concern in its prosecution.

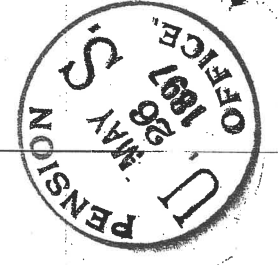
