

Golden Jet scores pair

WINNIPEG (UPI) — The Winnipeg Jets scored two goals in the first two minutes last night and went on to defeat the Vancouver Blazers, 6-3, in a World Hockey Association game.

The victory was the first of the new season for Jets.

An opening night home crowd of only 6,700 saw Winnipeg jump to a 3-0 first period lead and then, after the Blazers pulled to within one during the second period, the Jets came back with two more goals for a 5-2 lead after the second period.

Player-coach Bobby Hull scored two goals for Winnipeg. Other Jet scorers were Chris Bordeleau, Norm Beaudin, Danny Johnson and Jean-Guy Gratton.

For Vancouver, which took five of the nine minor penalties assessed by referee Ray Thomas, it was Claude St. Sauveur with two goals and Don O'Donoghue with one.
