

[Letter from Herbert Dyer to his Uncle Arno Knight; he is the son of Frederick and Emma Dyer, Olive's sister]

May 23, 1923

Dear Uncle Arno,

I got your letter today. Am sure sorry that you and Aunt Olive are not feeling well. It is impossible for me to get flowers here and I thought that perhaps Arne could get me some there and put them on Mother's & Father's graves for Decoration Day. I sure counted on getting over there on the 30th but I can't get away from here unless I throw up the job completely.

I am sending a money order for Arne & he might get some flowers for me there if he could. Thank you all very much for looking after the lot for me. If Arne will let me know how much I will send money for labor on the lot.

I don't like to work all night very well and hope they will give me a day job soon. Will close with love to you all.
