


# RALPH RICHARDS - 1910



**Saturday, Jan. 1** Fair and a nice day. Sammy has not been feeling very well, so my hollerday has been something of a fizzle. Just lay round and took it easy.

**Sunday, Jan. 2** Very warm, glass went way up by 40° today. Warm southerly wind, allmost a spring day. Did a very little work on my Ice Boat. And tonight took Dandy and carried Sammy home. Mattie Thomas Heal has gone clean stark raving crazy. Hell.

**Monday, Jan. 3** Snow most all day, a fine soft drizzle but tonight it has set in for a right smart storm with plenty of wind. Wrote a letter to my Sammy tonight and allmost finished the Stag Head Panel I am burning.

**Tuesday, Jan. 4** Fair but oh so cold. Coldest day this winter, brisk northly wind been howling all day. 18° below this morning and it has been below all day. And I am still wearing shoes.

**Wednesday, Jan. 5** Fair and cold 18° below this morning. Came up home tonight by way of Sammy's. She's pretty well. Snowing hard tonight. Died Mabel wife of Albert Marriner aged 27 years.

**Thursday, Jan. 6** Warmer and it has rained about all day and is still raining tonight. Got a letter from Sammy. Good one. Went in sleigh today first time this winter. Came up home again tonight. Went down to the Beech and back with Dandy. Married Leroy Marriner and Emma Hunt Hills Hell.

**Friday, Jan. 7** Cold raw day. Rain and snow all day. Everything covered with ice. Tim lame as the devil just like Dandy in his stifle joint I reckon. Father hawled me down about 100 lbs of hay. Went out to Goodwins tonight got Molly sharpened. Went in waggon today Sleigh tomorrow.

**Saturday, Jan. 8** Fair and some cold. When I got home this noon I had to shoe Tim, had the shoes all sharpened and I put them on. Came up to Sammy's over the Coleman Pond. See three men fishing on the ice. They had 25 nice Pickerel. Sammy could not come over home with me.

**Sunday, Jan. 9** Fair and a fine fine day. Went over and got Sammy, we went up to Chas Stevens to see about some hay. I didnt get any. This afternoon have been at work reparing my old sleigh. Carried Sammy home tonight. We took a little sleigh ride. Dandy sleighing. All ice.

**Monday, Jan. 10** Cold overcast raw but cold and fair tonight. Got a Pk. of stuff from S.R. Co. and still those dumbed fools have not sent what I ordered. Damn em, anyway. Father went to Camden with two bbls of truck for Will's folks today. Paid Mrs. F. board in full \$20.00

**Tuesday, Jan. 11** Fair nice clear cold day. Just elegant sleighing about 2 inches of ice in the roads and no snow just ice. Wrote Sammy. Shall hear from her tomorrow if nothing happens. Charlie Pendleton has been here tonight singing hymns while I played on my Alto horn.

**Wednesday, Jan. 12** Fair and not very cold. Came up home this afternoon big time at Grange Hall. Sammy and I went. No dance. Carrie Greenlaw went over with me.

**Thursday, Jan. 13** Another fine day. Horrible accident in our midst. Alton Andrews' horse runned away with him, one woman was thrown out and her collarbone broke. Andrews badly shaken up but not seriously injured.

**Friday, Jan. 14** Fair and cold. Came up home and went over to Sammy's and we had a fire in the Fire Place and a foin bit of an evening. Sammy is twenty five today. A real old ladie-o.

**Saturday, Jan. 15** Married Belle Turner and Marlton Knowlton. Cold yes darned cold. Nearly did freeze solid. I went in Tim's Top sleigh. Came up and carried Sammy over home with me tonight. Herb Thomas got me a new white shirt and 2 collars. Dottie Turner married Marlton Knowlton.

**Sunday, Jan. 16** Butifull day warm and just elegant sleighing. Sammy and I went on a long sleigh ride. We went down to the Coleman Pond and planted 20 Landlocked Salmon in the old Quarry. Then out across the Meadow down the Corner and Camden Ponds. Home by Wiley's Corner. Burned Eliza Parker's house caught from chimney.

**Monday, Jan. 17** Another butifull day, not very cold and nice traveling. Carried Sammy home this morning. Came down over the pond. Got 3 sofa pillow backs and cords to match for Sammy Snowball Jonsing.

**Tuesday, Jan. 18** Rain hard all day long, not very cold, everything is just covered with ice and so slippery, that one ought to have wings. Went in Em's covered sleigh. Shot a big White Arctic Owl up by Chas Dickey's but lost him.

**Wednesday, Jan. 19** Fair and very warm, warm wind and rain all last night and this morning there was no snow on the ground only a few patches of ice. I hired a wagon of Furnald 25¢ and towed my own down from home this afternoon. Wrote Sammy a letter.

**Thursday, Jan. 20** Butifull warm day, fine weather. Have been working on my ice boat today. Did not get any letter from Snowball Jonsin. Just wonder if she is sick or angry at me.

**Friday, Jan. 21** Fair and "Oh so warm" just like a day in April. Tonight it is raining hard. Got a letter from Sammy. Poor little woman. Up against it again. Her Mother had to get out on the ice to show how smart she was and managed to fall and lame herself, very bad.

**Saturday, Jan. 22** Rain ye pour a flood another deluge God but it has been an awfull rainstorm. Frost all coming out of the ground. Not storming tonight but very warm. And I did not go out tonight and can't be with my own Snowball Jonsin.

**Sunday, Jan. 23** Fair and warm. Ground froze a very little went out to Sammy's this morning. She could not go over home with me but I came over to her home for a little while this evening. Buried Delina Knight Age 93 years.

**Monday, Jan. 24** Fair and warm. Awfull rough ground froze hard. Just cussed traveling. And I am about sick with a beastly old cold and head-ach. Took a big dose of whiskey and pills now feel better. Miss Foster and Mrs. Worster been down playing cards.

**Tuesday, Jan. 25** Fair warm ye very warm. Looks like rain tonight. Wrote to Sammy. Just wish I could see her tonight. My Sammy. Could not work on my Ice Boat today. Orren away, shop locked.

**Wednesday, Jan. 26** Still fair and warm. Rather hard traveling. Roads are quite muddy. Got a letter from Sammy, she is not very well "Cough" and this is what I don't like. Worked on mast for my ice boat this afternoon. Emery sick. Bad cold. "Gripp"

**Thursday, Jan. 27** Very warm overcast bum traveling muddy as the devil. Finished mast for "iceboat" and now to night it is snowing. Soft damp snow. Just wish I was out with my Snowball Jonsin tonight. T.G. and his clerk and conkerbine have had a falling out. She threatens to leave. Oh Guts.

**Friday, Jan. 28** Fair and warm. Snow a little last night, about an inch but it went off with the sun so at noon it was all gone. Big flock of wild geese went over today, flying North. Geo Lermond shot and killed a fine red fox this morning, right in his orchard. H. Buchanan's dog driving. Wrote to Snowball Jonsin.

**Saturday, Jan. 29** Rain like Hellen Blazes all day. Died John Miller. I went in one of Furnald's top-buggys and went out in it tonight. Sammy could not come over with me "sick" so I have had a bum old evening. See 3 big deer tonight up in the head of the old Hills field.

**Sunday, Jan. 30** Fair and very warm. Went over and got Sammy for a little while carried her home at 12 M. tonight. We both see the new Comit in the west this evening. And I have a rotten cold and am now going to bed. Shelah.

**Monday, Jan. 31** Fair and some colder. Ground froze just cussedly rough. Came down this morning. Got a letter from ye "little Hans". He is working a Bug House in Worcester for his living this winter.

<p>1908 Very cold, 28° below this morning. Got a gun from my small Sammy to day. <del>to</del> <sup>tonight</sup> it is too cold for me to go.</p> <p>Fri 1909 Fair and pleasant. Nice day, the snow tread a little to day, first time for two weeks. Sammy came up across the wood on her snow shoes to see me to day.</p> <p>Sat 1910 Fair and a little colder, not bad. Sleigh went rather hard to day, cuts right through. Came up and got my snow-bill, carried her home with me. Sent my road wagon wheels out to Goodwines. Got Sammy pair new overshoe.</p> <p>Sun 1911 Fair and warm, fine day, colder this afternoon and tonight, so I carried Sammy home, this evening, stopped with her a little while then came down to the Beech. Every body in bed and asleep when I got here. Died Alben Heart.</p> <p>Mon 1912 Clear and very cold, and my cold is still simply hellish, powerful cough. Darned such weather any way, guess it will fix me for sure, if it dont get well soon.</p>	<p>1908 A short out of joint. An elephant and a terrible snow storm and the attractions for to day. Delta Seeks <del>and</del> Richards, not a relitif of mine. Thank God! Did the elephant set to day. God give them last full seals.</p> <p>Sat 1909 Overcast and very warm. Snow has settled like the devil to day. Hard traveling a horse will all bury up. Go clear to the bottom every step.</p> <p>Sun 1910 Clear and much colder. It was 6° below this morning, and tonight very much more than that. Just lay round, the house, a tofect read smoke, and talk. Sociable. Show.</p> <p>Mon 1911 Clear and cold, 18° below this morning. Roads are all ice and awful through. Got a bum head, cold coming on, wish I was out with Sammy tonight, will write her any way.</p> <p>Tues 1912 Fair and not so awful cold, bully good sleighing. Took my gun and went out for a little while tonight. No luck. Self got a hellish bad cold and feel bum.</p>

**Tuesday, Feb. 1** Overcast all day, looks like a storm. Big Mask Ball at Grange Hall went with Sammy did not mask. Fine time, 65 couple.

**Wednesday, Feb. 2** Bright fair day, Sunshiney. Now we shall see what we shall see. Will it storm or not. Have we had part of our winter or is it all to come. Feel pretty well used up tonight.

**Thursday, Feb. 3** Overcast and rather cold not bad but a little disagreeable. Been spitting snow, very fine all day and tonight it is storming hard. Lena McKinney and Charlie Pendleton were in tonight to do what they call sing. Oh Hell.

**Friday, Feb. 4** Snow hard all day, not very cold but just cussed traveling. Sleigh cuts right through to the ground and lots of places it is all bare. Got a nice letter from my Sammy Snowball Jonsin tonight.

**Saturday, Feb. 5** Fair and a little colder not bad. Sleigh went rather hard to-day cuts right through. Came up and got my Snow-ball, carried her home with me. Sent my road waggon wheels out to Good-wins, new tires. Got Sammy pair new Overshoes.

**Sunday, Feb. 6** Clear and much colder. It was 6° below this morning, and tonight very much more than that. Just lay round the house, a lofed, read, smoke and talked Socialism Sho'

**Monday, Feb. 7** Fair and very cold. 12° below zero this morning, and it has not been above the zero mark anytime to-day. Strong west wind. "Damn such weather". Carried my Sammy home this morning. Born to Mabel and Herbert Richards, a Daughter.

**Tuesday, Feb. 8** Fair and much warmer. Rather a nice kind of a day. Wrote to my Sammy Snowball. Orren Ames made me a pair of wooden sleigh shoes 4 in wide \$2.00. Durned lonesome to-night without Sammy.

**Wednesday, Feb. 9** Warm, very warm, dark and overcast tonight. Will rain before morning. Went on my new wooden sleigh shoes today, they work fine. Got a letter from Sambo Jonsin.

**Thursday, Feb. 10** Fair and warm. Last nights rain turned to snow and to-day it has been fine sleighing. Wrote my Snow-ball Jonsin a letter. High wind blowing to-night and it's much colder.

**Friday, Feb. 11** Another nice day, fair and cold. Bully good sleighing. Got a "little note" from Sammy and if it don't storm she will go over with me tomorrow night.

**Saturday, Feb. 12** "Did it snow" Well some, and then some more. Awfull old storm. Such a bad one that I did not go out home tonight but stopped down in this God forsaken hole and I want to see Snow-ball Jonsin so much.

**Sunday, Feb. 13** Fair and cold. Went out to Sammys this morning, awfull hard traveling, about a foot of hard snow, had to break my own track most of the way. Carried Sammy over home with me then carried her back at 12 tonight.

**Monday, Feb. 14** This has been a nice day, but rather cold. 6° below zero this morning. Dance at the Grange Hall tonight. Prof. Brown's Full Orchestra meaning all will be tite. I didnt go but I reckon Sammy is thear and I hope she has a fine time.

**Tuesday, Feb. 15** Fair and much warmer but the traveling is still pretty bum. And Sammy did not write me. Now that's darned mean for I expected a letter telling me all about the fool dance last night. Hell Horrible Skandal. Woman "calved" "miscarried" "beshit". In fact "everything" on the Hall floor Roomer said twas Ella Young.

**Wednesday, Feb. 16** Overcast, raw cold fogg over everything this morning. Cleared away about noon and has been a nice warm afternoon. Took Em's rifle and went up on the Mt shot one poor old Hedghog. Got a good letter from my Sammy.

**Thursday, Feb. 17** Snow hard all day and very cold. And tonight it is still snow-ing and commencing to blow. I am afraid the roads will be drifted full tomorrow. Wrote my own Sammy this morning. Do wish we were togather to-night.

**Friday, Feb. 18** Fair and some cold. Just horriable traveling. Had to break my own track for about twenty miles of my road today. Aint that fun. Did not go up by Geo Mahoney's. Road full of drifts. Went over by Sammy's and up through Pottle's wood road. See Sammy. Married Allie Allen and Flossy Athens [Athearn].

**Saturday, Feb. 19** Fair nice day. Came up and got Sammy. She went over home with me and tonight I have been giving the folks a concirt on my Alto Horn. When everybody had gorn to bed, It dawned on me that my music was not appreciated. Shelah.

**Sunday, Feb. 20** Fair and warmer. Nice day and nothing to do. Sammy and I have fought a little (fun) and danced a few. Carried her home tonight after 11 o'clock. Storm coming all thickening up.

**Monday, Feb. 21** Rain rain rain all day long. Awfull storm. I hired M's top sleigh and made my trip in that. Came up home got Snowball Jonsin, and she went over with me. Tomorrow I rest. Stabbed to death a Mrs. French of Belfast. One Grady and a Benner held for the slaughter.

**Tuesday, Feb. 22** Fair and some colder this morning. But commenced to snow just before dark, and it is coming down now in bunches. And we can't get to the dance Kaws they won't have it. Made a picture frame to-day.

**Wednesday, Feb. 23** Snow like the very devil this morning but cleared early and it has been a fine day ever since. Carried Sammy home. Father hawled a load of hay to-day from the old Stevens Place. Have to pay \$20 a ton in the barn. Aint that cussed.

**Thursday, Feb. 24** Fair and cool but a nice day. Sleighing pretty good. Wrote Sammy a letter today. Came down with Dandy this afternoon, intend to drive him over the route tomorrow, it will be the first time in six months.

**Friday, Feb. 25** Fair this has been a rippen old day. Pretty cold this morning.  $16^{\circ}$  below zero out home and  $24^{\circ}$  below in E Searsmt. Went out to Goodwins and had Molly shod new \$1.00 Had her shoes fitted so I can put quarter boots on her.

**Saturday, Feb. 26** Another nice day but very cold this morning.  $23^{\circ}$  below and that's going some. Snow squalls tonight and much warmer. Went up got Snow-ball and she went home with me.

**Sunday, Feb. 27** Warm rain most all day just whittleing the snow. Sambo Jonsin is not feeling very well, bad cold, and as for myself I have hardly looked out of doors today. Born to Mrs and Mr Homer Smith a Son.

**Monday, Feb. 28** Rain very hard this morning but stoped about sun-up. Overcast and misty most all day. Father carried Sammy home this forenoon and took Tim down to Goodwins and had him shod. Sleighing about ruined.

Well if every thing is all right I shall be with Sammy tomorrow night. this time wish I was now I do. Burt Young Paved me <sup>1/4</sup> on account. Only 4 more</p> <p><sup>Sat</sup> <sup>1910</sup> Still fair and warm. and the traveling is fine. the frost is not out of the ground of course but the roads have dried out on top in fine shape. Came up and got Sambo. we went home by way of Tuckers School House and took ride down into Tool Millers woods.</p> <p><sup>Sun</sup> <sup>1911</sup> Overcast. got up early took Sammy home, went down to the Cen Pond fishing, but got nothing. Percy Cross came home today. I got dinner ready and one small Picherell. Sammy did not come back home with me.</p> <p><sup>Thurs</sup> <sup>1912</sup> Warm. Snow squalls. almost rain. Took my gun this afternoon went up in the woods and <sup>had</sup> got a nice big Bunney, which mine. Pup ate up as soon as I got home.</p>	<p><sup>Frid</sup> <sup>1908</sup> Slightly overcast. warm. See a robin today. Geo Pendleton, 2nd 9. big cod today. But I didn't get any letter from Sammy, and that's what makes me mad. Had a wagon wheel fixed, that cost me 30¢.</p> <p><sup>Sat</sup> <sup>1909</sup> Fair and cool. nice day, but its乍eking so snow off, powerfull frost. Sammy went home with me. We went by way of E. Potters.</p> <p><sup>Dom</sup> Dandy Shod \$1.</p> <p><sup>Sun</sup> <sup>1910</sup> Another nice day. Fair and warm. Me and my Sammy went on a walk down by the old stream. we walked across on a plank, sheas a spotter. Carried Sambo home to-night. Powerfull dark and just a little muddy, still not very bad.</p> <p><sup>Mon</sup> <sup>1911</sup> Fair but full Town Meeting day. T. E. Guly, Chas Moody, Ernest Carter, selectmen. H. Goodwin tax collector. etc. Major Hanson, reelected for the 5<sup>th</sup> time by 96 majority.</p> <p><sup>Tue</sup> <sup>1912</sup> Bag Oats 7.20 Bag Corn 9.20 Bag Mix Feed \$1.60</p> <p><sup>Wed</sup> <sup>1912</sup> Warm and a terrible rain storm. awful traveling. Roy only went out as far as the Cen. But Warren and I went the full route. Slump forfully. Rain in currents all day, and still raining to-night. Hell.</p>

**Tuesday, Mar. 1** Nasty, rain, mist, fogg. Bitch of a day. Most of the snow gone. Durned hard traveling. Wrote Sammy. Raining to-night. Put on pr. of stocking I bought of Mother. Wonder how long they will last me.

**Wednesday, Mar. 2** Overcast, thick fogg, not very cold. Bum sleighing. Got a letter from Snowball, she's good. Write her allso. Just wish I was out there this night. Died Will Barton aged about 45 yrs.

**Thursday, Mar. 3** Butifull warm day. Went on sleigh this morning but came in from home on a waggon. Sleighing all gone. Went up to Renis Mathews tonight. He's been playing for me on his cornet.

**Friday, Mar. 4** Butifull fair warm day, just fine. Went out to Good-wins tonight and got my wagon wheels. Have been having them new tired and new rims. \$6.00. Dance Grange Hall tonight. I suppose Sammy went. Hope she has a good time.

**Saturday, Mar. 5** Fair and very warm. Came up and got my Snow-ball. She went over home with me. See Manly Turner this morning. He is on his way to Liberty to see his sister. Born to Mrs and Mr Parker Dean, a son, 9 lbs. Hell.

**Sunday, Mar. 6** Butifull day, very warm. Sammy and I went on a ride. Went up to the place whair Hump used to live. Then down through the Ctr. to the Coleman Pond, then Home.

**Monday, Mar. 7** Rain just come down in bunches, it has been an awfull storm. It has rained, snowed, haled and thundered mit [with] litnin. Sammy is at my house. Wish I was out with her to-night. I do. Paid Mrs F. in full \$10.00.

**Tuesday, Mar. 8** Butifull day, froze a little last night but the traveling got rather sticky about noon. Sammy Jonsin is still at my home when I got thear. I'se glad but she had to go home to-night.

**Wednesday, Mar. 9** Another butifull day, just fine. Got a letter from Mrs. Green. She writes that she has put her propity in Judge Robinson's hands of Camden to sell. So I wrote to him tonight just wish I could see that Green Acre place.

**Thursday, Mar. 10** (53 days of sleighin) Some colder but a butifull day and this afternoon it is warm again. Went clambing but never got a bite. Wrote to Sammy to-day. Do wish I was with her to-night.

**Friday, Mar. 11** Another fine day, froze some last night so the traveling was pooty good to-day. Went after clams to-night, got about a peck of nice big fellows. Got a letter from Snow-ball.

**Saturday, Mar. 12** Still fair and warm and the traveling is fine. The frost is not out of the ground of coarse but the roads have dried out on top in fine shape. Came up and got Sambo and we went home by way of Tucker School House and took a ride down into Joel Miller's woods.

**Sunday, Mar. 13** Another nice day, fair and warm. Me and my Sammy went on a walk by the old stream, we walked across on a plank. She's a sport. Carried Sambo home to-night. Powerfull dark and just a little muddy, still not very bad.

**Monday, Mar. 14** Very warm. Snowed this morning early but cleared off fine. Town Meeting, A.F. Hahn, Chas Moody, Chas Stevens, Selectmen. A. Moody, H. Dean, S. Phinney, Road Commissioners. M. Ross, Clerk, L. D. Ames, Treasurer. Hans Rankin came home today from Worcester. Mayor Hanson of Belfast reelected by 12 Votes. C. Mesirvy caught 3 big trout Corner Bridge.

**Tuesday, Mar. 15** Fair and very warm. Froze hard last night but thawed up early, and it has been quite muddy this afternoon. Seen a Chipmonk (striped squarrell) to-day. The boys at the corner bridge are getting some fine trout.

**Wednesday, Mar. 16** Fair and very warm and dumed hard traveling. Wrote to Sambo Jonsin. Emry went up the Metcalf Brook this afternoon fishing and he got 8 (Eight) fine large trout. What do you know about that. Born to Eddie Marriner and his wife, and now they have 6.

**Thursday, Mar. 17** Fair and a bit colder. Awfull rough traveling. See two Robins today. Renis Mathews and his foster sister Bessie Fernald were in tonight. Been having what old Clam Jonsin would call a Musical.

**Friday, Mar. 18** Fair and darned cold. Roads are awfull rough. Tonight I burnt a picture frame for Mother. Next Monday is her birthday. Made the frame myself. Drew and burned Poencitys on beam. Got a good letter from little Sambo Jonsin. Born to Mr and Mrs Melbry Hunt, Girl.

**Saturday, Mar. 19** Another nice day, the wind has just howled all day long and to-night it's still whooping. Very much warmer, and nice traveling. Came up and got Sammy. She went over home with me. Plenty Robins now.

**Sunday, Mar. 20** Warm, and a darned fine kind of a day. Southerly wind still howling. Did some grafting this afternoon. Finished re-topping a tree. Sammy's not feeling very well.

**Monday, Mar. 21** Another fine warm day. Sammy stopped over home today helping Abbie make a waist so I came up from the Beech and carried her over home this evening. And this is my Mother's birthday. 59 yrs old to-day.

**Tuesday, Mar. 22** Overcast this morning, raw, and cold. Rained about four hours in the middle of the day but has all cleared away, fine to-night. See many Blue Birds today. Died Gideon Young an old old citizen aged 91 yrs.

**Wednesday, Mar. 23** Butiful day, warm, just great. Quite muddy so it is rather hard traveling. Wrote Sammy allso. Sent money order to S.R. & Co. \$2.25. Silver Spavin Rendy. Got to use it on Tim. Signed 3 months for National Sportsman 25¢. Born to Mr and Mrs Elisen Morse a son 10 1/4 lbs.

**Thursday, Mar. 24** A fine warm day. Roads are getting pretty bad - frost coming out all the way. Fred Hardy and Jerry Young are here at Emrys sawing fire wood. Had my shaft ends put in new 60¢. Got a letter from Sammy.

**Friday, Mar. 25** Fair and Hot. This is the hottest day thear ever was this time of year. It's been 72° of heat in the shade all day. Frost almost all out and terriable traveling. One foot of mud every whair.



**Wednesday, Apr. 6** Very foggy this morning but out back of the hills it has been a fine warm day. Did not get any letter from Snow-ball, now I wonder if she is sick. Dont see why she didn't write. Thick fogg to-night. Died in E. Sears mont John Wellman.

**Thursday, Apr. 7** Warm, very foggy. Heavy shower this morning, pretty hard traveling. Got a letter from Sammy Kinney this afternoon. Took my gun tonight after dark and went up to Crehor's Point looking for wild gees.

**Friday, Apr. 8** Thick fogg all day but late this afternoon it cleared off and to-night it is bright starlight and some colder. Many flocks of wild gees went over today. Big flocks. Commenced work on new flote and boat whaf to-day. Been working on the outer cribb.

**Saturday, Apr. 9** Rains about all day, wet nasty. See 2 ducks in the Seller Pond this morning. Came up home got Sammy, she went over with me. Went down to the stream tonight after trout, nothing doing. Died Cinthy Levenseller. Strange case.

**Sunday, Apr. 10** Fair nice day but just a trifle cold. Took my gun and went down in the Big Woods. Wanted to graft but to very cold. Sammy and I had a very good day, not many fight's.

**Monday, Apr. 11** Fair and cold big wind been blowing all day, just howling. Carried Sammy home this morning. The ground froze last night. This afternoon I have been helping build the new boat whaf.

**Tuesday, Apr. 12** Another fine day, just a good one. Only we had one heavy snow squall. This afternoon I helped Ai Young tear down Dearborn's old barn. The roads have all settled and the mud has all dried up. Hollis Dean has been working on roads today with a split scraper.

**Tuesday, Apr. 19** Rain hard this morning. It's been thick fogg all day long. Wrote my Sammy a letter today. Poor Annie Patten buried. Wish I was out with my Snow-ball tonight. Victor Goldeing came from Worcester.





**Sunday, Dec. 4** Fair bright day. Went down to the Qurry this morning and fitted up a shoe for Molly and put it on her. Went to my traps. Have had one of my Wolf Larson head-achs all-day. Carried Sammy home tonight. Both of us are half sick.

**Monday, Dec. 5** Clear and cold. Very cold, way below zero this morning. Came down this morning. My old head feels like a bag of jelly but it's some better. Just hope Sammy is better. Wish we were togather to-night. Bag Oats \$1.30. Paid Mrs French in full to date \$10.

**Tuesday, Dec. 6** Clear and dumed cold. Traveling is pretty good now. It has worn down and is fair wheeling. Lewis Fenwick buried today. Wrote a letter to my Sammy girl. Do hope she is better from her mean old cold. Married Allie Dunton and Grace Moody.

**Wednesday, Dec. 7** Overcast and blamed cold. Got the nicest letter from Sammy, and she is much better of her cold. This afternoon went over to Orren's shop and did some work on my patent. Bag Oats \$1.30

**Thursday, Dec. 8** Clear and powerfull cold. Pretty nice traveling the roads are worn down fairly smooth. Wrote a letter to Sammy Jonsen, my Sammy. Worked over to Orren's this afternoon. Think about two days more will see the finished model. Got a letter from Will today.

**Friday, Dec. 9** Another clear cold day. Went out to Goodwins tonight and had Dandy shod. \$1. Paid. Got another fine letter from Sammy to-day. Emry's leg that he cut, and had such a bad time with, has broke open again, and is a running soar. Paid Goodwin \$5.00. Now owe him \$3.00.

**Saturday, Dec. 10** Fair and still very cold. Went out to Goodwins to-night, got Molly shod. \$1. Paid allso 35¢ on account. Came home by Sammy's she could not come over with me, so I walked over to her house this evening. Paid Covel in full for grain \$15.95. Bag Meal \$1.35. 4 Bags Corn \$5.40. 5 Bags Oats \$6.50.

**Sunday, Dec. 11** Fair and very cold. Sammy and I have had a fire in the fireplace and have had a slick time. Took the dog and went down to the brook and dened a mink see him but could not get him.

**Monday, Dec. 12** A little warmer today, but still pretty blamed cold. Sent an order for Sammy to Seigel Cooper Co. today for Christmas stuff. \$5.82. Wish we were togather tonight I do. Commenced giving Molly meditan for her cough. Gave her a quart of Linseed Oil to start with.

**Tuesday, Dec. 13** Clear and very cold. Came down this afternoon with Molly, and me thinks the oil I gave her yesterday is working by the way it came through her. Just covered my wagon. Wrote a letter to Sammy tonight.

**Thursday, Dec. 22** Clear and cold. Pretty bum sleighing. Had a big mail today. \$3.25 cancalation today. Went down to the office this evening and sorted mail for tomorrow. Been drawing pen and ink pictures to-night. Wrote Sammy a letter this morning.

**Friday, Dec. 30** Fair and cold again. Came up home tonight via Sammy's. We went and set trap for Mink. Sammy could not come over with me, her mother is not feeling very well.

**Saturday, Dec. 31** Fair and very cold. Went home by Goodwins had Molly sharpened. .50¢ then went up to Sammy's, her Mother very sick, so I came home and this evening walked over to Sammy's house.
