of the Chief Engineer of this Department contains a statement of the progress made, in erecting the several Fortifications, for which appropriations have been made.—In noticing Four Agams, in this Harbor, the Engineer remarks,—"Great progress has been made, during the year, in the construction of this Fort. The materials used are of an excellent quality, and the workmanship of superior execution."—The cost of eracting the works at Fort Adams, to the 30th Sept. 1828, was \$339,861,07—and the amount which will be required to complete the works, is stated at \$396,305,45 cents.
