## **Dave Was Passionate About Capreol**

Capreol lost another of its strong community advocates on July 9. Dave Kilgour, age 70, passed away suddenly, at his summer home at Ella Lake.

Dave was a well-regarded member of the community. He was born and raised in Capreol and pursued a career in teaching at C.R. Judd Public School, where he worked until his retirement. He was known to have maintained communications with many of his former students and was always pleased to hear of their successes.

Dave was also an active political figure, as a town councillor, mayor, and regional councillor, for several decades. Upon Capreol's amalgamation with the other "satellite communities" and City of Sudbury in 2001, Kilgour was dedicated to ensuring Capreol remained invested in the Greater City of Sudbury and did his best to make sure Capreol was not forgotten at the council table.

He was a true town booster, actively involved in negotiations for many projects that still benefit Capreol today. He was involved in the development of the Millennium Centre. He made the pitch to Capreol town council about purchasing the building on Bloor Street, now known as the Museum House. He was also key in the negotiations to house Valley Community Theatre at the Millennium Centre five years ago.

As a charter member of the Northern Ontario Railway Museum and Heritage Centre Foundation, he was the driving force behind the organization's fundraising efforts. He also helped negotiate the annex of the Fire Hall to the museum.

Among his many fundraising efforts, Dave secured start-up funds to develop the annual Terror Train 6077 event in October. Most recently, Dave was involved in fundraising with the Capreol 100 Committee, a group of citizens organizing Capreol's Centennial celebrations in 2018.



Dave, the man, will be truly missed by residents of Capreol. His efforts, as a volunteer whose work spanned some 40 years, have made Capreol a better place for us to live.
