

Tourism a pot of gold



Thumbs up to Science North for donating a slag pot to the Northern Ontario Railroad and Heritage Centre in Capreol. The pot, weighing between 50 and 80 tonnes, fits in perfectly with other pieces at the museum.

Eventually, the pot will be hooked up to two old Inco electric locomotives — one built in 1916 and the other in 1946 — that the museum currently has in storage. The mining and railway industries are intricately entwined throughout Sudbury's history. This generous gift on the part of Science North to the museum shows co-operation in the tourism industry which will benefit the entire city.
