# Dedication of Mingo Facility Scheduled for Sat. Noon

## Open House for Tulsans to Feature Product Displays

Dedication ceremonies for the Mingo Facility will begin at Noon tomorrow, and will be followed by an open house for the citizens of Tulsa.

One year ago today, cornerstone footings for the Mingo Facility were spaded out in ground breaking ceremonies. Site preparation for the two new buildings was well under way when Company officials and representatives from the trust and contractors involved welded gold-painted spades to start construction of the \$3.8 million addition to the Tulsa Division.

Legal details for the building program were completed when local banks committed themselves to lend the money for the construction.

A construction contract was awarded to Tulsa Planners and Constructors, Inc., a local combine of Hudgins, Thompson, Ball & Assoc., Carnes Construction Co. and Cowen Construction Co.

The first TD employees moved into the new complex in October 1967.

Today, the division is at its peak employment of 4800 employees, and components for the Apollo/Saturn program, Chinook helicopter, and Boeing aircraft are being produced at the Mingo facility.
