Safety Helps Win Your "E"


Judging Is Done In Three Groups

If your department doesn't have its star in Safety toward a departmental "E" . . . here are some pointers to help win that star for next month. Grading for the safety star is made on the basis of three separate points: cooperation, which counts 50 per cent; physical condition of department, which counts 25 per cent; and dispensary calls, which counts 25 per cent. The total grade for all three must be 80 per cent or above in order to deserve a star. The final grade is the average of three shifts.

Worst Points

According to R. W. Cornwell, Safety Engineer, the places where departments failed on the first grading were, good housekeeping and the training of new employees on safety rules.

Considered under cooperation are: how well the departmental employees follow the suggestions of safety inspectors and the plant safety rules; and the safety training given new employees in the department.
