SATURN BEING CHECKED AT KSC

Elements for the first manned Saturn vehicle in the Apollo program are undergoing initial checks at NASA's Kennedy Space Center, Fla.

The vehicle planned for use in the flight is the fifth Saturn IB, designated the SA-205. The milestone test is planned for this fall.

The instrument unit, the structure of which is built by the Tulsa Division, was flown to the moonport by the Super Guppy. The second stage of the vehicle, the S-IVB, was transported to KSC by the same aircraft.
