Thursday, Jan. 1 Warm overcast rain part of day. Clear and cold tonight. Have been salting and pickleing our pig pork. Put carborator back on car. Died in Belfast, Emma Millers Mother Jane Cammett. Age 90 yrs.

Friday, Jan. 2 Fair clear and cold. Dandy traveling roads are all ice. V & I both have a bad case of the Hives. Feel sometimes as if we had a whole swarm of bee's and they went all stinging at once. Hell.

Saturday, Jan. 3 Fair clear and cold. Burned my hand badly today while doing blacksmith work. Pitt came up tonight stoped to supper.

Sunday, Jan. 4 Fair clear and bitter cold. Changed carborators on my car today. First took it easy and piled wood into the stove.

Monday, Jan. 5 Fair clear and very cold. Went to Camden afternoon to get my car adjustid at "Higg's". Ray Rankin and Lena called this afternoon.

Tuesday, Jan. 6 Fair and warmer. Overcast tonight. Worked in blacksmith shop all afternoon tempering chisels, makeing a knife and a stope iron.

Wednesday, Jan. 7 Overcast. Warm fine day. Vesta and I went up to our pond lot to see how much wood Chas Seekin had cut. We see! but it isent cut. Hell

Thursday, Jan. 8 Fair and warm, fine day. Worked in shop. Mendid V's chair. And late this afternoon took my "gat" went up in the "Rogers" lot. Shot a fine rabbit. Got my automobile number tonight 8-320.

Friday, Jan. 9 Overcast colder and snowing tonight. We are in for a cussid bad storm and a big one. Died Virgel Halls wife, age 23 yrs. Born to Austin Rankin & wife a son.

Saturday, Jan. 10 Fair clear and cold. Had a blowout on the road today. Allso two dirty spark plugs. Went to Camden had a leak proof ring put in front cylinder.

Sunday, Jan. 11 Warmer and partly overcast. Looks like a bad storm coming tonight. We took "Henry" and went up to V's mothers. Called in to D's comeing back for a little while.

Monday, Jan. 12 Fair clear and cold. Bought and put a new non skid Goodyear front shoe on "Henry". Shot another rabbit up on Chas French with my gat.

Tuesday, Jan. 13 Overcast snow all day. Light stuff and tonight it is blowing like hell. Went to Camden this afternoon and got \$17.60 worth of grain at Camden Grist Mill. Chas Seekins hawled me first load of wood.

Wednesday, Jan. 14 Fair clear and very cold. Dee was in calling for little while afternoon. V's birthday 35 years young. Gave her book Rimes of a Rolling Stone by Service.

Thursday, Jan. 15 Clear and very cold. But a rotten N.E. storm comeing. Wind is blowing a gale, bitter cold. Chas Seekins hawled me two load more of wood.

Friday, Jan. 16 Cold slightly overcast. Went out to Andrews Pond, caught 1 small pickrell. Vesta visited at Dee's. Paid Chas Seekins \$10 for wood. \$50 due Megunticook Nat Bank Paid in full Jan 5-1920

Saturday, Jan. 17 Heavy snow storm. Heaviest this winter. Went in car got back to office at 10-30. Last trip got hell ahead of me from now on. With bum horses. Hellitydamd. Married in Camden Hazel Barton and [blank] Dyer.

Sunday, Jan. 18 Overcast, very cold. Strong N.W. wind blowing snow flying and the roads are sure to be blocked. Made a cross bar for my sleigh and shod Molly front, with N.S. shoes.

Monday, Jan. 19 Clear and cold and ye gods what traveling. First trip with a horse since the 22nd of last April. Drove Jack out to Lawry Rankins got his horse to finish my trip.

Tuesday, Jan. 20 Another bitter cold day. 28° below out in Searsmont this morning. Drove Jack from Rankins and tonight drove Molly out thear and back. Snowing hard tonight.

Wednesday, Jan. 21 Cold and snowing hard. About a foot of snow has fallen since last night. Put on my new dark gray pants that I got of "Ross" at the center for \$4.00.

Thursday, Jan. 22 Fair and warmer. Did not drive today feeling about all in. Got Emry to make the trip. Worked on my horse this morning.

Friday, Jan. 23 Another bitch of a cold and stormy day. Snow most all day and still snowing tonight.

Saturday, Jan. 24 Awfull cold and snow part of day. Damdable hard traveling thear is nearly two feet of snow on the ground and it has not settled a bit.

Sunday, Jan. 25 Bitter cold and still snowing. Snowed hard all day. About all we can do is to keep warm with two fires burning full blast.

Monday, Jan. 26 Fair clear and bitter cold. 30° below zero this morning. Made my whole trip with "Jack". Warmer tonight and its snowing again but looks like rain. 8 days sleighing.

Tuesday, Jan. 27 Warmer and raining this morning. Dandy traveling a sleigh runners fine. Chas Seekins is hawling my fire wood. Drove Molly the whole trip.

Wednesday, Jan. 28 Cold and froze up solid again but the sleighing is bully. Chas hawled me another load of wood today

Thursday, Jan. 29 Clear and colder. Charlie came with another load of wood. He is getting me quite a pile down about 5 cord now

Friday, Jan. 30 Fair and warmer, but blowing to beat the devil. Regular gale howling. Chas brought in another load of wood this afternoon.

Saturday, Jan. 31 Clear and the bitterest cold day we ever had. 30° below this morning and more than that in many places. From 8 to 16 below all day and awfull cold tonight.

19 th Snow like hell all day. Drove Dix's horse and got around all day. Right traps	

Sunday, Feb. 1 Overcast all day snowing a little tonight. Bay is froze over as far as a man can see. Its been an awfull cold spell of weather. Paul Young up and got some books tonight.

Monday, Feb. 2 Overcast fog and warmer. No sunshine today. Fred Frohock & Geo Collemer took a couple cord firewood out to Vs mothers. Fred Amborn bought a new horse \$28.00 in Camden today.

Tuesday, Feb. 3 Fair and warmer fine day and butifull sleighing. Lena Rankin down to viset the school. Put her horse up at our place.

Wednesday, Feb. 4 Cold and overcast looks like a big snow storm comeing. Tonight Vesta & I went down to Geo & Floes and spent the

evening. Child welfare legue came and took the 4 youngest children of Clere Moulton.

Thursday, Feb. 5 Cold and overcast. Very cold disagreeable east wind and every sign of a big snow storm. Dandy good sleighing now. Snowing hard tonight. Roy Oxton hawled me a load of grain from Camden.

Friday, Feb. 6 Snow hard all last night and today. Only got as far as "Calderwoods" "Pitcher" went up to the foot of the pond. And tonight it is snowing worst at all. Stage did not leave for Camden tonight.

Saturday, Feb. 7 A howling N.E. snow storm. It has snowed and blowed constantly for the last 54 hours and is still an awfull storm. No stage startid today. No mail train reached either Rockland or Belfast.

Sunday, Feb. 8 Fair and warmer. Have put in the day shoveling our selfs out. It looks like rabbit paths around our yard or rather a series of trenches. No Sunday papers got thro.

Monday, Feb. 9 Fair and not very cold. Did not get over half of my route. The roads are not broken. Never have we had such roads. Maynard Meservey has Scarlet fever.

Tuesday, Feb. 10 Overcast with snow squalls all day. Snowing again tonight hard. Could not get out to Searsmont Roads unbroken. Died David Cross Age 90 yrs

Wednesday, Feb. 11 Fair fine day but ye gods the traveling is awfull. Drove out to Leslie M [??] (Note due City Nat Bank \$150) put my horse in and fed him then came back got home at 5-45.

Thursday, Feb. 12 Fair and not cold. Overcast tonight. Covered practibly all my route. Got in at 5-30. The other boys did not make thears.

Friday, Feb. 13 Snow all day. A warm soft snow allmost rain. Ye god the traveling is simply cussid. Made my whole trip. Storming very hard tonight. Got home at 5-45. Stoped at Lige Muse and ate my dinner.

Saturday, Feb. 14 Overcast and not cold. Snowed about 8 in yesterday & last night damp snow. Cliff Pendleton shot two red foxes this morning ahead of his dog up by Burt Knights worth \$40.

Sunday, Feb. 15 Snow hard all day a heavy damp snow. Colder tonight. Went down to Emrys and got a pint of milk. No Sunday papers got thro.

Monday, Feb. 16 Fair fine day. Startid out bravely but did not get far before I found the roads full of snow and all unbroken

Tuesday, Feb. 17 Fair and colder. Made my whole route, but the Belmont part of it was simply hell. Roads unbroken. "Died" Hattie Brown age 42. "Died" Frank Coggins age 52. Lawry Rankin hawled me a load of hay.

Wednesday, Feb. 18 Fair fine warm day. First time snow has given. Traveling a very little better. Cut Guss Warrens hair tonight. 45 years ago today Sidney Young walked from North Haven to Lincolnville Beach on the ice 20 miles

Thursday, Feb. 19 Awfull storm. Raining this morning tavn to snow early and a regular howling blizzard this afternoon and tonight. Covered all my route. "Pitcher" only went part of his and "Amborn" did not get back at all.

Friday, Feb. 20 Fair and colder. Roads completely snow blocked. Stage did not start for Belfast at all. "Amborn" got in from yesterdays trip at 6 oclock tonight.

Saturday, Feb. 21 Fair and cold another fine day but all roads are blocked. Got out to Millertown via the ctr and had to come back same way.

Sunday, Feb. 22 Snowing again hard this morning and has snowed all day. Not very cold, fair tonight. Died in Belfast Ross Jackson age 67.

Monday, Feb. 23 Fair and cold. Did not drive but cut wood and chores about the place. Overcast and going to snow again. "Hell". Born to Mrs & Mr Elmer Flagg a son.

Tuesday, Feb. 24 Snow again last night and snowing this morning. Snow most all day and tonight it stoped but its overcast and looks like more snow comeing. Made my whole trip. Awfull traveling

Wednesday, Feb. 25 Snow a awfull N.E. storm just a howling and much colder. Only got out to Geo Heal's. Roads completely blocked.

Thursday, Feb. 26 Howling storm with a awfull gail of wind. All roads blocked no mail moved today. Did not start out at all. Died in Belmont Albina Pease age 72 yrs

Friday, Feb. 27 Fair bitter cold 20° below all roads blocked. 4 ft of snow in the woods and from 4 to 10 ft on the roads. Did not start at all. The bay froze over solid last night no open water.

Saturday, Feb. 28 Clear and very cold. 20° below zero this morning. Startid and got up as far as Geo Collemers end of road, had to come back.

Sunday, Feb. 29 Fair fine day. But ye gods talk of traveling. Amborn & I went out with our mail. Went thro Deantown and the Ctr up thro Millertown and back to the Beach.

Monday, Mar. 1 Fair clear and cold. And the roads are awfull. Got out to Sears mont but had to come back. The Cree road still closed. Guss Warren bought a 5 yr old horse from Coll Borrow of Rockland 1400 lbs

Tuesday, Mar. 2 Very cold last night. Clear and cold today. Roads still unbroken. Only got as far as A.H. Millers. "Amborn" got run into and his sleigh smashed up. 44 days sleighing.

Wednesday, Mar. 3 Mild overcast. Quite warm but the traveling is awfull. The snow dosent tread any. Very dry. Made my whole route today. First in 10 days.

Thursday, Mar. 4 Warmer. Roads getting a very little better. V went to the sewing circle down at Phebe French on her snow shoes.

Friday, Mar. 5 Overcast and much warmer. Every indication of a big thaw. Expect the horses will drop out of sight today. \$40 due Camden Nat Bank. Paid 3-5-20 \$100 due Sarah F. Knight.

Saturday, Mar. 6 Rain hard morning and warm. Afternoon wind shifted into N.E. commenced to snow and its increased still tonight one of the worst storms of the winter. Only got as far as Calderwoods. 48 days sleighing.

Sunday, Mar. 7 Fair and cold with a strong wind blowing. Roads are all blocked again. Mail did not get down to Camden last night.

Monday, Mar. 8 Fair and cool. Got out to "Claytors" this morning and the road blocked full of snow and so we had to come back. 50 days sleighing

Tuesday, Mar. 9 Fair and not so awfull cold. Got out as far as the Old Stevens place. Road thro Deantown unbroken had to come back.

Wednesday, Mar. 10 Fair and warm. Town meeting today. Same officers as last year except tax collector Chas Stevens bid them in for 1 ¼ cent. Roy Oxton hawled me four 52 bags corn from Camden

Thursday, Mar. 11 Fair warm spring like day the snow has settled a lot Got pretty skimpy this afternoon. Lawry Rankin hawled me a load of hay 1233 lbs

Friday, Mar. 12 Warm overcast rain and a very strong S.W. wind. Damdable traveling and ye gods such slumping. Made my whole trip. Lawry Rankin hawled me another load of hay 54 days sleighing

Saturday, Mar. 13 Rain hard all day. Only got as far as "Claytors" this morning slump so it is impossible to get over the roads

Sunday, Mar. 14 Fair clear and colder. Froze the slush quite a bit last night. No Sunday papers today. Have been cutting fire wood, mending barn door and blacksmithing. Made a hook to go on door. 56 days sleighing

Monday, Mar. 15 Fair clear and cold. Made my whole trip and spoiled Molly I think got her down in the slush and ice water and cut her right hind ankle very bad.

Tuesday, Mar. 16 Overcast and warmer. Only got out as far as Will McCobbs. Roads are impassable and every indercation tonight of worse traveling tomorrow. Alta & Flor up tonight to rehurs but the rest of the company did not come.

Wednesday, Mar. 17 Fair and some colder but awfull traveling only got as far as Will McCobbs. Amborn & I then came back

Thursday, Mar. 18 Fair and very much colder and the roads were froze some. Got out to east Searsmont. Got Jack in the slush had him down twice. Had to unhitch to get him out.

Friday, Mar. 19 Fair and some warmer. Went out to Millertown and over to Dad's got rid of all the mail I took out. Lost a roll of papers and a letter in front of S.K. store & P.O. Now ant that hell?

Saturday, Mar. 20 Colder and snowing hard this morning. Snow hard all day, a hell of a storm. Got out to E. Searmont. Burt Donnell came over from Belmont and got the mail. Pitt came up tonight for a little while.

Sunday, Mar. 21 Fair and warm fine day. Pitt came up and we went out and tryed his pup. Good hound dog. Born to Herbert & Abbie Thomas a daughter. Jack my bay horse dead lame this morning

Monday, Mar. 22 Another fine day warm. Went out to Searsmont, had to come back. Drove Molly but she is durned bad shap. Lame and soar in her cut ankle. Wonderfull display of Northern Lights tonight

Tuesday, Mar. 23 Fair and warm first warm spring like day. Snow went fast. Got up to Miller town. Had to come back thro the ctr. Born to Alice & Don Patten a daughter.

Wednesday, Mar. 24 Another fine warm spring like morning. Went my whole route. Awfull traveling especily thro Belmont. See 2 Robins, 2 Bluebirds a red winged Blackbird and a Chipmunk. 66 days of sleighing.

Thursday, Mar. 25 Another fine warm spring day. Went out to Searsmont and had to come back. Awfull traveling. See plenty blackbirds and robins. Quite a lot bair spots in the roads.

Friday, Mar. 26 Overcast fog and mist, and cussid traveling. First bair ground and then drifts 4 ft deep and a horse goes clear to the bottom. Went out as far as "Calderwoods" then came back.

Saturday, Mar. 27 Overcast fog and showers. Went my whole route. Covered Belmont and got back at 5 o'clock. Some damdable hard traveling. Vesta is at a big Community Hall director meeting at Winnie Youngs tonight

Sunday, Mar. 28 Fair and a fine day with one howling old west wind blowing. Have been working in my blacksmith shop most all day. 70 days sleighing

Monday, Mar. 29 Rain hard all day. Got good & wet. Awfull hard traveling. So much bair ground. Have to try a wagon tomorrow.

Tuesday, Mar. 30 Fair clear and colder. Wind blowing a gail all day. Went in wagon first trip did not get out to Searsmont, so many big drifts. Married Wilber Gray and Flora Fletcher?

Wednesday, Mar. 31 Fair and warmer. Fine day but awfull hard traveling snow drifts are very deep and many of them. Frank Collemer's little girl Edna awfully sick. "convulsions" is now uncorncious. Drs are not sure the trouble think poison

APRIL 10

19th Fair and cold, ground froze quite hard last night. Roads are very rough, and this afternoon were muddy as the devil

19th Fair and some warmer. Went to Camden tonight in my car and got a load of grain. \$13. Split more wood until dark

19th Fair, fair and cold, strong west wind. Roads are not very bad yet. Miles and miles of ice and snow.

Peer Thomas operated on Wolfe Co Hospital. Chopped fingers.

19th Fair, fine day. Sun came up early and went up fishing & got 6 m. fish. Total value \$1.50. Paid Bank 90. Snow

19th Very thick fog. Rain hard above all last night. Awful haching the worst yet. Ice left the Hesell Pond. Died last night. Wilbert Gould age 21 yrs.

APRIL 11

19th Fair and cold. Fire broke out in Robt. Barnes store at about 1-30 this morning. Burned the Kobb Store, Post Office and store of Roy Kobb, Lucy State of Ross Franklin, and the brick residence of Mr. Pendleton,價值 \$10,000. Fully insured.

19th Fair and showers overcast. Split wood. Went down to the Marsh and took up my traps. Hawk caught every rat in the swamp.

19th Fair, fine day. Sun came up from Camden walked and we went up to the brook fishing. Nothing doing at first little fish.

19th Very cold, awfully cold and growing cold. Ground froze solid last night and stayed frozen all day. Paid Roy store \$1.74.

19th Overcast showers. Rain had tonight. Traveling a very little better, but still some thing awful. School began to dog at the Beach. Which Elizier Greenlow set the whip.

Thursday, Apr. 1 Fair and very cold. Raw east wind. Chill one thro and thro. Am tired as a bitch tonight. Molly used up has cramp on her legs. See big flock wild gees.

Friday, Apr. 2 Cold raw overcast. Cold enough to snow. Rain most all day. And storming very hard tonight. Covered all my route today. Surprise party down at Emry French tonight his 59 birthday. Played Whist. I won a prize, a "purse".

Saturday, Apr. 3 Overcast, very cold, damd bum weather, awfull traveling. Drove Molly, we wont make many more trips. About all in. Covered all my route. Jack Law came home today. First jitney startid driving [??] A. Jackson.

Sunday, Apr. 4 Fair slightly overcast. Put a front show on Amborns horse. He brought us a 5 lb Cod. Went fishing up the brook got 15 fine trout.

Monday, Apr. 5 Rain awfull storm, just poured all day, one of the heaviest rain storms we have had in year's. Got every thing soaking wet. Heavy thunder Sharp lightning this afternoon. Dr. Tom Pearson operatid on in Boston. "cancer"

Tuesday, Apr. 6 Overcast very cold, snow squall this forenoon. Clear and cold tonight. Roads are all washed out with the heavy rain of yesterday and last night. Jessie Drinkwater operatid on at Rockland??

Wednesday, Apr. 7 Snow most all day. Cold as the devil. Ground froze hard last night. Maynard Meservey came in and took supper with us. He fished the Sleepy Hollow Brook got 3 small trout. The bridge at Cobbtown over the Knowls brook carried away. The dam at outlet went out and that took the bridge. Pitcher got to the bridge an hour after it went out and had to come back by Allen Millers. Knowls brook bridge carried away.

Thursday, Apr. 8 Another cold day. Snow hard most all day, and tonight the ground is white with snow and frozen hard. Have smashid a couple of wagon wheels today. Emmer French operatid on Rockland??

Friday, Apr. 9 Fair and clear, allso cold. Ground white this morning and frozen solid. Hired a wagon of Emry. Last rehursal of that elusive farce "Not a Man in the house". Paid Sarah Knight \$105.55

Saturday, Nov. 20 Fair clear and cold and growing cold tonight. Have been cutting up fire wood and at work at the forge.

Sunday, Nov. 21 Cold very cold. Roy & I went up in the Trap wood after moos. Well we see a big cow got within 40 ft of her but no bullet. Snowing tonight.

Monday, Nov. 22 About 5 inches snow fell. Had to buy a new set tire chains. Went to Camden got load grane afternoon. Roy and about every body elce out deer hunting. Herb and Pearl Thomas killed a doe deer today.

Tuesday, Nov. 23 Rain and snow all day. Snowing tonight. Worked in shop some this afternoon. Made a side plate for body support on "Henry"

Wednesday, Nov. 24 Snow allmost all day a warm drizzley snow. "Amborn" went with a horse and sleigh "Pitcher" and my self went in our car's.

Thursday, Nov. 25 Snow all day a soft warm snow. Thanksgiving Day. Pitt came up and had breakfast with us Then we went up the Trap Wood's. Drove a moos across the stream.

Sunday, Nov. 28 Fair fine day. Not very cold. Put my wagon together today and fitted up a set of shoes for my horse.

Monday, Nov. 29 Fair pretty good day. Shod a horse and drove Jack up to "Claytors" Roy Hurd and Clarence Griffen killed a couple of fine deer this morning??

Tuesday, Nov. 30 Another nice day. Drove my Island horse up to "Claytors" afternoon and fitted up a set of shoes for her.

Saturday, Dec. 4 Overcast. Snow, sleet & rain afternoon and tonight it is just pouring hard. Went to Camden got load grain. Found Pitt hung up on Springbrook hill. Helped him up out of gass.

Sunday, Dec. 5 Warm rain hard all day. Awfull storm. Heavy thunder storm this afternoon. Worked in shop sharpening shoes for horses. Pitt up for a little while.

Monday, Dec. 6 Overcast and showers all day. Damdable traveling frost all out of ground and about 6 inches mud. Some places regular quagmire. Corn \$2.50 bag Oats \$2 bag Wheat Mix \$3.50 per 100 lb.

Tuesday, Dec. 7 Fair clear and cold. Roads are very rough. Went to Camden bought a load of grain. Paid Grist Mill \$35.10 in full.

Wednesday, Dec. 8 Clear and cold. Awfull rough. Worked in shop this afternoon. Tonight Clarence Jonson an insurance agent was in giveing us a game of talk.

Thursday, Dec. 9 Overcast, showers and very rough traveling. Got a letter from Pitt tonight asking us to come to Camden tomorrow night to pictures.

Friday, Dec. 10 Cold and a frozen rain fell all day. Put on a couple of new Goodrich tires. One front and a rear.

Saturday, Dec. 11 Warm overcast. About 8 inches soft damp snow fell last night. Roads are blocked with snow laden bushes. Got into the ditch out in Searsmont took two hours to get out.

Sunday, Dec. 12 Overcast, warm. Worked around the place all day. Cleaning up and cutting fire wood. Did some work in shop made a knife for Clarence Hurd.

Monday, Dec. 13 Overcast and warmer. Went to Camden got load grain. Borrowed \$100 for six months Megunticook Bank. Drove the Island horse tonight out thro slab city.

Tuesday, Dec. 14 Rain and warmer. Most all the snow gorn. Storming very hard tonight and a wicked S.E. Wind blowing.

Sunday, Dec. 19 Fair not very cold. Worked in shop making hunting knives. Pitt and Louie came up tonight from Camden spent the evening.

Monday, Dec. 20 Clear and cool, not cold. Roads very rough. Had a tire blowout on the road. Got a new Goodyear AWT and put on afternoon. {\$2.34 cancerlation}

Tuesday, Dec. 21 Fair not very cold. Worked in the shop afternoon. Jack Law came up and got my horse, He and Riley went to Camden

Wednesday, Dec. 22 Fair pretty good day. Coldest this morning we have had it this fall. Made Roy Hurd a hunting knife and sent another to Clarence. Fred Frohock hawled me a cord of wood \$12.50

Thursday, Dec. 23 Stormy. Snow some last night tirn to rain, raining this morning. Heavy mail. Got a big bunch of it today both comeing and going.

Friday, Dec. 24 Fair not very cold. Heavy mail and pretty good traveling. Got a pint of cream at AH Miller for go with our Christmas dinner. Married Fred Dickey and Gladys Young.

Saturday, Dec. 25 Cold as the devil. Had a hell of a time car stoped on the road with me [??] trouble. Lawry Rankin hawled me load of hay.

Sunday, Dec. 26 Awfull cold, a bitter day. Coldest last night we have had way, way below zero. Kept by the stove all day

Monday, Dec. 27 Very cold. Snow all day, about 6 inches fell and still snowing tonight. Lawry Rankin hawled me another load of hay today.

Tuesday, Dec. 28 Fair and not very cold. Startid in car, but came back and took the horse from the Island. Got back at about 3 o'clock. Not very bad sleighing.

Wednesday, Dec. 29 Another overcast day. Drove "Jack". Pretty good sleighing but looks like a storm comeing.

Thursday, Dec. 30 Overcast snow most all day about 8 inches snow on the ground now. Have been fitting up fire wood this afternoon.

Friday, Dec. 31 Overcast and cold as the very devil. Clear and cold tonight "Pitt" came up this evening from Camden in his car. Died in Belfast Willis McKinneys little boy.
