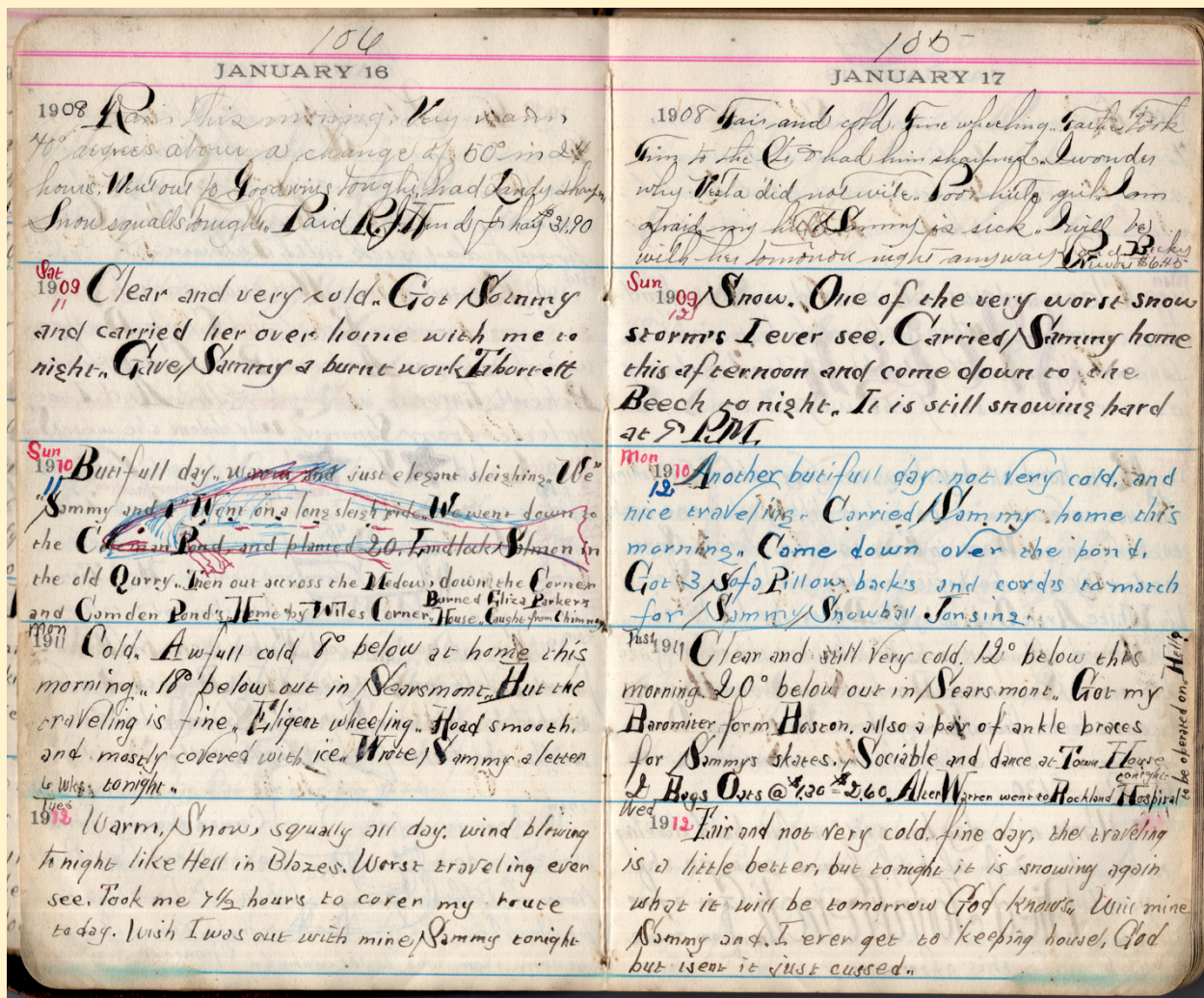


RALPH RICHARDS - 1911



Sunday, Jan. 1 Fair and warm. Went down to the Coleman Pond little while. Set another mink trap. Sammy's mother so sick she had the Dr. twice today. See 2 rabbits. Sammy about played out.

Monday, Jan. 2 Warm, rain some bum day. Came home from Sammy's about noon. Went back again tonight. Carried the kitten Nero over for her. Burleig Ordaway started driving the Ctr. Lincolnville -- Belfast stage. 4 Wks.

Tuesday, Jan. 3 Rain hard all day, one awfull storm. Mud about 5 inch deep all the way and the frost all coming out of the ground. Still raining hard tonight. See 2 rabbits side the road today. Wrote Sammy tonight.

Wednesday, Jan. 4 Fair come off cold again. Snowed some last night and has been awfull traveling today. Dick Crooker moved into the W.A. Mathews house. No letter from Sammy. Hope she is not sick. Paid Covel for grain in full \$16.05

Thursday, Jan. 5 Slightly overcast. Snow squalls. Cold as the devil. Went over to Orren's this afternoon finished drilling the skate plates I am making for Sammy. Got a nice letter from her today. Father came down got me load of grane. Bag Mx Feed 1.50. 2 Bag Oats @ \$1.25 = \$2.50 Bag Corn \$1.30. Bag Meal \$1.30 = \$6.60.

Friday, Jan. 6 Almost fair and cold. Rodes awfull rough. Sent Sammy a letter, wish I was with her to-night. Did some work on her skates tonight. Ray Coombs and I went down the shore gunning for a little while.

Saturday, Jan. 7 Snow hard all day. Allmost rain. Heavy damp snow. Went in Em's sleigh. Stayed down at the Beech till about 10 oclock then came up home with my wagon. And I didnt see Sammy tonight at all. Damd rotten shame. Bag Oats \$1.25. Died in Boston Baby Belle Fox Age only 27 years.

Sunday, Jan. 8 Fair and warm. Went over to Sammy's and we went to our traps. She went on her snow shoes, and we got a white Weasel. Then we went on a nice long ride down through Youngtown. Nice Sammy. My own Sammy.

Monday, Jan. 9 Rain awfull hard last night, but cleared off fine, very warm. Snow has meltid and run all day. Little colder tonight. Just wish I was out with Sammy. 5 wks

Tuesday, Jan. 10 Fair and not very cold. Fred Brown of this place lost at sea off Highland Light with his barge and crew this morning at 5 oclock. Warren P. and I went to Camden tonight. Bought Sammy a nice pair of skates \$1.50. Sent to Montgomery and Co. for new cap .45¢

Wednesday, Jan. 11 Fair and warm. Got a fine letter from Sammy. Mrs French fell on the ice and broke both bones of her right leg in the ankle joint. Dr Simmons set the bones. Dr Young gave the eather. Awfull bad break.

Thursday, Jan. 12 Fair and warm. Came out to Goodwins tonight had Dandy sharpned, then came home by Sammy's. Stopped and see her for a little while. Deedy and I went skating tonight. Sent for a pr of skaters ankle braces for Sammy. Sharpning Dandy 50¢ Died Abner Dunton of Hope Age 103.

Friday, Jan. 13 Fair not very cold, and blamed good wheeling. I am feeling a little bit under the weather. Poor old Luesh. He got {Died Lucius Knight} his at last, and blamed good kind of a man he was too.

Saturday, Jan. 14 Warm, and thick of fogg all day. Came up home got Sammy, and we went up to Cilly to a dance tonight. 35 couple. Walter Flagg and Nate Wellman had a fight 80¢ Sammy's birthday. Gave her nice pair of skates. Died Stephen Gushee Sr.

Sunday, Jan. 15 Fair and not very cold. Father went Fred Brown's furnall. I slept most all day. Hollis Dean came over and had his hair cut. Carried Sammy home tonight, she is not feeling very well.

Monday, Jan. 16 Cold. Awfull cold. 8° below at home this morning. 18° below out in Searsmont. But the traveling is fine. Eligent wheeling. Roads smooth and mostly covered with ice. Wrote Sammy a letter tonight. 6 wks.

Tuesday, Jan. 17 Clear and still very cold. 12° below this morning. 20° below out in Searsmont. Got my Baromiter from Boston, allso a pair of ankle braces for Sammy's skates. Sociable and dance at Town House tonight. 2 Bags Oats @ \$1.30 = \$2.60. Alter Warren went to Rockland hospital to be operated on. Hell?

Wednesday, Jan. 18 Fair and still awfull cold. 16° below here this morning and 20° out in Searsmont. Damd such cold weather anyway. Got a nice letter from Sammy Jonsin. Went over to Orren's and worked a little while on my skates. Bag Corn \$1.30

Thursday, Jan. 19 Warmer, nice day and most elegant wheeling. Put the Ankle Braces on Sammy's skates this afternoon. Sent her a letter today. Dr Simmons came down tonight and put Mrs. French's leg in a plaster cast.

Friday, Jan. 20 Fair and cold, cold raw eastly wind and it's going to snow and snow hard I think and all becaws Sammy and little me were planing to be together tomorrow night. Just wish we was together tonight. Got 50¢ Sugar for Mother.

Saturday, Jan. 21 Rain this morning, foggy very warm. Came up home and went over to Sammy's to spend the night. We had a bully fire in the fire-place, and had a jolly good time. Father took Tim and Molly down to Goodwin's and had them shod. \$2.00 Bag Mx Feed \$1.55. Died Rose Pendleton.

Sunday, Jan. 22 Fair and not very cold. Sammy and I went skating, went down on the Medow Stream and the Andrews Pond. Had one fine time. Sammy is a pretty good skater. She had on her new skates for the first time. I got them in Camden Peck and Snyder.

Monday, Jan. 23 Clear and cold. Got a early start this morning. Went over to Sammy's and she was not up so I did not see her at all. Damd mean old shame. Hell, damn, son of a gun, and gosh. Wrote her a letter tonight any way. 7 Wks.

Tuesday, Jan. 24 Fair and mild, nice day, bully good wheeling. Emry took my skate blades to Camden and ground and polished them to-day, and this afternoon I worked on them over to the shop. Wrote a letter to Sammy. Bag Oats \$1.30

Wednesday, Jan. 25 Fair and warm, that is some warm. Got a letter from Sammy girl, just a very little short one. Wish I was out with her tonight. Got an insulting letter from Edith Perry this morning. I returned it and wrote her that when I wanted her advice I would ask for it.

Thursday, Jan. 26 Fair, not very cold and dandy good wheeling. Only a horse must be sharp. Dident see anything of Sammy and I looked and looked. Darnation and gosh. Father down and got grain. I have bought \$6.25 worth this month and gave him \$4.00 for flour.

Friday, Jan. 27 Snow a little last night, mild and overcast today, snowing tonight. Hard traveling, cussed slippery horses ball and had hard work to stay on their feet. Wrote Sammy. Wish I was out with her tonight. Ann Thomas and her litter moved to Belfast to-day. Thank God?

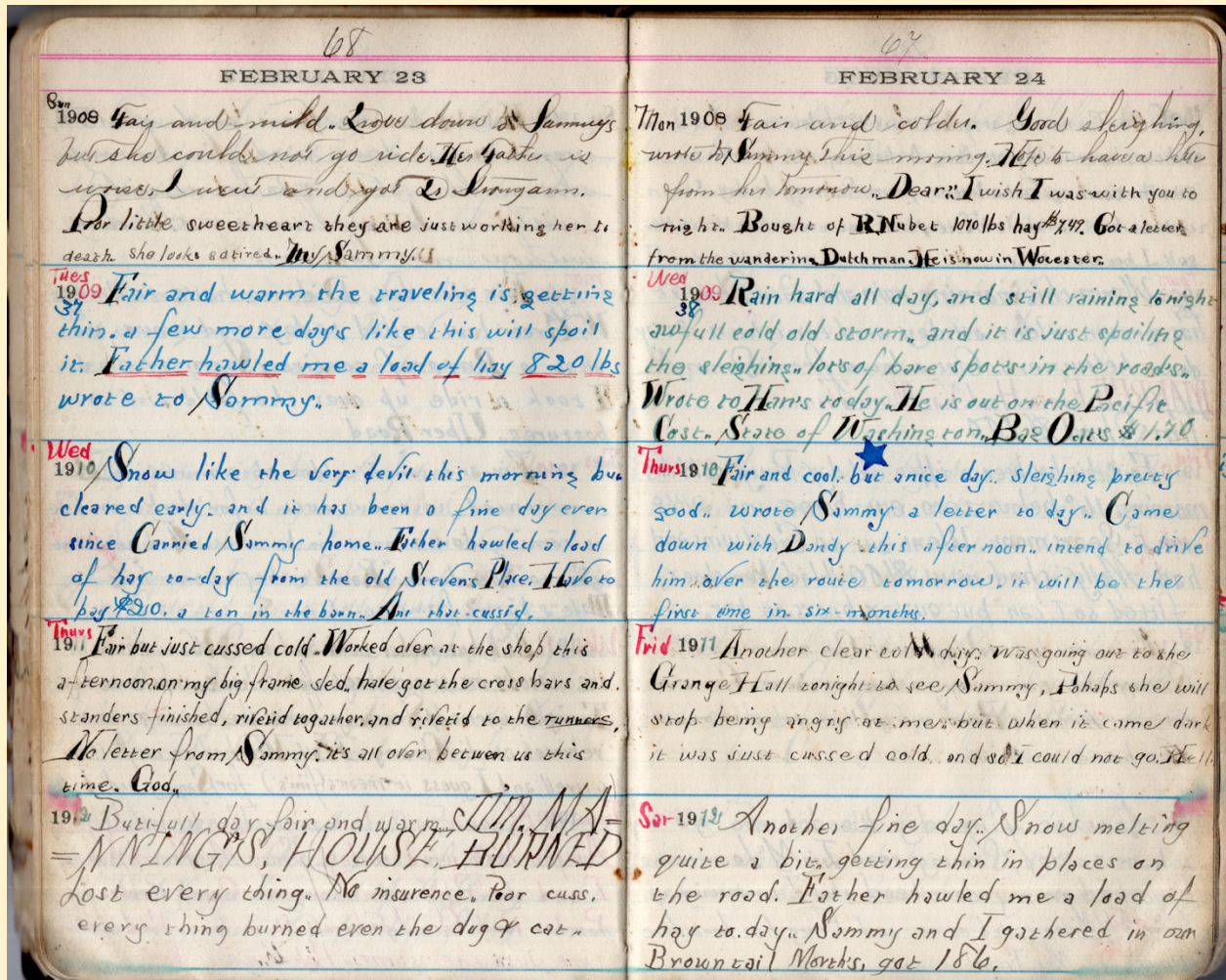
Saturday, Jan. 28 Snow hard all last night, and all today. About 8 inches fell. Came up home tonight, was going over to Sammy's but it is blowing a regaler blizzard. Very cold and the roads are drifting full. Went in Em's old Sleigh.

Sunday, Jan. 29 Fair and some warmer. Folks all sick at home, bad colds. So little me got breakfast. Went over to Sammy's, put my horse in Josh's stabel and Sammy and I have had a great time together. One of the best we have had for ages.

Monday, Jan. 30 Fair and very warm. Rain about all last night but it has been a fine warm day. Tonight it is very cold and is blowing Great Guns, the worst gale of the winter. God, don't I wish I was out with Sammy Jonsin. 8 wks.

Tuesday, Jan. 31 Clear and very cold 10° below this morning. Fine sleighing, roads are all covered with ice. Sent Sammy a letter this morning. Just wish I was out at her home with her to-night.

Wednesday, Feb. 1 Clear and very cold 18° below this morning. Fine sleighing, roads are smooth and hard. Got a foine bit of a letter from my Sammy. Had a sleigh show put on my sleigh this afternoon. Orren Ames \$1.25

Thursday, Feb. 2 A awfull snow storm. Snowed hard all day and fearfully cold, 2° or more below zero all day, and the wind is blowing a gale. H.E. Wrote Sammy a line this morning telling her not to look for me to-night. We intended going to Cilly to a dance.

Friday, Feb. 3 Fine day, fair and very clear, not very cold. See Sammy when I came down by the Barritt place this morning. Carried \$65. out and paid the school marm "Annie Richards" in the Miller school. Got a nice letter from my Sammy.

Saturday, Feb. 4 Awfull storm. It has just powred in torrants all day long, and I got souced to the hide. Cleared off tonight. So went out to Sammy's, got her and she went over home with me. Riley Mathews fell on the ice tonight, cutting his head and nearly kilt hissself.

Sunday, Feb. 5 Fair and warm, fine day. Colder this afternoon and tonight, so I carried Sammy home this evening, stoped with her a little while then came down to the Beech. Everybody in bed and asleep when I got here. Died Alben Heart.

Monday, Feb. 6 Clear and cold, 18° below this morning. Roads are all ice and awfull rough. Got a bum head, cold coming on. Wish I was out with Sammy tonight. Will write her any-way. 9 wks \$22.50

Tuesday, Feb. 7 Another awfull snow storm, the worst storm and the most snow fell this winter all day long it has fell, and tonight it's just as bad, with no sign of letting up. Wrote my Sammy today and wish I was with her tonight.

Wednesday, Feb. 8 Fair clear not very cold. Road full of snow but they got a hustle on this morning and broke them out in good shape. Got a fine letter from Sammy. Paid Orren Ames \$2.60. Bought a sled for Archie \$1.50. Paid Covell in full for grane \$22.35 Paid Jackson and Hall on acct \$20.00

Thursday, Feb. 9 Fair and warm day. Dance tonight at Freemans Hall, for benefit Alton Dean, he is slowly dying with consumption. Father was down here this afternoon and got some grane. I gave him \$5. Commenced building a frame sled. Got the runners out and bent.

Friday, Feb. 10 Fair and warm, nice day. Have been wondering if Sammy is sick, got no letter from the small girl. Made the 4 cross bars for my frame sled and made a casting pattern for Will's patent. Em will take it to Camden to-morrow and get the moldid.

Saturday, Feb. 11 Fair nice day but pretty hard traveling. Got a little note from Sammy and she is sick, aint that a damd shame. Drove up and see her tonight and she has a cussed head ach and just feels rotten. Married Everett Scruton and May Norton.

Sunday, Feb. 12 Overcast and snow squalls all day. Went over to Sammy early this forenoon, put Dandy in Josh's barn and we have had a fire in the open grate all day and have just had a fine time, till some of those bitches from the Grange sent over for Sammy to take part in a play.

Monday, Feb. 13 Clear and cold, came down this morning pretty hard traveling. This afternoon went over to Orrens and made a pattern for a part to my model. Got a letter from Billy this morning. Paid Mrs French, board in full to date \$25.

Tuesday, Feb. 14 Fair and very cold. 12° below this morning. Sent Sammy a card telling her I would go with her to the dance at Cilleys tonight. But it was so cold I telephoned her that I was not coming, pobily she went just the same.

Wednesday, Feb. 15 Clear and very cold 20° below this morning. Got a letter from Sammy. She wrote me all about the dance at Cilleys. Shipped Will his old model today. Sent for 9 ft – 3 in 6 ply canvas belt \$1.23

Thursday, Feb. 16 Fair and much warmer, the snow meltid a little today. The road up by Geo Mahoney's is blocked full of snow. Damd the snow anyway. Went over to Orren worked a little while. Emry and his crew set up thear Smoke stack for the new steam mill.

Friday, Feb. 17 Overcast and much warmer, the air fells like spring. But we will probily have a couple of feet of snow. Road up by Geo Mahoneys blocked. I had to take my horse out of my sleigh turn and come back and go up the Old wood road, by Sammy's see her a few minutes.

Saturday, Feb. 18 Clear and not very cold. Could not get up by Geo Mahoney's today, so went up through the wood road. Came up got Sammy she went over home with me. Bag Corn \$1.20 2 Bags Oats

Sunday, Feb. 19 Clear and cold, Carried Sammy home about noon. She has to go over to rehirsal at the Grange. She plays the Witches part in Imogene, the dramer those damd fool Granger's are getting up.

Monday, Feb. 20 Fair and cold 6° below this morning. Got up at 4-30 carried Sammy home then came down to the office through Dean town. The firm of Steven's and French, Mill workers, started their engine today.

Tuesday, Feb. 21 Fair and cold. Came up home tonight. Sammy went over with me. And this evening we all have just had a fine kind of an old time. I wrote to the Supt of the State Hatchery in Camden asking for trout.

Wednesday, Feb. 22 Fair but rather cold and raw. Went down in the woods on snow shoes for a little while today. Tonight carried Sammy home she has to go to a rehearsal at the Grange Hall. We had an awful quarrel and I guess it means (finis) for Sammy and I.

Thursday, Feb. 23 Fair but just cussed cold. Worked over at the shop this afternoon on my big frame sled. Have got the cross bars and standers finished, riveted together, and riveted to the runners. No letter from Sammy, it's all over between us this time. God.

Friday, Feb. 24 Another clear cold day. Was going out to the Grange Hall tonight to see Sammy. Perhaps she will stop being angry at me but when it came dark it was just cussed cold, and so I could not go. Hell.

Saturday, Feb. 25 Fair nice day not very cold. Got a nice letter from Sammy, she is not angry with me anymore. Came up over the Andrews Pond and got her and she went over home with me.

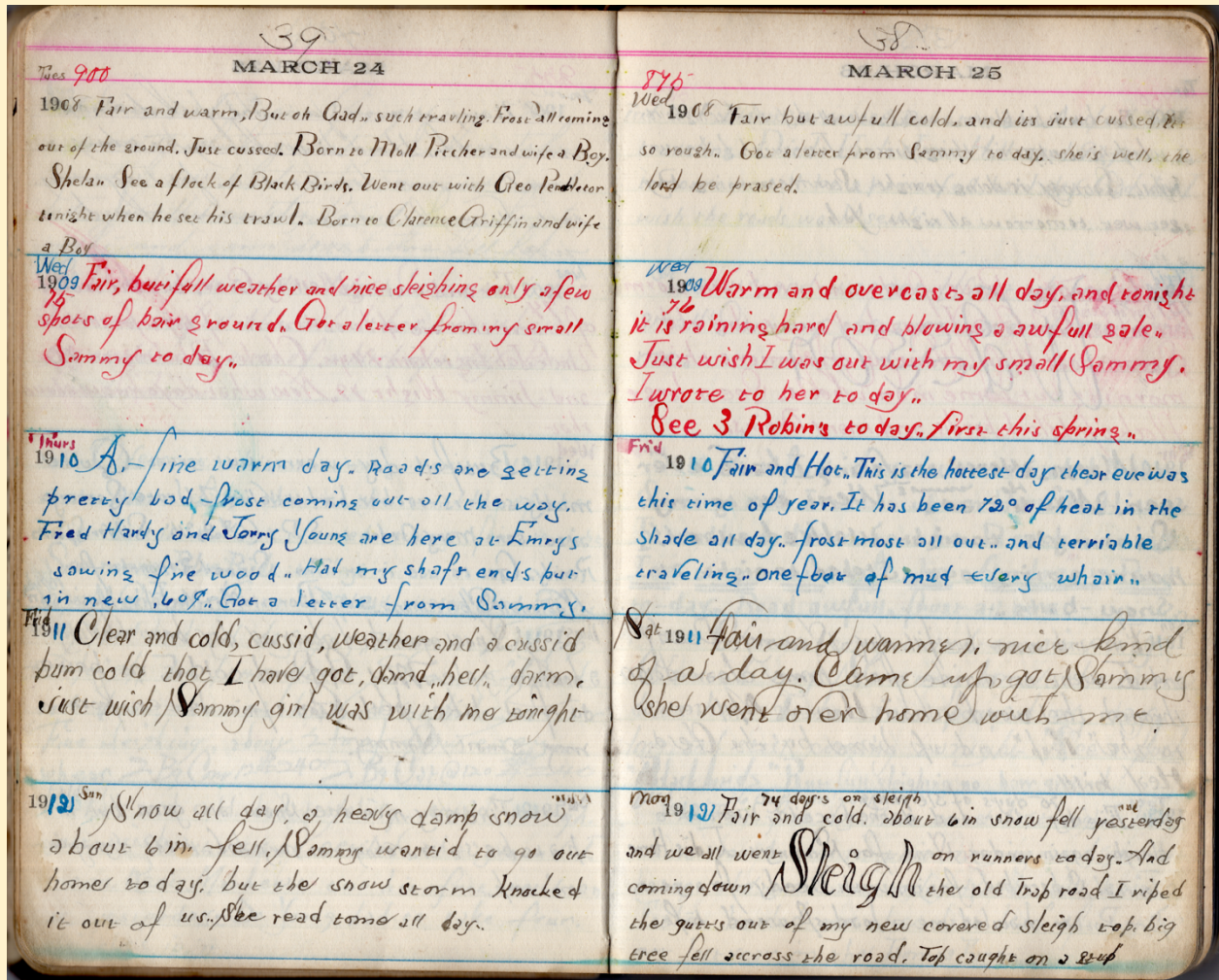
Sunday, Feb. 26 Fair and very warm. Sammy and I went down to the Grange Hall to a rehearsal. Horace Miller rode down with us. Sammy and Prof. Brown do their parts fine. Can't say same for the others.

Monday, Feb. 27 Fair and very warm, carried Sammy home this morning. This afternoon worked on my sled guess I can about finish it in two days more. Got my castings from Camden 8.19 also my belt from Chicago \$2.11

Tuesday, Feb. 28 Fair and very cold 4° below this morning. Cussed cold wind been blowing all day. No letter from Sammy and I expectid to get one sure. Damd? Finished my frame sled, now it is all ready to iron. Father has been down here today I bought him a Bag Meal \$1.20 and a bag Mx Feed \$1.50

Wednesday, Mar. 1 Fair nice day, much warmer. Russell Ames and I went out to the Grange Hall tonight to a rehearsal. He is going to light the Drama with his Surch Light. See my Sammy, she is not very well, soar throat. Paid Covel in full \$12.90

Thursday, Mar. 2 Fine warm day. Nice sleighing roads all ice, no bare ground. Wonder how Sammy's throat is tonight. Just wish I was out with her. Got my frame sled partly ironed this afternoon.

Friday, Mar. 3 Clear and a very nice day. Big time at the Grange Hall. Russell Ames went out with me. The play was a huge success. And the star of it was my very own Sambo Jonsin, she was surely just simply great. Biggest crowd that they ever had, cleared over \$87.

Saturday, Mar. 4 Fair nice day. Came up home over the Andrews Pond, got Sammy. She went over home with me. Got my blank from the Fish Commissioners for the trout to put in the Levenseller Pond.

Sunday, Mar. 5 Clear and cold, am feeling kinder bum. Sammy and I are both used up with this damd cold. Wanted to go fishing on the Corner Pond but it's too nasty cold. Dr. Simmons caught 10 big trout thear today, all about 18 inch long.

Monday, Mar. 6 Fair and cold nice day. But I don't feel much like enjoying it. Got the worst kind of a cold, just about dead tonight. The folks here dosed me up with hot drinks and flat irons. Gee but I do feel bum.

Tuesday, Mar. 7 Fair and cold this morning 9° below but this afternoon it is nice and warm. Wrote to my Sammy just wish I was out with her tonight. Finished my frame sled today, painted it blue, it's a good one.

Wednesday, Mar. 8 Butifull day fair and warm. Emry went to Belfast today. Got a fine letter from Sammy, my Sammy. Started work on my new model. Got a notic from the Fish Commissioners that I would get my trout this spring. Ralph Newbert came today from Era, N.Y.

Thursday, Mar. 9 Fair and warm nice day. Went out home tonight, carried my big new frame sled. Sammy went over with me. I came up over the Pond. Libby Sup. Camden Hatchery was fishing for Pickerell. He had 7. Slick sleighing.

Friday, Mar. 10 Warm overcast commenced to rain this afternoon about 3 o'clock. Renis Mathews got me a pint of live bate. Carryed Sammy home this morning and heard she and the rest were to play "Imegean" in Camden two weeks from to-night.

Saturday, Mar. 11 Fair butifull day. Came up over the pond set some lines and caught 5 Pickell, 1 big one. Sammy went over with me.

Sunday, Mar. 12 Overcast, got up early took Sammy home. Went down to the Ctr. Pond fishing but got nothing. Percy Cross came home today. I got damnd tired and one small pickerel. Sammy did not come back home with me.

Monday, Mar. 13 Fair butifull Town Meeting Day. I. Eugley, Chas Moody, Ernest Carver, Selectmen. E. Goodwin tax collector at 1¢ Mayor Hanson, reelectid for the fifth time by 95 majority. Bag Oats \$1.25 Bag Corn \$1.20 Bag Mx Feed \$1.50

Tuesday, Mar. 14 Butifull day, fair and warm. Came up to the Coleman Pond, set 6 lines but never got a strike. Came up to Sammy's she came over with me.

Wednesday, Mar. 15 Rain hard all day, just a miserable cold blowy rain storm. Carried Sammy home this morning. She is feeling kinder sick like. Went in Em's Top Sleigh. Paid Mrs French in full board to date \$10.

Thursday, Mar. 16 Snow and blow hard all day awfull cold. Went in Em's top sleigh again today. The roads are drifted full. Wrote to my Sammy. Just hope she is feeling better. For she must be all right to play the witch tomorrow night. Got my new discharge papers from the Navy Dept.

Friday, Mar. 17 Saint Pat's Day. Good stormy one this morning, clear tonight. Big time at the Grange Hall "Imogene" the dramer was played tonight. I went to the dance, fine time. They made \$2.05 each.

Saturday, Mar. 18 Fairly bilious day, snowed hard most all day but cleared away this afternoon. Went in Em's Top sleigh. Came up to Sammy's and she went over with me.

Sunday, Mar. 19 Butifull day grand sleighing. Sammy and I went on a sleigh ride. Went up over the Coleman Pond, fine sleighing. We see 6 robins when we came up from the Ctr. First I have seen this year.

Monday, Mar. 20 Butifull day. Snowed some time last night about 10 in. Fine sleighing. Sammy and I went over to Josh's last night. P.B. Cross went with us. Well we did have a fine evening. Yes, some.

Tuesday, Mar. 21 Clear cold day been blowing a howling gale. I am sick as hell. "Gripp". Do feel cussed. Em wanted to drive for me today but none of it for mine, went myself.

Wednesday, Mar. 22 Snow hard all day long. Went in Em's Top Sleigh. No letter from Sammy. Damd and poor me sick and nobody to cair. Fine sleighing, about 2 feet of snow ewewhear. 2 Bg corn \$1.20 = \$2.40. 2 Bg Oats @ \$1.20 = \$2.40

Thursday, Mar. 23 Snow again hard about all day. Been blowing a howling gale. My G. Damd cold is no better. Do feel like hell. Got a fine letter from my small Sammy.

Friday, Mar. 24 Clear and cold, cussid weather and a cussid bum cold that I have got damd hell. Darn, just wish Sammy girl was with me tonight.

Saturday, Mar. 25 Fair and warmer, nice kind of a day. Came up got Sammy she went over home with me.

Sunday, Mar. 26 Fair and warm butifull day. Sammy Deedy and I went on a ride from home clear down through the wood whair Duster's Mill sets to the "Trap" and up home by the Geo Heal mill.

Monday, Mar. 27 Overcast, commenced to rain early. Carried my Sammy home then came down here. It has just powred all day long and still coming tonight. See a flock of "Blackbirds". Butifull sleighing, no barr ground.

Tuesday, Mar. 28 Fair this morning but startid to rain and has kept it up all day long. Snow going fast. Wrote Sammy a letter this morning. Uncle Jabe Ingreham came to-night. Went down the outshore this afternoon, took up one of my mink traps.

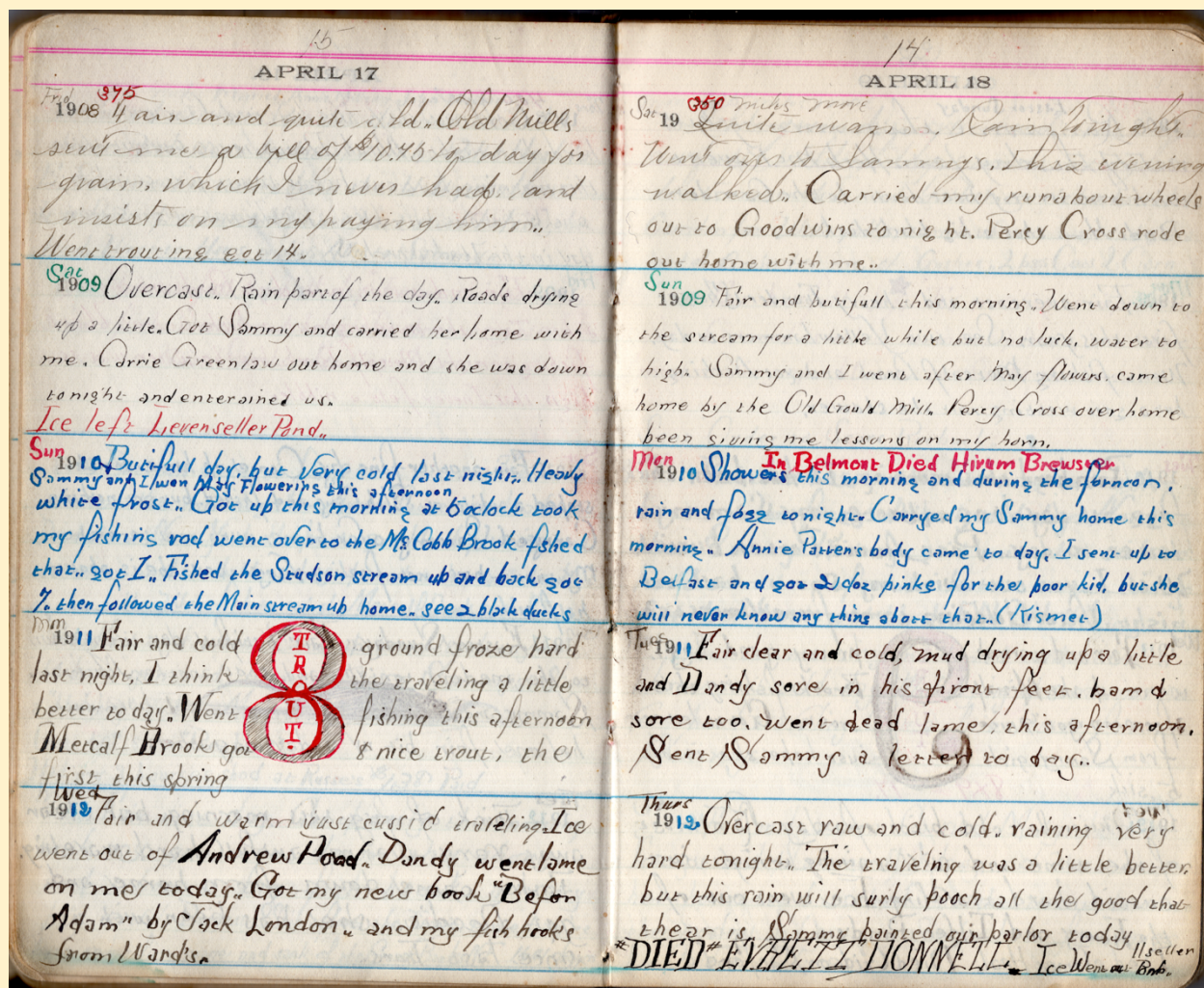
Wednesday, Mar. 29 Fair and not very cold. Went my last trip on runners. Carried my sleigh out to Ai Young's tonight. Bro Will came today. We tirmed out four big roolers to go in his Outer sole machine. Got a good letter from Sammy.

Thursday, Mar. 30 Thick fog and showery all day. This afternoon have set up a drill and drilled 4 castings and two face plates to go in our machine. Went in wagon first trip this spring. Now must write Sammy.

Friday, Mar. 31 Fair and darned cold, miserable day. Finished the castings for our model. Sammy sent me a postcard. She and the other Ambros' play "Imogean" tonight in Belmont. 4,371 pices of mall this month.

Saturday, Apr. 1 Fair and very cold, snow showers in afternoon. Came up got Sammy, she went over with me, Tonight Will and I put the model together. Can't say it was a howling success, still it isn't a failer. Goodwin fixing wheel \$1.75 Paid him \$5, now owe him \$1.48

Sunday, Apr. 2 Clear and cold. Sammy and I took a little walk down to the stream, whair the Frenchmen are chopping timber and tonight we went over to her home for a little while. She came back with me.

Monday, Apr. 3 Fair clear and cold, got up at 3 oclock this morning, brought Bill down to the Beech so he could take the 5 oclock stage for Camden. The girls did not go to Belfast today. Too cold.

Tuesday, Apr. 4 This has been a fine day fair and mild. Sammy and Ab went to Belfast shopping. The traveling was bully today. No frost out of the ground yet, but it has dried off on top. Got my blue flannel shirt from Wards \$1.50

Wednesday, Apr. 5 Snow hard last night about 8 in fell. Went in Ems (top sleigh). Sammy is up home, see her today. She and Abbie went to a lectur in Belfast last night by Prof. McMullen on Peary's discovery of the North Pole. \$1.50. Carlson Paid me \$3 my shair of the dory we sold him.

Thursday, Apr. 6 Fair and very warm, but a corking good day. Fell from the hay scaffol and put his right shoulder out of joint, that's what Emry French did today. Dr. Simmons reset it. See Sammy again this noon she is still up home. Wish I was with her tonight.

Friday, Apr. 7 Fair and warm, nice day but so muddy, frost just startid in a very few places. Colder tonight freezing. Wonder whair Misto Sambo is this evening and how she is feeling. Bought of Gushee a blue flannel (cotton) shirt .90¢

Saturday, Apr. 8 Fair nice warm day. Came up home took my gun, went over to Sammy's by way Slab City Coleman Pond and the old horse railroad. Found my "sampan" in the McKinney medow emptied the water out of it.

Sunday, Apr. 9 Cold and snow all day long. Sammy and I had a fire in the open grate. Just had a elegant day. Took my gun a little while this afternoon and shot a crow up by the "Sheep hole".

Monday, Apr. 10 Fair and cold, raw cold wind snow squalls. Wrote Sammy a letter this morning. Father down got some grain again today. 2 Bg's Oats @ \$1.20=2.40 1 Mx Fd \$1.50 1 Corn \$1.20. Paid Covell \$15.00 on account now owe him \$18.75

Tuesday, Apr. 11 Fair and cold, raw windy day. Sent Sammy a card this morning. Just would like to see her tonight. Cotterized the sore on Ems leg. Still lots of ice in the roads, ground has not settled anywhair. Bag Meal \$1.20

Wednesday, Apr. 12 This has been a bully good day but it is getting cusid muddy. Got a fine letter from Sammy Jonsin. This afternoon took my first lesson in running a board saw. Sawed several logs. Easy to lern. 4=\$10.

Thursday, Apr. 13 Butifull spring day, the first rearl one we have had. The traveling is getting damd bad. Cussid muddy. Sent Sammy a letter. Been sawing logs again this afternoon. Shed my Fur Coat first time since last October.

Friday, Apr. 14 Fair and warm, awfull muddy. Raining tonight. Got a fine little from Sammy, she is going to a party at Rich Lerman's tonight. Paid \$1.50.

Friday, Dec. 1 Butifull day. Came up got Sammy and carried her over home with me. Married Hattie Burgess = Albert Marriner. Went out gunning for a little while tonight.

Saturday, Dec. 2 Bully day. Came down to the office this morning. Took my mail round and hurried back home to Sammy. Tonight we have been having a hot old game of checkers.

Sunday, Dec. 3 Fair and cold. Went out with my gun for a little while but nothing much doing. Fired at one partridge, but no kind of luck. Sammy is still over home with me.

Monday, Dec. 4 Clear and very cold. Came up home tonight and Herb and I went deer hunting. I shot and killed a big 4 yr old buck down on the Old Hill Place with my new light Ithica shotgun.

Tuesday, Dec. 5 Clear and cold came up home, got my Sammy and carried her over home with me. Gee wasent she some surprised when I took her down celler and showed her the deer. Horace Miller operatid on at Belfast for Rupture.

Wednesday, Dec. 6 Another nice day clear and cold. Sammy went home this morning. The surveyers for the M.C.R.R. are running a line down by the Coleman Pond over the "Old Bucklin survey". Died Fred Patten.

Thursday, Dec. 7 Clear and cold, nice day. Came up home and Herb and I went and lay out for deer. No luck. Herb, Father and John Thomas see 3 deer this afternoon, over on Whitham's Hill.

Friday, Dec. 8 Fair nice day. Came up home this afternoon, and went gunning. Stayed by the old Hills place till 11 oclock, nothing doing. Wait but come no deer. Died David Mansfield.

Saturday, Dec. 9 Rain like hell all day long. Came up home got Sammy, she came over home with me. Abb and Herb went to Belfast today, and that's why it's rained so hellish.

Sunday, Dec. 10 A butifull warm summerlike day. Very warm. Went chopng firewood down on Herb Thomas and my Sammy and Deedy came down and piled up wood for me.

Monday, Dec. 11 Very warm, awfull traveling, mud about six inches deep. Father carried Sammy home this morning and got Molly shod, new behind. Did not get back to the office till 3 oclock. Paid Goodwin my tax \$5.91. Stoped down

Tuesday, Dec. 12 Another hell of a day. Very very warm and mud ankle deep over the whole route. Did not get in till 3-15 today. Stoped down at Emry's tonight. Just wish I was out with my small Sammy.

Wednesday, Dec. 13 And still it is hellish warm and muddy. Was 6 1/4 hours making my trip today. No let up stiddy drag all the way. Herb went to Belfast with the cow they killed yesterday. Wrote to my Sammy this morning.

Thursday, Dec. 14 Froze a little last night but it has been hellish traveling today for all of that. Stopped down tonight, set up two stoves in our new home. Got a bully nice letter from Sammy.

Friday, Dec. 15 Snow all day long a fine soft drizzle and tonight it is coming down thick and fast. Bought a woodsaw of Herb Thomas today. \$1. Sent Sammy a letter just wish I was out with her tonight I do. Dr. Ham broke his leg.

Saturday, Dec. 16 Snow a little. Came up got Sammy she went over with me. Instantly killed in E. Seasmont yesterday morning by accidentle discharge of his shotgun Almer Hall. Age 19 yrs. The charge took him fair under the chin. Bert Thomas & Dud Tower killed a big buck deer up by O. Gould's.

Sunday, Dec. 17 Snow all day long, not cold. Hope it will make sleighing. Just lay around home today and took it easy. Still snowing tonight and not a bit of wind. Horroh.

Monday, Dec. 18 Fair and dumed cold. Came up home this afternoon. My wife is still thear. Took my gun and went out a little while this evening. Nothing doing. Went in a sleigh, first trip this winter.

Tuesday, Dec. 19 Clear and cold. Came up home this afternoon carried Sammy over to her home tonight. Got a lot of things for our home, will bring them down to our house in the morning.

Wednesday, Dec. 20 Clear and cold. Drove from the Beech round home in my sleigh then took my wagon for the rest of it. Stopped down tonight. Bert Thomas is going to get Sammy tonight and they all go to Belfast tomorrow.

Thursday, Dec. 21 Fine day not very cold. Sammy went to Belfast today, with Bert and with Abbie to do her Christmas shopping. I went up to our new home and put the lining in our range. Came out home tonight.

Friday, Dec. 22 Fair nice day, but tonight it is raining very hard. Have been down to the Office all the evening sorting Christmas mail. My Cancerlation today was just \$3. Bert carried Sammy home this afternoon.

Saturday, Dec. 23 Rain this morning very hard. So I hired a covered wagon from Furnell for 2 bits and went in that. Stopped at the office till after the 4 oclock mail then came up and got Sammy, she went over with me.

Sunday, Dec. 24 Fair and warm nice day. Sammy, Deedy and I went on a long tramp way down in the "Big Woods", built fires and had a slick time. Mr & Mrs French up home, took dinner today.

Monday, Dec. 25 Nice day, went down to the Beech this morning, took my mail out and hurried back to Sammy's, took supper with her and tonight we went to the dance at the Grange Hall. Small crowd 40 couple.

Tuesday, Dec. 26 Clear and warm, fine day. Came up to my Sammy's this evening, brought up a load of grane. Sammy's about half sick, bad cold, got it at the dance, so she did not go over home with me tonight.

Wednesday, Dec. 27 Did it rain! Well some, and has kept it up all day long. Clear tonight and warm. Bustid a wagon wheel today, both tire and rim. Percy Cross sold my 2 Mink for me in N.Y. got \$5.70 Pretty good for unprime skins.

Thursday, Dec. 28 Fair and very cold, and the wind has blown like hell-in-blazes all day. This afternoon I went up to our new home, built a fire and hung curtains. Wrote Sammy this morning but wish I was out with her tonight.

Friday, Dec. 29 Bitter cold, and it has blown one of the worst gales of wind we ever had. And I am down here at the "French house" while my own little wife Sammy is a way out in the country. We were married 10 weeks ago tonight.

Saturday, Dec. 30 Fair and cold. Came up and got Sammy carried her home with me. Have a big long vacation coming to me two whole days. Had 6,572 pieces of mail this month, biggest ever.
