Voted, William McFarland Collector of dues at one shilling and half penny per pound, who recognized in the sum of one hundred dollars for the faithful performance of his duty. Gideon Young and John Heal, Jr., sureties, recognized each in the sum of one hundred dollars.

Voted, Hezekiah French, Town Treasurer.

Voted, William Kidder, John Studley, Ephraim Gay, Jona. Mariner,

Daniel Poole, Wm. Moody, Gideon Young, Westbrook Knight,
