


RALPH RICHARDS - 1918



Tuesday, Jan. 1 Clear and cold. 25 below zero this morning. Vesta has a new cat came as a New Year visitor. Went over to Ames shop and made a heavy knife this afternoon.

Wednesday, Jan. 2 Another bitter cold day 24 below zero this morning. Our sink spout froze up and busted. Went over to Ames shop and bought a new pipe and put it in this evening.

Thursday, Jan. 3 Bitter cold 21° below this morning. Commenced to snow about noon, awful storm tonight. Emry French drove for Roy today. Walter Alexander and Chas French are painting and papering the Post Office today.

Friday, Jan. 4 Bitter cold snow and blow all day. Roads blocked with snow. Went up thro the Ctr this morning. Could not get from Allen Miller's over to Dad's. So came back straight to the office.

Saturday, Jan. 5 Cold snow and blow all day. The roads are drifted badly, but with the help of shovelers I made my whole route.

Sunday, Jan. 6 Fair and warmer fine day. Have been working around the garage some today laying floor and balling it up.

Monday, Jan. 7 Warm. Rain and soft snow. Damnable hard traveling. Roads are broken but snow very deep. Raining tonight (39 days sleighing)

Tuesday, Jan. 8 Warmer. Snow and rain all day. Damnable hard traveling got back so late no time to do any work.

Wednesday, Jan. 9 Fair and some colder. Startid to build my forge this afternoon. Borrowed \$100 of Hollis Dean for six months.

Thursday, Jan. 10 Fair and colder. Rather hard traveling. Lots of snow. Worked around the building some this afternoon. Vesta is over calling on Mae Everett tonight. 42 days sleighing.

Friday, Jan. 11 Fair clear and cold. 8° below this morning. This afternoon have been building a forge got it started any way. Walter Richards came in stoded tonight.

Saturday, Jan. 12 Snow, hale and rain all day. Hellish old storm and cussid hard traveling. Rural carrier exam in Belfast to fill vacancy made by Roy Hurd resigning.

Sunday, Jan. 13 Fair and colder. Vesta and I went out to her home this afternoon. Roads are awfull rough.

Monday, Jan. 14 Fair and cold this morning. Warmer tonight. Jack has a durned bad nigh hind ankle. Damd the cussid luck anyway. 46

Tuesday, Jan. 15 Snow awfull hard all day. Warm and raining tonight about a foot of snow fell making over two feet any place. 47

Wednesday, Jan. 16 Fair and warmer. Awfull hard traveling, did not get out to E. Searsmtont today. Roads not passable. See a fox this afternoon up by Chas Frohock's.

Thursday, Jan. 17 Fair and not very cold but ye gods the traveling is something horrible. Made my trip all right but it went blamed hard.

Friday, Jan. 18 Fair and warmer. Traveling a little better. Guss Warren raffled off a lamp big one at "Cobb Store" tonight. Billy Robb got it for 22¢. 50 days sleighing.

Saturday, Jan. 19 Another fine mild day. Went over to "Ames Shop" this afternoon and fitted up a pair of hind shoes for Jack.

Sunday, Jan. 20 Fair and cold. Worked a little around in the shop but could not do much work. Too cold. Shod Jack new behind. 52

Monday, Jan. 21 Fair and cool, rather hard traveling today. Jack Law gave me 100 ft [?] rope for a cloth line tonight.

Tuesday, Jan. 22 Fair and cold today. Snowing tonight. Borrowed a volume of the town record from town clerk Rankin first volume. Great reading.

Wednesday, Jan. 23 Another clear cold day. Roads were drifted some. Awfull winter for wild birds. Hundreds of wild duck are hanging around the shore trying to get something to eat.

Thursday, Jan. 24 Fair and not very cold, only down to zero this morning. Did a little work around the place this afternoon.

Friday, Jan. 25 Snow all day, about 5 inches of soft snow fell. Went over to Ames shop and got my sleigh draw rod mendid then broke it again putting it on. Hell. Note due Camden Nat Bank \$103.00

Saturday, Jan. 26 Fair clear and cold. Wind blowing hard and roads drifted pretty full of snow. Guss & Alta Warren, Vera Andrews, Vesta and I went up to Saturday Cove to a drama & dance tonight. 20° below zero.

Sunday, Jan. 27 Clear and cold 5° below this morning. Bay was frozen over as far as one could see. Bitter cold tonight.


Monday, Jan. 28 Clear and bitter cold, 24° below this morning. The bay is frozen over clear across to the islands. Vesta is down to Jack Law's tonight getting Lettie to take part in a sociable she is getting up.

Tuesday, Jan. 29 Clear and cold. Awfull cold and powerfull hard traveling. The snow is so cold that sleigh runners grind like hawling over bair ground. 61 days of sleighing.

Wednesday, Jan. 30 Clear and very cold. The roads are getting in good shape again. Hundreds of black duck & mallards are starving to death since the bay froze over.

Thursday, Jan. 31 Bitter cold, 24° below zero this morning. Have been working about the place this afternoon. Lawry Rankin hawled a ton of hay to Cyrus McKinney's \$13. Days of sleighing 63.

Friday, Feb. 1 Clear and very cold, 24° below this morning. Very cold all day. Wild duck, Black and Mallard are dying by the dozen this winter since the bay froze over.

Saturday, Feb. 2 Fair and cold. Way below zero this morning. Tonight Guss & Alta Vesta and I went out to the Hills School House to a Red Cross time Deedie had she made \$12.10

Sunday, Feb. 3 Some warmer and it is snowing hard and has been all day. Big steamer loaded with cale, trying to buck a passage through the ice today. She can't do it, but she did in time. 66

Monday, Feb. 4 Cold overcast, about a foot of very light snow fell, just like feathers. Blowing hard tonight and tomorrow will be hell for [??].

RALPH RICHARDS - 1918

Tuesday, Feb. 5 Awfull day, 24° below this morning and the glass has not been above 10° below all day. Roads drifted full of snow. Roy only got as far as the Ctr. I made my whole route.

Wednesday, Feb. 6 Awfull cold and has snowed hard all day. Made my whole route but Pitcher did not do but about half of his. After I got to bed tonight Pete Cross and 4 quarts of whiskey blew in.

Thursday, Feb. 7 Bitter cold and awfull hard traveling. Roads blocked badly. Today a bunch of fellows from the Beach walked across the bay on the ice to the Island. 70 days sleighing

Friday, Feb. 8 Snow most all day and awfull cold. The very worst kind of a winter. Pete is still with us. And has a devil of a cold. Pete gave me a big heavy gold Signet Ring. "Some Ring"

Saturday, Feb. 9 Married Maud McKinney and William Meherven [?] Some warmer, and an awfull snow storm. Commenced snowing this morning, about a foot has fallen snowing hard tonight. Pete went out to the Ctr this afternoon.

Sunday, Feb. 10 Snow most all day, a fine dry snow. Some warmer. Have a hell of a head ach. Have been shoveling out our paths. Took me most all day.

Monday, Feb. 11 Fair and quite cold. Awfull hard traveling roads full and the snow knee deep. Did not get back to the office until 4-30 tonight.

Tuesday, Feb. 12 Warmer, Snow this morning Rain all the rest of the day. Thick fog tonight and warm. Cussid hard traveling, worse tomorrow. V has gone over to Alta Warrens this evening.

Wednesday, Feb. 13 Fair and not very cold, but the roads are quite slumpy. Darned hard traveling. V has gorn down to Angie Drinkwater's this afternoon. 76

Thursday, Feb. 14 Died Charlie (Turk) Pendleton. Fair and warm, but a little better traveling. Charlie Pendleton went into the house of Capt. John Monroe about noon today. Complained of a pain in his heart, then fell from his chair Dead.

Friday, Feb. 15 Rain like hell all day. Warm. Came out clear, awfull slumpy. Roads so bad I did not get out to Searsmont all day, Damdable. Colder tonight.

Saturday, Feb. 16 Clear and colder. Roads are very rough. Cussid traveling. V had a crowd of femail women up home tonight rehearsing for her time. I went down to Em's and played cards. 79

Sunday, Feb. 17 Clear and colder. Snowed a little last night. Ice had broken up pretty well in the bay. Good.

Monday, Feb. 18 Fair and colder. Roads are very rough. Oscar Gould's barn roof fell in yesterday. Weight of snow took it down.

Tuesday, Feb. 19 Snow, rain and warmer, snowed a thick soft snow. Tonight it's a howling gail. V had a part of her theatrical company up to rehurse tonight. Days of sleighing 82

Wednesday, Feb. 20 Blowing great guns. Just rained in buckets last night. Roads were terribly slumpy today. A horse would bury all up thro the drifts.

Thursday, Feb. 21 Clear and cold and rough? Ye gods, Some thing cussid. This evening V in having another rehursal and I went down to Emrys and played cards.

Friday, Feb. 22 Raw and cold. Very cold way below zero this morning and the bay is frozen over as far as one can see. Snowing tonight. Have boxed and played pool down at Kobs Store today.

Saturday, Feb. 23 Fair and warmer. Pretty good day. V went down to the hall this afternoon and swept and cleaned it up.

Sunday, Feb. 24 Warm, snow squalls. Very warm tonight. V has a very bad soar throte. Have been working around my Henry Ford this afternoon.

Monday, Feb. 25 Fair and warm, fine day. V has a rehursal of her time down at Freeman's Hall tonight. Sent a letter up to F Finn's for him to send me a pr of hip rubber boots. 88

Tuesday, Feb. 26 Stormy warm and damd slumpy. Rain part of the day hard traveling. Blowing hard tonight and colder.

Wednesday, Feb. 27 Fair and cold. Roads are awfull rough, full of deep holes. V had a rehursal down at the hall tonight. 90

Thursday, Feb. 28 Warm overcast, looks like rain. V has another rehursal tonight. Got a pair of rubber boots today from Fred Finn \$5. 91

<p>1918 Fair and cold. Bum traveling. About noon clouded up and commenced to snow. Chas away and is fair and colder tonight.</p> <p>1918 Fair fine day, but still the traveling is on the bum. Spider wood like the many devil today, but ye gods the pile does seem to grow much smaller.</p> <p>1918 Fair overcast rain and a very strong SW wind. Damp all traveling and ye gods such chomping. Made my wife trip Lucy Rankin. Found me another load of hay 54 days sleighing.</p> <p>1918 Fair and warm, but traveling some thing terrible. About all in. Tonight hardly got to sleep though when I had a bad attack with her heart. Fair a fine start and got water heated.</p> <p>1918 Fair fine day. Dumb to town only to Pleasant Village and got a horse for two months.</p> <p>See 2 chipmunks</p>	<p>1918 Fair fine day, but ye gods how the wind has blown. Town meeting day. Sam Kid 12 and Ross and Henry Peavy 3rd section of Hucker, Freeman & Gordon collection. Have driven 104 trips in my top sleigh this with 104.</p> <p>1918 Fair and cold very cold. Visited some houses this afternoon. V. is attending the sewing circle today just him for months. Pitt was up to see us tonight. Just never home.</p> <p>1918 Rain hard all day. Only got as far as "Dayton" this morning. Suppose it is impossible to get over the roads.</p> <p>1918 Fair, and warm fine day. "Dayton" drove down with his lame horse this afternoon. Have built a cow pen in the barn floor for to put our cow in to dry.</p> <p>1918 Fair fair and warm, but full day. Town meeting day. Ugly 1st H. Freeman, Ross Richards 3rd, H. L. Johnson, John Johnson Collection. Broken sled. See blue birds today</p>

Friday, Mar. 1 Snow most all day, not very cold. Another rehearsal tonight. Went up to Ems this evening and played cards.

Saturday, Mar. 2 Fair fine warm day. V gave her Red Cross time tonight at Freeman's Hall and cleared \$31.76. Big time took in \$36.36. Good enough for a (26 year birthday). 93 days sleighing

Sunday, Mar. 3 Fair but blowing a awfull wind and such a raw cold wind. After last night don't feel very spry today. 94

Monday, Mar. 4 Fair and warm. Tonight we Guss & Alta Warren V & I went out to the Grange Hall to a dance. Had a dandy time 50 couple.

Tuesday, Mar. 5 Fair and not very cold. Nice sleighing. Have got a hell of a cold in my head too much dance. 96

Wednesday, Mar. 6 Rain, nasty foggy bitch of a day. Clear away and fair tonight. Guss Alta V & I went to Camden tonight to the pictures. A Daughter of the Gods. Annett Kellerman the great swimmer. "She's a wonder".

Thursday, Mar. 7 Very cold, raw east wind, cold enough to blister one's face. Commence to snow at noon, has kept it up all day. V went to a Red Cross sewing meeting down at Nell Brown's. 98

Friday, Mar. 8 Snow most all day. Clear tonight. Dandy sleighing. Got 2 lbs sugar yesterday at the P.O. and 4 lbs today from Kobb Bros. We are rich with 6 lbs sugar.

Saturday, Mar. 9 Fair and fine nice morning. Been a dandy warm nice day. Went down to "Kobbs" store this evening and played pool until ten o'clock tonight. 100

Sunday, Mar. 10 "Cold" very cold. Snow all day strong nasty wind blowing. Just bitter outdoors. Have had the roomiticks in my right sholder for a week can hardly move my arm. Hell.

Monday, Mar. 11 Fair and cold. Awfull storm yesterday all roads blocked. Town Meeting day but had to postpone until next Wed. I was the only driver that covered my whole route. Belfast & Liberty or Belfast & Sears mont stage did not get through. Neather did the Lincolnville Ctr & Belfast. I stoped out to Eliza Morse and got dinner, fed my horse and got back to the office at 4 o'clock. Days of sleighing 102.

Tuesday, Mar. 12 Fair and cold. Bum traveling. About noon cloudid up and commenced to snow. Clear away and is fair and colder tonight.

Wednesday, Mar. 13 Fair fine day but gee whiz how the wind has blown. Town Meeting day. Sam West 1st, Luch Russ 2nd Henry Peavey 3rd selectmen. A.H. Pitcher Treasurer B. Goodwin collector. Have driven 104 trips in my Top Sleigh this winter. 104.

Thursday, Mar. 14 Storm snow most all day, damd weather anyway. Went clambing tonight got a peck big fellows. Very cold tonight. 105

Friday, Mar. 15 Fair and blowing a howling gale. And I am sick as a bitch pup. Ate too much clamb stew. Allmost pooched me. Died Wilbur Mahoney "Shock". 106

Saturday, Mar. 16 Fair and cold, but not as bad a day as yesterday. Feel some better today, but am not feeling very sprightly. Mrs Cilley operatid on for hernier.

Sunday, Mar. 17 Fair and warm fine day. V and I took a ride out to her home this afternoon, nice sleighing only too much snow. Found a skunk in our hen house this morning. "Shot him" 108

Monday, Mar. 18 Fair and warm. Dandy day. Have been working like a bitch this afternoon repairing my top sleigh, it is pretty well shook up.

Tuesday, Mar. 19 Fair fine day, warm. The snow has just schoatid [?] today. Went out and got a load of grain. Nice and warm tonight. Roy Hurd took his 2nd degree in Masonry tonight. 110

Wednesday, Mar. 20 Another fine warm day. I sold my skunk to Wash Tower miskined [?] for 75¢. Snow went like smoke today. See 6 fine big red breasted Robbins. Spring is here.

Thursday, Mar. 21 Fair and warm fine, but ye dog's what a slumpy traveling day. Some thing cussid, two feet of snow every place in the road, with many drifts of 4 & 5 feet. 112

Friday, Mar. 22 Overcast fog and a drizzle part of the day, but as it froze some last night the traveling was a little better. See many blackbirds and Robbins today.

Saturday, Mar. 23 Clear and cold. Strong west wind been blowing almost a gale all day. We have had now 114 days of sleighing. Frank Pendleton, Cap. of a barge, broke thro the wharf at New London Conn, fell, caught by his neck between two spiles & strangled to death. 114

Sunday, Mar. 24 Clear and colder. It has been a fine day but my rumittick is so bad I couldn't enjoy it much and now I have a hell of a cold and a soar throte. Damnation, say I.

Monday, Mar. 25 Fair and warmer, fine day. Snow melted pretty fast. Took our car tonight and V and I went down to Nell Brown's, first time I have driven the car this year. 116

Tuesday, Mar. 26 Overcast, cloudy, air quite cold this morning. Looks like rain. Drove out to Dad's tonight and got a load of grain tonight. Full moon and light as day. Good sleighing. 117 days sleighing.

Wednesday, Mar. 27 Clear and cool, but a dandy morning. Sleighing is getting thin. Lots of Robbins, Blackbirds and bair ground.

Thursday, Mar. 28 Fair fine day, but hard traveling thair is so much bair ground. Can't go in a wagon, thear are too many deep drifts.

Friday, Mar. 29 Another butifull spring day. Clear and cool. Getting to be cussid hard sleighing. So much bair ground. 120

Saturday, Mar. 30 Fair fine day. Yes very warm. E. French drove on No 1 route today. Clarence Hurd went to day, into the army at Camp Devens drafted. So did Walter Clark. Sidney Young's building burned today, no insurance. Dee came down with me this afternoon. 121

Sunday, Mar. 31 Another foine day. Easter Sunday. Took "Henry Ford" and carried V and Dee up to church to the Easter convent [?]. Durned muddy from the house to state road. 122 Days of sleighing.

<p>19th Clear and cold. Days hard this morning so the traching-eggs was as bad as got around to the office in fairly good time.</p> <p>19th Fair and some warmer. Spent the day wood this afternoon. And set a dozen more traps.</p> <p>Caught two nice big night rats.</p> <p>Pay due Sarah Knight \$52.50.</p> <p>19th Fair slightly overcast. But a few short afternoons. He bought me a 5' 18 cord. Went fishing up the brook for 10 fm trout.</p> <p>19th Fair fine day. Roads drying up fine. Ray Head drove his car out to the Cts. yesterday.</p> <p>19th Overcast warmer. About 6 inches snow this morning came in wagon.</p> <p>Billie Kops Catches finger off 252nd. Married Carrie Clark & Ike Hagg.</p>	<p>19th Rainy day fair and cold. Some traps hard last night. Some mud and a few more. Got 2 eggs from our pure bred Light Bramas. The first.</p> <p>19th Fair and warmer. Fair two more rats this morning. And some. Son of a bitch. I think it is Russell (some) spring growth. I had set over in the salt marsh and back one.</p> <p>19th Rain and full storm. just downed all day. one of the heaviest rain storms we have had in years. Got pretty things soaking wet. Heavy thunder and lightning this afternoon. Tom Pearson operaticon in Boston. Concert.</p> <p>19th Fair fine day. Vista went to Minnie Young tonight to a directors meeting of Community Hall Corporation. W. of them elected Vice President. Mrs. Alice Minnie came home from Belpre.</p> <p>19th Fair fine day. Cloudy but warm. Danabek had traveling and some bad mud holes.</p>

Monday, Apr. 1 Another butifull spring day. Roads are very muddy in places and deep drifts in others. Fred Clark has bought the "Coleman Place", and is mooving in. Look out for another house burned.

Tuesday, Apr. 2 Thick of fog this morning. Warm. Cleared away fine, but mud, mud, mud, frost coming out all over the roads. Terrible traveling. Fred Clark has bought, and is mooving into the Coleman House.

Wednesday, Apr. 3 Fair and damd muddy. When I got back this afternoon Molly was taken with cramps in her off hind leg. Guess that is the end of her this time. Hell.

Thursday, Apr. 4 Clear and cold. Froze hard this morning so the traveling was not as bad, got around to the office in fairly good time.

RALPH RICHARDS - 1918

Friday, Apr. 5 Butifull day fair and cold. Ground froze hard last night, some mud and awfull rough. Got 2 eggs from our pure bred "Light Bramen's". The first.

Saturday, Apr. 6 Fair fine and warm. Froze very hard last night, so helped out on the traveling some today. Got pretty damed hard going by afternoon. Mud deep.

Sunday, Apr. 7 Another butifull day. Heavy freeze last night. Went up the Sleepy Holler Brook this morning fishing and got a fine bunch of trout, caught 40. Some catch.

Monday, Apr. 8 Fair and not very warm. Have to still use my fur coat. Roads are very muddy, lots of mud holes. Pete Cross came drifting in tonight from Providence R.I.

Tuesday, Apr. 9 Another fine day, warmer, and blamed hard traveling. Been smashing up my old boat for fire wood this afternoon. Amos Mahoney has bought of Fred Clark the "Churchill Place" and is mooving in.

Wednesday, Apr. 10 Fair and cold, ground froze quite hard last night. Roads are very rough, and this afternoon were muddy as the devil.

Thursday, Apr. 11 Fair and cold. Fire broke out in Kobb brothers store at about 1-30 this morning. Burned the Kobb Store, Post Office and store of Roy Hurd, Livery Stable of Ross Fernald, and the brick residence of Ella Pendleton. Loss about \$10,000. Partly Ins.?

Friday, Apr. 12 Cold as the devil. And tonight it is snowing thick and fast. A regular howling northeaster. Burned in Searsmont farm buildings of Will Wellman no ins. Note due City Nat. Bank Belfast \$103.

Saturday, Apr. 13 Cold overcast, showers part of the day. Snowed about 3 inches last night, ground white today. Molly my bay mair dead lame right front foot. Damdnation.

RALPH RICHARDS - 1918

Sunday, Apr. 14 Cold and overcast raw east wind. Cut down and cut up a few gray [?] birch trees, back of our hen house for fire wood. Born to Cliff Pendleton & wife a daughter 1919.

Monday, Apr. 15 Fair and warmer fine day. The roads are just damdable muddy. Molly dead lame. Will probably kill Jack this cussid traveling.

Tuesday, Apr. 16 Fair and warm and the hardest traveling we have had yet, frost coming out all over the roads.

Wednesday, Apr. 17 Another fine warm day. Roads are a very little better. Strong wind drying them out some. Deedie started teaching the Rackliff school today. She is boarding at Aubrey Collemer's.

Thursday, Apr. 18 Raw and cold. About 3 inches of snow fell last night. Damdable hard traveling. Drove Molly today first time since she went lame.

Friday, Apr. 19 Clear and cold. Have been dolling up out around the yard and tonight went up the Gilky Road and got a but cut of white ash to make ax handles. "Kobbs", the German family moved into Gushees house.

Saturday, Apr. 20 Fair and some warmer. But the roads are still cussid muddy. This afternoon have been mowing bushes.

Sunday, Apr. 21 Overcast. Showers this morning and raining hard this afternoon. Got Frank Duncan to go up on the mountain with me, and show the corners of several wood lots. Died Leroy Marriner, shock. Age 61.

Monday, Apr. 22 Heavy showers, clear and cold tonight. Rain hard all of last night. Got a letter from Pitt Kellen this morning. Ice left the Levenseller Pond. Note due Sarah F. Knight \$105.00

Tuesday, Apr. 23 Showers about every fifteen minutes all day. Cut some bushes this afternoon and fitted up some rubbish for fire wood. Ice went out of the Andrews Pond.

RALPH RICHARDS - 1918

Wednesday, Apr. 24 Fair and warm this morning. Came up a regular cyclone. Thunder, rain, hail and a howling bitter cold wind. Lawry Rankin hawled me a load of hay 18.00 @ 70¢. \$12.67. Billy McLoud came back from Boston. Ice went out of the Tilden Pond.

Thursday, Apr. 25 Fair and a strong gust of wind westerly blowing and it is surely drying out the roads in fine shape.

Friday, Apr. 26 Another fine day with a strong west wind blowing. This afternoon startid work on our driveway culvert. Got to take it all out and put in a new one.

Saturday, Apr. 27 Fair fine day. Chas French and I have been working on the culvert this afternoon. Got it allmost dug out.

Sunday, Apr. 28 Fair and warm. V and I took our car and went out to her home. I went fishing over in the Trap Stream got a damn dandy big trout. 12 trout. Died Amanda Gardner "shock".

Monday, Apr. 29 Over cast with occasional showers. Chas French and I got the metal culvert bolted together. Put it into the trench and partly covered. Raining tonight.

Tuesday, Apr. 30 Overcast and showers about every ten minutes all day. Rain hard all last night and the roads are full of mud holes again.

Memoranda Thursday morning April 11, 1918. Fire broke out in the Kobb Bros Store owned by Lucy Freeman at about 1-30 this morning and destroyed that store, The Post Office and general store of Leroy Hurd, Livery Stable of Ross Fernald and dwelling house of Ella Pendleton. The house of Winnie Young was on fire at two different times, allso the brush banking around the Ida French residence caught, but Vesta was right on the spot, with her little broom and soon smothered it, but for about an hour we thought every building in the place would go, our home with the rest. We were bombarded with a perfect storm of burning brands, and had to keep the roofs of house and barn soaking wet. Some firefighters we have or they never could have stoped the fire at "Halletts" as it was the Hallett house caught and burned the east end badly, but was smothered and the fire stoped. If it had not been for

Collier Hills driving home from Camden, who discovered the fire and gave the alarm, we would in all probiltys have burned in our beds.

1921 Rain and warmer. Went out to Vesta's afternoon stopped with her mother. Showed bright, no change. Third one of the best fellows that ever lived Percy Burton Cross Age 38.

1921 Rain and warm. For my rack home first time I have had it this winter. Had to mend a broken spoke. Paid L. C. Roberts \$47.50. "Paid the man's fee at rock 10%.

1922 Rain had all day and just now turned to a full heavy rain. Select men of Lincoln and Belmont. Payed and Baby of Belfast and Committee of eight men. Mrs. & the one other but day for a hearing on the Affairs.

1920 Fair day. Got back from Vesta, about 12 o'clock last night. Fairly quiet the same. Went to Belfast afternoon. Paid Paid A. W. T. Good year tires \$30.00. 30x3.25. 12x3.00. 10x4.

1921 Fair day. Warm and cold. Vesta and I cleaned our gardens and I harvested it this afternoon. Paid Camden first mill in fuel \$2.

1922 Thick fog, showers, miserable bitch of a day.

Born to Herbert & Addie Thomas a son Peter.

Wednesday, May 1 Rain powerfull hard all last night and this forenoon. Chas French helped me finish the work on the culvert. Fred Amborn the new carrier on Route one startid driving today in a rain storm. Born to Alice Dickey Renolds a daughter. Born to Mrs and Mr Miller Ross a son.

Thursday, May 2 Fair fine day. Worked like the out around the buildings and barn cleaning things up. Died Caroline Prock.

Sunday, May 19 Dandy day. Took cilender head off car and cleared carbon out. Bigfire up at Geo Collemer's, carried a crowd out tonight. Carried "Dee" out to her boarding place. Born to Annie and Horace Miller a daughter.

Monday, May 20 Another fine day, very warm with strong west wind. Been planting potatoes this afternoon and painting window screens. Married Walter Pillsbury and Celia Thomas.

Tuesday, May 21 Butifull day, very warm. Have been planting this afternoon, Carrots and Radishes. Tonight V and I went out to her mother's and got some milk for "Gladys" (Pig). Married Carrol Wiley and Marion Ranken.

Monday, May 27 Overcast, showers, a miserable bitch of a day. This afternoon have been making a net to catch alewives in.





Thursday, Dec. 26 Fair and a little colder. Went in car today, roads are awfully rough, but froze enough to hold a car. Light mail this season.

Friday, Dec. 27 Fair fine day but ye gods how rough the roads are. Went in car. Put on a new "Goodyear" tire rear this morning and got home at 1-30.

Saturday, Dec. 28 Colder and snow most all day. Broke a front spring in car and had to put on a new front shoe while on the road. Hell!

Sunday, Dec. 29 Clear and quite cold. Put a front spring in car. Allso put in a set of batterys to help start with. Died in Camden Fred Martin, age 35

Monday, Dec. 30 Fair clear and not very cold and the snow helped fill up the ruts so the traveling is not as worse. Went in car again today.

Tuesday, Dec. 31 Cold overcast. Snowing tonight. Traveling pooty good. Went in car today. Sent Chas Seekins \$4. for cutting wood. Threshed my Early Peas. Got a peck or more.
