The City of Tulsa's Mohawk Zoo is one diamondback rattlesnake richer, thanks to J. L. Logan, Engineering Data Requirements.

Logan traveled to Waurika, Okla. earlier this month to participate in the annual snake hunt. It was his first experience with the sport, but he captured a 5 ft. 1 in. diamondback rattler shortly after he started his search.

The snake was only nine inches short of the prize winner, but it had 14 rattles, which tied it for first in that category.

Roadblocks will be established at various locations throughout the city by the Tulsa Police Department. Vehicle Safety Inspection stickers will be given to operators whose vehicle meets minimum safety standards.

Citations will be issued for noted discrepancies requiring that they be corrected within a specified period of time.

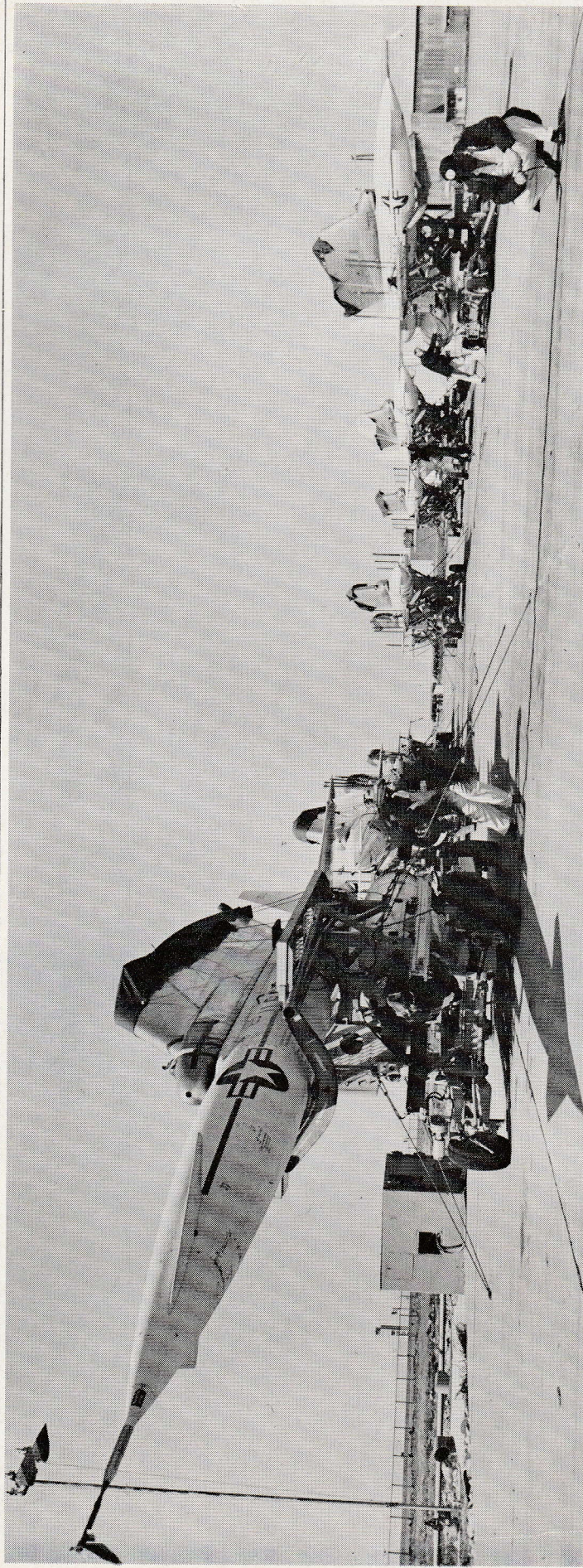
