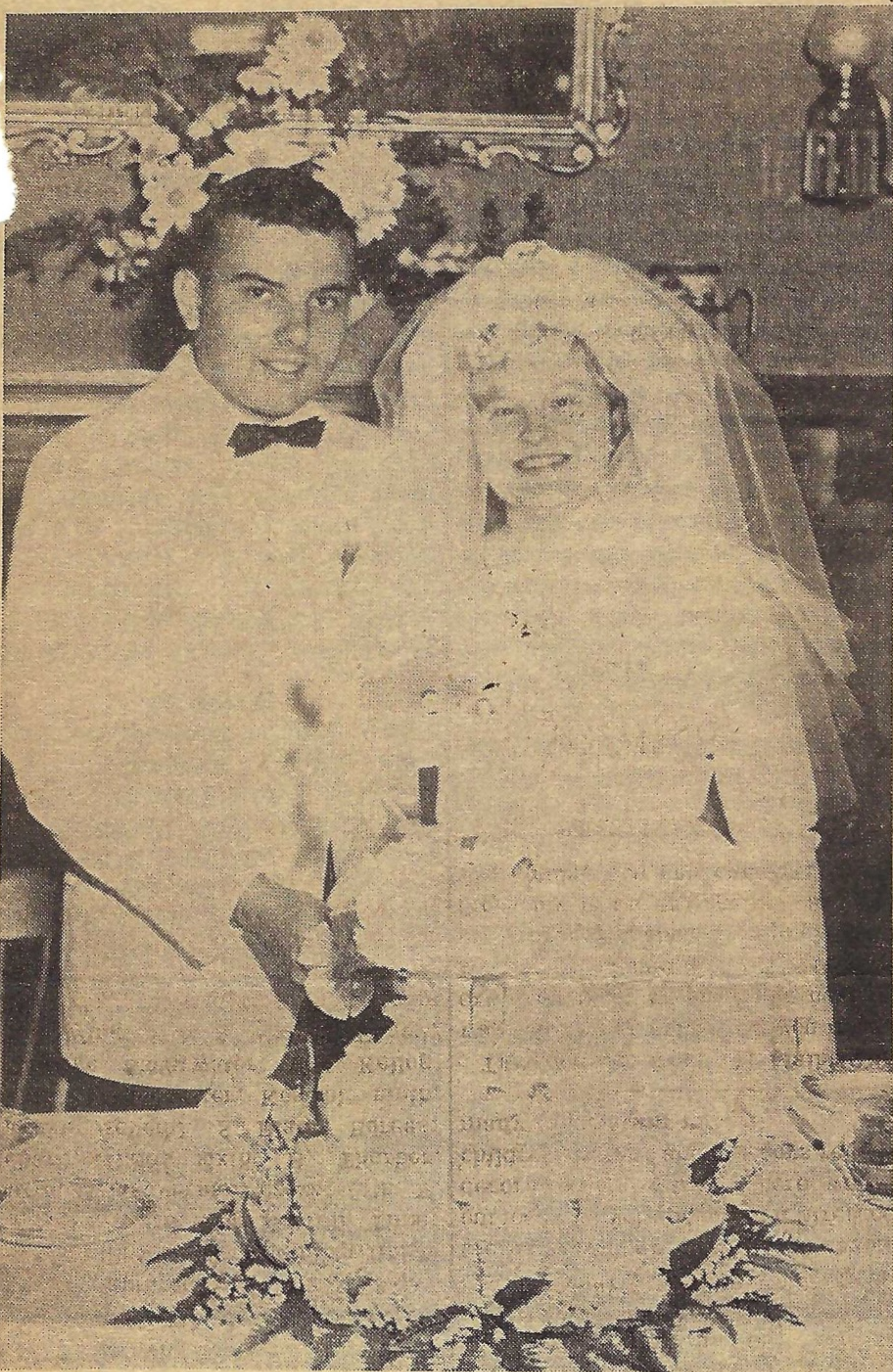


Miss Elinor Hardy Bride Of Norman Beloin July 30
