Dear Carl: -

You will remember that in our conversation with Mr. Hansel that he suggested the possibility of our splitting our diamond drill cores length wise and leaving one half in the core box to represent the core, the other half was to be taken in lengths of 5' each and ground for samples. Thave been experimenting with the splitting of these cores to-day that it can be done in a manner which may allow. I find that when we attempt to split the cores they break into short pieces not to exceed an inch in length. It is quite important that our cores be kept inviolate. I am wondering whether having the cores in such very irregular pieces would not discount their value. It certainly would not discount the value to me especially should the work be done either by myself or Mr. Anderson but a question arises whether it would discount the value of these cores to some one who might have access to them and whose impression might be a matter of considerable importance and who knew nothing of us or the circumstances which brought the cores to the condition in which they find them.
