


RALPH RICHARDS - 1926



Friday, Jan. 1 Fair and warmer. Snow this afternoon. Funeral service for Vesta's Mother. Took our car tonight and carried Mrs Howe oil stove home!

Saturday, Jan. 2 Fair and warm. Did some work on toy boats for Guy Carver.

Sunday, Jan. 3 Fair and warm. We went and carried flowers out to the cemetery. Took Guss & Alta and went to the Cove got a saw.

Monday, Jan. 4 Another fine day. We went to Belfast and I bought a new plane & new saw.

Tuesday, Jan. 5 Warm and sloshy also soft snow & rain. Worked on the toy boats. Freddie Hall broke his wrist, crashing his Ford car.

Wednesday, Jan. 6 Warm still just like a spring day. Got some stuff for ax handles. Marion Balff came from China today.

Thursday, Jan. 7 Fair and growing cold fast. Geo Rubin Mathews found dead in his house this morning. See a big red breastid robin up by Burt Collemers this morning.

Friday, Jan. 8 Fair clear and cold. Have been working all afternoon and this evening on toy boats.

Saturday, Jan. 9 Snow all day and cold as the dickens. No wind. Finished up what boats I had makeing. 11 now all compleat.

Sunday, Jan. 10 Butifull mild day. About 8 inches of light snow fell yesterday. Got my snowmobile tuned up took Vesta on a ride up around the squair.

Monday, Jan. 11 Fair and mild roads are in pretty good shape after the storm no trouble to cover it with a car.

Tuesday, Jan. 12 Fair and not very cold. Bought a chicken from Nellie Frohock for Vesta's birthday dinner. Guss & I went out to Slab City and cut 3 pine trees.

Wednesday, Jan. 13 Snow all day but its very light, so that a car rolls thro it pretty good.

Thursday, Jan. 14 Cold and overcast. The Warrens gave Vesta a little dinner at thear home tonight. Among other presents she has a box of 41 gifts to open one each day.

Friday, Jan. 15 Another fine day. Some of my roads are rather hard but most of the way fine traveling.

Saturday, Jan. 16 Butifull day, not cold just fine winter day. Did some very nessary work on our stove pipe. Put in a new damper.

Sunday, Jan. 17 Butifull day. Worked all day building boats. Have 17 about all ready to launch.

Monday, Jan. 18 Fair this morning Raining hard tonight. Guss Warren cut his foot badly while chopping up at The Farm.

Tuesday, Jan. 19 Butifull day just like spring and tonight its wonderfull. Have been building boats this afternoon.

Wednesday, Jan. 20 Fair fine day. Helped dress the cut on Guss foot this afternoon.

Thursday, Jan. 21 Still dandy weather mild and foggy. Vesta & I went to Belfast this afternoon.

Friday, Jan. 22 Snow some and cold as the devil. 24° below zero this morning. Vesta's oil stove ran amuck. Smoked every thing in the room.

Saturday, Jan. 23 Snow and blow cold as the dickens. Went in my Snowmobile the first trip. See a honest to goodness robin today. Sewing O gave a supper tonight cleared \$17. Roy & Orris Young startid chopping for me.

Sunday, Jan. 24 Fair and cold. Snow squall this morning. I put in most of the day washing cleaning up from our smoky oil heater.

Monday, Jan. 25 Fair butifull day, mild and pleasant. Vesta startid taking raw egg's today. Vesta & I went to Camden got load grane.

Tuesday, Jan. 26 Fair and some colder. Aubry Collemer promised to hawl my wood from the mountain.

Wednesday, Jan. 27 Another pretty fine day. This afternoon have been scraping [?] a road across the Rodgers lot to get my wood thro.

Thursday, Jan. 28 Snow all day and tonight its bitter cold and blowing a liveing gale. Made my route O.K. in touring car.

Friday, Jan. 29 Bitter cold, and blowing a gale all day down to zero or below. Road driftid full. "Amborn" did not get to the Center & Parker Young

to Belfast but I covered my route with snowmobile. Guss came over today on crutches first time he has got out since cutting his foot.

Saturday, Jan. 30 Warmer this morning. Went in my Snowmobile again. Made my route all O.K.

Sunday, Jan. 31 Warm & overcast. Sawed & split oven wood. Washed the kitchen floor & entertained Ernest Carver.

Monday, Feb. 1 Snow and blow not much snow fell but cold as the dickens. Born to Elenor McLeod Trull, Twins, boy & girl.

Tuesday, Feb. 2 Fair and cold. Broke roads with my Snowmobile over part of my route. Died Henry LeMay, at Harry Edisons.

Wednesday, Feb. 3 Fair and warmer. Split up oven wood and did work on Snowmobile. An old acquaintance of Vesta called today. Eddie McCabe.

Thursday, Feb. 4 Heavy snow storm. Fierce this afternoon. Built a new trough for our hog's.

Friday, Feb. 5 Fair weather but blowing a gale got out to Sanford Dyers. Roads plumb full & had to come back.

Saturday, Feb. 6 Fair. Hard traveling. Got out as far as Dale Heals. "Crie" road unbroken had to come back thro the Ctr.

Sunday, Feb. 7 Fair and warmer. Worked and rested at home today. Split up some extra oven wood.

Monday, Feb. 8 Fair fine day, clear and bright. Aubry Collemer hawling wood for us from our mountain lot. Guss startid to do a little wood sawing. 3 weeks since he cut his foot.

Tuesday, Feb. 9 Fair clear and cold. Roy Packard of Searsmont shot in face & hand by Princible of the High School. "Raines" his name. Packard & wife having fight, and [frightened?] wife went to the teacher for [protection?].

Wednesday, Feb. 10 Cold and snow hard all day. Covered my route in record time. Got back at 11-30. Awfull storm tonight.

Thursday, Feb. 11 Cold & blowing great guns only got out to Calderwood. No mail from or to Belfast. Born to Elma Johnson & wife Twin's.

Friday, Feb. 12 Fair and not very cold but roads not half broken. Ant it hell to be a mail carrier. Went to top of Lamb Hill. Roads blocked.

Saturday, Feb. 13 Fair and much warmer. Snow tread a little today. Louie Drinkwater cant get thro with his Snowmobile, but I cover 26 miles with mine. Covered all my route with Snowmobile.

Sunday, Feb. 14 Fair and mild. Spent most of the day digging ourselfs out of the snow. Snowing hard tonight. Aubry Collemer hawled me a load of hay. Died Harry Edison.

Monday, Feb. 15 Snow about 15 inches fell last night & this morning. Awfull traveling only got as far as the center.

Tuesday, Feb. 16 Snowing hard again. Roads are pretty near inpassable, but covered 20 miles.

Wednesday, Feb. 17 Cold and blowing great guns roads pretty well blocked with snow. Covered all my route.

Thursday, Feb. 18 Overcast raining late tonight. Very hard traveling but I covered it all with snowmobile.

Friday, Feb. 19 Rain most all day. The first rain since Dec 6/25. Roads are very slumpy. Had Mellie Dearborn carry me over my route with his horse.

Saturday, Feb. 20 Fair and a strong west wind. Froze last night so I could go in my snowmobile.

Sunday, Feb. 21 Fair clear & cold. Put in the day fitting up oven wood.

Monday, Feb. 22 Another clear cold day traveling is getting fine again. But didn't travel and just took a vacation.

Tuesday, Feb. 23 Fair and cold as the dicken's. Bay froze over this morning.

Wednesday, Feb. 24 Fair fine day. Went to Camden this afternoon had some work on my snowmobile.

Thursday, Feb. 25 Fair nice warm day. Tonight it is raining hard. Aubry Collemer still hawling fire wood from the mountain lot.

Friday, Feb. 26 Warm rain & snow. Harry Frohock & Marion Drinkwater commenced sawing my fire wood, and I busted my back lifting a 12 ft beach log. Ant that hell?

Saturday, Feb. 27 Snow and drizzle all day. Our sawing crew did not come to saw wood today.

Sunday, Feb. 28 Butifull day. Split fire wood and babyed my broken back. Gad but it's a powerfull lame [?].

Tuesday, Mar. 9 Another nice day. Went up the mountain with "Aubry" and got the last load of long wood. Alton French gave a "Stag" party tonight. Arthur McCobb out of jale today. Sirved 4 months Bootlegging.

Wednesday, Mar. 10 Clear & cold, butifull winter weather. Split fire wood this afternoon. Aubry Collemer finished hawling my wood.

Thursday, Mar. 11 Fair and cold dandy traveling. Two big Tractors and a snow plow opened the road from Belfast to Camden today. Split and piled oven wood.

Friday, Mar. 12 Another clear cool day. Still splitting oven wood. Have quite a bit split but ye gods what a pile to split? Went clambing this afternoon.

Saturday, Mar. 13 Clear and cold, fine. Splitting wood all afternoon untill low tide then went clambing again. Got 8 Hen Clambs. Born to Merret Carver & wife Gladys a daughter.

Sunday, Mar. 14 A butifull day out side. Every thing out doors full of sunshine.

Monday, Mar. 15 Fair and butifull traveling. Guss & Will Young are helping sawing wood. Harry Frohock & Marion Drinkwater came with thear machine to saw my wood.

Tuesday, Mar. 16 Another fine day. Will Young & Guss helped put on oven wood. Lettie Armstrong operatid on Waldo Co Hospital Gall Stones. Finished sawing my fire wood 24 cord.

Wednesday, Mar. 17 Butifull day. Fine, and I just worked like hell all afternoon. Split 3 cord wood this afternoon. Went calling this evening.

Sunday, Mar. 28 Fair fine day. Fred Frohock got me to take my Snowmobile and carry Gladys Carver & baby out home.


Monday, Mar. 29 Fair fine day the first spot of bair ground is showing today on the Knights Hill.

Friday, Apr. 2 Butifull warm day. Selectmen met at the post office to take valuation. Vesta & I cleaned out our kitchen cupboard.

Saturday, Apr. 3 Snow all day, about six inches fell but made a quick trip. Vesta & I cleaned the cupboard in our kitchen. Died at the Center Will Knight.

Sunday, Apr. 4 Overcast raw cold day. Hell of a Eastor Sunday. Built a couple of boats today.

Monday, Apr. 5 Warm and overcast. Quite a bit of bair ground and pieces of deep snow. Split fire wood this afternoon. Merrit Carver & Will Young startid work on the Carver Frohock Garage.

Tuesday, Apr. 6 Snow all day miserable bitch of a day and terriable deep snow drifts.

Friday, Apr. 9 Fair fine day. Getting to be hard traveling. So much bair ground. Died Llewellyn Pendleton.

Saturday, Apr. 10 Fair and cold as the dickens. Had a hard trip.

Sunday, Apr. 11 Fair worked all day on machine Guss helped. Put the front wheels on my Snowmobile. Packed and shipped 25 boats to Guy Carver \$25

Monday, Apr. 12 Fair and very very cold. Lots of the roads have 4 & 5 feet of snow. Went first trip in Snowmobile with wheels in place of the runners. Got stuck up by Lermonds 2 $\frac{3}{4}$ hours

Tuesday, Apr. 13 Butifull day clear and cold made a quick trip. The most snow in the roads I have ever seen in 23 winters & springs.

Wednesday, Apr. 14 Fair and warm. Got back & went to Camden with my Snowmobile had it rebushed.

Monday, Apr. 19 Another nice day only its very cold. Had Geo Nichols reline my Snowmobile.

Tuesday, Apr. 20 Overcast and cold. Went to Camden had some new parts for my Snowmobile. Merrit Carver put in two connecting rods.

Wednesday, Apr. 21 Fair and cold. Vesta getting heafty. We went to Belfast and she weighed 122 lbs.

Thursday, Apr. 22 Another nice day. Got bothered on the road my belts slack on machine and wheels spin. \$50 Camden NB

Friday, Apr. 23 Cold and raw. Worked on my fire wood this afternoon. \$378 CNB Belfast

Saturday, Apr. 24 Fair and warm fine day. Have been working on car this afternoon. Took a link out of the belts.

Sunday, Apr. 25 Another nice day. Was going up to the Hart place but Vesta has a hell of a cold and do feel bum.

Monday, Apr. 26 Overcast cold and raw and mud enough to sink the world in. Cussid traveling


Tuesday, Apr. 27 Fair fine day. Helped Vesta paint in our kitchen. Putting on a new coat of cream colored paint.

Thursday, Apr. 29 Fair but a raw east wind that has a cussid chill in it. Put new links in the drive belts of my Snowmobile.

Friday, Apr. 30 Overcast and cold as the dickens. The roads are in awfull condition mud hub deep and frost just comeing out.

Saturday, May 1 Fair fine day. Roads are not settled yet, miles & miles of mud hub deep. Spring dance Community Hall by Townsend. Ice left Coleman & Corner Ponds.

Sunday, May 2 Fair and a dandy day. We took Guss & Alta and went up to Shack spread gravel, built a fire place, and burned the bush at Ye Old Farm.

Monday, May 3 Butifull warm spring like day. Have been cleaning up and burning rubbish. Set out a Linden Tree.

Tuesday, May 4 Another fine day. Helped Vesta clean up and burn trash out of the chambers. Guss set out 3 oak trees.

Wednesday, May 5 Worked on car took the belts off and put in new links. They are getting badly worn. Vesta set out a Rock Mapel on our lawn.

Thursday, May 6 Another fine day. Put fire wood into our barn and cleaned up about the place. Set out 3 rock maples & a elm tree.

Friday, May 7 Fair and warmer much warmer in fact it was hot part of the day. Worked on car untill late this evening.

Saturday, May 8 Fair butifull day. Dismantled my Snowmobile took the belts & one set of wheels off this afternoon. Guss Warren finished work for the S.H.D. tonight 8 years

Sunday, May 9 Overcast showers. We all four went to the Hart Place and burned bush this afternoon. Suppa at Shack. Ride up to "Barters Camps", Searsport.

Monday, May 10 Fair and a nice day only was a little cold. Went to Camden had generator repaired on my touring car.

Tuesday, May 11 Another fine day. Did some work around home and more on my truck [?].

Wednesday, May 12 Fair fine day. Guss & I went up to the Shack and put our gas tank into the ground. Went first trip in touring car.

Thursday, May 13 Overcast but no storm. Guss & I went up to the Shack & worked untill dark.

Friday, May 14 Fair fine day but rather cold. Painted Screens both door & windows.

Saturday, May 15 Fair and fine. Put our screen doors and windows on this afternoon. Let my horse to a guy named Fred Clark. Mellie Dearborn plowed & harrowed my garden.

Sunday, May 16 Butifull warm day. We went up to the Little House. Guss & I painted most of the out side Vesta & Alta varnished chairs and painted the settees.

Monday, May 17 Rain most all day thick fog tonight. I went up to the store and painted the gold letters on the sign. Patterson & Sylvester filled our gas tank.

Tuesday, May 18 Fair and warm, but a terrific thunder storm this afternoon. Went up to the store painted on the sign. "Saulsbury" the plumber came down and set our gas pump.

Wednesday, May 19 Fair and warm fine day. Helped Vesta put up her curtains and drapery. Cleaned out the wood house. Born to Clifton Dickey & wife Marjorie a 9 lb son. Married 17 of April.

Thursday, May 20 Overcast cold & showers. We went up to the little store this afternoon and did a lot of repairing & cleaning.

Friday, May 21 Fair and not very cold. Took Richard & Warren to Belfast this afternoon they ordered goods for the store.

Saturday, May 22 Fairly decent kind of a day between showers but very cold.

Sunday, May 23 Cold and showers. Rain hard part of the day. We all went up to the Little Store and worked. Built a corner cupboard changed the sink over.

Monday, May 24 Awfull cold day with shower, allmost snow. Carried Vesta & Alta to Rockland to buy shear trade good's. Put add on the screen at [??].

Tuesday, May 25 Cold as the very devil. Stole away went to Cobb Town troutng got 9 butys. B.B. Warner Punched Poked & Choked Ada Wheeler last night. She had him before Judge Doke in Belfast today. Put him under \$1000 bonds Sep court.

Wednesday, May 26 Still cold, still rain showers and still overcast and a all around spell of cussid weather. Went up and worked at the shack untill dark.

Thursday, May 27 Same as yesterday only a little more disagreeable all most snow. Worked at the "Shack" this afternoon. Died Chester Dean. Born to L.W. Drinkwater & wife a 9 lb son.

Friday, May 28 Fair and a pretty good day. I carried the [??] up to the Shack then went to Belfast got good & chattel. Mrs Hurd went over the route.

Saturday, May 29 Fair and warmer. Carried Ice up to the Store and put things in shape to open. Vesta & I went out to the Cemetery at the Ctr. Worked at the Little Store untill after 10 tonight.

Sunday, May 30 Overcast & Fog all day. Opening of The House by the Side of the Road for 1926. Sold \$16.51

Monday, May 31 Awfull cold raw & foggy day. No business to speak of to nasty weather. Put the glass under the drain pipe in our Ice Box Leaking. Took \$11.88 today.



Thursday, Oct. 28 Another fine day. Went up to the Farm working? Not too much as I feel rotten.


Friday, Oct. 29 Fair fine and warm did a little work at home but not to much.


Saturday, Nov. 27 Overcast warm & rain roads some thing awfull for mud and deep ruts.
