On this 11 day of May 1897 personally  
came before me, A Notary Public within  
and for the County and State aforesaid  
Jeremiah Stormaker aged 56 years,  
who lives near and his Post office address  
is McComb Hancock County Wis. To me  
well known as a reputable, and credible  
person, who being by me duly sworn  
according to Law declares and says  
that he knows and was acquainted  
with Isaac Cussas (who was Capt. of  
Co 4 "21" D.V.A.) before the war of the  
Rebellion, that affiant was a member  
of said Capt Cussas' Compy, and before  
to the war, said Cussas was a brave  
and hearty man, of good sound physical  
health, that at the battle of Chancellorsville  
1863, said Cussas was captured by the  
Enemy, and held a prisoner of war for a  
long space of time, that when affiant  
first saw said Cussas after his release  
from prison, he did not in any way
