Lincolnville School Body Ends Job With Years, Money To Spare

LINCOLNVILLE—The board of trustees of the Lincolnville School District, formed 12 years ago to provide a consolidated school for the town at an estimated cost of \$56,000, finished its job Saturday, eight years ahead of time.

It also turned over a check for \$1,000.47, which was left over.

Allen Morton, first selectman, accepted the deed and keys to the school from the school district board on behalf of the town. He will turn the check over to the town treasurer for use on school maintenance.

"It is a refreshing thing in these times of economic troubles," Lawrence Rankin, trustees president said "to be able

to accomplish this job eight years ahead of time and with the same board with which we started."

"And we all got along fine together, too," he added.
