


RALPH RICHARDS - 1919



Wednesday, Jan. 1 Warmer, overcast, snowed last night sleet and rain tonight. Have been threshing my beans today and fitting up fire wood. Died Sarah McCobb.

Thursday, Jan. 2 Warm overcast. Rain hard last night, ground bair this morning. Ground the valves and cleaned the carbon in my car this afternoon. Awfull dirty.

Friday, Jan. 3 Snow all day, about 8 inches of heavy (not damp) snow fell. Went in car, but the going was hard. Snowing tonight. Not very cold. See a [sketch of fox]

Saturday, Jan. 4 Snow hard all day and colder. Went in sleigh. Powerfull cold and a miserable snow storm all day.

RALPH RICHARDS - 1919

Sunday, Jan. 5 Clear and cold. Worked in my blacksmith shop part of day. Put a front shoe on Jack. \$100. due H.A. Dean. Died in Camden Jack Welker, blacksmith.

Monday, Jan. 6 Clear and cold. Hard traveling a sleigh grinds like hawling over bair ground. No drifts just hard snow, about 8 inches on ground. Died Theodore Roosevelt, ex president.

Tuesday, Jan. 7 Overcast, and warmer. Roads are getting good again. Fred Frohock & Geo Collemer are hawling my firewood got 4 cord out today. Died in Pawtucket R.I. Fred Amborns brother.

Wednesday, Jan. 8 Warm. Snow all most rain all day. Fred & Geo got me 4 cord more of wood today. Have now got 12 cord. Died Ralph Dean. Parker & Hattie Dean's boy age 8 yrs.

Thursday, Jan. 9 Fair and warm. Good sleighing. Fred & Geo got me 4 cord more wood today makes 16.

Friday, Jan. 10 Clear and cold. 8° below zero this morning, cold all day but dandy good sleighing. Fred Frohock & Geo Collemer finished hawling wood 22 cord. Died W.A. Mathews Age 80 yrs 2 days.

Saturday, Jan. 11 Clear and cold. 6° below this morning. Have been sorting and piling over my wood. Getting in shape to saw.

Sunday, Jan. 12 Clear and very cold. 14° below this morning. Have been cutting and piling fire wood most all day. Wrote a letter to Clarence Hurd tonight, he is at Camp Dodge Iowa.

Monday, Jan. 13 Fair and cold, but not so bad as yesterday and tonight very pleasant. Have been working on my wood again this afternoon.

Tuesday, Jan. 14 Fair and warmer, only down to zero this morning. Have been hard at work sorting my fire wood. Got a big lot all fixed.

Wednesday, Jan. 15 Fair and warm, fine day and the dandyest sleighing. More wood work this afternoon.

Thursday, Jan. 16 Another fair warm day, and fine sleighing. Worked in my blacksmith shop this afternoon, and piled over some more wood tonight.

Friday, Jan. 17 Fair and warm fine day and dandy sleighing. Feel about poocched have a hell of a bad cold.

Saturday, Jan. 18 Another fine warm day. This afternoon took our car and went to Belfast. V went to see Miss Mathews on Red Cross business.

Sunday, Jan. 19 Rain most all day not very hard just a slow drizzle. Did not go any place. Worked in my shop part of day. Made me a small hunting ax.

Monday, Jan. 20 Fair fine day. Not very cold about 26° above all day, butifull sleighing. Got a letter from Clarence Hurd tonight he is in the army stationed at Camp Dodge Iowa Co A. 219th Eng.

Tuesday, Jan. 21 Fair fine day, a little colder. Finished sorting and pile my firewood. Have 15 cord large wood and about 5 cord of small.

Wednesday, Jan. 22 Warm and overcast. Bully good sleighing. Have been fitting us firewood this afternoon. Cutting with ax. Small wood.

Thursday, Jan. 23 Warm and overcast and fine traveling. V got her papers from Lawyer [??] in her Ellen Richards insurance case. 30 Days of sleighing.

Friday, Jan. 24 Rain hard all night and all day a beastly old storm. Went in a wagon most of the snow gone. See a white weasel up by the old "Snow place". Pretty wagon [*sketch of wagon*]

Saturday, Jan. 25 Fair and cold. Went in the car today nice traveling only went into the ditch a couple of times. Big Installation at the Trap. V did not want to go, so we stayed at home.

Sunday, Jan. 26 Fair and warm, fine day. Took the car. Went out to Aunt Ellens over to Effie Rankins, then to Joe Mullin and back to Lill Mahoney's at Ctr. Pitt Kella landed in New Yorck from army in France.

Monday, Jan. 27 Fair and warm fine day went in car again. Pretty fine traveling worked on the car this afternoon. Walter Richards came up today.

Tuesday, Jan. 28 Fair fine day a little colder. Did some more work on "Henry" this afternoon. Got a letter from Pitt Kella last night. Fred Frohock & Geo Collemer found a bull moos head, hide and guts in the trap woods.

Wednesday, Jan. 29 Fair fine day. Went in car today. Dandy good traveling. Went out to Joe Mullens tonight to have him sign some paper on the Richards insurance case. See Ralph Young. Just got home after 4 yrs in the Canadian army been all thro the world war been "gassed" [??]

Thursday, Jan. 30 Another fine day, a very little colder. No snow on the ground to speak of. Roads are bair or covered with ice. Melly Dearborn came home from Camp Upton N.Y. "discharged"

Friday, Jan. 31 Fair and not very cold and dandy wheeling. Went in car. This afternoon been cleaning spark plug's. A game warden came from Augusta today to try and find who killed a bull moos in the trap woods.

1922	Fair and very warm. I have had run into water to day for some time. Robert & Elphret were up tonight Roy Hardi sent in his resigernation as virent today. 18 tips	1922	Clear and cold. froze very hard last night. Roads rough. V. had a rehearsal at County Hall tonight.

Saturday, Feb. 1 Fair and colder, but dandy weather and great traveling went in car again today. Have been cutting up firewood this afternoon.

Sunday, Feb. 2 Fair clear and quite cold. Butifull day but blowing a gale west wind. Startid smokeing our bacon this afternoon. Cleaned some spark plugs for "Henry".

Monday, Feb. 3 Fair fine day cool, but not cold. Have been cutting firewood this afternoon. "Deedie" came down with me this afternoon to make a little viset.

Tuesday, Feb. 4 Fair and warm fine day. Was going out to Marshall Cilleys but couldent get any gass "hell". Maynard Meservey down tonight "loveing Dee". Born to Eddie Pendleton & Wife a 10 lb son.

Wednesday, Feb. 5 Warm. Snow a little last night and a few squalls today. Have been at work in my blacksmith shop made some iron hooks to hang our smoked hams away on.

Thursday, Feb. 6 Fair clear and cool, fine dandy traveling. Been working in shop today and cutting stove wood.

Friday, Feb. 7 Another dandy day and fine traveling clear cool, fine. Cut wood and blacksmithed. Sent for auto no. Asked for 5555. Warren Pitcher came got me to put a shoe on horse.

Saturday, Feb. 8 Fair fine day, not very cold. Walter R. and Dad came down clambing. Dee went out home tonight. I went fishing. Andrews Pond this afternoon got 7 fine pickerell.

Sunday, Feb. 9 Snow most all day, about 2 inches light, fluffy stuff fell. V and I went out to her home. I went back to the pond fishing. No luck. V's mother sent \$60 by us to put in bank.

Monday, Feb. 10 Another fine day not very cold and dandy wheeling. Got my auto numbers this morning 6747. Clarence Hurd got home out of the army. Note due City Nat Bank \$200.

Tuesday, Feb. 11 Fair fine day. Not very cold, This afternoon V & I went up to Cobb Town, paid Chas Seekins for cutting wood \$14.

Wednesday, Feb. 12 Another fine day. Not cold. Did some work about the place and cut fire wood this afternoon.

Thursday, Feb. 13 Fair fine, not cold. Maynard Heal and his father and Fred Young came this morning to saw my fire wood. Pooched thear machine and had to go home.

Friday, Feb. 14 Fair and warm fine day but its raining and snowing tonight. The boy's have been sawing my wood today got it all cut but 4 cord. Lawry Rankin hawled me a load of hay.

Saturday, Feb. 15 Fair and warmer. Rather sloppy traveling and some slippery. Made my trip all right in car. Have been splitting fire wood afternoon. Pearson Keller arived home from the army last night.

Sunday, Feb. 16 Fair and a little colder with a strong west wind. Pitt Kella came up and spent the day with us just got back from France. Looking fine.

Monday, Feb. 17 Fair and fine. Went to Belfast this afternoon. Carried Nora Warren up put \$60 in the bank for V's mother. Brought a man back and carried him down to Camden. Got \$2.50.

Tuesday, Feb. 18 Fair and fine. Strong west wind. Pitt Kella up and spent the evening telling is about European country.

Wednesday, Feb. 19 Another fine day. Wind still blowing strong from the west. Pitt up this afternoon helped me split wood for a while.

Thursday, Feb. 20 Butifull day. V and I went out to Joe Mullins this afternoon. She wanted to see about that damd fambly of fools that wont do anything to get \$10,000 insurance.

Friday, Feb. 21 Another butifull morning. Seems like spring. Went to Belfast this afternoon got Nora Warren. She has been sick ever since she went to B. V & I went out to her home tonight they have a little cold, but are better.

Saturday, Feb. 22 Warm, snowing this morning a warm soft snow. Went to Camden tonight, took Guss & Alta. Shod Gus horse new all round this afternoon. Went to the pictures Wm. Farmer in the Rain Bow Trail. "Fine"

Sunday, Feb. 23 Warm. Snowing hard all day a heavy damp snow. I guess it will pooch my driving the car anymore this winter.

Monday, Feb. 24 Fair clear and not very cold but a strong west wind. Went in my sleigh. About 10 inches heavy damp snow 31 days

Tuesday, Feb. 25 Fair and warmer. Snow melted fast today. Am about poached with a cold. A little better traveling today. Clarence Hurd went to Portland today to work at his old job in a bakery. 32 days.

Wednesday, Feb. 26 Warm. Snow hard all day. About 7 inches soft heavy snow fell. Awfull hard traveling. Herb Thomas down this afternoon took dinner.

Thursday, Feb. 27 Fair and not very cold. Father brought down the remanes of my old top Sleigh, then went clambing. Died in No. Searsmont Abbie Jane Howard. Note due City Nat Bank \$100.

Friday, Feb. 28 Fair and warmer fine day, but the traveling is still bum. Herb Thomas brought his 4 horses home from Searsmont today.

Snow last night and rain to day. Went with Jack. Dang hard tops front cornering and in lots of places. Paid Harry Rankins 40.00 for hay.</p>
<p>1922 Thurs. Fair and warm and quite muddy. See 4 black birds today. Two were the red winged kind. See blackbirds today.</p>	<p>1922 Fri. Fair and warm tonight about 11 o'clock I took Jack my bay horse up into the deep wood and shot him. Poor old bay he was all in. Shot Jack my bay horse.</p>

Saturday, Mar. 1 Warmer. Commence to rain at noon, and just came down in bunches. Have a damd bad cold and getting wet to the skin wont help it.

Sunday, Mar. 2 Fair and warm fine day, have not felt very sprightly, but went clambing this afternoon, got about a peck of nice clamb's. 37 days sleighing.

Monday, Mar. 3 Fair and warm fine day. The sleighing is getting thin. Went clambing with Pitt tonight got a peck of big "He Clamps". Mrs Eaton went out to Annie Rankins for the winter. 38

Tuesday, Mar. 4 Fair and war. Sleighing is about poached. Fred Amborns horse ran away this morning. Got frightened at a car. No damage. 4 mast

schooner lauched in Camden. 39 Went to Camden in car got 2 bgs oats & Bg mix feed.

Wednesday, Mar. 5 Fair and warm fine. Damed muddy. Snow most all gone. Went in a wagon today. Father & Herb went to Belfast today in the "Ford" to see a big 5 masted schooner lauched.

Thursday, Mar. 6 Fair and a little cooler. Went in the car today. Hell of a hard trip. "Dee" came down with me. Have been splitting wood this afternoon.

Friday, Mar. 7 Fine and warmer fine day. Could not get any gass this morning so had to go in a team. Roy Hurd sick with the "Gripp". Born to Osborn Wade & wife a daughter.

Saturday, Mar. 8 Another dandy day. Went wagon with "Jack". Tonight Maynard Meservey came down and caustid Dee half the night. Two Gov inspectors for the income tax were here today.

Sunday, Mar. 9 Snowing hard this morning. Not so awfull cold, but dumed unpleasant. Awfull rain storm, its just came down in torrents all day.

Monday, Mar. 10 Fair fine day. Blowing a howling gail. Town Meeting day. Joseph Mullen 1st Selectman L S Russ 2nd H Peavey 3rd. AIH Pitcher treasurer, E Goodwin collector. LC Rankin clerk.

Tuesday, Mar. 11 Another fine day. Roads got pretty muddy this afternoon. Deedy went out to Dad's with Maynard Meservey tonight. Gerald Coggins operatid on for apendicitis by D's Topley & Pearson Note Due H.A. Miller \$100.

Wednesday, Mar. 12 Fair fine day, but still the traveling is on the bum. Split wood like the very devil today, but ye gods the pile dont seem to grow much smaller.

Thursday, Mar. 13 Clear and cold very cold. Winnowed some beans this afternoon. V is adtending the sewing circle today first time for months. Pitt was up to see us tonight. Just went home.

Friday, Mar. 14 Fair and cold. Pitt came up for a little while this afternoon and stoked the evening. Have been splitting firewood. Vesta sent the papers into Washington, about the insurance for Aunt Ellen

Saturday, Mar. 15 Another fine day, clear and cold. Went climbing got a pk of big fellows. Split more wood this afternoon. Went in my car today. Died Frank Richards. Age 62 yrs 11 mos 2 days

Sunday, Mar. 16 Fair and some warmer. Slightly overcast this afternoon. Cleaned the carbon out of "Henry" today. Been splitting wood. Died Eva Dean. Age 58 yrs. 11 mo. 16 dys.

Monday, Mar. 17 Rain fog, rotten weather. Went in the car. Sent a signed order to "Norton" for a new "Ford".

Tuesday, Mar. 18 Fog and rain. Damnable mean weather. Mud deep and plenty of it. Have had a hard trip and feel about pooped tonight.

Wednesday, Mar. 19 Fog and more rain. Roads are just cussed frost coming out all over and a stiddy pull thro mud with no easy spots. "Hell".

Thursday, Mar. 20 Fair and warmer. Ye gods but its muddy, frost coming out all over the roads. Damnable hard traveling. See a real live Chip Monk. (Striped squirrel)

Friday, Mar. 21 Fair and quite warm. Mud a foot deep and some places deeper. After four o'clock when I got back today. Worse tomorrow. Got a pr rubber boots S.B. Haskell

Saturday, Mar. 22 Overcast raw east wind and hellish traveling. Mud a foot deep and twenty five miles of it on my route. Fred Hall came home from Fort Preble Portland Me.

Sunday, Mar. 23 Overcast rain, and stiff east wind. Miserable day. Worked around cleaning up the horses, shod Jack new all round. Pitt up a while this afternoon.

Monday, Mar. 24 Fair and muddy. And that explains the whole thing. Split wood this afternoon. See big flock Black Birds.

Tuesday, Mar. 25 Another fair day. Ground froze last night and the traveling was not as bad today. Split wood this afternoon.

Wednesday, Mar. 26 Fair and some better traveling but not much. See a lot of "Bluebirds" Robins, and Blackbirds today. Emry French fished the Sleepy Hollow brook today and got 35 fine trout. Died Daniel Richards at Colon Panama Age 24 yrs

Thursday, Mar. 27 Fair and a pooty good day. V went to the sewing bee at Mrs F's whilst I split wood. Have about one quarter of it split. Ice left the Il'seller Pond and the Andrews Pond.


Friday, Mar. 28 Rain an awfull storm and very cold. Got wet all over, soaking thro. Lost some mail and had to drive four miles extra in the storm. But every day [??], so did this one.

Saturday, Mar. 29 Ground white this morning with snow. It has stormed all day, first rain then snow. Traveling a very little better. Took my gun and went down the "marsh" tonight see one muskrat, no shot.

Sunday, Mar. 30 Rain all day. Very raw and cold a few snow squalls for good measure. Set the clocks and watches a head one hour today. For the next six months we go on the new summer time.

Monday, Mar. 31 Fair and cold. Ground froze very hard last, and remained froze most all day. Went to Camden tonight in car. Got 2 bgs oats. 1 bg mx feed. 1 bsh corn \$8.35

Tuesday, Apr. 1 Fair and cold. Very cold last night, froze hard, and rough as the verry [blank] Caught 10 trout. Sleepy Hollow Brook.

Wednesday, Apr. 2 Fair clear and cold. Roads are frozen up solid and very rough. Split more wood this afternoon. Deedie is still with us. Got a dozen Triple Clutch Traps from Hall Ellis Co.

Thursday, Apr. 3 Another clear cold day. Split more wood this afternoon. Set a dozen traps for muskrat down in the swail by the shore salt marsh.

Friday, Apr. 4 Fair and some warmer. Split fire wood this afternoon. And set a dozen more traps. Caught two nice big muskrats. Note due Sarah Knight \$52.50.

RALPH RICHARDS - 1919

Saturday, Apr. 5 Fair and warmer. Got two more rats this morning, and some son of a bitch I think it is Russell Ames sprung every trap I had set over in the salt marsh and broke one.

Sunday, Apr. 6 Warmer overcast all day. We did a couple of new ends on my shaft irons. Father came down and got D this afternoon. Got a hell of a head ach though. Born to Geo & Flora Nichols a daughter. Died Mr [or Mrs?] Rosco Hurd of Northport age 76

Monday, Apr. 7 Fair but cold and damnable traveling. Am about poached. Got a cussid cold and a head ach. Ice went out the "Lawry" & Tilden Ponds.

Tuesday, Apr. 8 Fair and cold and I feel rotten. Split fire wood this afternoon. Pitt came up and spent the evening. Aunt Ellen got notification from the war Dep. that her insurance would be paid.

Wednesday, Apr. 9 Another nice day warmer. Winnie Young teacher at the school here, taken sick, heart trouble. Had to be carried home. Annie Drinkwater Harkness substituting for her.

Thursday, Apr. 10 Fair and some warmer. Went to Camden tonight in my car and got a load of grain \$13. Split more wood untill dark.

Friday, Apr. 11 Fog and showers overcast. Split wood. Went down to the "Marsh" and took up my Traps. Have caught every rat in the swamp.

Saturday, Apr. 12 Overcast, fog. Traveling improveing very slowly. Vesta has a damd bad case of tooth ach. Just about killen her. Married Scott Knight and Leona Merethew.

Sunday, Apr. 13 Raw and cold, fog and a few showers. Went fishing all day got a good string but am tired out. Pit and I went fishing. Geo Heal stream got about 40 in that and Sleepy Hollow Brook

Monday, Apr. 14 Fair fine day. Roads drying some. Set a shoe on Jack. Had a fine chew with Dr Gould about Aunt Ellens Insurance. "Dee" commenced teaching school in E. Searsmt. Lawry Rankin hawled me load of hay.

Tuesday, Apr. 15 Fair fine day. Worked splitting wood so long tonight that I am about pooched. Gee but I am feeling tired.

Wednesday, Apr. 16 Awfull cold. Just terriable. And tonight it is snowing and feeling bitter cold. Sent four muskrat skins to T.J. Murphy Lewiston Me.

Thursday, Apr. 17 Rain most all the time miserable bitch of a day. Wet and cold. Roads are still very muddy. April 17. Aunt Ellen received \$348.83/100 Insurance Money.

Friday, Apr. 18 Fair fine day. Split wood this afternoon till I was about pooched. Got my returns for 4 muskrats skins sold for \$8.00

Saturday, Apr. 19 Another nice day. Roads are drying out some. Split wood this afternoon untill dark. Vestas tooth still doing business.

Sunday, Apr. 20 Fair fine day. Split wood all the forenoon. Pit came up about noon and we went fishing in Sleepy Hollow Brook. Only got a couple. Died in Searsmont, Emma Berry age 67-yrs 10 mo. 28 days.

Monday, Apr. 21 Another nice day. Roads drying out pretty good. Went to Belfast this afternoon. Vesta went to Dr Jenness and had one tooth filled and another out. \$2.25

Tuesday, Apr. 22 Fair fine day. Went in my car, first trip. Roads fairly dried out but awfully rough. Split 1400 sticks of wood this afternoon. Covered my route in "Henry Ford".

Wednesday, Apr. 23 Another nice day. Went in car. Split wood afternoon. Raked the weeds from garden and burned them. "Died. Dropped dead Emma Phippen Clark"

Thursday, Apr. 24 Rain and snow most all day and very cold. Gad but its awfull weather just like the fall.

Friday, Apr. 25 Another cold cold day and ye gods but it nearly froze me. Split fire wood again today. Big praid in Boston today. The 26th division [??] Yankee division. New England Men. 20500

Saturday, Apr. 26 Fair nice day. Went with car again today. Roads are dry and very rough. Split wood again this afternoon.


Sunday, Apr. 27 Fair fine day. Clear and cool. Vesta and I went out to her home. I went fishing up by the Gardner Place. Got a basket full of fine large trout 30 fine ones.

Monday, Apr. 28 Fair fine day. Came home and with my little ax finished splitting my fire wood. All done about 20 cord.

Tuesday, Apr. 29 Raw cold, showers. Went in car. Roads powerfull slippery. Cleaned out our wood shed and this afternoon plantid our bed of Sweet Peas. Died Ada Wheeler's mother Adaline age 85 yrs

Wednesday, Apr. 30 Fairly decent kind of a day. Worked on car afternoon put new bushings in the steering gear's.


Wednesday, May 28 Fair fine day. This afternoon put up the wire and riged the takle for the service flagg. Have about pooched my self shining those damd poles.



Thursday, Dec. 18 Another very cold day. Coldest last night we have had 20° below this morning. Everett Wade killed 3 pigs for Guss Warren today.

Friday, Dec. 19 Fair clear and cold but a little warmer, only 10° below zero this morning. My cold is still doing business. Put a new Goodyear shoe on front today.

Saturday, Dec. 20 Fair clear and cold. Some warmer tonight. Got Vesta a Xmass present today. A fluff of a kitten Mattie. Got it at "Gelo's" for a dollar.

Sunday, Dec. 21 Fair and warmer. Worked in the shop part of day and did some very nessary work on the car. Married Harry Drinkwater & Alice Pitcher.

Monday, Dec. 22 Fair and warmer. We went to Belfast this afternoon to do a little belatid Christmas shopping. Roads very rough.

Tuesday, Dec. 23 Fair and warmer. Lots of Christmas mail but not a heavy as in past seasons. Went up to pond afternoon cut my boat out. Born to Burleigh & Velma Ordway a daughter.

Wednesday, Dec. 24 Another pretty good day. Colder and snowing hard tonight wind N.E. We went out to Vs folks this evening and took them out some Xmass cheer.

Thursday, Dec. 25 Fair and cold. Pretty heavy mail. Vesta gave me a dandy pair fur lined gloves for my present. Died Angelia French 83 yrs, Cap. Oscar French wife. Married Donald Brownell & Georgie Furnald.

Friday, Dec. 26 Some warmer. Overcast. Went up to the Davis Cottage to see Everett Wade about killing our pig. Car working rotten. Tried every thing and it don't help.

Saturday, Dec. 27 Fair and warm fine day. Carried my car to Camden and left it at "Higg's" for repairs. Came home with "Barton" on the stage.

Sunday, Dec. 28 Fair fine day not very cold. Killed our pig today and did it without help from the neighbors. Allso did it alone and [??]. Weight 215.

Monday, Dec. 29 Fair clear and cold. Went to Camden tonight got our car. Cost \$18.50 to have repairs done on it. Brought our pig in to cut up. Went around my route in Roys car.

Tuesday, Dec. 30 Snow squalls, part of day snowed hard. Clear & cold tonight. Car went some thing awfull. Carborator trouble. Borrowed a carborator of Horace Miller. Born to Louise & Merrell Brown a daughter.

Wednesday, Dec. 31 Fair clear and cold. Hell of a day and very cold. Car went fine today used H.A. M's carborator. Got a new one from "Norton" tonight.
