to day. A real old lady.




Sat 1911 Warm, and thick of fog all day. Came up home

with his new span of hours.


JANUARY 15

1908 Fair. Very cold, 10° below zero  
This morning Amanda Law came  
over toing & taying, and gave me my first  
present in Cilly. George Pendleton. Came  
home to day, sick with dysentery.

Fri 1909 Fair and warm. Not snow enough yet  
10 to go on runners. Harry and Charles Dearborn  
went fishing on Andrews Pond. Got 17 fine  
Pckerell. Largest weighed 2 1/2 lbs. And I got  
no letter from Sammy. Why didn't she write?

Sat 1910 Cold. Yes   turned cold. People did  
not freeze solid.   Married to <sup>R. F. D.</sup> <sup>Tanner</sup> Marrian, so Marlan Knutson  
and others. Came up and <sup>45</sup> Lincolnville carried Sammy over  
Market and <sup>15</sup> with me tonish. Herb Thomas  
set me a new white shirt and 2 collars

Sun 1911 Fair and not very cold. Father went to Fred Brown's  
furnace. I slept most all day. Hollis Dean come over  
and had his hair cut. Cannied Sammy home  
tonight. She is not feeling very well.

Mon 1912 Snow just overfull.  
Then come down   1040. Carried Sammy home  
part of Belfast upon sled" bought a new  
Top Sleigh \$45. Six months time. I will  
Storm. Rain. and I got soothed. Opened front <sup>10</sup> 1/2.

**Friday, Jan. 1** Butifull day clear and cold. Went out to Goodwins this morning and got Dandy shod behind. Went up to Herbs, got Sammy and we went to the dance in the new Grange Hall. Born to Helen and Lawry Rankin a BOY.

**Saturday, Jan. 2** Clear and cold elegant traveling. Went up home tonight first time I have slept at home for five weeks. Sick tonight. Just so sick as Hell. Lame shoulder.

**Sunday, Jan. 3** Slightly overcast, and not very cold. Hump McKinney and I went Pickerel fishing on Andrews Pond. Got 3 big fish. One over 20 inches long. Went up to Smike's tonight to see Sammy.

**Monday, Jan. 4** Fair and very warm. So warm that it has about spoiled the sleighing. Father got a load of hay Tom Hall, E. Sears mont 1230 lbs at \$13.00 \$8.00 Got my new pants from Sears Roebuck \$4.00

**Tuesday, Jan. 5** Rain hard all day. Just a mean cussed wet old day. Went in Gushee's Top Sleigh so did not get wet. And tomorrow I shall have to go in a wagon again. Dang the luck anyway. Snow all gone.

**Wednesday, Jan. 6** Rain hard all last night. This morning the snow was all gone. Frost coming out of the ground mud. Just cussed traveling. Went today in Em's Top Buggy. Got a letter from Sammy.

**Thursday, Jan. 7** Clear and cold. And Oh deary me how rough. Went in my own wagon today and tonight my innards meaning guts feel like a peck of angleworms. 8 below zero.

**Friday, Jan. 8** Clear cold and just cussedly rough. It seems as if every bone in me has been jolted out of joint. Father went out to T. Hall got another load of hay 1030 lbs. Bag Oats \$1.70

**Saturday, Jan. 9** Fair and clear, not very cold. Drove up to Herb's tonight and captured a small Sammy. She went home with me. Capt. Jake Coombs and wife Harriet celebrated their Golden Wedden tonight. Married Fifty Years.

**Sunday, Jan. 10** Warm, snow last night and this morning. Rain all day. Old Joe Wiggin came home today but is going back in the morning.

**Monday, Jan. 11** Very warm, overcast all day, rather hard traveling. Muddy and rough and I am plamed tired. Roy Hurd swapped his gray hourse for a big bay. Died Wales Elms. Paid Mrs. French to date \$15.00

**Tuesday, Jan. 12** Overcast and darned cold. Commenced to snow about three this afternoon and tonight it is an awfull storm. Wrote to Sammy to day. Sent \$50 to Henry Rankin now owe him \$35.00 Born to Mrs. Albert Grey a Son.

## RALPH RICHARDS - 1909

**Wednesday, Jan. 13** Clear and darned cold. 9 below this morning. Went on wheels again today not snow enough for sleighing. Lent, or rather gave Birt Young \$5. She said she would pay in 30 days. Will she. No. Damn her.

**Thursday, Jan. 14** Cold raw day. Snow this afternoon and rain hard tonight. And this is my own Sammy's birthday. I wish I was with her tonight. Yes everyday and night.

**Friday, Jan. 15** Fair and warm. Not snow enough fell to go on runners. Emery and Charles Dearborn went fishing on Andrews Pond. Got 17 fine Pickerel. Largest weighed 3 1/2 lbs. And I got no letter from Sammy. Why didn't she write. Sick.

**Saturday, Jan. 16** Clear and very cold. Got Sammy and carried her over home with me to night. Gave Sammy a burnt work Taborrett.

**Sunday, Jan. 17** Snow. One of the very worst snow storms I ever see. Carried Sammy home this afternoon and came down to the Beech tonight. It is still snowing hard at 9 P.M.

**Monday, Jan. 18** Clear and just bitter cold and the damdest traveling. When it cleared last night it formed crust, and today have had to break my own road most of the way.

**Tuesday, Jan. 19** Bitter cold. This morning it was 18 below zero. And the traveling is just cussed and tonight it is snowing again. Bag Corn \$1.50

**Wednesday, Jan. 20** Fair and much warmer. Got a letter from Sammy and such a good letter too. Roy and I went Rabbit hunting got one went on Snow Shoes.

**Thursday, Jan. 21** Fair and very warm. Snow melted and trod on the road in fine shape, tis the first time in a week. Have been doing a little burn work tonight.

**Friday, Jan. 22** Very warm overcast and rain a little this afternoon. Wrote to my Sammy today, but will be with her tomorrow, which is better. Fire The old Kindell Mill, burned this morning. Hot friction pulley. Owned by W & M. Hills. No inc.

**Saturday, Jan. 23** Fair and warm. Nice day. Sammy came over home with me tonight. Commenced to snow rain and sleet tonight.

**Sunday, Jan. 24** Not very cold, but it has snowed all day long, a fine dry snow. Sammy is with me so let it snow, we don't cair.

**Monday, Jan. 25** Snow hard all day. Soft damp snow. Did not take Sammy home this morning. Stormed too hard. She is up home tonight and I wish I was.

**Tuesday, Jan. 26** Snow all last night and today. About 12 inches fell. Cussed traveling. Sammy is still at my home. God but I wish we were together tonight. My Sammy.

**Wednesday, Jan. 27** Fair and not very cold. The roads were drifted a little today, but not too bad. And my Sammy went home this afternoon. How I shall miss seeing her tomorrow.

**Thursday, Jan. 28** Fair and cold. Father went to Camden today with two barrels of grub for Will's folks. They are in pretty hard shape this winter, no work.

**Friday, Jan. 29** Fair and not very cold. Wind blew like the very devil today. Road drifted some but not bad. Got a letter from Sammy today and will see her tomorrow I hope. Died Thomas Little Aged 93 yrs.

**Saturday, Jan. 30** Snow and blow all day, and still storming hard tonight. Worst storm for years. All the roads blocked. Mail did not get to Camden tonight. I stopped down. Got a letter from little Sammy. God how I wish I was with her.

**Sunday, Jan. 31** Fair and not too cold. All the roads in town are blocked and tonight the wind is blowing like the very devil. This has been a lonesome old day for me without Sammy.

So went out to Sammy's, got her and she went over home with me. Riley Mathews, fell on the ice tonight, cutting his head and nearly hit himself.
Sat	1912 Butifull day fair and cold, but just fine sleighing, am afraid it wont last. Father hawled me a load of hay. Bert Thomas, is hawling lumber for the Hills Bro's.	Sun	1912 Butifull, day clear and fair, not very cold. But yours truly has a bum cold, just rotten. Sammy and I did not go any whaire, just stuck to the house.

**Monday, Feb. 1** Fair and cold as the devil. Made my trip all right, but the roads are in cussed shape. Drifted full, and not half broke out.

**Tuesday, Feb. 2** Cold as the dickens. The weather has been overcast. This is a good Candlemas. Let us hope winter is most over. Letter from Sammy. Bag Oats \$1.70

**Wednesday, Feb. 3** Awfull cold day and terrible hard traveling. Cold. Well rather it was only 28 below zero this morning.

**Sunday, Feb. 7** Fair and colder. Sammy and I drove up the Levenseller Pond and watched the two Humps fish. They got three little fish so we went home. And I am sick with a cussed bad cold.

**Monday, Feb. 8** Fair and quite cold and rough. Oh my, its just cussed. Carried Sammy home this morning, and it was so rough it nearly shook our — out. Paid Tom Hall for hay \$50.00

**Tuesday, Feb. 9** Clear and cold. Yes darned cold. 18 below zero this morning and that's going some. Wrote to Sammy, wist I could see her tonight.

**Wednesday, Feb. 10** Snow this morning hard, then turned to rain and it has just poured. I got wet to the hide and as I have a bad cold now, expect this will about finish me. Got no letter from my Sammy.

**Thursday, Feb. 11** Fair and warm. The roads are just a solid bed of ice, never see it so bad or smooth. Got a letter from Sammy, she like me own self has a bad cold. Mine is just cussed. Bought me a Tenor Horn.

**Friday, Feb. 12** Fair and not very cold. But oh so icy. Never see anything like it. Well tomorrow I will be out with Sammy if it don't storm. I just hope it won't.

**Saturday, Feb. 13** Fair and very warm. Snow melted awfull fast. Another day like this will spoil the sleighing. Sammy went home with me tonight. \$5 due from Birt Young.

**Sunday, Feb. 14** Overcast and cold all day. Father set two traps last night and I went to them today and had a Hedghog in each. Carried Sammy home tonight, it commenced to snow so I came down to the Beach. Married Miller Ross & Margaret Jackson.

**Monday, Feb. 15** Overcast, snow sleet fog and mist all day raw and cold. Just a bum old day. Decorated a pair of Moccians with Pocopine Quills to wair to the Masquarade.

**Tuesday, Feb. 16** Storm all day hard. Snow sleet and hale and tonight it is storming worse than ever. Got a letter from Hans today he is layed up at a place called Clear Lake Wash, with a busted ankle. Got my Indian Suit from Bannerman.

**Wednesday, Feb. 17** Fair and cold. The cussedest kind of traveling, about a foot of frozen ice fell and it is like driving in dry sand. Letter from Sammy.

**Thursday, Feb. 18** Clear and cold. Big Masquarade Ball at the Grange Hall tonight. 100 couple. 60 couple masked, fine time. Sammy went as a Red Cross Nurse, I as a Red Injun. Lewis Fenwick filled his skin so full of poor whiskey that he just naturally went to sleep, Dead Drunk.

**Friday, Feb. 19** Fair and a little warmer today but tonight it is raining. Hope it won't storm so tomorrow so I can go see my Sammy.

**Saturday, Feb. 20** Fair part of the day. Nice tonight but the front part was rainey, went up and got my Sammy she went over home with me.

**Sunday, Feb. 21** Fair nice warm day. Just lay round home and tooted my old Horn. Percy Cross came over and gave me some lessons.

**Monday, Feb. 22** Fair nice day. Did not have to drive W. Greenlaw called today and gave us all a Ponygraf concirt. Sammy and I took a ride up over the field and in pastures. Uper road.

**Tuesday, Feb. 23** Fair and warm the traveling is getting thin. A few more days like this will spoil it. Father hawled me a load of hay 820 lbs. Wrote to Sammy.

**Wednesday, Feb. 24** Rain hard all day, and still raining tonight. Awfull cold old storm and it is just spoiling the sleighing. Lots of bare spots in the roads. Wrote to Hans today. He is out on the Pacific cost. State of Washington. Bag Oats \$1.70

**Thursday, Feb. 25** Warm this morning rain and snow but it has grown colder all day and tonight it is way down below zero. Got a letter from Sammy. Married Ernest Heal via Mattie Thomas. Tim Shod \$1.00

**Friday, Feb. 26** Clear and cussed cold. The roads are just nickle plate with ice. Something cussed. But some bare ground.

**Saturday, Feb. 27** Fair nice day, not very cold. Came up home tonight via the Andrews Pond. Willis and Edna McKinnie are stopping thear in a cottage and I brought them up a load of grub. Sammy came over home with me tonight.

**Sunday, Feb. 28** One fine old day. Sammy and I took a ride. Were up to Hump's for a while this afternoon. P. Cross was up thear, tryed to pump some music into my empty think tank.

**Saturday, Mar. 6** Fair and quite cold. Went and caught little Sammy and carried her home with m. And tonight we set and talked till 3 o'clock. Yow.

**Sunday, Mar. 7** Fair, nice warmish day. Sammy and I went on a ride. Over to the ruins of the Old Pitcher Mill first then to Wilbur Greenlaws, then up to Smike's. Bought a big Phonograph Horn of Greenlaw.

**Monday, Mar. 8** Clear and cool. Town meeting. Leslie Ames 1<sup>st</sup>, Charles Moody 2<sup>nd</sup>, Chas Stevens 3<sup>rd</sup>. A.F. Hahn Treasurer. In Belfast E.L. Hanson reelected mayor by 21 votes. Paid Mrs. French in full to date \$10.00

**Tuesday, Mar. 9** Clear and cool, fine day. Elegant sleighing roads and a bed of ice, not many bair spots, but it is warmer tonight and will rain before morning.

**Wednesday, Mar. 10** Rain hard all day but clear tonight and very warm. Did a little shooting at ducks this afternoon. No luck. Got a letter from Sammy. Big time at Ctr tonight. Sociable and dance, bet Sammy went. Wish I could.

**Thursday, Mar. 11** Clear and colder, with occasional snow flurry's. Cold tonight. Still pretty good sleighing for all of the rain and warm weather we have had.

**Tuesday, Mar. 16** Fair and not very cold. The traveling is very good lots of ice in the roads. Wrote to small Sammy today. Just hope I get a letter from the little girl tomorrow. See a big mink this morning down by the Old Steamboat Wharf.

**Friday, Mar. 19** Fair nice day but a helly of a strong wind. Roads drifted some but pretty good traveling. Got letter from Sammy. She don't think she will go over with me tomorrow night. Smike and fambly are coming down Sunday.

**Saturday, Mar. 20** Butifull day fair and warm. Went over to Sammy's tonight. Hawled over my boat boards. Put my hourse in Josh's barn. Sammy and I spent the evening over at Clara's.

**Sunday, Mar. 21** Fair and warm. Herb and Sarah came down to Sammy's. Smike and I built a boat. Skiff 15 ft long by 28 in wide [drawing of boat].

**Monday, Mar. 22** Damd snow squalls all day. Some times it has been an awfull blizzard. It has been what you can call, a son of a bitch of a day. But foins sleighing.

**Tuesday, Mar. 23** Fair and warm. Well by Gav, but the crowd of hunters that are up here. Tis a trio of boys for sure. Uncle Job Ingraham 74 years, Charles Blackington 78, and Jimmy Wight 79. Now what do you know about that.

**Wednesday, Mar. 24** Fair butifull weather and nice sleighing only a few spots of bair ground. Got a letter from my small Sammy today.

**Thursday, Mar. 25** Warm and overcast all day, and tonight it is raining hard and blowing a awfull gale. Just wish I was out with my small Sammy. I wrote to her today. See 3 Robins today, first this spring.

**Friday, Mar. 26** Overcast. Powerfull wind and rain storm last night. 101 days of sleighing. Line Gale. It washed away the old Steamboat Wharf. Went out on runners this morning but came in on wheels. See a large flock of Blackbirds and many Robins.

**Saturday, Mar. 27** Fair and warmer. Went up and got my small Sammy. She went over home with me.

**Sunday, Mar. 28** Rain hard all day long, and still storming hard tonight. Sammy and I just spent the night sitting up and letting our jaws run.

**Monday, Mar. 29** Clear and cool, strong west wind. Sammy and I started for her home this morning at three o'clock and then I came down here, landed at five feetnn [fifteen?] See a Blue Bird.

**Tuesday, Mar. 30** Fair and not very cold. Roads are breaking up some, and quite muddy but thear is lots of ice in the roads, so the traveling is not so bad. Made my trip today in 5 1/2 hours. Wrote to Sammy.

**Wednesday, Mar. 31** Fair nice day. Snowed a little last night. Got a letter from Sammy, she is not feeling very well. Got cold on our midnight ride.



<i>Fri</i>	1912 Rain all day miserable old day, got good and roused. Borrowed a set of Steel letters from Don Spalding and put my name on some of my steel traps.	<i>Sat</i>	1912 Fair fine day, Sammy and I went out to my home. I cut a load of wood and went gunning a little while shot one Rabbit. Brought the Phonograph down with us.

**Friday, Oct. 1** This has been one butifull fall day. I went out hunting a little while this afternoon. Nothing doing. I am now having a damd bum old cold, my head in, and that makes me feel some rotten.

**Saturday, Oct. 2** Rottenest kind of a day, just a nasty drizzle all day and the sun shining most of the time. Roy rode out with me tonight and we went gunning, got wet that's all. Sammy's working up to Noyes. I went and got her. And what do you think Sarah Mc is going to Boston while the two kids and thear energetic par, are comeing down to Vestas for her to care for.

**Sunday, Oct. 3** Fair, just a little overcast. Sammy and I went out to E. Searsmt and got 2 bushels of Elderberry. Enough to make 4 galon of wine. Well Cy'se and Jose decided not to take the kids. Sammy told them whair she

stood and that if the brats came, she would leave. You may just be sure that squelched the whole thing. God wasent I proud of her. She told [them].

**Monday, Oct. 4** Butifull day clear and cold. Made 4 gallons wine. Carried my Sammy home this morning. Went gunning this afternoon and got nothing. Great hunting weather but as for game, well it isn't many. Killed a bird like this Kingfisher. [drawing of a bird]

**Tuesday, Oct. 5** Just a perfect day, butifull Indian summer. Very warm. Got a letter from Sammy and such a letter about four words. Am well can't write anymore. Went gunning little while tonight, nothing doing. Died in New York Myron Frohock aged 16 Typhoid Fever.

**Wednesday, Oct. 6** Butifull day, just perfect. Town Fair and say it was all right too, good one. Dance at Grange Hall tonight, more than 100 couple. Alexanders music. Sammy and I went and had just a helly of a time.

**Thursday, Oct. 7** Another butifull da., But tired. Oh no, got just 2 hours of sleep last night, and that isant too much. Died E. Edward Easton Shock and Paralysis. But we did surely have a time of it last night, all right. Paid Mrs. French \$10 Board Bill.

**Friday, Oct. 8** Just a butifull day. Very warm. Went out gunning for a little while tonight, see three partridge down on the Point "No luck" fired at one, much smoke, a few feathers.

**Saturday, Oct. 9** Butifull warm summer day. Came up got my Sammy and carried her home with me. Went up on the Harville Place with my gun for a little while this afternoon, nothing doing.

**Sunday, Oct. 10** Just a butifull hot summer day. Sammy and I took Molly and had a long ride, went out by Dickey's Mills to Hall's Corner and back home over Flagg Hill by Pitcher Pond. Butifull ride.

**Monday, Oct. 11** Overcast this morning, fogg and a fine mist all most rain. Carried Sammy home then came down to the office. Played cards tonight "500" Miss Foster, Emery, Mrs. French and I.

**Tuesday, Oct. 12** Fair this morning, but it shut in foggy about noon and tonight it has been raining firce. Gee whiz but here it is almost winter again and no Sammy for mine. I might as well go south to Dixey as keep living like this.

**Wednesday, Oct. 13** Butifull day. Pohap's it seems more fine to me because it is the beginning of my Vacation. Sarah McKinney and the little Kinneys, 3 in number, went away to Boston today, for keeps she says. Sammy and I went to the Socilest Lockal tonight. Bing Ville [??] somewhat.

**Thursday, Oct. 14** Butifull nice old day. Just took my gun and went away gunning all up and down the places where I used to go when a boy. Nothing doing. Sammy and I went to the Ctr tonight. Band Concirt and Socilest lecture at the old Church. Miss Grace Silver spoke. Fine speaker. Sammy came home wit me.

**Friday, Oct. 15** Rain. Gee whiz how it rained. I got out early and took my small Sammy home, she is stoping at Harold's. Clara's mother is sick. Don't it just beat hell how someone is always after that girl and they see her too. And I have been after ten years and I haven't got her yet.

**Saturday, Oct. 16** Butifull day cleared off fine. Just great. Went out mit my gun but noddin to shoot. Stoped down with Sambo Jonsin for dinner. She came over home with me. Heavy shower tonight. Clear and cold now at 9:30. Sammy's asleep.

**Sunday, Oct. 17** Butifull this morning but lovely old rainstorm tonight. Sammy and I have just lofed round today. Went on a ride out into Belmont this afternoon, see Herb Morse two deer. He just brought them home from the back woods. Moosehead Lake. Married Dick Crooker and Lena Heald.

**Monday, Oct. 18** Fair and warm but didn't we just have a foine old frost last night. Froze the ground. I went up to the old Seller Pond today and got my two boats. Don't expect they will ever be in thear again now that Smike Grogan and wife have moved to Boston Town.

**Tuesday, Oct. 19** And still we have butifull weather and I see Roy today and we can't go up river hunting together, that old fool wife of his has gorn away to Boston so now we just can't go up river. O' Hell.

**Wednesday, Oct. 20** Another fine day went over got Sammy. She is to viset a few days. Took my old Ithica tonight and went down by the stream. Shot one black [*drawing of duck*] all alone. I made a beach of a shot but it took both barrels to bring her down.

**Thursday, Oct. 21** Fair butifull day, got up early 3-30 this morning and went down to the Knight's Medow duck hunting, got down on the marsh just at daylight. Only one duck came in and I got her by a corking long shot with the left barrel.

**Friday, Oct. 22** Fair and warm, nice old day. Sammy got tired of stoping over here, so we harnessed Molly and I took the small girrl home. My Sambo is just a little under the weather, she just ought to go see some old pill bag and get some thing to help her.

**Saturday, Oct. 23** Butifull day. Very warm. Took Molly this morning and drove out to E. Searsmtont, tryed to get Harry Hart to go up Moosehead Lake deer hunting. Well I didnt get him. Went down to Sammy's and went gunning shot Six crows down below the Grange Hall but never a durned partridge.

**Sunday, Oct. 24** Rain hard all day. Stoped over to Sammy's tonight. Hump and I went gunning. I got two woodcock and one partridge. We swiped Geo Dickey's boat, went down the medow stream in it. Then we pinched Ann Beckeys and went across the Coleman Pond in it, set her adrift for home.

**Monday, Oct. 25** Rain like Hellen-blazes all day. Went gunning part of the time. Nothing doing. Was crawling up on a flock of partridges down in old John Dean's woods when that fool dog of Hump's came tearing in amongst them and the fun was all spoiled for mine. Damn him anyway. Died Rose Calderwood, Willard Calderwood's mother.

**Tuesday, Oct. 26** Fair butifull warm day. Sammy and I went to Belfast and bought a heep of things. I got a pair of Gloves, Moccisons, new stockings and leggings, a blanket for Molly and lots of other truck. Sammy got a new pair of shoes. We came home by the Fair Grounds [corner of Routes 1 & 52]and out through Hall's Corner Belmont. [Back Belmont Road to Hall's Corner]

**Wednesday, Oct. 27** Very warm. Sammy and I went gunning. Took Tim and we went down by the old John Miller place but never a bird. This afternoon I went over to Whitham's Hill and got a rabbit. A bloke, one John Grove, potato buyer, stope here for supper. Raining powerfull hard tonight.


**Thursday, Oct. 28** Rain hard most all day. Clear away tonight. Did a little shooting today but game is very scarse artical in this old town. Wasn't I a big damd fool not to go up into Northern Maine this fall.

**Friday, Oct. 29** Butifull day fair and not very cold. Carried Sammy to her home. Hump and I went out gunning little while. He had Sammy's rifle I kilt a big gray squirrel with it after Hump had fired three shots. And am sorry I did.

**Saturday, Oct. 30** Butifull day fine one. Went out with my gun for a little while but nothing doing. Drove over and got Sammy and we went to a whist party down at Mrs. French had a fine time and a elegant ride home in the moon light.

**Sunday, Oct. 31** Fair nice old day. And don't I just wish my playday was to begin tomorrow instead of a long, long year of storms and exposier. Sammy and I took a ride up to the upper road [*High Street*] whair the big land slides are. Had a fine ride.

**Monday, Nov. 1** Litchfield and Mills sold their grain business to Covel. Vacation ended no more fun for me. Roy commenced his vacation today and he has started right for tonight he is on his way to Grindstone in northern Penobscot for to kill a big bull moose and a bear also a deer or two. Butifull day. Hump McKinney broke his cow's leg. Had to kill and dress hen. Just the same as a dead loss. Carried my Sammy home this morning.

**Tuesday, Nov. 2** Overcast all day and very warm. Wrote to Sammy Jonsin. Am sick and tired of driving the rural mail. Wish I had a home of my own and could go gunning. Miss Foster was down to night. We played (500).

## RALPH RICHARDS - 1909

**Wednesday, Nov. 3** And oh what a nasty rain storm. It has just fallen in bunches all day and I got the Shanker end of my trousers good and wet. Just wish I was out in God's country tonight with Sammy.

**Thursday, Nov. 4** This has been a butifull warm summerlike day just a foine one. Got a letter from the State Fish Hatchery at East Auburn inquiring about train connections from Lewiston via Belfast and so I am to have my Landlock Salmon for the Seller Pond after all.

**Friday, Nov. 5** Overcast this morning, look like a storm. But it cleared away and has been a fine day. We have not had any real cold weather yet. Wrote to my Sammy today. Tonight I am alone. Em & Mrs F. have gone up to Leslie Ames to a whist party. Damn whist. Mr & Mrs Litchfield stoped here tonight. Going to Auburn tomorrow.

**Saturday, Nov. 6** Nice day, not very cold, just a little raw wind. See 3 Partridge today. Came up home by Goodwins, got my light road wagon, been having it repaired. Sammy went over home with me. She's a great girl "Bi Gar".

**Sunday, Nov. 7** Butifull warm day. Just a fine one. I washed my new wagon down in the stream, then Father and I hoisted it up into the top of the barn. Sammy and I took a little ride down as far as her home.

**Monday, Nov. 8** Warm and overcast. Rain this afternoon and evening. Carried Sammy home this morning. Lena McKinney rode down to the Beech with me and Mrs. French has trimmed H— out of me at Peonocal this evening.

**Tuesday, Nov. 9** Fair nice day and not very cold, only a fine brisk west wind. Wrote to my small Sammy and just wish I was with her to-night. Went gunning down on the point for a little while this afternoon, nothing doing.

**Wednesday, Nov. 10** Very cold last night, down to within  $16^{\circ}$  of zero but it has been a butifull warm day. And why in hevins name dident Sammy write to me today. I just know she must be sick. Roy Hurd came home today from his upriver hunting trip. One deer.

**Thursday, Nov. 11** Just a butifull day. Warm as summer. Got a letter from Sammy and I'm so glad she's not sick. It was Aunt Wellman yesterday that bothered her so she could not write. Just wish I could see that Sammy Jonsin tonight.

**Friday, Nov. 12** Another butifull warm summer day. Greatest weather ever. See Hump McKinney today. He was shingeling old Peavey's house. He wants to go gunning tomorrow night and Sun. I borrowed 13 ten gauge shells of O. Ames. Paid Father \$30 for 2 ton of hay.

**Saturday, Nov. 13** A butifull warm day. Just like summer, tonight it is very warm and overcast. Roy Hurd and Helen while coming home from Camden tonight got run into thrown from thear wagon and busted Roy's right sholder.

**Sunday, Nov. 14** Another butifull summer like day. Sammy and I rode over to her home got Smike and then went gunning. Smike shot 3 Biddys. Sammy and I see one of the biggest buck deer ever was. Dog drove him across the McKinney Medow's.

**Monday, Nov. 15** And still another warm summer like day. Got a letter from Hans the wanderer. Pay Mrs French \$10. Went out to Goodwins tonight and got Tim shod \$1.00 See many deer tracks to-day.

**Tuesday, Nov. 16** This has been a nice day. But a little colder than yesterday. Coming down the old Trap Road I fired at partridge. Cut a streak of feathers out of her. Went out to Goodwins had Molly shod \$1.00

**Wednesday, Nov. 17** Miserable day. Rain hard all day, and it has rained hard too. Hired a top of Furnald to go in so did not get wet. Got a letter from Sammy Jonsin. She wrote Smike had shot another partridge. Rah for Smike.

**Thursday, Nov. 18** Fair but rather cold raw cold wind and tonight the ground is freezing hard. First time it has froze any to speak of for three weeks. Wrote my Sammy today. Roy's vacation was up yesterday but his sholder is in such bum shape that his sub will drive this week. See 26 Wild Geese.

## RALPH RICHARDS - 1909

**Friday, Nov. 19** Fair but bully cold. Ground froze hard last night and has remained so all day. No letter from that Sammy girrl. Built a fire screen for Mrs. French to put in front of the Fire Place. Bag Corn Bag Oats \$1.36

**Saturday, Nov. 20** Butifull warm day, warm as summer. Had a row with "Old Joe Lamb" damd him anyway. Bi gar he go too far. My Sammy girl went over home with me tonight. Oh I forgot it snowed quite a bit early this morning, first snow this fall.

**Sunday, Nov. 21** Just as warm as summer. Sammy and I went over to her home this afternoon. Hump and I went gunning. Nothing doing and tonight we went skunk hunting. Still nothing.

**Monday, Nov. 22** Another fine warm day. I see a lot of deer tracks up by the old Gid Young place today so tonight M and I drove out thear and we see 4 Big live deer and fired two shots each but it was so dark we missed.

**Tuesday, Nov. 23** Slightly overcast rather raw and cold. Em and I went out to the Young Place tonight with our rifles but never the sight of another deer. I was surely a fool last night not to have killed one.

**Wednesday, Nov. 24** Nasty rain snow sleet and about everything else. Not nice. Came up home and got my Sammy for tomorrow is Thanksgiving day and Sammy Jonsin is to take dinner with me. Storming hard tonight, rain and snow.

**Thursday, Nov. 25** Snow and rain all last night and about all day. This is my rest day, don't have to drive. Sammy and I went to the dance tonight at the Grange Hall. Had a fine time. Sixty couple. Alexander's Orchestery.

**Friday, Nov. 26** Fair and warm. But Ise so sleepy tonight. See heep new deer tracks in the old Young road today. Em and I went out. Nothing. Been deer thear just the same.

**Saturday, Nov. 27** Fair and some colder. Sammy came over with me tonight. I called John Stanley Supt of the E. Auburn fish hatchery on the long distance tonight about the salmon he is shipping me for Seller Pond. See two deer tonight down on the old Hill Place.



**Tuesday, Nov. 30** Clear cold day, froze hard last night and oh so rough today. Wrote to Sammy but expect she is full of mads with me and won't answer. Father went to Belfast after my 4,000 salmon for Seller Pond. Father put salmon in pond about 8,000.

**Wednesday, Dec. 1** Cold cussed cold and awfully rough. It has been snowing hard this afternoon and evening, a fine icy snow that cuts one like a knife. Got a letter from Sammy, she is sick with the Gripp.

**Thursday, Dec. 2** Fair and much warmer, snowed about 3 inches last night and allthough a waggon went hard it was much smoother than yesterday. Sam Stevens and Will McCobb drove a big buck deer up in the old Gid Young orchard, and fired at him.

**Friday, Dec. 3** Fair and much warmer. Nice day. Got my stuff from Sears Roebuck, everything I sent for, and in addition a shirt and two pair of gloves. One pair ladies and one of gents. Been doing burnt work tonight.

**Saturday, Dec. 4** Warm, went up and got Sammy girl and she went over home with me. Poor Sammy has had a bum cold, but she is better now and we have talked history tonight till I bet some of the old Kings turned over in their graves.

**Sunday, Dec. 5** Butifull day very warm, just like a spring day. Have just taken it easy today. Carried Sammy home tonight. Gosh how its lonesome after she is gorn. Gladys French Bullock came home today from Idaho.  
[Housekeeper in the home of Carroll French, 22 years old and with a child in 1910]

**Monday, Dec. 6** Bute of a day warm as summer. But the traveling is cussed mud about six inch deep all the way. Have see several people Plowing today. Had a broken wheel tire and had a piece riveted on.

**Tuesday, Dec. 7** And still another fine warm day. Great but tonight, Oh my but don't it rain. Some hard. Been doing some burnt work tonight. Burned. School Days on a cinnamon skin for Sammy.

**Wednesday, Dec. 8** Butifull warm day. But dident it just rain and snow this morning. Well rather. Awfull hard traveling, Roads all mud. See Sammy today, she met me down on the Sand Hill. Sent a order to Roebuck & Sears \$13.26

**Thursday, Dec. 9** Clear and cold And Oh so rough. Just cussed. Got a letter from Sammy. Went to a whist party at Fred French tonight. Nice time but a bum game.

**Friday, Dec. 10** Cold and rougher than Hell, so thear. Well only another day and I shall see Sammy Jonsin. Hope she can go over home with me. Been doing some burnt work tonight.

**Saturday, Dec. 11** Fair and cold. The roads are terriable rough. Sammy wrote me she could not come over home with me so I walked over to her house and passed one of the pleasantest evenings of my life.

**Sunday, Dec. 12** Still fair and cold. Sammy and I had a fire in the fire place in the sitting room. And by G but we did have one corking evening together. Walked home late tonight.

**Monday, Dec. 13** Cold and overcast. Big storm coming. Wind just howling blue Murder tonight. And I am just feeling bum. Mrs French put a good big slug of whiskey into me, and Ime hopes to feel better tomorrow.

**Tuesday, Dec. 14** Rain and blow like all Sam Hill. It has been an awfull storm. Snowed about all night back from the shore and has rained about all day. Cleared off tonight warm. Wrote Sammy. Been doing burnt work tonight.

**Wednesday, Dec. 15** Fair and very warm, slightly overcast tonight with signs of snow. Got a good letter from a good girl "Sammy" to day. Finished burning my Christmas stuff tonight. Have burned 7 boxes and a Decorated panel. Married Leslie Richards and Mildred Paul.

**Thursday, Dec. 16** Fair and quite warm. Wrote my Sammy. Went out to Goodwins got Tim sharpened, found Father out thear having Dandy shod. Road are awfull icy, no snow on the shore about two inches out back in Searsmont.

**Friday, Dec. 17** Fair and real cold. Roads are getting worn down now so it is fairly smooth traveling. And tomorrow if it dont storm at this time I shall be with my Sammy.

**Saturday, Dec. 18** Fair and cold nice day. Came up home and got Sammy tonight and she went over home with me and Abbie got the Sears Roebuck truck she ordered, and Oh my what a mess.

**Sunday, Dec. 19** Another nice day. Just loafed around all time. Father sick with bad pain in his belly, better tonight. Allen Miller over home for a little while today.

## RALPH RICHARDS - 1909

**Monday, Dec. 20** Butifull day fair and not very cold. Got up at five this morning, hustled Sammy out of bed and carried her home. Broke bolt in single tree of my waggon. Molly pretty frightened but not act bad. Got part my Sears Roebuck stuff.

**Tuesday, Dec. 21** Another fine day, just a trifle chilly but fair and bright. A automobile just went by, hows that for the 21st of Dec. Went Ice boat sailing this afternoon great sport.

**Wednesday, Dec. 22** And still another nice day and the traveling is bully. Roads are worn down nice and smooth, rather chilly wind blowing today. Got a good letter from Sammy, she is going to Camden tomorrow with Bessie Harvey.

**Thursday, Dec. 23** Fair and not very cold. Awfull nice traveling, road hard and smooth. Been ice boating this evening. Got a fake pk. [Package?] from Sears Roebuck this morning. G.D. tear rotten hearts anyway.

**Friday, Dec. 24** Fair foine day. Went out home tonight took Sammy and we went to the Christmas Dance at the Grange Hall. Big crowd and many slushed but we had a slick time. Sammy came home with me after the dance.

**Saturday, Dec. 25** Another fine day. I got a hustle on myself and got back home and ate my Christmas dinner with Sammy. And tonight we went to a Christmas Tree time at the Town House. Married Ella Thomas and Harry Forca [??]

**Sunday, Dec. 26** Snow, well some and powerfull cold. Gee whiz but it has come in bunches all day. Tis an awfull storm. But Sammy and I have raised the very devil so we have not minded the storm. Died Stephen Fredson. Age 94 Yrs.

**Monday, Dec. 27** This has been a nice day. The roads though are full of drifts and it is just cussed traveling. Sammy did not go home until this afternoon. Father carried her over.

**Tuesday, Dec. 28** Nice day clear and cold. Very cold last night. The glass went down to 18° below zero. Awfull hard traveling, a wagon goes blamed hard through the heavy drifts. Wrote my Sammy today.

**Wednesday, Dec. 29** Fair and cold, crisp. But a nice day. Got a fine letter from Sammy, also one from ye little [?] Hans. Traveling some better but still a wagon goes hard through the snow. Borrowed Hans Alto Horn.

**Thursday, Dec. 30** Very cold, way below the zero mark and tonight it is pleasant, fair I mean, and bitter cold. Wrote to Sammy tonight and hope to be with her tomorrow night.

**Friday, Dec. 31** Fair and blamed cold. 18° below zero this morning. Came up and got Sammy and carried her over home with me and tonight we watched the new year come hoping in furnince [?] the coffin of the old.
