

New Safety Record Established By Tulsa Division Employees

This month Tulsa Division employees established a new division safety record by going 60 days without experiencing a disabling (lost time) industrial injury, announced D. E. Tostenson, Health and Safety.

The previous record, established in 1966, was 47 days. The new record was set from Feb. 7 through Apr. 8 and marked the first time that the "Safety Craft" was able to make two consecutive trips to its goal of 30 days of injury free experience. The "Safety Craft" makes its trips on boards mounted in Bldg. 001 and the Engineering Bldg.

Tostenson explained the basis for judging industrial safety. "Since Tulsa's activation in 1962, Tulsa employees should feel proud of this record and continually strive to decrease it by actively supporting the Safety Program," Tostenson said.

tem (ELS) for the Apollo spacecraft has successfully passed its first test with a full-scale boilerplate spacecraft. The test spacecraft was dropped from an aircraft and used an automatic sequencer to deploy its two drogue parachutes and three main parachutes under conditions simulating a landing following reentry from Earth orbit. The ELS has been modified to handle the increased weight of the Apollo command module, and has undergone extensive testing since last summer with instrumented test vehicles. The test program is being conducted by NASA at the Naval Air Facility, El Centro.

Manned Sea Test

The 48-hour Apollo at-sea post-landing systems qualification test has been completed successfully in the Gulf of Mexico.

Between her other painting projects, Mrs. Woodruff is painting the life history of Presidents Roosevelt, Truman, Eisenhower, Kennedy and Johnson.

This year she entered her painting, "Eisenhower, A Moment in

History," in the 1968 Oklahoma Art Competition. The painting won the Ruskin Art Club Award for representational painting.
