Appropriations for Partifications.

The Llouse, in Committee Mr. Forsyth in the chair, discussed the vill making appropriations for certain Foru-

ilerions for 1897.

Mr. Dwight moved to reduce the approprietion for Fort Adams, near Newport, to \$70,000;—And in reply to an inquiry of Mr. Penrae, explained, that it was the wish of the Committee of Ways and Means, to reduce the appropriations for fortifications for the current year, from \$680,000, as first reported, to \$540,000; that the difference in those agas should be distributed pro rata, on the works in progress; and that an application had been made to the Way Depurtisent on the subject. The motion was adopted, as were similar motions respecting Forts Humilton, Monroe, Callionn, Macon, &c -- Motions to incrouse severatof the appropriations. ware made, and negatived; and the item furthe Fort Mobile Point, was reduced from \$90,000 to \$70,000. Other appropriatintions were reduced, and some agreed to as reported.

The Committee then rose, and reported the bill to the House, and the amendments having been agreed to the

NAVAL APPROPRIATION BILL.

The House, in Committee, considered the nit making appropriations for the naval service of 1827.

A motion of Mr. Barney to add an appropriation for a Navy Yard at Bultimore, was negatived: Some amendments were proposed and nerved to.
