Hazy cool kind of day Cut a couple of apple trees in lower orchard and battened up pig pen

Hazy A.M. Snowed P.M. Carried down 32 lbs. 10 oz gross weight of Butter to N.D. Ross 21 ½ lbs of ham at 12 cts and 17 lbs. 7 oz of Shoulder at 8 cts. Bought 3 bbls of him Arnie somewhat better but still very sick Did nothing but churn, chore and tend baby Sat up with Arnie

Sunday, February 5

Clear lovely day
Baby a little better A.M.
Em called
I and Olive pretty well dragged having sat up with Baby every night since taken sick
Eve went for Doctor again Came up and left medicine for Baby 10 cts.
Sat up part of night and Olive part with Arnie

Wrote New Age and sent by Bennett
Helped Olive tend baby
Ave called Reckoned up our acct. owe him five dollars to date
Packed one bbl. of apples
Eve at home recorded Bill of Sale for Geo Young while sitting up with Arnie
