The Week of the Child is an annual, week-long event comprised of different activities geared toward families with infants and tod-dlers. Activities will be held at different venues across the city from Oct. 19 to Oct. 27.

The week begins this Saturday with a children's parade. Kids are invited to meet at the Sudbury arena at 10 a.m. to dress up in costumes, decorate their bikes, wagons or scooters, and paint their faces for the parade. From there, they will walk along Elgin Street to Market Square, Sudbury's farmer's market.

The parade begins at 11 a.m., and all children are welcome, although those under 12 must have an adult with them.

After the parade, Market Square will be host to hayrides, crafts, more face painting and playtime on inflatable bounce-a-bouts, as well as a free hot dog lunch for the kids.

Some of the other children's activities throughout the week include skating parties, pictures taken with Santa, a pancake breakfast, a nature walk, storytelling, singalongs and gallery and museum tours.

Although there is plenty during the week for little ones to do, the activities featured are not just for children. There will be information available for parents as well.

The opening day will feature a car seat display and demonstration on how to install and use car seats properly, and Greater Sudbury Police officers will be fingerprinting children.
