


RALPH RICHARDS - 1912



Monday, Jan. 1 Butifull day, fair and very warm. Went got Sammy and I came down to our new home and fixed things up. Bert Thomas hawled me down a load of hay.

Tuesday, Jan. 2 Fair and warm. Carried Sammy home this morning. This afternoon I have been fixing up our new home. Hope to be living there this week. Bert T. hawled me a load of firewood.

Wednesday, Jan. 3 Fair and warm. Nice day. Came up and got my Sammy took her over home with me. Gave Mother \$3. Paid Littlehale for grane in full to date \$17.35. Sent to "Wards" for dresses for Sammy \$6.18. "Died fighting Bob Evans".

Thursday, Jan. 4 Fair and colder. Carried Sammy home this morning then came down to work, brought our set of dishes down. Bought of Mathews \$6 worth of groceys.

Friday, Jan. 5 Snow. The biggest storm New England ever had. 32 inches snow fall in 12 hours on bare ground. Roy and I walked in from Slab City, broke trail for our hours. Wish I was out with my little wife.

Saturday, Jan. 6 An awfull day. Frightfully cold and blowing a gale of wind. Roads blocked with monster drifts. We never went out today. Andrews with the Belfast Stage never left Belfast yesterday, and is still thear. Wish I was out with Sammy tonight.

Sunday, Jan. 7 Very cold. 12° below zero. Roads blocked, no mail through to Belfast or Camden, and tonight another snowstorm coming. How I wish I was out home with my little wife tonight.

Monday, Jan. 8 Still very cold today but warmer tonight. Overcast, looks like rain. We could not go today, roads blocked. Went up to our new home and dug away the snow. Gee but I am some lonesome tonight without my small Sammy.

Tuesday, Jan. 9 Rain and snow all last night. Snow and blow most all day, mail didnt leave the office till tonight, then only went to Camden and back. We rural carriers have not made a trip since last Friday. Don't I wish I were with my own little wife Sambo Jonsin.

Wednesday, Jan. 10 Fair and cold. And again the roads were blocked, this time with frozen drifts. Roy went out to the Ctr on his snowshoes. Warren or I did not start. Worked up at the house cutting up firewood.

Thursday, Jan. 11 Bitter cold, way below zero. Well we all startid out this morning, Roy covered most of his route but Warren and I only made part of ours. Got one butifull letter from mine Sammy girl.

Friday, Jan. 12 Still very cold, made all of my route today but the bit up by Geo Mahoney's. Went from the Calderwood place up through the Ctr. Awfull hard traveling. Hope it will be so I can see mine Sammy tomorrow night.

Saturday, Jan. 13 Clear and very cold. Came up to Sammy's got her and carried her over home with me. Awfull hard traveling, 2 ft of frozen snow in the roads. Just cussed.

Sunday, Jan. 14 Fair and still cold. Sammy and I hardly went out of the house. I made her a fine ironing board and that's about all I have done. Bert Thomas went to Belfast this afternoon with his new span of hourses.

Monday, Jan. 15 Snow just awfull. Carried Sammy home then came down to the Beech. Called Burnes Norton of Belfast up on tel. bought a new Top Sleigh \$40. Six month's time. Awfull storm. Rain and I got soked. Spencer & Eaton \$10.

Tuesday, Jan. 16 Warm. Snow, squally all day, wind blowing tonight like Hell in Blazes. Worst traveling ever see. Took me 7 1/2 hours to cover my route today. Wish I was out with mine Sammy tonight.

Wednesday, Jan. 17 Fair and not very cold, fine day, the traveling is a little better but tonight it is snowing again. What it will be tomorrow God knows. Will mine Sammy and I ever get to keeping house. God but isent it just cussed.

Thursday, Jan. 18 Warm nice day but still awfull hard traveling. More than 3 ft of half-frozen snow on the ground. Got a fine letter from mine little wife this afternoon. Died John French.

Friday, Jan. 19 Rain hard all day long, but did not get wet thanks to my new top sleigh. Cold tonight freezing hard. Awfull hard traveling. Father came down and got me 4 bags of grain. Wish I was with mine Sammy tonight, I do.

Saturday, Jan. 20 Fair nice day. Came up to Sammy's, put my team in Josh's stabel and S. Jonsin and I went to the Insterlation at the Grange, big time. Pete Cross took mine Sammy to Supper while I went with Katherin Proctor.

Sunday, Jan. 21 Fair nice day. Sammy and I drove over home this afternoon. Bert Thomas went to Belfast with his big team, will start work tomorrow hawling lumber.

Monday, Jan. 22 Fair nice day, some cold. Came up home to mine Sammy's and we came down to the Beech and went to keeping house in W.A. Mathews house. Born to Velma and Burleigh Ordaway a 14 lb. son.

Tuesday, Jan. 23 Snow about all day, cold and nasty. Mine Sammy has been working like a little imp cleaning and cooking. We have a pretty nice looking little home now.

Wednesday, Jan. 24 Very cold, snow most of this forenoon clear away tonight. Sammy and I have been fixing our home up. Got it to looking pretty good.

Thursday, Jan. 25 Awfull cold 24° below zero this morning, just cussed. Don Patten hawled me a cord of wood today. Sammy got her lace curtains put up today. We have both got bad colds. Oh Hell.

Friday, Jan. 26 Fair and cold but nice sleighing. Can go my route pretty quick now. Sammy and I still have our bad colds, don't seem to get much better. This afternoon have been fitting up mine firewood.

Saturday, Jan. 27 Very cold just cussed 22° below zero this morning. Got home quit early been at work on my woodpile. Sammy and I are reading the Second Generation fine book.

Sunday, Jan. 28 Clear and very very cold. Sammy and I did not wake up till 7-30 this morning. Wasent we the lazy cats. We went out to Sammy's and took dinner then went over home and brought Molly down with us.

Monday, Jan. 29 Fair and very cold. Worked mine woodpile this afternoon. Sammy been cooking and cleaning to-day. This noon she fed mine Monty hoss.

Tuesday, Jan. 30 Fair and some warmer. Got ready to cut mine wood up this afternoon when Mrs French and Emry came in for a little social call.

Tuesday, Feb. 6 Fair and not so awfull cold. Bully good sleighing. Took my gun and went out for a little while tonight. No luck. Still got a hellish bad cold and feel bum.

Wednesday, Feb. 7 Butifull day fair and warm. Molly sick belly ach I guess. Father hawled me a load of hay. Emry and I took a load of store out to Camp Rabbet, Pitchers Pond.

Thursday, Feb. 8 Another butifull day. Snow squalls but not very cold. Willard Calderwood got me a 12 ft Tree Pruner, 75¢. Sammy had callers this afternoon. Mame Coombs and Phebe French and tonight we went down and spent the evening at Em's. Married Neil McGarrison and Gladys Morse.

Friday, Feb. 9 Fair nice day but rather cold. Father, Mother came down to Mrs French's and brought Archie "Ty Cobb". Is the little shaver's birthday he is five years old. They all stayed down it's so cold. Dad went home.

Saturday, Feb. 10 Fair but oh so cold. Way below zero and a gale blowing, just awfull. Mother and Ty still down to Mrs French. Sammy and I went down this evening big sing. Chas Pendleton and Nonie Drinkwater Coombs were thear.

Sunday, Feb. 11 Fair but still very cold. Mother and Archie came up to our home and took dinner. Father came and got them. Sammy and I went out to her home this evening, got back about 9 oclock. Damd cold.

Thursday, Feb. 15 Fair nice day. Dandy off hind leg swell up something awfull. Very lame, stifle joint. Sammy and I took him tonight and walked him round the squair.

Friday, Feb. 16 Butifull day fair and not very cold. Butifull sleighing. Finished my Gun Rack and put it up, looks dandy. Guss Warren and his wife Alter were in and spent the evening.

Saturday, Feb. 17 Fair and warm, a bully good day. My pup Bars ran away from Sammy and went round the route with me. Very nice dog, we call him Jack.

Sunday, Feb. 18 Another butifull warm day. Sammy, Jack and I went on a ride out through the Ctr, and then up to Sammy's people. Stoped for supper.

Monday, Feb. 19 A fine day warm good and just butifull sleighing fine. And today my Pup Jack run away went home but Warren brought him back home. Born to Mr and Mrs Robbie Hardy, a son.

Tuesday, Feb. 20 And still a fine warm day. This afternoon I took Jack and my Snowshoes and gun and we went out for to drive a rabbet. Jack is a very nice doggy.

Wednesday, Feb. 21 Overcast raw and cold. Raining pretty hard tonight. Got a pint of live bate of Fred Young. Emry and Mrs F. Sammy and I were going out to Camp Rabbet fishing tomorrow.

Friday, Feb. 23 Butifull day fair and warm. Jim Manning's house burned. Lost everything. No insurance. Poor cuss. Everything burned even the dog & cat.

Saturday, Feb. 24 Another fine day. Snow melting quite a bit. Getting thin in places on the road. Father hawled me a load of hay today. Sammy and I gathered in our Browntail Moths, got 186.

Sunday, Feb. 25 Another fine day. We did not go any whair today. Sammy read Lin McLean tome. I worked on my deer head that I am setting up. Hon A.H. Miller called on us and Emry has been here twice and Mrs French once.

Monday, Feb. 26 Pretty nice kind of a day. Just a little bair ground but still jolly good old sleighing. Father hawled me another load of hay.

Tuesday, Feb. 27 Awfull snowstorm did not make but a small part of my route. Went with Molly had her down in the snow half of the time. Cussed day awfull traveling. Roy only got to the Ctr, but Moll Pitcher went his whole trip.

Wednesday, Feb. 28 Nice day, but cussed hard traveling about 15 in heavy snow fell. Drifted badly but I made my trip all right today. Tonight have been working on my deers head.

Thursday, Feb. 29 Fair nice day, pretty dum cold and just awfull traveling. Powerfull lot of snow on the ground. Tonight finished setting up my deer head, the one I shot last fall. Buty and looks fine.

Sunday, Mar. 3 Fair and very cold. Awfull hard traveling snow more than 3 ft deep every whair and more than that in the woods. Did not go any whair today too cold but tonight Emry and I went clambing. I got a peck of big uns.

Monday, Mar. 4 Fair and very cold. Election today for State Senator from Waldo Co. E.F. Hanson electid by 900 majority. Democratic Victory. Did not stop and vote. What in the hell is the use. No good could come from eather.

Tuesday, Mar. 5 Still fair and bitter cold. Went out with mine Pup and mine gun tonight but its too cold to run rabbits. Sent \$10 to Spencer & Eaton & Co. Now owe them \$37.70. Born to Renis Mathews & wife a Daughter. Been married 7 1/2 months.

Wednesday, Mar. 6 Fair and a very little milder. Dandy fell down flat as a flounder with me today but I was in luck for once, he did not break anything. Paid Mrs. L.H. Knight's in full. Dick Crooker killed "Rover", Gushee's big St. Bernard dog.

Thursday, Mar. 7 Fairly good day. Some rain some snow a little sleet, and lots of fog. Went over to Orren Ames and made a shild like this [*drawing of a shield*] and mountid my deer head. "Good one".

Friday, Mar. 8 Fine day fair and warm. Father came down today. Carried home the Pruning Hook to cut his Brown tail moth with. Took out a set of snowshoe wood to bend for me.

Saturday, Mar. 9 Fair fine day, warm. Traveling pretty bad. So blamed slumpy I have a very bum left sholder. Rumitick I reckon. Can hardly crawl around. Hell but tis just rotten.

Sunday, Mar. 10 Snow squall this morning, rest of the day fair with a raw March wind. Sammy and I went out to her home took dinner then went over to mine home, got supper. Freddy Lamie [?], a French mill-man came thear to board.

Monday, Mar. 11 Butifull day. Town meeting. Irv Eugley, 1st Chas Moody, 2nd, Fred French, 3rd, John Wyley, Frank Rankin, Will J. Monroe, Road Commissioners. Married Jennie Andrews and Harry Gushee. "Hanson" reelectid mayor of Belfast by 290 majority.

Tuesday, Mar. 12 Warm. Snow squalls, allmost rain. Took my gun this afternoon went up in the woods and got a nice big Bunney which mine Pup ate up as soon as I got home.

Wednesday, Mar. 13 Warm and a terriable rain storm. Awfull traveling. Roy only went out as far as the Ctr but Warren and I went the full route. Slump farfully. Rain in torrents all day and still raining tonight. Hell.

Thursday, Mar. 14 Bum old day, snow and rain but not very cold. Awfull traveling, the roads are in cussid shape. A hourse keeps droping through every step. Just cussid.

Friday, Mar. 15 Rain like hell all day and tonight it is just coming down in bunches. Emry came up this afternoon and stayed until after five o'clock, made a big strong call. Sammy reading me tonight, The Wings of Morning.

Saturday, Mar. 16 Fair and warm nice day. But it has just pushed the sleighing half of the roads are bare. "Pete" Cross came calling on us today and is going to stop tonight. "Goody"

Sunday, Mar. 17 Fair bully spring like day. Emry and I went clambing this afternoon. I got a peck of little devils and we had fryed clams for supper. "Pete" is still with us.

Monday, Mar. 18 73 days of sleighing. Another fine day but the sleighing is all gorn. Went in my wagon today. Pete Cross rode out to the Town house with me this morning. See a chipmunk today.

Tuesday, Mar. 19 Butifull spring day, very warm. Shed my fur coat and wore a cloth one down from home. Went clambing tonight and got a peck of big uns also a big blister. Got my Rubber Boots from Wards 90¢ Express.

Wednesday, Mar. 20 Fair and SPRING warm but tonight it has tirned cold and its awfull cold. Awfull hard traveling deep mud and frost coming out. See 8 Robbins first this spring. Went clambing tonight and got a peck of fine big ones.

Thursday, Mar. 21 Raw awfull cold, overcast. Came off cold last night and froze powerfull hard. Cussed hard traveling. Awfull rough. Went over to Orren's this afternoon and had a shoe fitted up, then came home and tacked it on Dandy.

Friday, Mar. 22 Fair and cold, bum traveling, cussid rough. Just wish it was all settled the ground I mean. Renis Mathews cut his foot with an ax yesterday. Dr Young had to take four stitches in it.

Saturday, Mar. 23 Fine day nice one. Snow all gorn but in patches. Traveling not very bad. Roads drying out on top.

Sunday, Mar. 24 Snow all day, a heavy damp snow about 6 in. fell. Sammy wantid to go out home today, but the snowstorm knocked it out of us. She read tome all day.

Monday, Mar. 25 74 days on sleigh. Fair and cold about 6 in snow fell yesterday and we all went on runners today. And coming down the old Trap Road I ripped the gutts out of my new covered sleigh top, big tree fell across the road. Top caught on a [??]

Tuesday, Mar. 26 75 days of sleighing. Fine day clear and darned cold. Went on a sleigh again today. Sent for Sammy's Ladies Home Journal. Subscribed for it with Deedy for a year. Don Patten hawled me a load of wood, 5 ft.

Wednesday, Mar. 27 76 days on runners. Fine fair day. Froze some last night but came round warm this morning and gee but hasent the snow run today. Roads all bair. Father hawled me the last load of hay we got last year on the Thomas farm.

Thursday, Mar. 28 Fair fine warm day. Went in my wagon, snow all gorn. See a flock of 22 Wild Gees tonight. Took my gun and went down the shore this afternoon but come no duck.

Friday, Mar. 29 Rain and blow all day, just a hell of a big storm. Awfull traveling, deep mud with frost coming out some in places. See 7 Black birds, first this spring.

Saturday, Mar. 30 Fair and warm. Pooty good day. See "Injun Han Rankin". He was up by the Harvill Place looking for Skunk tracks. I got my new clam hook and went tonight and hooked out a Pk of big uns.

Sunday, Mar. 31 Fair and warm. Sammy and I went down to Emry's. She made a call while I went and gathered another Peck of clams. We had to stop to supper, they just made us.

Saturday, Oct. 19 Overcast, rain most all day. Belle Taylor and Doris went away tonight. We gave her \$5. Got a new sweater from Haskell \$7 and a pr Buck gloves, \$1. Borrowed \$5 of Em.

Sunday, Oct. 20 Fair (Note due City Natl Bank \$50) fine day. Sammy and I went out to her home this afternoon. I went down to Maguner (Coleman Kill's) gunning, see 2 deer a big buck and a doe.

Monday, Oct. 21 Fair and warm fine day. Vine Richards is here tonight, he has been plowing for me. Paid him \$1.50 for his work and he stoped here tonight.

Tuesday, Oct. 22 A fine fine day. Damd if Vine R. did not come back again and camp on us tonight. Went up to Sleepy Hollow this afternoon, set a mink trap.

Wednesday, Oct. 23 Overcast, raining tonight. Startid in to fix our driveway, had Vine plow it this morning before he went away. Got a letter from Belle Taylor tonight begging for \$4 and she bled me for 5 bucks last Sat. Oh Hell.

Wednesday, Oct. 30 Rain this morning cleared away and this afternoon took my gun and went out in the woods shot one partridge and lost it out of my coat pocket. Bought of O.E. Ames a wheel barrow \$5 not paid.

Thursday, Oct. 31 Fair nice day, took my gun and went up to Sleepy Holler to my traps. A mink has stole the bate. Found the bird I shot yesterday and lost. Ella and Mabel Pendleton and Lucy Freeman up tonight.
