PRESIDENT DONALD W. DOUGLAS, JR., IN A MESSAGE TO THE OPENING SESSION

OF THE INTERNATIONAL AIR TRANSPORT ASSOCIATION GENERAL MEETING HERE.

DOUGLAS SAID CURRENT NEGOTIATIONS INDICATE THAT THE TOTAL HUMBER OF DC-8S PURCHASED IS EXPECTED TO BE INCREASED BY 25 IN THE NEXT FEW MONTHS.

FIRST AIRLINE TO PLACE A REPEAT ORDER WAS UNITED AIR LINES, WHICH INCREASED ITS ORIGINAL CONTRACT FOR 30 DC-85 TO 40. OF THE INTERNATIONAL CARRIERS, KLM ROYAL DUTCH AIRLINE WAS THE FIRST TO SIGN A CONTRACT WHICH ADDED FOUR TRANSPORTS TO ITS INITIAL PURCHASE OF EIGHT INTERCONTINENTAL MODELS.

TWO OTHER INTERNATIONAL AIRLINES ALSO HAVE INCREASED THEIR
DC-8 FLEETS BY A TOTAL OF SEVEN AIRCRAFT, DOUGLAS REVEALED. THESE
UNANNOUNCED ORDERS AND NEGOTIATIONS WITH PRESENT AND NEW CUSTOMERS
ARE EXPECTED TO ADD UP TO 25 AIRCRAFT TO THE CURRENT TOTAL OF 143
DC-8S PURCHASED BY 18 AIRLINES.

IN HIS GREETING TO THE MEMBERS OF IATA OPENING THEIR 15TH GENERAL MEETING IN TOKOY, DOUGLAS SAID.

TRANSPORT OPERATIONS, HOWEVER, IS A DEFINITE INDICATION THAT THEY
WILL CONTINUE THEIR FORWARD PROGRESS. "

POWERED BY THE PRATT & WHITNEY AIRCRAFT JT-3 ENGINE, WAS AWARDED ON

AUGUST 31 AND SERVICE WAS STARTED SIMULTANEOUSLY BY UNITED AND

DELTA AIRLINES ON SEPTEMBER 18.

CERTIFICATION OF DOMESTIC AND INTERCONTINENTAL VERSIONS
EQUIPPED WITH MORE POWERFUL JT-4 ENGINES IS EXPECTED IN DECEMBER
AND AN INTERCONTINENTAL MODEL USING ROLLS-ROYCE CONWAY ENGINES IS
SCHEDULED TO RECEIVE ITS TYPE CERTIFICATE IN FEBRUARY, 1960.

ALL MODELS ARE IDENTICAL IN SIZE AND GENERAL ARRANGEMENT,
DIFFERING ONLY IN THEIR POWER PLANTS AND IN GREATER ALLOWABLE
TAKE-OFF GROSS WEIGHTS TO ACCOMMODATE FUEL FOR LONGER RANGES.
