[Letter from Allie (Dyer) Smith to her Aunt Olive Knight; Allie is the daughter of Emma Drinkwater Dyer]

Apr. 24th 15 Belmont St. Portland, Me.

Dear Aunt Olive:

Had a letter from Uncle Ned a few days ago and he writes me that you are sick with the grippe; now I am very sorry to hear it and hope by this time you are well over it, but it is not an easy thing to recover from I know, such a terrible winter and spring as we have had; it goes from one extreme to the other; last Saturday it was very hot here, 82 in the shade at noon, thought I should pass out with heat in the house but believe me fires feel good tonight.
