Dear little thing, 'tis hard, 'tis hard! he was so fair, and sweet and dear to us.
Oh God! if there be a future existence, we feel it must be well with such as he.
Sent mother and Nell notice of Baby's death also wrote postals to Chas. Lancaster and Mrs Tucker
Eve went to Ctr. Tea 25 cts
Ave present this evening Lucy staid all night

Went to Camden with Ave Bought Casket \$10.50
Engaged Elder Evans to preach funeral services tomorrow
Engaged Artist Lane to photograph Baby
Came up with Ave Sent him home with my Team in charge of Victor J. Knight Selected a lot in New Cemetery
Tamson Scruton, Clara McKinney and Lucy present Wrote Lillian of Baby's death
Murray Fuller repaired clock
Lucy staid with Olive to night
Cuffs & Collars 40 cts
Called at Sylvanus's and informed them of Baby's death

Wednesday, January 3

Warm and clear A.M. P.M. partially cloudy
Funeral services over our baby at 1 P.M. Elder L.D. Evans preached from text "Man that is born of woman is of few days and full of trouble" Olive and Arne unable to go to Cemetery. Singing by Dr. Young's choir
Will Lucy and Ernest took tea with us
Paid minister \$5.00

Thursday, January 4

Warm thawy day partially clear
Olive and Arne both quite sick
Cut a little wood at door and tending sick ones
Lucy came in several times during day
No courage for work.
Truly the hand of Adversity bears heavily upon me
Eve went to Centre
Paid Leander Morrill \$1.50 for Digging Baby's grave
Dear little thing, we loved him so! Oh, it is hard to part with him

Friday, January 5

Warm and cloudy A.M.
Split logs at door
P.M. snowed
Choring waiting upon sick ones
Rec'd negative of our Dead Darling's Photographs
Evening Will and Lucy present

Billy present to dinner
Eve went to Ctr a few minutes and got mail
Rec'd on $\frac{3}{4}$ doz Eggs 21 cts
Bought 1 lb Coffee 30 cts paid cash to bal. 9 cts

Gave him $\frac{1}{2}$ bushel of Turnips and 6 or 7 lbs of Spare-rib
Returned 20 cts to Minot Drinkwater for error on Beef sold him

Olive nor Arne very smart yet

Clear calm and cold A.M.
Billy's wife came over and washed for Olive Carried wash water and choring

Evening carried Billy's wife home
Clear sharp night

Mailed letter to Board of Agriculture giving name and address of eight farmers
Olive received letters of condolence from Lilly and Etta Lancaster
Arne received Youth's Companion from Aunt Lill
Soap 12 cts
Heard of death of Anna Thomas which occurred Jan 1st in Indian Territory Cyrus Mc'Kinney
called also Lucy
Alf Martz show at Centre

Wind changed evening to South and rained A.M.
Cut wood at door called at Will's a few minutes
P.M. Snowing hard Hauled 2 loads of firewood
Eve went to Ctr for mail

Went to a Populist Lecture at Band Hall by Dave Richards
Mailed Affidavit to Mrs Fred B Dunton Jamaica Plain
