nice day. Punched a hole in one of my new tires today. Ant that hell? Havent driven the dinged thing more than a couple of hundred miles.

Sunday, Mar. 18 Snow most all day about 4 inches fell and tirn to rain tonight. Just took it easy today and read untill I couldent see to read no mo.

Monday, Mar. 19 Fair and warm the snow helped out the traveling quite a bit, filled up some of the holes so a car didnt buck quite so badly.

Tuesday, Mar. 20 Another nice day. Split wood all the afternoon, slow job. Big wood, old man hell of a combination

Wednesday, Mar. 21 Fair fine day. Got back early and we went to Camden had my transmission relined and we went to the pictures. Ben Hur.

Thursday, Mar. 22 Rain this afternoon and tonight. Went to Belfast this afternoon. Vesta went to her doctor Small and I went to my doctor Jennace (dentist) and he yanked (and yanked is right) out a couple of teeth and damded near bustid my jaw. Ant it hell to grow old and loos ones pep and teeth?

Friday, Mar. 23 Fair and warm. It got pretty muddy before I got back. Split wood this afternoon, but dont feel very well. Got the dropsy I guess for I seem to want to drop into every chair I see.

Saturday, Mar. 24 Slightly overcast a shower and a hale storm. Roads froze hard last night and today it was overcast and so I made my trip before it got muddy. See a chipmunk today. Fired four shot with 30-30 at a flock of wild gees.

Sunday, Mar. 25 Warm overcast and showers all day. Took banking from back of the house and burned it. We went over to Guss for a little while this evening. See another flock of gees and hundreds of black birds & robins today

Monday, Mar. 26 Warm and fog, thick as mud all day. Roads are very muddy frost comeing out of the ground. Darn the spring any way. Drove a horse today and surely had a hell of a buggy ride.

Tuesday, Mar. 27 Warm fog and rain colder tonight. Drove a horse again today and my god what a long long road it was. About all in when I got back to the offace.

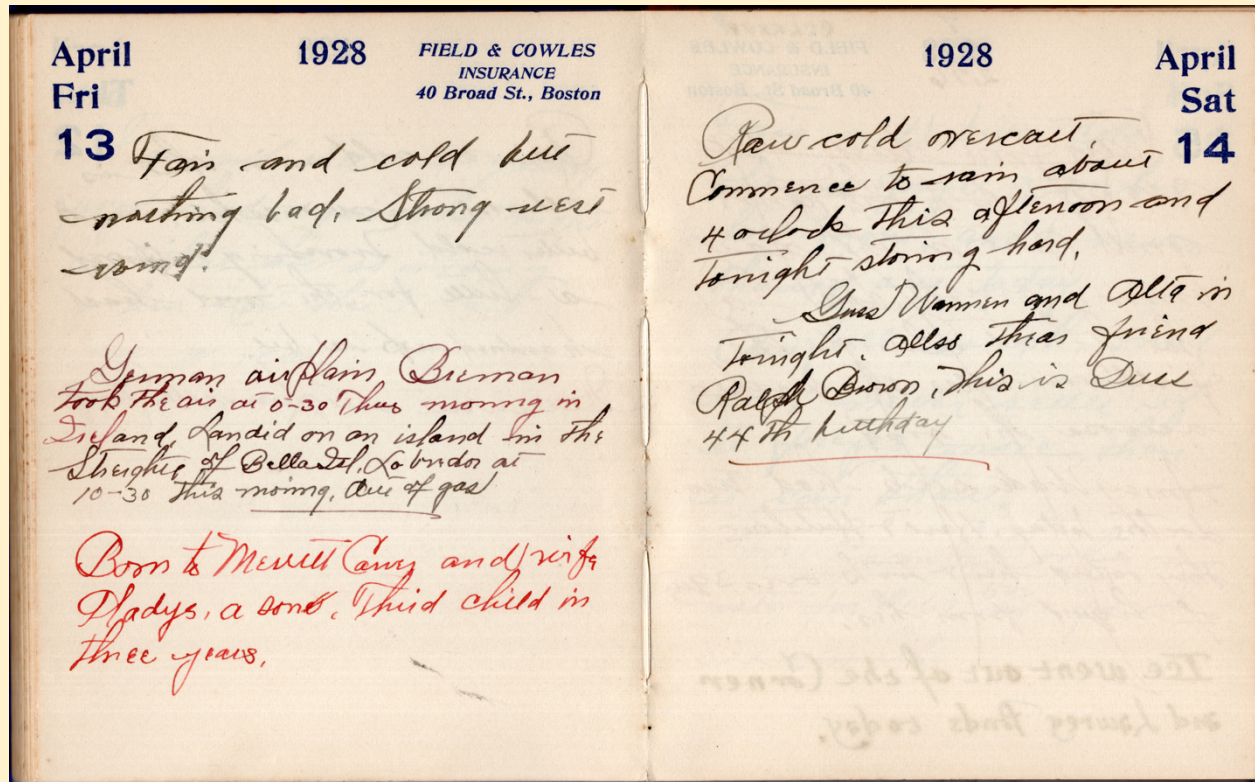
Wednesday, Mar. 28 Fair fine day. Drove my car on route today. It froze solid last night and I made the trip before it thawed much. Had all kinds of tire trouble today and skidded into the ditch once but managed to drive out without trouble.

Thursday, Mar. 29 Another fine day froze hard again last night and I hustled over the route, but came in on two flat tires rear. One came off so I could not get into the yard. After dinner I put a pair of tires on and got into the garage at last.

Friday, Mar. 30 Overcast cold raw wind. Went to Camden this afternoon and had new springs front and rear put in my car a new pair Firestone tires on rear a new torcion rod put in. Snowing hard tonight. Roads very bad between the Beach and Camden.

Saturday, Mar. 31 Overcast and cold a blamed cold wind blowing with a few small snow squalls. Drove my car again today. First trip with the new skid chanes and Firestone tires. About 4 inches of snow fell last night and that made the traveling rather bad.

Sunday, Apr. 1 Fair and some cold, with some snow squalls and some wind. We all didn't do anything today but read and play the phonograph.

Monday, Apr. 2 Fair fine day covered route with car. This afternoon took Vesta & Alta up to the farm and we all burned brush. Guss went up this morning and repaired [fish] the fence. Gave my note to Mont Heal on Security Trust Co for six months \$79./90

Tuesday, Apr. 3 Fair fine day. Went in car today roads getting too muddy for [??] rideing, and Oh God so rough. Went up to the Farm this afternoon and helped Guss saw his fire wood. Robie Ames sawing outfit. Billy Creamer helped. Died in Walpole Mass Emily H Munroe wife of Cap. John Munroe age 84 yrs

Wednesday, Apr. 4 Warm and hazy regular spring weather. Roads very very muddy. Went with a horse and will have to drive them the rest of the month. Died Jerry Young, Age 74 yr's. Signed a \$150./00 note with "Amborn" on the Camden National Bank for six months.

Thursday, Apr. 5 Fair and very warm a fine day. Roads very muddy frost coming out. Pulled a front shoe from one of my horses today. Went to Camden this afternoon got 3 bag oats \$6.15 Bag flour Ham Pot Rosts, and some other groceries. See a fox out by Chas Dickey's.

Friday, Apr. 6 Fair and hot. 82° in the shade at 11 o'clock and the hardest day for mud I ever drove. Stopped at Eliger Morse fed and rested my horse for 45 minutes got back to the office 4-25 tonight. Helluva trip.

Saturday, Apr. 7 Fair and warm. Awful traveling. Pulled a shoe from my mare today. Got as far as Chas Dickey place at 12-10, and fed my horse gave her 45 minutes rest then paddled on got to the office at 4 o'clock.

Monday, Apr. 9 Fair and colder. Ground froze some last night and the roads are a little better today. Special Town Meeting today to raise money to repair the Youngtown road so called. Voted to expend \$1,000 on said road. Also voted to build a new cement bridge at Wiley Corner. Ice went out Andrews Pond.

Tuesday, Apr. 10 Fair and cold. Froze solid last night. I got back at 2 o'clock and Vesta & I went to Belfast. I went to Probate Court in regard Em French will by its [??]. he gave his girl Gertrude \$200.00 and the rest of his property if he had any went to wife Eunice.

Wednesday, Apr. 11 Fair and still cold ground froze hard again last night but there are so many broken spots that I can't use a car.

Thursday, Apr. 12 Rain a cold rain that is almost snow & sleet, and bitter cold. Traveling improved a little for the mud has hardened up a bit. Ice went out Levenseller Pond.

RALPH RICHARDS - 1928

Friday, Apr. 13 Fair and cold but nothing bad. Strong west wind. German airplain Bremen took the air at 5-30 Thurs morning in Iceland. Landed on an island in the Straights of Bella Isl. Labrador at 10-30 this morning. Out of gas. Born to Merritt Carver and wife Gladys, a son. Third child in three years.

Saturday, Apr. 14 Raw cold overcast. Commence to rain about 4 o'clock this afternoon and tonight storming hard. Guss Warren and Alta in tonight. Also their friend Ralph Brown. This is Guss 44th birthday.

Sunday, Apr. 15 Fair fine day. We went up to the Farm and put in the day burning brush. Did a lot of it. Burned the field over also the bushes across the road. Amey Wade sick had two doctors today. Hart & Hutchens. They taped her & took over 3 qts of liquid from her. Ice went out of the Corner and Lawrey Ponds today.

Monday, Apr. 16 Fair and bitter cold. Ground froze 3 inches last night, and never thawed out today. Awful rough. Mud can never settle if it freezes more than it can thaw. Gave Frank Cooper my note for \$167.50/100 for six months.

Tuesday, Apr. 17 Fair and still bitter cold. Wore my fur coat and I was none too warm. So blamed tired couldn't do much work, but did try and start my broken down Ford. No good.

Wednesday, Apr. 18 Another cold day but a little warmer. Went to Camden this afternoon had my mair shod new. \$1.75 Got two bags oats and a bag C Corn \$6.70. Don Patten hauled me a load of hay from Herb Thomas. See a big buck deer this morning up by Carvers corner.

Thursday, Apr. 19 Cold raw and heavy showers. Hale to beat the band. Started taking my old car apart. Stripped the gears in the rear and got it partly apart. Finished this morning.

Friday, Apr. 20 Fair and cold. Very cold tonight. Ground freezing solid. Went to Camden this afternoon got a new master and new pinion gear for the car. Put it partly together this afternoon.

RALPH RICHARDS - 1928

Saturday, Apr. 21 Overcast and showers. Went to Camden this afternoon got a new set of bolts for [??]. Put the rear end in and took head of engine cleaned carbon.

Sunday, Apr. 22 Snow last night over 4 inches snow on the ground. Showers cold as the dickens. Bum kind of a day. Snow and sleet all day. Snowing hard again tonight.

Monday, Apr. 23 Cold awfull with snow & sleet about all day. Worked on the car this afternoon. Got it running but my battery has pooched out.

Tuesday, Apr. 24 Another miserable bitch of a cold snowy rainy day. Startid in this afternoon to wash the kitchen ceiling. Some little bit of a neck breaking work.

Wednesday, Apr. 25 Still cold overcast and generally cussid weather. Mud still deep cant dry out too wet and cold.

Thursday, Apr. 26 A little better today some sunshine and a little warmer. Still putting in my repair time playing I am a fly, washing the ceiling.

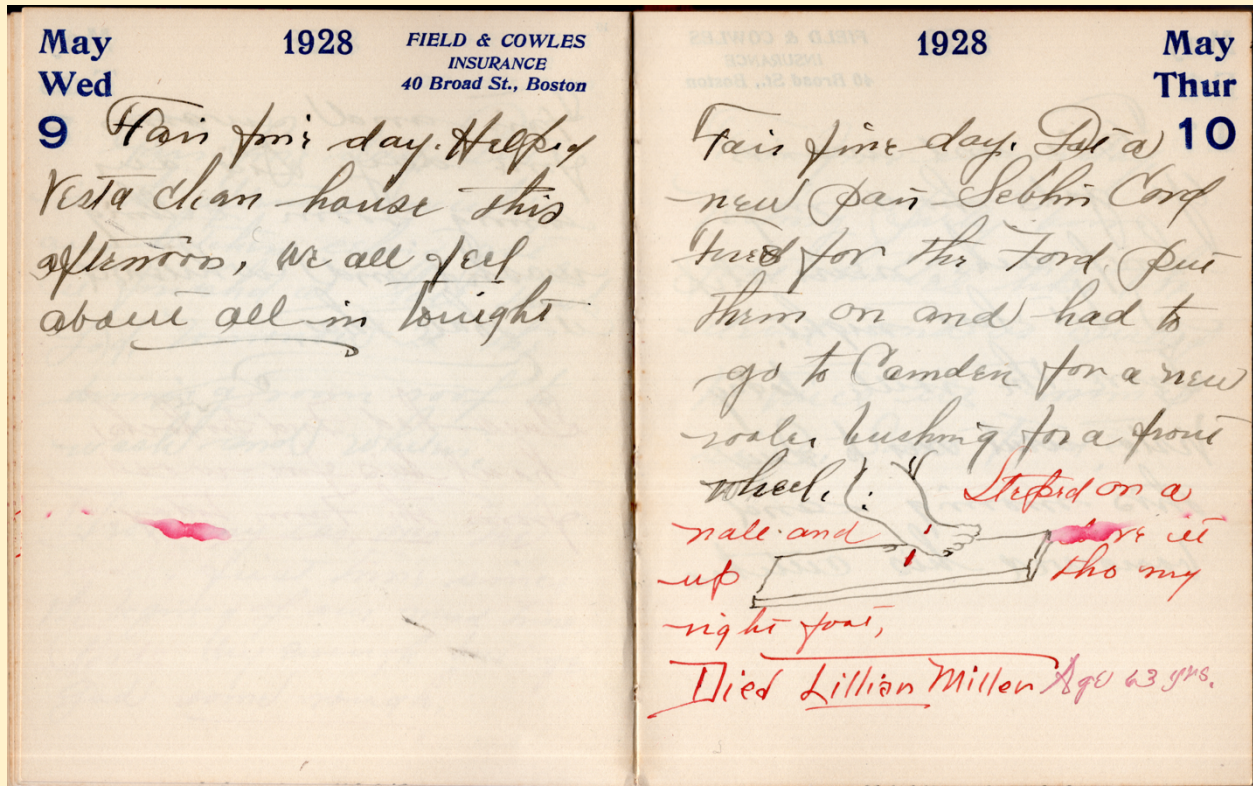
Friday, Apr. 27 Fair and a little warmer. Washed the roof of our kitchen this afternoon have it more than half cleaned now.

Monday, May 7 Fair fine day. Put in the afternoon washing our kitchen celing, got it finished at last thank God. Tomorrow it the dineing room roof to wash and whiten. Drove my car, over the route, first time since the beginning of our mud time. Roads dry enough but ye God some rough.

Tuesday, May 8 Fair and warm fine day. Did our dining room celling washed and whitened it that's that. Guss had Fred Frohock haul his fire wood from the Farm today.

Wednesday, May 9 Fair fine day. Helped Vesta clean house this afternoon, we all feel about all in tonight

Thursday, May 10 Fair fine day. Got a new pair Seblin Cord Tires for the Ford. Put them on and had to go and had to go to Camden for a new roller bushing for a front wheel. Steped on a nale and drove it up thro my right foot. Died Lillian Miller Age 63 yrs.

Friday, May 11 Fair and warm. Ye gods how my hoof achs. Never sleep a bit last night. Drove the route today. Vesta went over to Guss this morning and borrowed his crutches.

Saturday, May 12 Fair fine warm day. Feeling pretty bum foot hurts like the devil and is swelled to twice its normal size. Some Foot?

Sunday, May 13 Fair clear & cold went up to the farm this afternoon. Vesta & Alta worked cleaning up. I painted the gilt letters on the sign. Guss played the gentleman and lofed. Died Adelaide V King Age 77 yr's.

Monday, May 14 Fair fine summer like day only so very cold that it seems like fall. Foot a little better I hope. Trying to make myself think it is anyway.

Tuesday, May 15 Still fair and hear I am tyed down with a punctured hoof and so much work to do I will never catch up.

Wednesday, May 16 Fair and warm cant do any work. Damd and double damd every thing.

Thursday, May 17 Another fine day I guess, the sun is shining and the world is turning green, but hear I am on crutches with a foot big as a sofa pillow. Hells bells. Went to Belfast this afternoon and had our car washed and greeced. Died Harold Inman, Lydia Heals husband. New oil put in Chrysler 21,456 miles. Change again when it registers 22,000

Friday, May 18 Fair fine day. Another of rest and fret. The blue [*devil*] have me for sure. Why in hell must I put up with this any longer?

Saturday, May 19 Overcast fog looks like rain. Went to Belfast this afternoon. Vesta did the shopping while I looked pretty out of the car. Buried Lydia Heals husband Harold Inman, they were married six months ago tonight. Nov-19-1927.

Sunday, May 20 Overcast Raining hard tonight. Harry Frohock came up and I took him out and gave him a lesson in driving a clutch car.

Monday, May 21 Overcast fog rain. Went to Camden this afternoon got the battery for our Chrysler and put it into the car.

Tuesday, May 22 Rain hard all day. Roads just a sea of mud. Awfull hard traveling. Pitcher got stuck in the mud once.

Wednesday, May 23 Thick of fog and rain about all day. Another Special Town Meeting to vote to shift the Federal Aid Road from Rackliffe to the Beach. Beach won 105 votes to 99

Thursday, May 24 And still raining and more mud, can just wallo a car thro.

Friday, May 25 Fog & overcast this forenoon. Cleared this afternoon fine tonight. Helen Collemer went to the Knox Hospital to be operated on for apendicitus.

Sunday, May 27 And still it wont clear away for good. We went up to the Farm and plantid some flower seed and did a little painting.

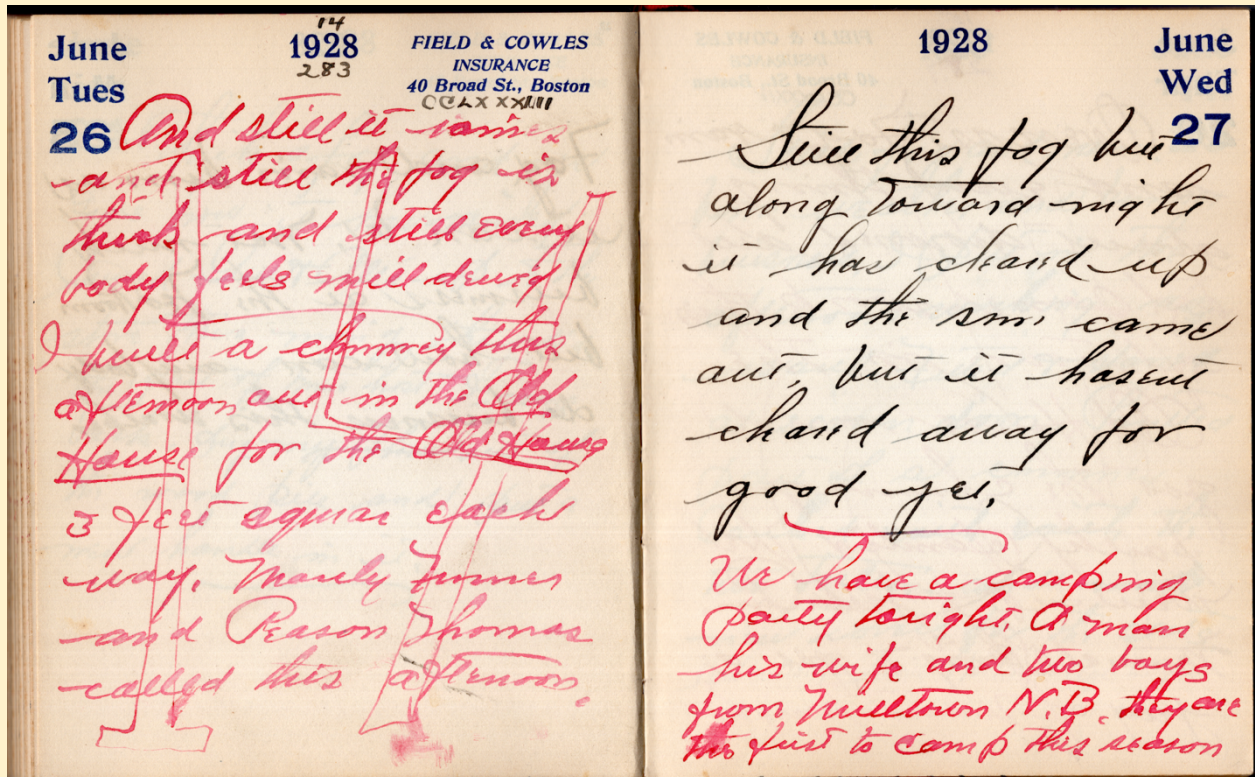
Monday, May 28 Rain and fog bum as can be. We all are about mildewed.

Friday, Jun. 15 Butifull day fair and warm. We went up to the Farm and cleaned house. Wheeled our barn wood in and stowed in the Old House 25 barrow loads. Mother went back with Edith on tonights boat. Mellie Dearborn came over harrowed and furrowed out my garden this afternoon.

Saturday, Jun. 16 Fair and warm. I went up to the Farm this afternoon and plantid 2 quarts early morn peas & a peck potatoes. Went to Belfast got a hair cut and went again tonight and did some shopping.

Sunday, Jun. 17 Fair butifull day. We all went over to Augusta via Belfast & Liberty, spent the afternoon looking over Old Fort Western came home by Waldoboro 120 mile trip

Monday, Jun. 18 Another fine day carried Vesta & Alta up to the Tea House then went to Belfast and ordered a lot of goods from M.T & Co.

Tuesday, Jun. 19 Fair fine day. We all went up to the Tea House and put in the afternoon. Got in a supply of traid goods all put in place with the Ice Cream packed in the new cabinet. Allso the Ice Box iced.

Wednesday, Jun. 20 Overcast, rain this morning. Carried the firm up to thear Tea House and they opened for buisness. Bum day and a small traid as might be expectid.

Thursday, Jun. 21 Fair fine day. Mellie Dearborn came up and mowed the farm for us this afternoon. We all did our bit with the lawn mowers. I plantid this afternoon 200 hills sweet corn, row of lettuce, and 20 hills of cucumbers.

Friday, Jun. 22 Fair fine day. Doing buisness at the Tea House but not much. Awfull dull. Nobody stoping to eat, most of the traveling public takeing thear lunch along with them. Plantid more garden truck this afternoon, about all finished now.

Saturday, Jun. 23 Another fine day but very small traid. Put in the afternoon rakeing up what Mellie Dearborn mowed. Have it all raked and put up into good hay cocks now let it rain. And I think it will tomorrow all right by the way it looks tonight.

Sunday, Jun. 24 Thick fog and ye Gods how it has rained. Carried Guss & Alta up to the store this morning they did the part of Maine host. I came back, dug my plow out of the wood pile and put a new handle in it.

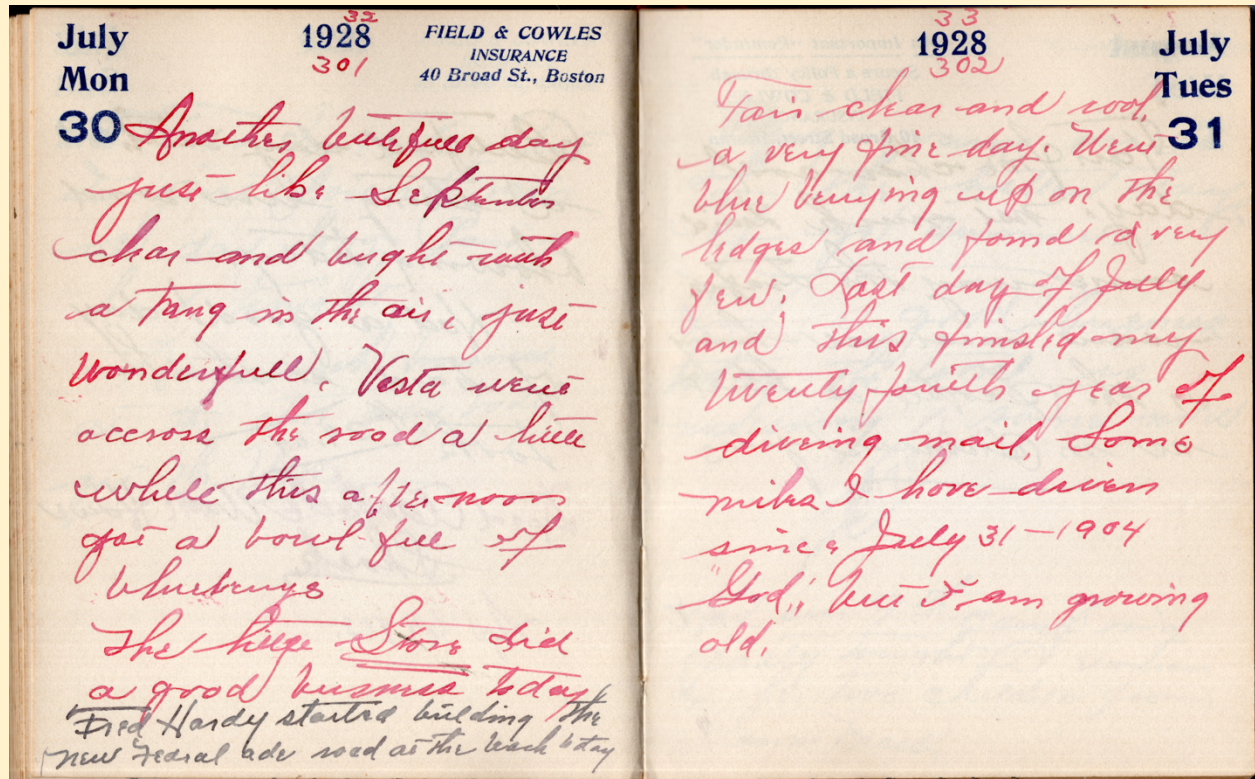

Thursday, Jul. 19 Still fair and very hot. Butifull weather to get hay. My 50th birthday. Vesta gave me a pair if gray knickers and stockings and a pk of Blackstone Cigars Mrs Warren 3 handkerchiefs, Guss 2 neckties Alta a quart [??] butter Father a new pipe. John Wade came home this morning.

Friday, Jul. 20 Another fine summer day. Very hot but nice for hay makeing. Everybody improveing the chance to get thear hay. Jennie McCobb, Louise & Ada with little Tom at the wheel returned to Mass, this morning. Van Thompson wife Marion & the children returned to Conn today.

Saturday, Jul. 21 Fair fine day not as hot as yesterday. A cloudless sky this forenoon meaning a storm soon I think. Patterson & Sylvester put 750 gal, gas into thear tank this morning.

Sunday, Jul. 22 Overcast, Rain hard this afternoon and tonight. No buisness at the Tea Room untill tonight then had a rush They took \$24./75 Our 7th camping party stoped tonight. Mass car.

Friday, Jul. 27 Overcast and raining tonight. Very small traid today \$5.55. Built a brick oven for our baked beans to bake in the ground. Got wood from the Old House one time and built a fire in it. Alta went blueberrying across the road today and got two bowls full. Guss brought up a mess of green peas this afternoon.

Saturday, Jul. 28 Fair fine day but it just powered rain all day long. Raining hard tonight. Not much buisness at the store every body got the blues.

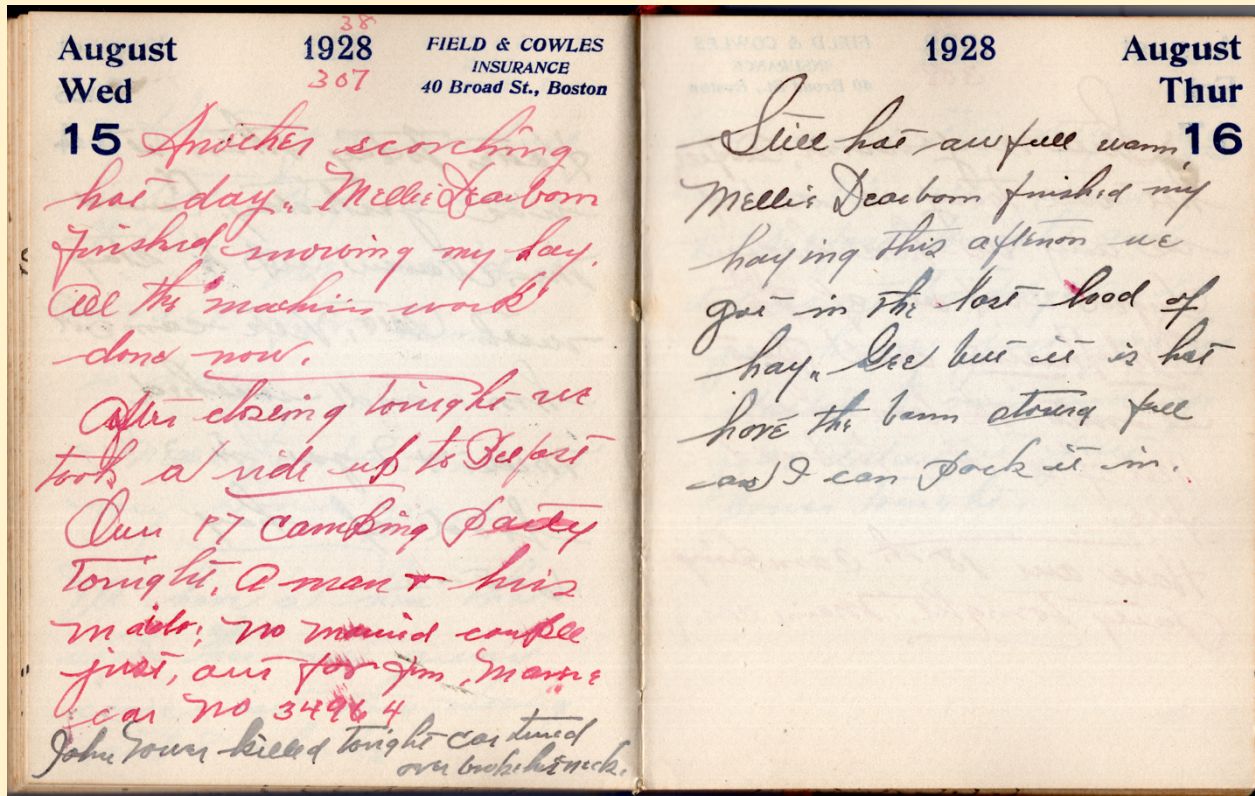

Friday, Aug. 10 Fog and showers bum kind of weather small traid and every body fed up on this weather. Another camping party tonight makeing 15 so far this season

Saturday, Aug. 11 Still fog and rain bum weather. We have another party tonight that makes 16. Ada & Alton McCobb & Tom Andrews blew in this morning from Westboro. Ada took Mrs Warren to see Dr Heart in Camden. They are afraid she has a cancer in her intestines.

Friday, Aug. 17 Still very warm. Awfull hot still. Today is as bad as any we have had yet. Lugged wood out of the Old House and put it into the bean hole. Hell of a day to build a fire. Have our 18th camping party tonight. Maine car.

Saturday, Aug. 18 Fair and still very warm. We all went to Belfast tonight and did some traiding and got home just as it startid to rain and ye gods dident it just power tonight.

Sunday, Aug. 19 Fair fine day cleared away and its been a dandy day \$41./30 in traid. Ralph, Hazel Frank & Eve Brown at the Tea Room this afternoon.

Monday, Aug. 20 Butifull day clear and cool. Alta went blueberrying across the road this afternoon got a bowl full of blueberrys. I took my car out back of the Old House and did some work on it. Had our 19th camping party tonight. Mass car.

Tuesday, Aug. 21 Butifull day clear and cool. Alta went to Camden this afternoon took Mrs W to Dr Heart. Veddie & I kept house. Small traid \$15.45 that's all.

Wednesday, Aug. 22 A butifull day clear and fine. Went up in the woods this afternoon got cedar bords to build chairs. Split one of them out in the Old House. Vesta & Alta each went blueberrying across The Road and both got a bowl full of fine berrys. Good day at the Tea Room took \$22/33. Married Harry Collemer and Genever Mahoney.

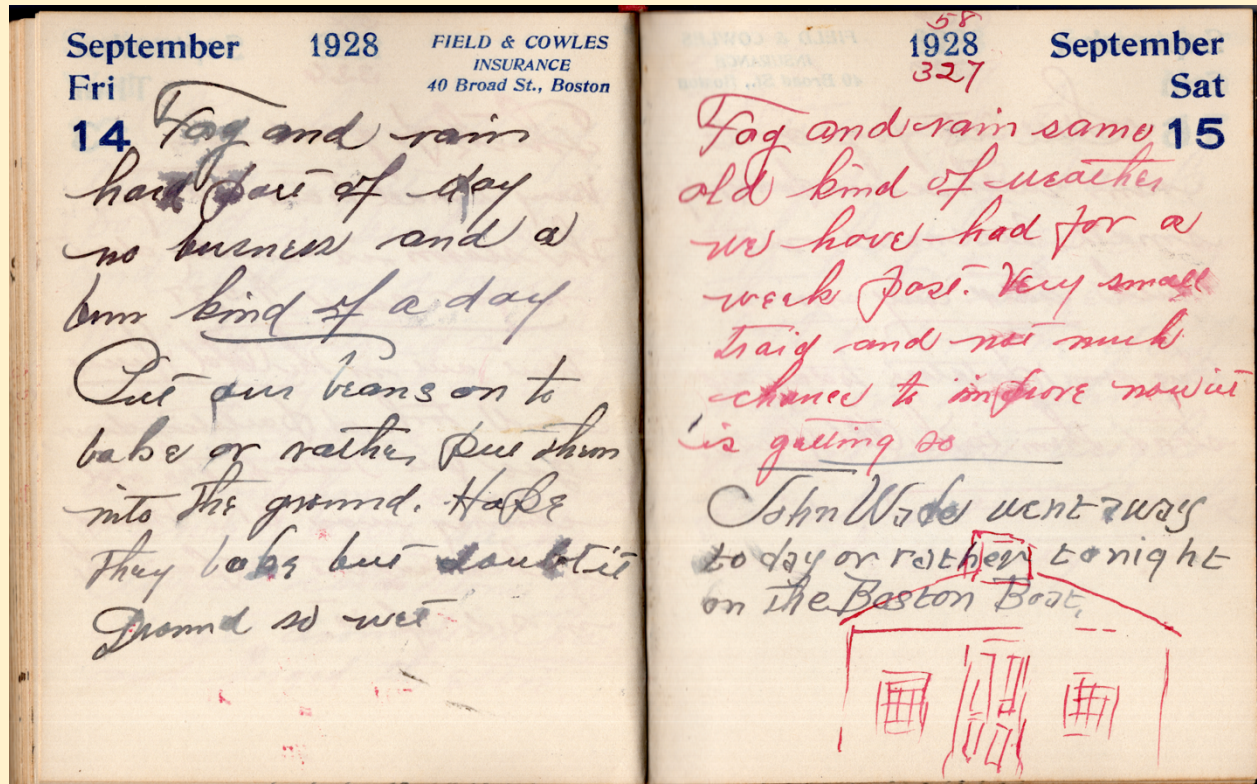
Tuesday, Aug. 28 Fog and showers bum weather and not much traid. Nobody wants to stop in this kind of weather.

Thursday, Sep. 27 Fair day with several small showers. I put in the afternoon cutting and burning brush across The Road.

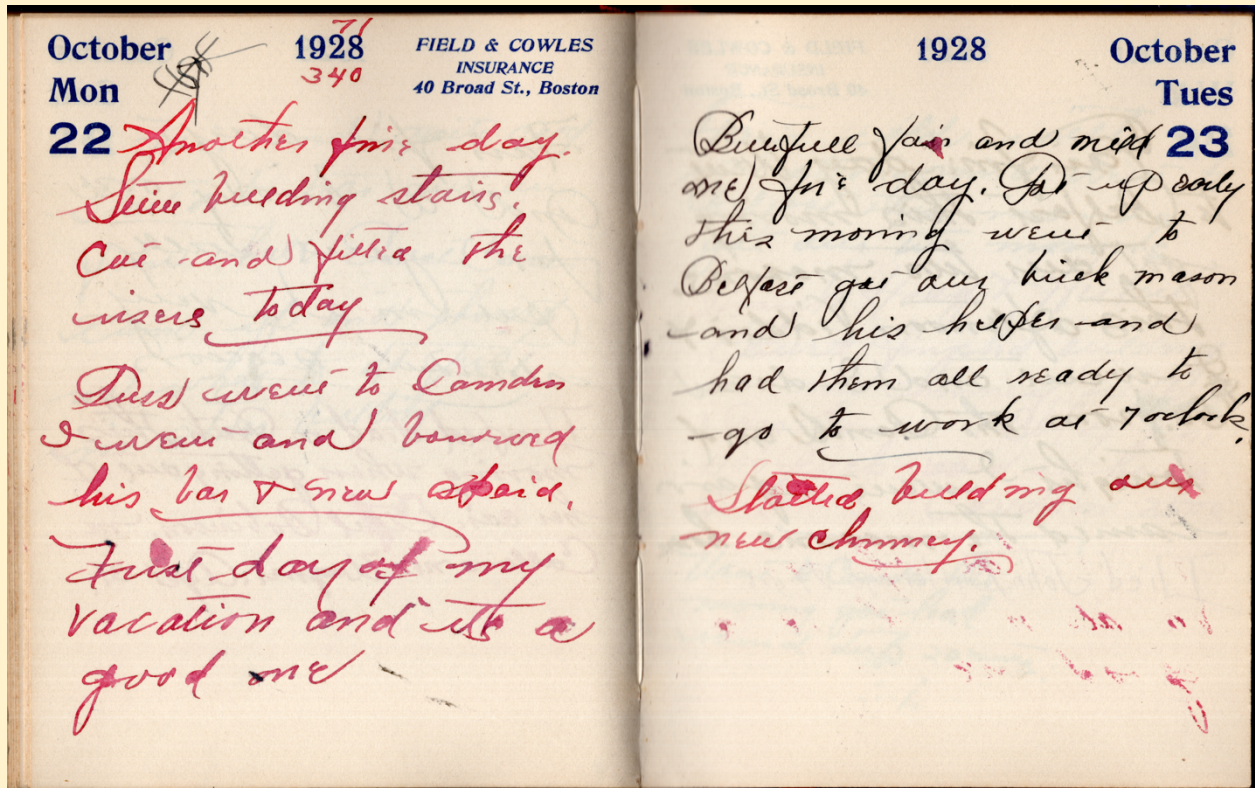
Friday, Sep. 28 Fair and cold with a couple of heavey showers mixed with hale throne in for good mesure.

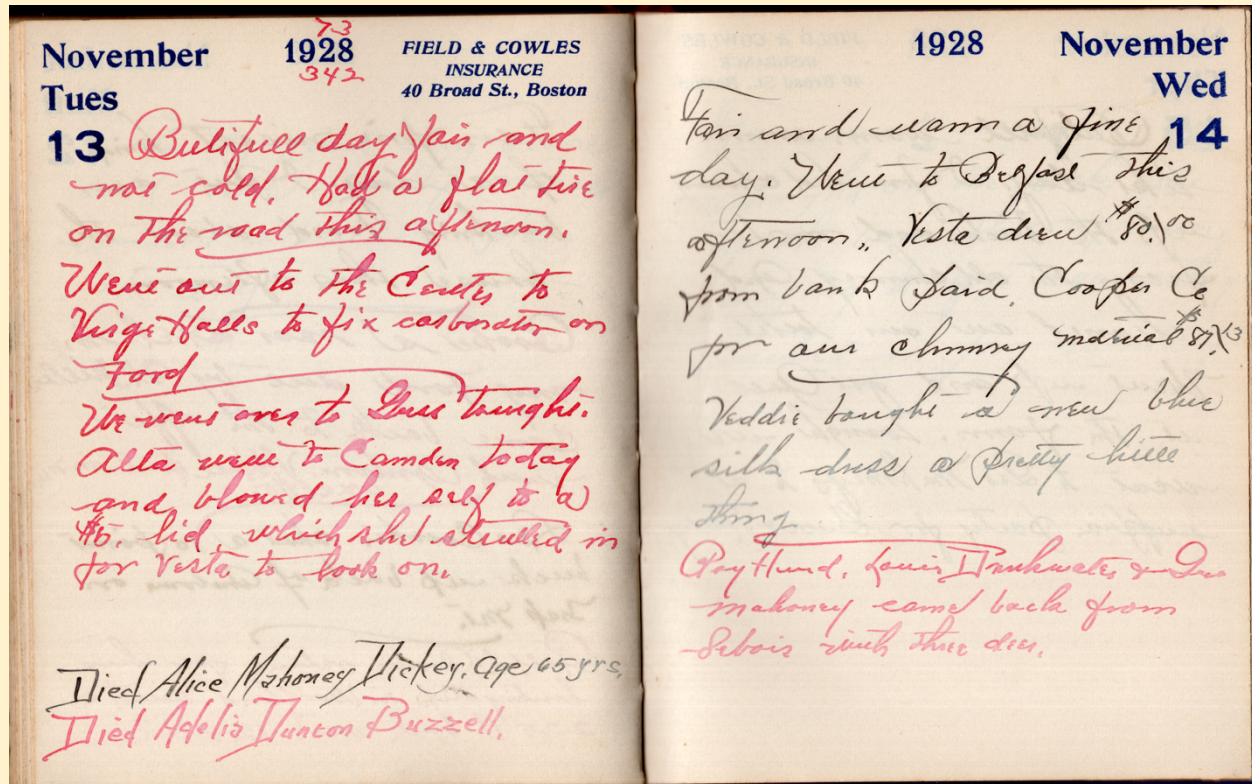
Sunday, Oct. 28 Overcast cold and raw. Worked all day on our stairs. They commence to look like the real thing now.

Saturday, Nov. 10 Fair clear and cold. Have been putting fire wood in today allso put on our last storm door and the storm windows. Went to Camden tonight or rather this afternoon on a wild goos chase.

Sunday, Nov. 11 Fairly good day some cold and partly overcast. Worked about the place all day

Monday, Nov. 12 Fair fine, nicest kind of a day. I put our banking board about the house this afternoon. Broke a rear axel in my Ford out by A.H. Miller came back to the office with Amborn. V. Hall out in new axel \$5. Leo Crooker shot a 10 point buck up back of Amborns on Trap Mt. Ralph Brown returned from his hunting trip in Woodland with a 225 lb buck with 12 points.

Tuesday, Nov. 13 Butifull day fair and not cold. Had a flat tire on the road this afternoon. Went out to the Center to Virgel Halls to fix carborator on Ford. We went over to Guss tonight. 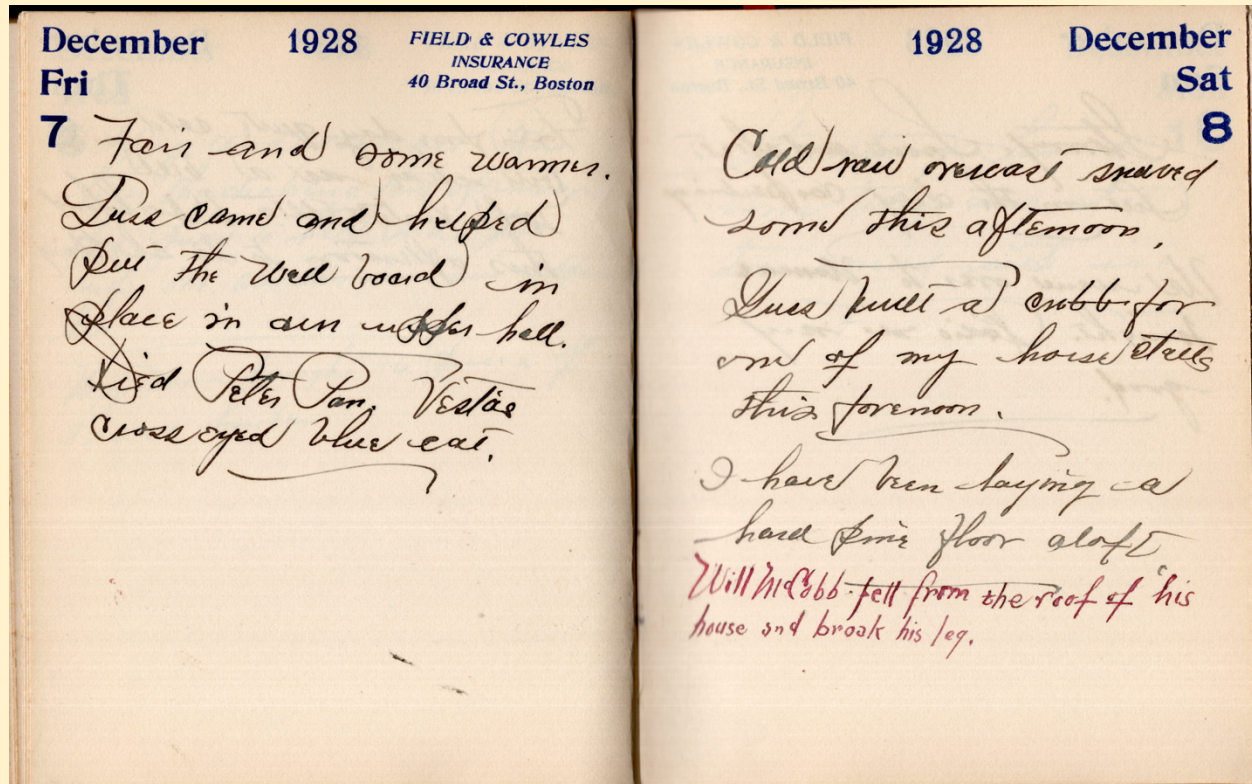

Sunday, Dec. 9 Stormy. Snow and sleet. Put in the day carpentering. We went over to Warrens tonight. Radio not very good.

Monday, Dec. 10 Still stormy. Snowed some today, allso sleet trees covered with ice.

Tuesday, Dec. 11 Butifull day bright and warm. Vesta & I went to Belfast this afternoon and did some Christmas shopping.

Wednesday, Dec. 12 Another fine spring like day. We went to Belfast again this afternoon to do more shopping. Alta went with us. I got a big can of Plastic wood for our finish.

Thursday, Dec. 13 Another wonderfull bright warm day. Still working at our carpentering have been laying more chamber floor this afternoon and studding up a cloth press.

Friday, Dec. 14 Fair and warm. Worked all afternoon and until late tonight putting on wall board and finish.

Saturday, Dec. 15 Fair and very warm. Put in a busy afternoon on our carpentering job up stairs. Killed in a auto accident in Northport Louis Knight. Post Master Helen Knight Hurds brother.

Sunday, Dec. 16 Another beautiful spring like day. Warm and very pleasant. I enjoyed it by taking my Ford apart and putting a new front frame in. It took about all day but it's finished tonight.

Monday, Dec. 17 Warm overcast. Raining hard tonight. This afternoon I finished on our upper hall and around the stairs and hung a door that opens into the east room chamber.

Tuesday, Dec. 18 Warm and overcast. Rained all last night and today the traveling was something cussid. Frost coming out and mud from three to six inches deep. Got stuck repeatedly. Got back at 1-10. The other carriers had their trouble also smashed their tire chains all up.

Wednesday, Dec. 19 Fair fine day. Froze last night and though the roads are very rough the traveling was much better. Had quite a heavy Christmas mail today.

Thursday, Dec. 20 Warmer. Rain this afternoon and tonight. We went to Belfast this afternoon to do some more of Christmas buying, but everything complete. Guss & Alta went with us. Rain hard in town like the dickens.

Friday, Dec. 21 Colder snow and rain some last night about an inch of snow fell and froze. Right in the midst of Christmas mail now. But at our office it's not as heavy as last year. Vesta and I went to Belfast tonight to do a little more Christmas buying.

Saturday, Dec. 22 Fair and cold. 8° above zero this morning. My old Ford doesn't want to start after a night in a cold garage. It's getting old, like myself. Went to Camden this afternoon got a new battery from Waldoboro Garage. Guss & Alta went with me.

Sunday, Dec. 23 Fair and warmer. Put my new battery in the Ford this morning.

Monday, Dec. 24 Fair and very mild finest kind of weather. Heavey Christmas mail. But not as much as last year.

Tuesday, Dec. 25 A wonderfull day fair & warm. Did not have to drive. Vesta got up last night and came down stairs and decorated a Christmas tree for me. First one I ever had and when I got up this morning I was simply speechlis. She gave me two suits of pajamas, pair fine slippers 2 pr stocking two neck ties handkerchiefs. I gave her a new [???], bath salts & face powder. We went after to Warrens Guss & Alta gave Mrs Warren a Christmas tree. They gave Vesta a new silk bedspread and I got a new shirt & tie.

Wednesday, Dec. 26 Butifull day fair and as warm as spring. This afternoon I shingled on the back side of our barn. Just as warm and plesant as any time this fall. Guss burned the tubes out of his radio last night.

Thursday, Dec. 27 Warm and overcast. Raining hard tonight. Shingled on the back of our barn this afternoon. Allso put in a new two light window so one can see about in our wood house.

Friday, Dec. 28 Overcast rain warm. Hard traveling roads have thawed up so, but got thro O.K. Put in the afternoon filling nail holes with plastic wood in our new hall.

Saturday, Dec. 29 Fair and fine a little bit colder tonight clear as a bell and cold. Went to Belfast this afternoon ordered a new door built at Cooper for the closet at the stair head. Two panel. Guss went with me got his Radio condenser mendid.

Sunday, Dec. 30 Clear & cold as the very dickens. Had to take a frozen front shoe from off my Ford and patch a tube. Then put it back on again. Some little trick. Loned Guss my Peerless battery for his radio

Monday, Dec. 31 Butifull clear fine day. Went to Belfast this afternoon. Alta went with us. Veddie went to see Dr Small. I got 2 bags flour 2 lbs butter 2 qts beans ½ lb cream tartar \$4.00. We went over to Guss and watched via
