In the year 1809 there were eight marriages in town. \$700 for town charges and \$400 for schools were raised. Nothing of special interest outside of the regular town business took place in 1809.

Peleg Decrow was put on to the board of selectmen with Abner Heal and Sam'l. Miller. \$400 for the support of schools, \$500 to defray town expenses were raised.
