Whereas

Fred A. Jordan,

of Sellwood,

Ontario,

Canada,

has petitioned the Commissioner of Patents, praying for the grant of a Patent for an alleged new and useful Improvement in Methods of Making Briquets, and has assigned to Moose Mountain Limited, of Sellwood, aforesaid, all his right, title and interest, in and to the said invention.

a description of which invention is contained in the specification, of which a duplicate is hereto attached, and made an essential part hereof, and has elected his domicile at Sellwood, Ontario in Canada, and has also complied with the other requirements of The Patent Act, Chap. 69, Revised Statutes of Canada, 1906.

Now Therefore the present Patent grants to the said

Moose Mountain Limited,

its executors, administrators, legal representatives and assigns, for the period of Eighteen Years from the date of these presents, the exclusive right, privilege and liberty of making, constructing and using, and vending to others to be used, in the Dominion of Canada, the said invention, subject nevertheless to adjudication before any Court of competent jurisdiction.

Provided, that the grant hereby made is subject to the conditions contained in the Act aforesaid.

The partial fee required for the term of six years having been paid to the Commissioner of Patents, this Patent shall cease at the end of six years from date, less before the expiration of the said term, the holder thereof pay the fee required for other term or terms as provided by law.
